VESTI IZ SLOVENIJE



ZOPET STRELJANJE na meji. — Dne 27. februarja je bilo slišati v zgodnjih jutranjih urah na jugoslovansko-tržaški meji pri Repentabor streljanje jugoslovenskih straž. To je sigurno znamenje, da je zopet skupina beguncev hotela prestopiti mejo ilegalno. Jugoslovanske oblasti izdajajo vedno nove ukrepe, da bi preprečile ta beg v svobodo. Po zadnjih odločbah se smatra za zločinsko dejanje že to, če je kdo sumil, da misli kakšna osoba bežati preko meje, pa tega ne javi takoj oblastem. Vse take ljudi, o katerih se ugotovi, da so vedeli za kako namero pobega, obsodijo na več let prisilnega dela. Vendar je življenje pod komunističnim režimom tako hudo, da nobene policijske odredbe niso dovolj močne, da bi ljudi ustavile. Vedno nove skupine se skušajo rešiti iz tišovskega pekla.

HRANA IN PRESKRBA. — Hrana se ni nič izboljšala in je v splošnem nedostatna. Enako preskrba z industrijskimi izdelki. Cene strašno naraščajo. Na črni borzi stane na pr. par ženskih Nylon nogavic 1,400 do 1,800 dinarjev, obitajan film za fotoaparat 450 dinarjev, katalog rija 500 dinarjev. Povprečna plača pa je 3,200 do 3,500 dinarjev mesečno.

V zadnjem času se je sicer pojavil v prodaji bel kruh, a le na karte in je treba zanj oddati tri običajne krušne odrezke. Razen tega je treba dolgo stati v vrsti. Nekoliki boljše so zadnji čas preskrbeli za šolske otroke, ki dobe v šoli malico: kruh in maslo ali marmelado.

VOJSKA. — V Sloveniji ni več pomembnejših vojaških edinic. Vse so odšle na južno-vzhodne meje. Za seboj pa so razdejale kasarniške prostore ka kor kakšna okupacijska vojska pri umiku.

Komunistični izgredniki so vprizoril pravo bitko v San Severu, mestu južne Italije

Napadli so redno armado, policijo in karabinjerje. Več oseb je bilo ranjenih. — Situacija postaja polagoma zopet normalna.

RIM. — Meščani v mestu San Severo v južni Italiji, kjer imajo komunisti mogočno bredo, so 23. maja izvali velike izgrede ter napadli italijansko redno armado, karabinjerje in policijsko silo.

Karabinjerska postaja v mestu San Severo poroča, da se boji še vedno vrše, toda da se že počasi vrača "normalni položaj." Mesto San Severo šteje 50,000 prebivalcev.

Na obeh straneh je bilo večje število ljudi ranjenih, karabinjerski glavni stan poroča, da siartnati slučajev ni blio. — Med ranjenimi je tudi deset karabinjerjev in policistov.

Druga resna bitka je izbruhnila v Cerignoli, ki je rojstni kraj komunističnega voditelja Giuseppe di Vittoria. Tu je običaj morajo ti ljudje sami voziti do vrada družbe na Chardon Rd. in Euclid Ave.

Mestna zbornica je prejela od Phil-Mar Corp. 4712 Chester Ave. Cleveland, Ohio, prošnjo za dovoljenje zgraditi na 260. cesti in Lakeland Blvd. lončarsko podjetje. Firma ima tako podjetje že zdaj v Chattanooga, Tenn. Zgradili bi dvoje poslopij z 40,000 štirjaških čevljev prostornine vsako. V enem bi izdelovali lončarske predmete, v drugem pa bi izdelovali senčnike za svetilke.

Točasnata mestna postava (zoning code) ne dovoljuje izdelave lončarskih predmetov v Euclidu.

Euclidsko učiteljstvo je vpravalo šolski odbor za višjo plačo v znesku \$300 za vsakega za prihodnje šolsko leto. Odbor še ni izrekel mnenja.

Predloga za redukcijo počitnic federalnim uslužbencem

Z odpravo dolgih počitnic, "bolezenskih" opravič in mnogih brezdelnih dni, bi se prihranilo 200 milijonov dolarjev na leto.

WASHINGTON. — Svet državnih trgovskih zbornic je izjavil, da bi primerna redukcija časa počitnic in prekomerno "bolezensko" izostajanje od dela od strani vladnih uslužencev, prihranila federalni vlad najmanj \$200,000,000 na leta.

Pred dyema tednoma je senat porazil predlogo, da bi se reduciralo letne počitnice vladnih uslužencev od 26 na 20 dni, in da se zniža opravičenih v plačanih dni za bolezni od 15 do 10. Demokratični senator Douglas iz Illinois, ki je vložil to predlogo, je izjavil, da bi se s tem prihranilo \$100,000,000 na leto. Če bi se znižalo čas počitnic in opravičljivih dni za bolezni od 1:30 do 2:30 ter ob sredah od 1 do 2 popolne.

Nedeljsko pismo

Dragi prijatelj!

Ko boš prihodnjo nedeljo stopil v cerkev te bo objela neka žalost in tesnoba, saj bo cerkev izpremenila svoj obraz: v črnilo in temo se bo odela. Boga, križ nam bodo zakrili. Bog beži od nas, beži iz človeške družbe, beži s sveta, saj nesrečni in zaslepljeni človek nima Zanj drugega kot pravljjen kamen, da ga vrže Vanj. To liturgično dejanje Cerkve je žalostna podoba dejanskega stanja umirajoče človeške družbe, ki je izrinila Boga iz svoje srede in gre kar brez Njega, ki je Začetnik življenja, Pot in Resnica — v bodočnosti.

Saj ne vem, prijatelj, toda možnost je, da sva tudi morda med to druhaljo, morda je kamen tudi v najinih rokah. Ali ne čutiš, kako hitro poteka sv. postni čas? Samo še nekaj dni in že bo grmelo čez svet: "Vstal je! Zmagal je!" Kaj sva res tako nespametna, da bova še ob odprtrem grobu stala s kamnom v roki, z grehom v duši, ko bodo nebesa in zemlja slavila zmago nad grehom in smrtno? Največja nespamet bi to bila, še več, najina poguba bi to bila. Zato veš kaj, prijatelj, pridruživa se v tejtej uri apostolu Petru, spremljajva ga na njegovi poti in če sva ga posnemala v grehu, v zataji, ga posnemava tudi v pokori, da bo praznik Vstajenja tudi za naju praznik zmage.

Dogodki na veliki četrtek zvečer se odigravajo s filmsko naglico. Zapelivec, revolucionar, sovražnik režima Jezus je zvezan, je v ječi. Hitro je treba sklicati ljudsko sodišče, da bo pred soboto, pred praznikom vse končano. Z denarjem se ne štedi, tempeljska blagajna ga ima dovolj. Zaslužiš tudi vsakdo rad. Kaj, krivo pričevanje, denar je le v žepu. Po vsem mestu se kupujejo krive priče, ki bodo nastopile pred ljudskim sodiščem. Pri Ani in Kafju se vrši obravnava in konča pri Pilatu: "Ibis ad crucem!" Na križ ž njim! Nič novega za nas. Stokrat smo bili priče takim sodbam.

V ozadju te tragedije pa se odigrava še druga: Petrova zataja. Komaj je Jezus zvezan, se razbeže vsi apostoli. Kot preplašene ovce, brez pastirja so. Samo Janez in Peter se pokorajžita, da od daleč spremljata Jezusa in razbojniško druhal v mesto. Peter je ves radoven, kaj bo z Jezusom, zato jo mahne kar na dvorišče Kafove palače. Od mraza in strahu trepetata pred vhodom. Moj Bog kaj če ga spoznajo! Tudi nimetu ne uide križ. V teh mislih mu že zabrusi dekla v obraz: "Tu ti spadaš v Jezusovo družbo!" Peter prebledi. Kaj sedaj? Naj prizna? Trpinčenje, smrt ga čaka. Ne, samo laž je izhod, ta ga reši vsega. "Ne vem kaj govorиш, blede ste ti, ženska!" Krik petelin se oglasi v dali... Peter je že v vrtincu greha, ne more ven. Je že druga dekla tu. Spozna ga. Peter pa: "Ne poznam ga!" v dvorišču nastane šum. Ogleduh, izdajalec je tu! Vlečeo ga k ognju, da ga vidijo pri luči. Tu ni nobenega dvoma več. Maleh, ki mu je Peter odsekal v vrtu, uho, ga spozna. Spozna ga vsi. Izhoda ni več. Peter se razburja, taji, prisega, da Kristusa ne pozna. Že planejo po njem. Komaj se izvije batinam in ostrom vrvem. Petelin pa v drugič zapoje... .

Strašno je morala boleti Jezusa krivična odsoba pred Pilatom, toda zdi se mi, da nič manj Petra zataja! Peter, prvi med apostoli, namestnik božji, skala Cerkve, pa ga zataji!

Na begu se Petrov pogled sreča s pogledom obojnega Jezusa. Dovolj je. Samo en pogled poln žalosti, ki prodro dušo. Peter spozna greh, spozna zlobo zataje, s solzami izmiva z tempeljskim zdovjem svoj greh in svoje spreobrnjenje potrdi s križem, na katerem je umrl za svojega Učenika.

To je Petra zgodba. In vzroki njegovega padca? "Življenje dam zate — tudi v ječu in smrt s teboj — če se bodo vsi pohujšali nad Teboj, Te jaz ne bom zatajil!" tako je v Petru govorila njegova osabnost, njegov napuh, njegovo preveliko zaupanje v samega vase. Pozabil je na Gospodove besede: "Brez mene ne morete ničesar storiti!" pozabil je, da hodi napuh pred padcem. Da, prijatelj, če ni božje milosti z nama, bova padla ti in jaz.

In drugi vzrok padca: Tik pred slovesom je dal Jezus zadnji opomin apostolom: "Čuje te molite, da ne padete v skušnjava." Peter pa spi. Jezus zahteva molitve, samo ta more prinesi v duše duhovno pomlad, če pa molitve ni, so na široko odprta vrata grehu v naše srce. Zdi se mi, da vsi oni, ki so v peklu, so zato tam, ker niso molili in zveličani so zato v božjem naročju, ker so molili. Je pač resnično: "Zamanj se trudijo zidarji, če Gospod ne zida hiše."

In še en razlog Petrovega padca: ni se varoval nevarnosti, bližnje priložnosti v grehu. Kakšen opravek ima Peter z Jezusovimi sovražniki, kaj se ima razgovarjati s temi vojaškimi ženčinami, kaj je to družba za prvaka apostolov? Ni čudno, da v tej izprijeni družbi pade celo oni, ki je zatrjeval: "Ti si Kristus, Sin živega Boga!" pade tako globoko, da izjavlja: "Ne poznam ga!"

Nikar prijatelj, ne obsojamo Petra, saj sva bila tudi morda boge kolikor je v oni nepregledni procesiji, ki gre za Petrom v bližnjo priložnost za greh in tam padla. Koli-

ko kot biser čistih duš je že utenilo v takih družbah v močvirju nečistosti, koliko jih je izgubilo zaklad vere, koliko jih je zatajilo Boga, vero, posmrtnost, vse, prav vse. Količko na žalost tudi naših bratov in sestra, je utenilo v tujini: s križem na čelu, z vero v srcu so odhajali čez prag domače hiše, danes pa preklinjajo križ in Boga in vero. Slaba družba, slab časopis, knjiga, vse to mori s Kristusovo krvijo odkuljene duše, ki gredo danes v svoji zaslepljenosti in napuhu samo do Petrovega greha, njihov napuh pa jim brani stopiti še korak naprej in s Petrom reči: "Grešil sem, Bog odpusti!"

Prijatelj, pojdi z menoj sedaj na Kajfovo dvorišče pa ne zato, da bi s Petrom spet grešila, pač pa, da tudi midva tam ujameva Kristusov pogled in presunjena od njega greva za Petrom k jeruzalemskim zdovom, da se tam izjoka za svoj greh. Zelo važno je to, prijatelj, kajti v nasprotнем slučaju nama grozi, da nama bo Kristus nekoč dejal: "Ne poznam tega človeka."

S prisrčnim pozdravom,

Kakor rečeno, slavlje je bilo domače in prisrčno, kakor je domača v prisrčna vsa Eršetova rodbina, ki se nikoli in nikjer ne sili v ospredje, pa je vendar dala svojemu narodu več kot svoj delež. Nevesta Berta se je svoječasno mnogo udejstvovala v slov. dramatički kakor tudi v drugih, slovenskih kulturnih in karitativen aktivnostih; prav tako njena sestra Anica, ki je nastopala na slovenskem odru in kot igralka i kot pianistinja. Vsa rodbina je narodno zavedna in slovensko-čuteča. Nevesta Berta (sedaj ga Lobotova) je poleg vseh drugih aktivnosti našla še čas za posecanje ruskih tečajev ter obvlada ruščino v govoru in pisavi. Pokojna je bila tudi ustanova članica podružnice št. 47 SZZ ter so se v njeni hiši vrstile mesečne seje 16 let, katerih je tudi ona redno udeleževala, dokler ji je zdravje dopuščalo. Bila je tudi članica društva Presv. Rešnjega telesa, katero ji je bilo v največjo tolažbo v njeni bolezni. 
YOUR HEALTH CENTER



(This is the first of a series of articles on the Newton D. Baker Health Center and its services—)

On Oct. 18, 1949, Governor Frank J. Lausche dedicated the Newton D. Baker Health Center to the service of the people. This health center is housed in a beautiful, new, modern building on E. 15th St. between St. Clair and Superior Avenues and serves the area bounded on the north by the lake on the south by Euclid Ave., and on the east by 73rd at St. Clair; 79th at Superior and 105th at Euclid. It is one of the 7 health centers

operated by the Cleveland Division of Health to bring health services as close to the home as possible. The chief purpose of the Health Center is to keep the family well and teach ways of preventing disease. Its clinics are for the most part diagnostic — cases requiring treatment are referred to the private physician or, if such services are not obtainable, to hospital cut-patient departments. The Health Center is also Headquarters for public health who serve the community in the clinic, the home and in the school. More about your health center and its services next week.



If you walk by the Newton D. Baker Center on a Tuesday or Friday morning you will see a procession of baby carriages on their way to the Well Baby Clinic at the Center. Let us follow one of these carriages inside and see what happens. In the first carriage there is Tommy Jones, a bright-eyed young man of 4 months. This is not his first trip to the Clinic — he has been coming in for a check-up since he was six weeks old. Each month Tommy's weight is checked by a nurse and he is examined by a Clinic pediatrician. A report of his progress is given to his mother at each visit. During a visit the doctor may prescribe a new formula for Tommy and recommend additions to his diet.

Tommy's mother will also receive some valuable suggestions from the doctor on child care and can ask any questions that puzzle her. Tommy's parents happen to need financial assistance at this time, and so milk is provided — as well Vitamin D and ascorbic acid upon the doctor's prescription.

This is a special day for Tommy — he is four months old and he will be started on his immunization schedule. Today he will get the first of a series of three shots which will protect him against diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough. At five and six months he will receive his other two shots. When he comes in for his third shot he will also be vaccinated against smallpox. Tommy is well on his way to becoming a normal, healthy and happy child. Every infant from birth until he is two is welcome at the Well Baby Clinic nearest his home.

Asking For Trouble

Any business, large or small, which fails to train its employees in fire prevention and fire control is asking for the most serious kind of trouble.

An engineer of the National Board of Fire Underwriters recently cited some cases showing what this failure can involve. In one instance, a new employee in a warehouse was told to take some rubbish "down to the end of the hall, and you'll find a door there leading to the incinerator." He obeyed. There were two doors and he chose one that led into a paint spray room. He dumped his rubbish and struck a match to it. The loss was \$350,000. In another case a salamander had been set up on a loading dock to keep the men warm. It was tipped over, and oil spilled and burst into flame. No one took quick and expert action to put the fire out. In a few minutes it was a roaring inferno, and the loss came to \$58,000.

The point is that training employees in fire prevention, appointing fire brigades with definite responsibilities and the knowledge of what to do if fire does strike, and installing adequate alarm and fire-fighting systems have a big dollars-and-cents value. Much can be done to insure safety even in very small factories and shops. Ignorance and carelessness are always fire's best friends. Knowledge and caution are fire's most effective enemies. And this goes for homes, schools and all other fire hazards as well.

Get Ready for Census Quiz

The United States Census Bureau, which does the job, estimates that about 150,000,000 Americans will be counted this year. For every one of them, certain basic population data will be wanted.

Under the household address will come the name of each occupant, including lodgers. Then will follow across the enumerator's question-and-answer sheet the person's relationship in the household, race, sex, age, marital status, birthplace and citizenship.

For those 14 years or older there will be five to eight more questions, depending on whether they are working, looking for a job, the kind of work, if working, and the business or industry.

The sheets, 19 by 22 inches, have space for 30 names. Every fifth name will fall on what are known as sample lines, of which there will be six on each sheet, rotated from sheet to sheet so that the sample lines appear in different positions. Those whose names fall on this line will be asked sample, or extra questions.

Basic Data

For every name on a sample line will be listed data showing where the person lived a year ago, his par-



Well, now there is an estimated population of 151,000,000 and the government is spending \$287.00 this year for every single individual, old and young. Hadn't we better think it over and do something about it?

TWENTY-ONE reorganization reports have been submitted by the President which will become effective within 60 days unless vetoed by either House of Congress. The items covered are comparatively minor ones which were scattered through the Hoover reports and none of them offer any immediate savings.

You will recall that the Hoover Commission submitted eighteen reports only two of which have been substantially adopted, one reorganizing the Defense Department and the other creating the General Services (Housekeeping) Administration.

Most of the presently submitted twenty-one reports from the President are designed to increase the power of the heads of federal departments and agencies. The rest

of them involve a re-shuffling of certain functions. Two of the twenty-one would build up the Labor Department with new functions, one would abolish the Office of the General Counsel of the NLRB, one would abolish the Maritime Commission as an independent office and put it under the Department of Commerce, creating a new Under Secretary of Commerce for Transportation. There seems to be less interest in real savings than in concentration of power in departmental officials.

A woman, the widowed mother of seven children, a Laborite, has been elected to the New Zealand Parliament. She is the first Maori woman to be so elected.

TWO of our Navy units are visiting Turkey. The 45,000 ton aircraft carrier Midway, one cruiser and six destroyers have been to Istanbul and three destroyers, one light cruiser, one oil tanker and a submarine are in the Aegean Sea port of Izmir.
