





**Spomin na sodelavce za Baragovo zadevo**

**Ob smrti Fr. Gabriela Rusa.**

LEMONT, Ill. — V Lemontu imamo Baragov park, sredi katerega stoji Baragov spomenik. Blagoslovil ga je pokojni marquetteški škof Thomas Noa dne 3. septembra 1950. Od tedaj obhajamo v Lemontu prvo nedeljo v septembru Baragovo nedeljo. Ker bo letos v nedeljo, 2. septembra, Baragov dan v Clevelandu, smo prestavili Baragovo nedeljo na 26. avgusta.

Letošnji Baragov dan v Clevelandu je zame povezan s spomini na pok. Fathra Gabriela Rusa SM, ki je umrl 25. marca letos v Daytonu, O. Pred dobrim letom sem začel prejemati od njega številna pisma, iz katerih sem spoznal njegovo globoko vernost in preprostost ter gorečnost v delu za Baragovo zadevo. Po težki operaciji je z zdravniškim dovoljenjem obiskal Baragovo in svojo rojstno domovino Slovenijo. Father Rus je bil doma z Bleda. Naprosil sem ga za nekatere fotografske posnetke iz krajev Baragovega delovanja v domovini in za fotografijo prenovljenega oltarja Marije Pomagaj na Brezjah. Mojo prošnjo je velikodušno ušlišal. Zadnje jesen je še enkrat potoval v Baragovo deželo. Delo je opisal to svoje potovanje za katoliški časopis, a članek ni bil objavljen. Poslal mi ga je brez pripombe; obljubil sem mu, da ga bom prestavil v slovenščino in ob priliki objavil. Z zanimanjem je sledil pripravam za Baragov dan 1979 in želel pri tem tudi sodelovati. V ta namen je naredil obširen načrt, ki bi ga lahko izvedli samo s spospeševalci Baragove zadeve, ki bi se

vživel v Baragovo duhovnost. Prepričan je bil, da bi lahko učinkovito predstavili Barago za zgled sodobni mladini, kar bi pospeševalo duhovniške in redovniške poklice. Njegov načrt je bil nepraktičen, ker bi zahteval intenzivno delo iz meseca v mesec letošnjega leta. Ako bi bil izveden, bi Baragov dan 1979 prinesel obilne duhovne sadove. Izrazil je bojazen, da bo pri Baragovem dnevu poudarek na zunanost v škodo duhovnega ali verskega dela. Ni mu bilo dočakati veselega sporočila, da bo tudi sobota (1. sept. 1979) posvečena molitvi in pobožnosti. Misli iz njegovega načrta za Baragov dan 1979 so praktične in nam bodo lahko v spodbudo ob raznih prilikah.

Ne morem pozabiti na pokojnega msgr. Johna Zaplotnika, ki je svoje zmožnosti posvetil raziskovanju zgodovine Baragovega življenja in dela ter drugih slovenskih misijonarjev-pionirjev katoliške Cerkve v ZDA. Mislim, da je bilo leta 1954, ko sem kot kaplan pri Sv. Stefanu (Chicago) prišel v začetku septembra v Lemont. Tam sem srečal msgr. Zaplotnika in Mrs. Josepha Gregoricha, ki sta se pripravljala na potovanje v Baragovo deželo. Povabila sta me, naj se jima pridružim. Z veseljem sem sprejel njuno vabilo in naslednje jutro smo se že vozili po cesti 41 proti Marquette. Na potovanju smo se ustavili v vseh krajih, ki spominjajo na Baragovo misijonsko delovanje. od Munising preko Marquette, Negaune, po Keweenaw polotoku vse do Copper Harbor; obiskali smo grob msgr. Režka v Houghtonu in grob misijonarja Andolška v Eagle Harbor, bili smo tudi v Bayfieldu in La Pointu. Najdalje smo se zadržali v Negaune, kjer je bil pri fari sv. Pavla župnik pokojni

msgr. Joseph L. Zryd. Spomnim se, da nas je s svojim avtomobilom peljal v svojo poletno kočjo ob Lake Superior. Tedaj sem zvedel, da je bil msgr. Zryd v avtomobilski nesreči, ko se je nekega hladnega dne vračal iz kočje. Cesta je bila prazna, ponesrečen je ležal pod avtomobilom. Tedaj se je zaobljubil, da bo delal za Baragovo beatifikacijo, ako ga kdo reši izpod avtomobila. Prošnjo je bila uslišana in msgr. Zryd je postal znan med Slovenci kot pospeševalec Baragove zadeve.

Pozneje sem še srečeval msgr. Zaplotnika. Z njim sem se tudi dopisoval kot urednik AM in AMK. V našem koledarju je objavljaval svoje zgodovinske spise o slovenskih misijonarjih.

Pokojni Father Gabriel Rus SM mi je dajal spodbudo v delu za Baragovo zadevo. Prav v tem delu je bil sam zelo aktiven v mesecih in tednih pred svojo smrtjo. Zato čutim za dolžnost, da ne poročamo samo, da je umrl; z njegovim zgledom moramo nuditi tudi spodbudo za druge, zakaj Baragova zveza potrebuje zvestih sodelavcev. Pokojnega Fathra Gabriela se bomo spominjali v molitvi in skušali nadaljevati delo, ki je bilo njemu tako pri srcu.

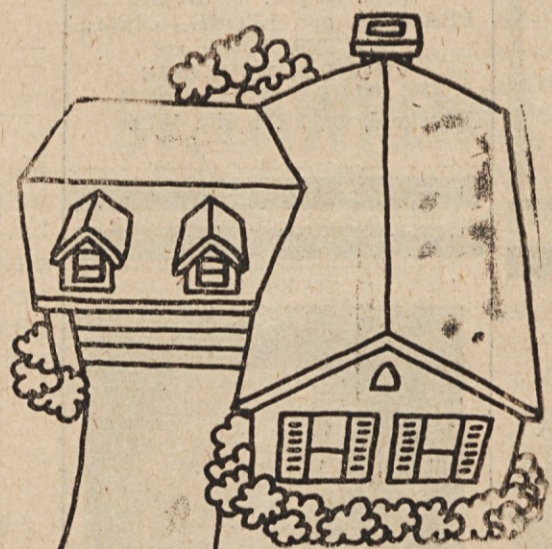

**Florida, the Land of Sunshine**

Fort Lauderdale, Fla. — We are down again to spend the winter in southern Florida, the land of sunshine and warmth. At our retired age it is much more pleasant than it is up North where we had to spend all our growing and working days.

Down there it is quite different than up North where we will return when the time comes to plant and work in the garden.

Florida is a big state and very different from the others. It is a peninsula with a panhandle in the northwestern part that has the shape of a handgun. From the Northwest corner to the East and then South, the road measures full 750 miles, while from North to South the distance is 400 miles, the same as it is from East to West. The country is flat and the soil sandy.

At Christmas time the days at Fort Lauderdale are one hour and fifteen minutes longer than in Chicago or Cleveland.

The short winters are cool at night, but it warms up during the day as the sun rises and temperatures are reasonably steady.

From New Smyrna to Palm Beach there is an occasional frost, but further South it happens very rarely. In 1936 the first snow flurries were recorded in Ft. Lauderdale.

After you drive a couple of hours from Georgia into Florida, the orange and grapefruit groves are all around and there seems to be no end to them.

Here and there are lazy, rolling, hills or knolls with some ponds in between. The fruitrees are all planted in rows, and as they need a lot of water, those on higher levels have sprinklers over;

 them for better marketable fruit. Oranges and grapefruit need some 300 sunny days, so it takes from 10 to 12 months to ripen, with the result that in late winter you see both fruit and sweet smelling blossoms on the trees at the same time. Since there are many varieties, some ripen in November and others late in June; some of the trees are over forty years old. Such fruits as cherries, grapes, apples and other northern types do not grow here, but other tropical fruits do, such as bananas, but these are not good enough to be marketed.

Grass and trees are always green and bushes are covered with blossoms. The leaves are thick, often large and in time, change color, dry a bit and fall off, and that happens at any time of the year.

Here there is a big variety of palms from potted plants to big trees. Palm leaves grow from the center outward until they dry up and fall off. When the trunk is cut, it shows no rings and so you cannot tell the age of the tree.

In the interior there are a lot of ranches where cattle grazes in the open the year around, but you will see no hayfields or barns.

Of course there are also big vegetable fields for there are many crops per year; just now it is tomatoes, beans and cabbage time.

The houses and homes are usually built on one level, a

foot or two above the ground; and you will find no basements as not far underground water is found, so most houses and all buildings are erected on concrete piles. The homes are mostly built with cement, some brick and metal, but no wood or very little of it. Electricity is used for cooking, heating and air-conditioning but some still prefer the bottled liquid gas.

In the cities you will find many high-rise buildings, some reaching up to 25 stories; the apartments are mostly of the condominium type, that is each apartment is individually owned. There are also a lot of other apartments, efficiencies consisting of room and small kitchen, motels that can be rented for a day, week, month or season. If anybody is interested in buying property, be cautious and get advice from one who specializes in the type of building or home you are purchasing.

Beside the building and construction trades and the all-embracing tourist business, there is no large industry here, but one finds a big choice of restaurants from McDonald's to Le Cordon Bleu, retail stores, supermarkets and shopping centers. The prices are fairly reasonable but winter clothing outlets are not to be found.

Florida is well known for lots of sunshine, and in the summer it is hot, especially in the interior. The state is appealing and attractive but not for everyone. The majority of the people here come from the northern states.

A lot of Golden Agers are here for the winter, and then in the summer go up north to be with their family and long time friends. Then comes a time to settle in one place and the majority decides to stay here.

Slovenians are scattered throughout the state; most of them are on the Atlantic coast as in New Smyrna-Samsula where they have a long-time established Slovenian Hall.

In Fort Lauderdale a social is held in a very nice place, on the first Sunday of the month. All Slovenians are welcome. For information, please call Tony Kebe or his wife Mrs. Christine Kebe at 564-8756. It must also be mentioned that a good number of folks live on the West coast of the state, near the Gulf of Mexico.
