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
JAVNI SOCIALNOVARSTVENI ZAVODI, SLOVENIJA, 2007

PUBLIC SOCIAL WELFARE INSTITUTIONS, SLOVENIA, 2007

- ▶ V letu 2007 je v Sloveniji delovalo 69 domov za starejše, 14 posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodov in 71 varstveno-delovnih centrov. V vseh navedenih ustanovah skupaj je bivalo 19 008 oskrbovancev oziroma varovancev, od tega malo manj kot 70,0 % žensk (67,3 %); delež žensk se iz leta v leto postopoma povečuje.
- ▶ V letu 2007 je začel na novo delovati en varstveno-delovni center, sicer se število javnih socialnovarstvenih zavodov ni spremenilo.
- ▶ In 2007 there were 69 old people's homes, 14 special social welfare institutions and 71 centres for protection and training in Slovenia. There were 19,008 people in care or protégés in these institutions, almost 70.0% of them women (67.3%), their share gradually increasing each year.
- ▶ Compared to the previous year, the number of public social welfare institutions stayed almost the same; there is only one centre for protection and training more.

Domovi za starejše


Število domov za starejše se v letu 2007 v primerjavi s prejšnjim letom ni povečalo, povečalo pa se je število oskrbovancev v teh domovih.

Old people's home

In 2007 the number of old people's homes didn't change compared to the previous year, but the number of people in care in those institutions did.

Chart 2: People in care in old people's homes, by sex, Slovenia, 1995 - 2007




V letu 2007 je v 69 domovih za starejše (med temi 13 s koncesijo) bivalo 13 856 oskrbovancev, to je za 1,1 % več kot leto poprej. Med vsemi oskrbovanci je bilo 74,8 % žensk; delež oskrbovank se postopoma povečuje.

In 2007, there were 13,856 people in care in 69 old people's homes (13 of them licensed ones), which is 1.1% more than in the previous year. Women represented 74.8% of people in care and their number is gradually increasing each year.

Chart 3: People in care in old people's homes by age groups, Slovenia, 2007




V domovih za starejše so prevladovale osebe, stare 80 let ali starejše od teh. V letu 2007 je delež teh oseb znašal 59,2 % in se je v primerjavi z letom prej še povečal (za 2,9 %).

Most of the people in old people's homes were over 80 years old. In 2007 their share was 59.2% and further increased compared to the previous year (by 2.9%).

Chart 4: People in care in old people's homes, by reasons for their admission in old people's home, Slovenia, 2007




Napogosteji razlog za sprejem v dom je bila starost (za 67.5 % oseb, med katerimi je bilo kar 83,7 % bolnih), sledila so hujša duševna in telesna obolenja (za 22,4 % oseb), nato neurejene stanovanjske in družinske razmere (za 5,8 % oseb) in drugo (za 4,3 % oseb).

In most cases the reason for admission was old age (for 67.5% people among whom 83.7% were also sick), followed by serious mental and physical illnesses (for 22.4% people), unsettled housing and family conditions (for 5.8% people) and other (for 4.3% people).

V letu 2007 je bilo med vsemi oskrbovanci domov za starejše največ oskrbovancev z zahtevnejšimi starostnimi in zdravstvenimi težavami, ki v celoti potrebujejo neposredno osebno pomoč (III. kategorija; 41,3 %). Sledili so oskrbovanci, ki zaradi starosti ali drugih razlogov, ki spremljajo starost, niso bili v celoti sposobni za samostojno življenje in so potrebovali delno neposredno osebno pomoč (I. kategorija; 28,9 %), nato oskrbovanci z zmernimi starostnimi in zdravstvenimi težavami, ki so potrebovali delno neposredno osebno pomoč (II. kategorija; 20,4 %) in oskrbovanci z dolgotrajnimi težavami v duševnem zdravju, ki so zaradi starostne demence ali sorodnih stanj potrebovali delno ali popolno osebno pomoč in nadzor (IV. kategorija; 9,4 %).

Oskrbnino v domovih za starejše so v največji meri plačevali oskrbovanci sami v kombinaciji s svojci, in sicer je tako plačevalo oskrbnino 68,2 % oskrbovancev.

V letu 2007 je bilo za sprejem v domove oddanih 25.823 prošenj. Pozitivno so jih rešili 15,8 %.

Zaposleni v domovih za starejše so financirani iz dveh virov: zdravstveni in negovalni program plačuje zdravstvo, socialno in osnovno oskrbo pa socialno varstvo.

V letu 2007 je bilo v vseh domovih za starejše skupaj zaposlenih 6 448 oseb (med njimi 90,7 % žensk), in sicer za storitve zdravstvenega varstva 53,8 %, za storitve socialnega varstva pa 46,2 %.

Povprečno razmerje med številom oskrbovancev in številom zaposlenih je bilo 2,1 oskrbovanca na zaposlenega. V enem domu je bilo v oskrbi povprečno 200 oskrbovancev.

Posebni socialnovarstveni zavodi

V letu 2007 je bilo v Sloveniji 14 posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodov, od tega 8 enot za posebne oblike varstva odraslih, ki delujejo kot posebne enote znatnoj domov za starejše ali kot njihove dislocirane enote.

In 2007 most people in care in old people's homes had severe age and health problems who entirely require direct personal help (3rd category; 41.3%). They were followed by people in care who, because of age or other reasons which accompany it, weren't entirely capable of independent life and needed direct personal help (1st category; 28.9%), than people in care with moderate age and health problems who required partial direct personal help (2nd category; 20.4%) and people in care with long-term problems in mental health who, because of dementia or similar conditions, needed partial or full personal help and supervision (4th category; 9.4%).

Regarding the mode of payment in old people's homes, people in care in combination with relatives in most cases (68.2%) took care of paying for it.

There were 25,823 applications for admission in 2007, but only 15.8% of them were solved positively.

Persons in paid employment in old people's homes are financed from two sources. Health and care programmes are financed by the health care, while social and basic care is financed by the social welfare.

In 2007 there were 6,448 persons in paid employment in old people's homes (of those 90.7% women), namely 53.8% for health care services and 46.2% for social welfare services.


On average there were 2.1 people in care per one person in paid employment in old people's homes. On average an old people's home took care of 200 persons.

Special social welfare institutions

In 2007 there were 14 special social welfare institutions, among which 8 units providing special care for adults operating as special units within old people's homes or as their units.

Oskrbovance posebnih enot v okviru domov za starejše smo v prikazih podatkov do vključno leta 2003 upoštevali pri domovih za starejše. Zaradi te spremembe v popisu se je spremenila številčna razporeditev oskrbovancev in poročevalskih enot, in sicer se je pri posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodih število oskrbovancev in število poročevalskih enot povečalo, pri domovih za starejše pa se je število oskrbovancev zmanjšalo.


V letu 2007 je v posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodih bivalo 2 531 oskrbovancev, to je za 2,3 % manj kot leto poprej. Tudi sicer se je število oskrbovancev v omenjenih zavodih zniževalo. Med oskrbovanci je bilo žensk približno za polovico (leta 2007 jih je bilo 49,6 %).

Until 2003 people in care in special units of old people's homes were counted together with people in old people's homes. The above-mentioned change brought about the change in the distribution of people in care and reporting units: in special social welfare institutions the number of people in care and reporting units increased while in old people's homes the number of people in care decreased.

In 2007 special social welfare institutions were taking care of 2,531 people, which is 2.3% less than in the previous year. Noticeable was also a downward trend in the number of people in these institutions. Women represented approximately half of all people in care (in 2007 their share was 49.6%).

Chart 7: People in care in special welfare institutions by age group, Slovenia, 2007




V opazovanem letu so bile med oskrbovanci v posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodih najštevilnejše osebe v starostnem razredu 50–59 let (24,2 %), sledile so osebe, stare 80 let in starejše od teh (16,0 %), in osebe v starostnem razredu 40–49 let (15,5 %).

In the observed year in special social welfare institutions people in care in the age group 50–59 predominated (24.2%), followed by people aged 80 or more (16.0%) and those in the age group 40–49 (15.5%).

Vsi oskrbovanci v posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodih so bili bolni. Med temi so bile v letu 2007 najštevilnejše osebe z motnjami v duševnem razvoju (55,1 %), sledile so osebe z več motnjami (38,4 %) in osebe z gibalno ali senzorno oviranostjo (5,4 %).

Oskrbnino v posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodih so v letu 2007 v največji meri plačevali oskrbovanci skupaj z občino, in sicer je tako plačevalo oskrbnino 60,0 % teh oskrbovancev.

V opazovanem letu je bilo za sprejem v omenjene zavode oddanih 1 417 prošenj. Pozitivno so jih rešili dobro tretjino (34,4 %).

V letu 2007 je za oskrbovance posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodov skrbelo skupaj 1 462 zaposlenih (med njimi 81,6 % žensk), in sicer za storitve zdravstvenega varstva 51,2 %, za storitve socialnega varstva pa 48,8 %.

Varstveno-delovni centri

V letu 2007 je delovalo 71 varstveno-delovnih centrov, in sicer 29 teh centrov je bilo samostojnih, 21 enot je delovalo v sestavi drugih zavodov, 21 teh centrov pa je delovalo s koncesijo.

All people in special social welfare institutions were sick. In 2007 most of them had mental problems (55.1%), followed by those with several problems (38.4%) and by those with physical and sensory problems (5.4%).

Regarding the mode of payment in special social welfare institutions, people in care together with municipality in most cases (60.0%) took care of paying for it.

In the observed year there were 1,417 applications for admission in the mentioned institutions and over a third of them were solved positively (34.4%).


In 2007 there were 1,462 persons in paid employment in special social welfare institutions (of those 81.6% women), namely 51.2% for health care services and 48.8% for social welfare services.

Centres for protection and training

In 2007 there were 71 centres for protection and training: 29 of them were independent centres for protection and training, 21 were units of these centres at other institutions and 21 were licensed centres for protection and training.

Slika 9: Varovanci v varstveno-delovnih centrih po spolu, Slovenija, 1995–2007


Chart 9: Protégés in centres for protection and training by sex, Slovenia, 1995 - 2007



V opazovanem letu je v centrih bivalo 2 621 varovancev, to je za 1,3 % več kot leta prej. Med vsemi varovanci je bilo dobrih 40,0 % (44,9 %) žensk. Delež žensk je v varstveno-delovnih centrih nekoliko manjši kot v prej obravnavanih ustanovah (domovih za starejše in posebnih socialnovarstvenih zavodih).

In the observed year there were 2,621 protégés in those centres, which is 1.3% more than in the previous year. Among all protégés women represented over 40.0% (44.9%). The share of women in centres is a bit smaller than in institutions mentioned above, i.e. old people's homes and special social welfare institutions.


Slika 10: Varovanci v varstveno-delovnih centrih po starosti, Slovenija, 1995–2007

V letu 2007 je bila večina varovancev stara do 45 let (83,6 %), najštevilnejša med temi pa je bila starostna skupina 26–35 let (40,4 %).

In 2007 most protégés were under 45 years old (83.6%), the age group 26–35 predominated (40.4%).

V varstveno-delovnih centrih so v letu 2007 prevladovali varovanci z zmerno motnjo v duševnem razvoju (60,7 %), sledili so varovanci z več motnjami (27,4 %).

Večina varovancev teh centrov je stanovala doma s starši (63,4 %) in bila le v dnevnom varstvu (70,3 %).

V obravnavanih centrih je bilo v letu 2007 zaposlenih 937 delavcev, največ v programu, ki ga plačuje socialno varstvo (80,8 %).

In 2007 protégés with moderate mental problems predominated in centres for protection and training (60.7%), followed by those with several problems (27.4%).

Most of the protégés lived at home with their parents (63.4%) and were only in day care (70.3%).

In 2007 there were 937 persons in paid employment in centres for protection and training; most of them in the programme paid for by the social welfare (80.8%).

From 2004 on we added people in care in eight units of old people's homes providing special forms of care for mentally and physically handicapped adults to six special social welfare institutions. Until 2003 people in care in special units of old people's homes were counted together with people in old people's homes or combined social welfare institutions. This change in classification brought about increase in the number of people in care and reporting units in special social welfare institutions and decrease in the number of people in care in old people's homes.

Special social welfare institutions provide special forms of institutional care for mentally and physically handicapped adults.

Centres for protection and training provide special training and care for as well as employment of mentally and physically handicapped adults.
