The executive committee of our Union reports that payments of sick benefits were discontinued for the period from Sept. 4, 1935, to Dec. 4, 1935, because she was not totally disabled during said period.

The decision of this judiciary committee is that it was not proved the above appellant was totally disabled in her sickness during the period from Sept. 4, 1935, to Dec. 4, 1935, and is therefore not entitled to sick benefits for said period.
