## ANARHISTI NA- GAJAJO ŠPANSKI VLADI

Lisbona, Portugalska, 5. apr.  
General Francisco Franco, arhovni poveljnik fašistične armade, sestavlja ultimatum, ki ga bo naskrivil španski ljudski vlad in v katerem bo zahteval kapitulacijo v določenem času, se glavno despolja poročila. Ako bo vlad odbila zahteve, tedaj bo fašistična pomorska in letalska sila bombardirala Barcelono, da čimprej konča civilno vojno.

Hendaye, Francija, 5. apr.—Fašistični častniki so sinoči našli, da so njihove čete odrezale Katalonijo od ostalega ozemlja lojalistične Španije, od Madrija in Valencije. Prve čete so dosegeli do Tortose, kjer so postavile strojnice in topniške streljnice, zasedle hribe in zdaj kontroliajo železnico in ceste, ki vežejo obsežki španskega ozemlja. Neko poročilo celo pravi, da so fašisti že okupirali Tortoso, strategično mesto, ki leži 20 milij južnozapadno od Barcelone. Vse prometne zvezne med unim in severnim sektorjem lojalistične Španije so pretrgane.

Okupacija Tortose, kjer se reže Ebro steka v morje, pomeni, da so si fašisti utrli pot do sredozemskega morja. Fašistične čete so okupirale to mesto in budi bitki z vladnimi četami, pa niso bile kos premoči. V bitki so fašisti ujeli okrog milijonnikov.

V bližini Leride, katero so fašisti zavzeli, se ljute bitke načnejo. Na desnem bregu reke Segre so lojalisti še vedno aktivni in sipajo kroglo iz strojnih topov na predmestja na južni strani mesta. Predno so se lojalisti nagnili na drugo stran reke so dinamiton uničili mostove.

Lojalisti poročajo o uspehih prototipenčevi na guadalajarški fronti, severozapadno od Madrida. Ta je bila podvzeta z menom, da general Franco nekaj čet na to fronto iz Katalonije, kjer so fašisti v ozadju. Vest iz Madrija se glasuje, da so bombe, ki so jih vrgli fašistični letalci na to mesto, in drugim kroglo ubile 50 in redno čez dvesto ljudi.

General Pablo, poveljnik španske armade v sektorju Benasque in Pirenskem gorovju, je izvill, da anarhisti v Kataloniji nagnali so ze več poslopji v krog z dinamiton, poleg tega pa izvajanje obrambnih načinov. Razkol, ki so ga povzročili anarhisti v vladnih vrstah, deloma odgovoren za poraze fašistov na tej fronti.

## Kitajska armada se umika pred Japonci

Japonci zasedli kitajsko mesto po deset dni trajajoči bitki

Sanghaj, 5. apr. — Japonske kolone so začele prodričati proti jugu po okupaciji mesta Tajčervanga, ki so ga neprestano napakovalo deset dni. Japonski cilj je zdaj okupacija mesta Sučov, važnega železniškega križišča. Japonske čete prodričajo proti temu mestu po ozemlju ob Veiklom prekopu in prve čete so že vkorakale v provinci Kiangso.

Japonski častniki so priznali, da so bile bitke za posest Tajčervanga najbolj vroče na fronti ob progri Tientain-Pukov železnic, v katerih sta obe strani utrpeli velike izgube. Sele zdaj so nad tem mestom zavrhale japonske zastave.

Kitajska armada 50,000 mož se je umaknila šele potem, ko je uvidela, da ne bo mogla vzdržati pritišča japonske vojne mašine. Z japonsko armado je v nasokih na Tajčervang sodelovala letalska sila. Letalci so vrgli veliko število bombo na mesto, ki je zdaj le še kup razvalin. Revščina je naredila Hitlerja močnega

## Tako je izjavil v svojem govoru v Celovcu

Berlin, 5. apr. — "Revščina me je naredila močnega," je dejal Hitler v svojem govoru pred veliko-množico, ki se je zbrala v Celovcu, Korotku, da ga sliši. Ta je bil drugi Hitlerjev govor na avstrijski zemlji v njegovem kampanji v zvezi s plebiscitem, ki se bo vršil prihodnjem nedeljo in pri katerem bo ljudstvo glasovalo v Londonu ali pa v uradnih nemških konzulov v prihodnjih treh mesecih. Kdor bi se upiral in ignoriral, bo izgubil pravice kot nemški državljan.

"Moja borba proti kapitalizmu je trajala petnajst let," je rekel Hitler. "V teh letih sem redkokdaj dve zaporedni noči prespal v eni postelji. Ako bi me takrat kdaj vprašal, kje je moja domovina, bi moral odgovoriti, da je v vseh krajih Nemčije. Dolgo vrsto let sem bil najrevnejši nemški državljan, človek brez doma in domovine, toda revščina me je naredila močnega. Vsi Nemci so danes načini; oni, ki so zunaj stranke, so le norci in idioti."

Milan Hodža, češkoslovaški premier, je zdaj podvzel korake, da potolaže voditelje nemške manjšine. V svojem govoru po radiu zadnji teden je izjavil, da ne bo pogajal s Henleinom, ker ta ni član češkega parlamenta. Na tem stališču se vztraja, toda pripravljen je se pogajati z drugimi voditelji, ki reprezentirajo nemško manjšino v parlamentu. Opazovalci pravijo, da to pomeni, da bo Hodža pristal na nekatere zahteve nacijev. Sicer je bila naznanjena amnestija za politične jetnike. Med temi so Nemci, Madžari in Poljaki, ki so bili vrženi v zapor zaradi prevratnih aktivnosti.

## CHAMBERLAIN ZOPET ZMAGAL V PARLAMENTU

Poslanci odobrili zunajo politiko angleške vlade

## REGISTRACIJA NEMCEV V ANGLIJII

London, 5. apr. — Ministra predsednik Neville Chamberlain je sinodi ponovno odobril napad laboritor in liberalcev v parlamentu. Predlog, da parlament izreče nezaupnico Chamberlainovi vladi zaradi njene zanjanje politike, so stavili laboritori in liberalci, a je bil poražen s 359 proti 152 glasovom. Laboritori so argumentirali, da premierjeva zunanja politika potiska delavščike v vojni, poleg tega pa so zahtevali takojšen razpis volitev.

Chamberlain namerava reorganizirati svoj kabinet z namenom, da pospeši izvajanje obvezitvenega programa. Organizacija delodajalcev je že debila na svojo stran, zdaj pa skuša pridobiti voditelje delavških unij, da bodo koperirali z vlado v napori, da se poveča producija orodja in državnega mesta.

London, 5. apr. — Diktator Hitler hoče imeti popolno kontrolo nad Nemci in bivšimi Avstrijo, ki žive v Angliji. Vse je pozval, naj se registrirajo v uradu nemške poslanika v Londonu ali pa v uradu nemških konzulov v prihodnjih treh mesecih. Kdor bi se upiral in ignoriral, bo izgubil pravice kot nemški državljan.

Po izjavi angleškega notranjega ministra živi v Angliji okrog 20,000 Nemcev, med temi 11,000 žensk, in 11,000 Avstrijev. O takiti Hitlerjeve vlade, ki hoče imeti kontrolo nad temi Nemci, ki živijo v tujezematu, bo razpravljalo tudi angleški parlament. Politični krogri trdijo, da je Hitlerjev poziv, da se morajo Nemci registrirati, vmešavanje v angleške zadeve.

## Comments On This and That

By IVAN MOLEK, Editor

### ON TAKING CARE OF HEALTH

Our Society is interested in the health of its members because the healthy members are active members, therefore, good members. Healthy membership also means a larger reserve in the treasury and more money available in any future emergency.

Our members should also be interested in health, first, individually for the sake of their own happy and long life, second, collectively in order to be secure from special levies and curtailments in sick benefits which usually threaten when the sick benefit fund is heavily drained.

Unfortunately, the general state of health is beyond the Society's control. Not even the U. S. government has any real control over public health, and the local authorities fare no better. To illustrate the mighty neglect this country finds itself in this respect: the government takes care of business through its commerce department, it has army and navy departments besides others—but there is no health department not to mention the gapping lack of an education department. The country wages war at any cost collectively—but the greatest war of all times, the war against disease, is left to the feeble local authorities and to private medicine.

The only thing to do, then, is to look over our health as individuals, and to give the best hints possible to those lacking knowledge in these matters. Every one knows it is better to keep disease away than to struggle with sickness when it attacks you.

Proper and healthy food is the most important thing for the protection of health. Since science discovered the vitamins and other valuable properties of foodstuffs, and since the government authorities are giving out free literature on food values, the only thing they can do thus far, it is easy to learn what to select for the proper protection.

We hope that some day the duty of the government will be to interfere with the right of every ignorant citizen to undermine his health with improper food and drink; that it will be criminal to be ignorant in that respect just as it is criminal now to attempt suicide. One's liberty to get sick shall be done away with.

But before America comes into this happy age there ought to be an end of the system that produces and distributes foodstuffs not for use but for profit of the few. An economic system that gives to a class of people all the liberty to be hungry, undernourished, and sick by giving foodstuffs, medicine, and other means of good health to another class of people with liberty to dispose of it as they see fit—is a relic of the long and barbarous past.

Our struggle should be two fold: first, to keep ourselves healthy inasmuch it is possible in the present conditions, and second, to instill in others the firm belief in the change of the present economic and social system.
