Povorka se bo pričela v nedeljo ob 2:30 popoldne na E. 134 cesti in St. Clair Ave.

Tega dne, nameč v nedeljo popoldne ob 2:30 se bo pričela ena največjih parad, ki se bo začela na E. 134 cesti in St. Clair Ave. do Five Points, od tam severno po E. 152 cesti do N. Y. C. R. R. mostu. Tamkaj pa bo čakala velika skupina mornarjev, jezdče policije, odred policije na motornih koliesih, članstvo civilne obrambe, šestero godb, osem vežbalnih krožkov, armadni "jeipi" in še več drugih zanimivosti. Računa se da bo v povorki nad 2000 uniformiranih pohodnikov. Parada bo trajala polni dve uri.

STALIN JE ZADOVOLJEN

Voditelji ameriške in angleške kampanje v Afriki so "organizatorji prvega reda," je rekel Stalin.

MOSKVA, 14. novembra. — V pismeni izjavi, ki jo je podal Josip Stalin ameriškemu časnemu karelu Henryu C. Cassidyju glede sedanjega vojnega in političnega položaja, je sovjetski premier izjavil slednje:

Ameriška in angleška kampanja v Afriki sta radikalno izpremenili vojaško in politično situacijo v Evropi v korist vitezov, veznikov ter odprli pot za skorajšnje razsrušenje Nemčije in Italije.

Ameriške in angleške voditelje afriške kampanje je označil sovjetski premier za "organizatorje prvega reda ter je izrazil prepričanje, da bo ta kampanja kmalu olajšala nemški pritiski na ruski fronti.

Glede Rusije je izjavil, da bo kakor v preteklosti, tudi v bodočnosti "s častjo doprinesla svoj delež v vojni."

WALLACE O SOVJETSKI RUSIJI

Mi sicer še nismo padli na ponoreli nivo nacijskega mita o plemenski superiornosti, toda smo kljub temu že dovolj grešili, kar smo morali že plačati s krvjo deset tisočev dragocenih življenj. Etnična demokracija, ki je zgrajena iz srca, je največja potreba anglosaškega plemena.

Cetrta demokracija, ki se nanaša na izobrazbo, temelji na etnični demokraciji. Samo dejstvu, da je Stalin potiskal demokracijo izobrazbe in ospredje z vsemi močmi, ki so mu bile na razpolago, se je zahvaliti, da se more Rusija danes taka uspešno upirati Nemčiji. Rusko ljudstvo je imelo že cele generacije velik pohlep in željo, da bi se naučilo pisati in živati, in ko sta mu Ljenin in Stalin dala to priložnost, se je to ljudstvo izpremenilo v dvajsetih letih iz ljudstva, ki je bilo 90 odstotkov ne-pismeno, v ljudstvo, ki je danes 90 odstotkov pismeno in ki zna pisati in brati.

Rusija silno občuduje in spoštuje ameriški sistem tehnične izobrazbe in javnih knjižnic. Ako bo mogla nadaljevati v prihodnjih dvajsetih letih z napredkom, kakršnega je pokazala v preteklih dvajsetih letih, bo prekosila Zedinjene države. Ako bo stopila Rusija v bodočnosti z vsem srcem v družino narodov, tedaj nam je pričakovati, da bodo prispevali ruski znanstveniki takšne kontribucije dobrobitu človeštva, ki se bodo mogle meriti s kontribucijami katerega koli naroda sveta. Na vsak način pa si bo ruski znanstvenik prizadeval, da bodo rezultati znanosti služili v prvi vrsti preprostemu človeku. S patentni, ki temelje na delu ruskih znanstvenikov, se ne bodo mogli okoriščati razni internacionalni karteli.

Peta demokracija se tiče postopanja s spoli. Treba je bilo še vojnih izkušenj Rusije, da smo mi spoznali svoje tozaddevne izjavljivte. Oni, ki so v zadnjem času obiskali Rusijo, pravijo, da izdelajo v Rusiji ženske približno 40 odstotkov vsega dela v tovarnah. Povprečna ženska izdelu približno toliko dela kakor povprečen moški, zato je tudi njeno plačilo enako plačilu moškega. Tisoč ruskih žensk je v uniformi ter so zaposlene v aktivnih bojih, ali pa na stražah.

Stara demokracija ni mogla služiti kot jamstvo miru. Nova demokracija, v kateri je ljudstvo Rusije in Zedinjenih držav tako globoko zainteresirano, pa bo moral dati tako jamstvo. Ta nova demokracija pa ne bo niti komunizem starega internacionalnega tipa, niti demokracija stare izolacijske vrste. Letala, ki so ustvarila potrebo po organizirjanju svetovnega miru, so hkrat tudi sredstvo vzdrževanja miru. Ko bo ta vojna končana, bodo imale Zedinjene države toliko superiornost zračne sile, da bodo lahko povsod vsilile kakršen koli na pravici temelječ mandat, čim ga bodo zedinjeni narodi odobrili.

Ob tej priliki bi tudi rad omenil pogovor, ki sem ga imel z Molotovom, ko se je slednji nahajjal spomladji v Zedinjenih državah. Premišljajoč o brezposelnosti in revščini, ki utegneta slediti tej vojni, sem govoril Molotovu o potrebi produktivnih javnih delavskih programov, ki bi razburkali imaginacijo vseh narodov sveta, ter sem svetoval za začetek izgradnjo kombinirane ceste in zračne zveze iz Južne Amerike, preko Zedinjenih držav, Kanade in Alaske v Sibirijo in od tam v Evropo, kakor tudi takšnih zvez iz Kitajske, Indije in Srednjega vzhoda. In Molotova prva reakcija je bila izrečena v sledečih besedah: "Noben narod ne more tegu sam storiti." Nato je pripomnil: "Toda vi in jaz bova doživelata dan."

Nova demokracija bo zavračala imperializem. Toda po svoji definiciji, bo internacionalno usmerjena ter zainteresirana predvsem za podvig produktivnosti in potom nje živiljenjskega standarda vseh narodov sveta. Najprej bo prišla na vrsto transportacija, kateri bo sledila izholjšana agrikultura, industrializacija in elektrifikacija poddelja.

Ni dvoma, da bo izvajala Kitajska velik vpliv na svet, ki bo izšel iz te vojne in Sun Jat Senovi principi.

bodo prav tako učinkoviti kakor principi katerega koli modernega državnika. Toda, če želimo, da bodo združeni narodi učinkovito služili svetu, je vitalno važno, da bo med Zedinjenim državami in Sovjetsko Rusijo sporazum gledě temeljnih pogojev trajnega miru, ki bo baziral na aspiracijah preprostega človeka. Jaz sem danes tu med vami zato, da vam izpovem svojo trdno vero, da bosta ameriški in ruski narod vrgla svoj vpliv na stran izgradnje nove demokracije, ki bo up in nada vsega sveta.
