Montana, 100 Per Cent State, Gains in Section Rating

Seven Societies Advance as Newcomer Is Admitted; 130 Units in Membership Race

BULLETIN

Two societies have made quota last week, according to unofficial reports. The new honor societies are No. 81 of Pittsburgh, heavy favorite to merit honors first in Pennsylvania, and No. 169 of Cleveland, veteran supporter of KSKJ campaigns and the largest society in the Union.

The above information is unofficial and awaits confirmation from KSKJ Golden Booster headquarters.

With two societies near the quota mark, Nos. 81 and 169, KSKJ Golden Booster Campaign reports show seven societies made gains in the drive that is now going into its last 37 days and produced four quota societies.

The Montana Jays, up in the North where they say the hand-clasp is firmer and the heart beat truer, KSKJ workers added another feather in their hat by the addition of No. 43 to the list of active societies.

New enlistment of the new society in this drive gives the Montanans a batting average of 100 per cent participation.

The work of the Montana societies, in addition to making their state a banner group, also sent the Montana-Wyoming-Oregon-Washington section into second place, replacing the Missouri-Iowa-Nebraska group.

Wisconsin augmented its total last week, but not sufficiently to retain second place in the sectional rating, while Indiana, Illinois and Pennsylvania sections also boosted their totals to retain their respective places in the lineup.

In the state parade Missouri leads the field. Montana, Ohio, Wisconsin, Illinois and Pennsylvania made increases, but there was no change in the order of standing.

Of the 130 societies now in the drive, seven boosted their pointage in last week's activity. The forward marchers are Nos. 206, 108, 162, 146, 25, 120 and 174.

Although all state leaders appeared safe in retaining their leads—and this on records only, for a dark horse can overtake the pacers at any time—only one, No. 220 of Illinois, was threatened last week. No. 206 is on the upward march, and if No. 220 doesn't augment its past-quota mark, No. 206 will sail into the lead.

With the drive going into the last stages, present records show five states have 100 per cent participation. Wisconsin, Wyoming, West Virginia, Nebraska, Arkansas, Washington and Iowa need but one society each to place them in the 100 per cent class.

In the individual ratings Helen Spelich of No. 108 graduated to the Golden Booster Class, which includes 17 high ranking boosters, while the Silver Booster Class lists 31 active workers. A Golden Booster is one who recruits 20 or more members, a Silver Booster must enlist 10 or more members.
