

Fašistična Italija bojkotira angleški mirovni načrt

Mussolini noče odpoklicati "prostovoljcev" iz Španije. Nov spor ograža obstoj mednarodnega nevmesevalnega odbora. Italijanski tisk žigosa aktivnosti angleškega vojaštva v Palestini. Koncentracija nemškega in italijanskega vojaštva na aragonski fronti

London, 19. okt. — Znamenja kažejo, da vprašanje odpoklica "prostovoljcev" iz Španije ne bo rešeno na konferenci pododseja mednarodnega nevmesevalnega odbora. Kaj se godi za kublami, ni jasno. Znano je le, da je Mussolini izjavil, da bo odpoklical gotovo število "prostovoljcev" iz Španije pod pogojem, da tudi druge države potegnejo enako število tujcev, ki se borijo na strani ljudske milice v Španiji. Anglija in Francija pravita, da to ne bi bilo pravično iz razloga, ker je število tujcev v španski armadi nematno v primeri z italijanskimi in nacističnimi četami, ki podpirajo Francove fašiste. Ako ne bo prišlo do sporazuma med diplomati glede odpoklica "prostovoljcev" iz Španije, bo najbližji mednarodni nevmesevalni odbor razpuščen.

Angleški zunanji minister Eden, ki bo vodil sejo nevmesevalnega odbora, je imel večeraj razgovor s francoskim poslanikom Corbinom v Londonu, potegne se je posvetoval s premierjem Chamberlainom, potem pa se je vrnila seja članov angleškega kabineta. Nenadni odhod nemškega vojaštva v Berlin je iznenadil angleške uradne kroge. V Berlinu se je poslanik posvetoval s člani zunanjskega urada, potem pa je obiskal Hitlerja v Berchtesgadenu.

Lloyd George, bivši angleški premier, je v svojem govoru nedavno soboto dejal, da je nevmesevalni odbor sleparija, zato pa je izjavil, da je Mussolini postal 110,000 vojakov na pomoč generalu Francu. Ta izjava je razkazala fašistični tisk, ki je takoj zakrčal, da se George laže, kajti v Španiji je le 40,000 italijanskih vojakov. Važno je to, da so te številke uradne.

Il Popolo d'Italia, Mussolinijev list, piše, da angleške čete v Palestini terorizirajo prebivalce. Uničile so več poslopij v Lyddi, da se masčujejo nad Arabi, ki so razdejali angleško letališče z dinamitom. "Teroristični čini angleških čet v Palestini so izzvali ogorčenje v civiliziranem svetu," piše Mussolinijev list. Angleška vlada je odgovorila na te obdolžitve, "da ima Mussolinijev list najmanj stroka pisati o civilizaciji."

Madrid, 19. okt. — Poročila španske vlade naznanjajo koncentracijo italijanskih in maročanskih čet ter nacističnega vojaštva na aragonski fronti. Ta poročila so dokaz, da se general Franco pripravila na veliko ofenzivo na tej fronti.

Druge vest se glasi, da so lojalisti obkolili Saragozo in obnovili naskoke na fašistične položaje. V bitki pri Villamayoru so miličniki porazili fašiste. Asturijske čete se uspešno upirajo upornikom, ki prodirajo proti Gijonu, pristaniškemu mestu v severni Španiji, ki je še pod kontrolo ljudske vlade.

Angleži imajo velike homatije v Palestini

Jeruzalem, 19. okt. — Večja skupina sirskih nacionalistov je zadnje dni udrla čez mejo iz Sirije v Palestino, toda nalezela je slab. Angleške čete so potolkle večje število Sircev, ostale pa zapuščile nazaj čez mejo.

Nacijski tisk napada češko policijo

"Nemčija ne bo trpela provokacij"

Berlin, 19. okt. — Komaj se je vihar nacijskih protestov, ki ga je izzvala razstava slik v Pragi, nekoliko polegel, je nacijsko časopisje spet zakrčilo, da češka policija terorizira člane nacistične organizacije. Objavilo je poročila o brutalnem policijskem nastopu proti članom te organizacije v Teplicz-Schoneauju, ki so se zbrali na javnem shodu, da slišijo govor svojega voditelja Konrada Henleina.

"To je izzivanje vsęga nemškega ljudstva," piše berlinski list Lokal Anzeiger. Ta pravi, "da sedanja Nemčija je povsem drugačija kakor je bila pred štirimi leti." Oglasil se je tudi list Der Angriff, uradno glasilo Goebbelsa, ministra nacijske propagande. "Praga mora biti uverjena, da nemški narod 70,000,000 ljudi ne bo trpel zatiranja vitalnih nemških pravic po državi, ki ima 6,500,000 prebivalcev," piše Der Angriff.

Dunaj, 19. okt. — Poročila iz Češkoslovaške zanikajo obdolžitve nacijskega tiska o teroriziranju članov nacijske organizacije. Konrad Henlein je razkaččen, ker je policija aretirala Ernesta Rutherja, njegovega pomočnika, na obtožbo homoseksualstva, zato je sklical več protestnih shodov. Na shodu v Teplicz-Schoneauju je zahteval avtonomijo za nemški distrikt v Češkoslovaški, zato je policija razkazala Henleinu. Vest zanika nacijske trditve o brutalnosti češke policije. Samo dva nacija sta bila lahko ranjena, ko je policija razpršila demonstrante.

Mogočna družba kapitulirala pred unijo

Podpisala je pogodbo, ki določa zaprtje delavnice

New York. — (FP) — Ponosna in mogočna Brooklyn-Manhattan Transit Co. je po dolgem obotavljanju pristala na vse zahteve unije transportnih delavcev. Slednja je izvojevala zaprtje delavnice, zvišanje mezd in izboljšanje delovnih pogojev. Pri tej družbi je uposlenih 9000 delavcev.

Unija je zapretila s stavko 22. septembra, a je oklic odložila na apel župana La Guardia, ki je potem imenoval poseben odbor, da poravnava konflikt. Pravkar podpisana pogodba, ki bo v veljavni od 31. oktobra do 31. decembra prihodnjega leta, bo povečala dohodke delavcev \$2-400,000. Minimalna plača je \$25 na teden in vsak delavec, ki je uposlen več kot pet let, dobi dva tedna počitnic s plačo na leto, drugi pa en teden.

Transportna unija je članjena v CIO. Slično pogodbo je družba podpisala z bratovščino železniških strojevodij in unijo Independent Traction Workers. Ta krije nadaljnjih 1500 delavcev.

Dva ameriška poslanca na Španskem

Bernard in O'Connell navdušila lojaliste

Albacete, Španija, 19. okt. — Dva ameriška kongresnika sta večeraj objavila 5000 vojakom glasovite mednarodne brigade v španski ljudski armadi, da bo sta storila vse, kar je v njeni moči, da pridobita podporo vlade Združenih držav vladi ljudske fronte v Španiji.

Kongresnika sta Jerry J. O'Connell, demokrat iz Montane, in John T. Bernard, farmer-laborit iz Minnesote, ki se nahajata na obisku demokratične španske republike. Okrog 5000 mož mednarodne brigade, v kateri so tudi ameriški prostovoljci, je počastilo ameriški kongresnik s parado in prepevanjem ameriške himne "Star Spangled Banner". Več kot 15,000 gledalcev je opazovalo prostovoljce, ko so korakali mimo odra, na katerem sta s španskimi poveljniki vred stala odlična ameriška gosta.

New York, 19. okt. — Dr. Theodore Sverberg, švedski profesor medicine in prejemnik Noblove nagrade, je ob svojem obisku Amerike seznanil ameriške zdravnike o novi metodi za diagnosticiranje (ugotavljanje) bolezni. Nova metoda je aparat, ki pokaže gibanje molekulov v krvi in iz tega gibanja je lahko razbrati začetek te ali one bolezni v telesu davno prej, predno se boleznen toliko razvije, da pokaže znane simptome.

Bojkot nemškega premoega v Kanadi

Montreal, Kanada. — Tukajšnji svet delavskih in strokovnih unij je pozval kanadsko vlado, naj ustavi uvoz nemškega premoega v Kanado. Ta svet, ki je največja centralna delavska organizacija v Kanadi, je apeliral na organizirane delavce, naj dokupijo premoega in produktivne nacistične Nemčije v znak protesta proti Hitlerjevi vladi, ki je zatira svobodne delavske organizacije in preganja žide.

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Z namenom, da postavi trdno podlago in pospeši politične aktivnosti med organiziranimi delavci, je Delavska neustrankarska liga pričela ustanavljati podružnice v industrijskih mestih. Liga upa, da bo v nekaj mesecih imela permanentne organizacije v vseh krajih.

Zdaj je izdala letak z naslovom "Kako je treba ustanavljati krajevne anote Delavske neustrankarske lige." Liga pravi, da je izdala ta letak, da ustreže unijam, ki so zainteresirane v delavskem političnem gibanju in so izrazile željo, da hočejo več informacij.

"Splošno zanimanje glede ustanovitve krajevnih postojank se je pojavilo v avgustu, ko je Delavska neustrankarska liga opozorila javnost, da skuša grupa reakcionarnih kongresnikov preprečiti sprejetje zakonskega načrta minimalne mezd in maksimalnega delovnega dneva," je rečeno v naznanilu. "Vse primarne volitve v ameriških mestih v zadnjih tednih, pri katerih so prodrli delavski kandidati, so rezultirale v poplavi vprašanj v zvezi s formiranjem podružnic."

Volitve ojačile francoske socialiste

Dobili so največ mandatov

Pariz, 19. okt. — Kantonalne volitve v Franciji, ki so se vršile zadnje in predzadnje nedelje, so prinesle največ uspeha socialistom. Nekoliko so napredovali tudi socialni radikali, ki so še vedno najmočnejša politična stranka na Francoskem, zelo pa so nazadovale komunisti. Te volitve kažejo, da imajo komunisti, razen v predmestjih Pariza in v nekaterih drugih večjih industrijskih središčih, zelo malo zaslombe na deželi. Prav tako nimajo po deželi zaslombe francoski fašisti. Vseh fašističnih glasov pri teh volitvah ni bilo niti 10 odstotkov.

Francosko ljudstvo je pri teh volitvah v veliki večini spet pokazalo, da odklanja fašistično diktaturo na skrajni desnici, kakor tudi komunistično diktaturo na skrajni levici.

Newdealski kandidat poražen v Arkansasu

Little Rock, Ark., 19. okt. — Pri večerajših izrednih volitvah za senatorski mandat umrlega Jos. T. Robinsona je bil izvoljen John E. Miller, sedanji kongresnik in neodvisen demokrat. Governor Bailey, novo-dealski kandidat, je ostal v manjšini za več kot 20,000 glasov.

Najstarejša okamenica otroka odkopana

Washington, D. C., 19. okt. — Tukajšnji Smithsonian zavod je prejel najstarejšo okamenico otroka, kar je do danes znanih. Okamenica je bila odkopana v Utahu in sodi se, da je stara 5000 do 12,000 let.

ODLOČEN ODPOR KITAJSKJE ARMADE NA SEVERU

Prodiranje japonskih čet ustavljeno

BESNE BITKE V SANGHAJU

Sanghaj, 19. okt. — Prodiranje japonskih čet od dveh železnih, ki vešeta severno Kitajsko s jugom, je bilo ustavljeno, se glasi po sem dospela poročila. Japonci so nalezli na močan odpor na ozemlju, ki leži na južni strani Rumene reke.

Na vzvodu Japonci ogražajo Tsinan, glavno mesto province Santung, kjer je kričalice Tientsin-Pukow železnice. Japoniki topničarji in letalci so večeraj obstreljevali kitajske položaje ob reki Tuha, 80 milj južno od Tsina. Japonska armada ob progi Peiping-Hankow železnice je dobila ojačanje, da zlomi odpor kitajskega vojaštva na tej fronti, ki leži 150 milj južno od Peipinga.

Druga vest s fronte v severni Kitajski govori, da je bilo 8000 japonskih vojakov ubitih v bitki pri Tansangu, Kitajci pa so izgubili 1400 mož. Bitka je trajala 33 ur.

Japonska armada na sanghajski fronti ne izkazuje velikih uspehov v napadih na Čapej, kitajsko četr v Sanghaju. Ti napadi se vršijo že več tednov s kopnega, morja in iz zraka. Vest iz kitajskega vira pravi, da so japonski letalci v napadih na kitajsko četr v zadnjih dneh ubili in ranili čez 2000 civilnih prebivalcev. Večera so letalci napadli s bombami kitajske obrambne položaje pri K'angliu ob reki Yangtse, 80 milj severno od Sanghaja.

Peiping, 19. okt. — Zunanji opazovalci potrjujejo kitajska poročila, da so japonske čete v pasti v hribovju v severnem delu province Sansi. Preti jim uničenje, ker so kitajski vojniki zapustili svoje utrdbe v gorovju, proti katerim so se umaknili v teku zadnje japonske ofenzive. Japonska armada je obkoljena od treh strani in opazovalci pravijo, da se ne bo rešila iz pasti.

Predavanje o japonsko-kitajskem konfliktu

Chicago, 19. okt. — Prihodnje predavanje v Tomanovi podružnici čikaške javne knjižnice na ogju 27. ulice in Pulaaski Road, ki se vrši prihodnji petek, 22. oktobra, ob osmih zvečer, bo o konfliktu med Japonsko in Kitajsko. Predaval bo profesor dr. James M. Yard. Vstop k predavanju je brezplačen.

'Ohnstown, Pa. — Pinkerton National Detective Agency je prejela od Bethlehem Steel Corp. vaoto \$16,022 v preteklem letu. Tako je izpovedal Robert A. Pinkerton, direktor te firme, ko je nastopil kot priča pred člani federalnega delavskega razsodišča, ki vodi zaslišanje v zvezi z obtožbo, da je korporacija krčila Wagnerjev zakon. Tožbo proti korporaciji je vložil organizatorični odbor CIO.

Delavska politična fronta v Detroitu

Pogajanja med voditelji CIO in ADF

Detroit, Mich. — (FP) — Tu se širijo govorice, da je prišlo do sporazuma med voditelji unij CIO in ADF glede skupne politične fronte, da sodnik Patrick O'Brien, ki je prodri pri primarnih volitvah kot županski kandidat, zasede županski stol v novembru. Njegov protikandidat je Richard Reading, republikanec, ki je bil — kakor član vrhovnega sodišča Black — član teroristične organizacije Ku Klux Klan.

Razlika med Blackom in Readingom je v tem, da je prvi priznal, da je bil član teroristične organizacije, dočim Reading trdi, da ni. Zaprisežena izjava neke priče, ki jo je podala pred sodiščem, pravi, da je Reading še vedno član te organizacije.

Unije Ameriške delavske federacije so tudi imele svojega županskega kandidata, ki pa je bil poražen pri primarnih volitvah. Sedaj so namignile, da so pripravljene podpirati O'Briena proti Readingu. Vprašanje je, kakšno stališče bo zavzel Frank X. Martel, predsednik Detroitске delavske federacije. On je pred primarnimi volitvami dejal, da ne more podpirati kandidata na listi CIO, ker so do bili zaslombo pri komunistih.

Zdaj kaže, da se bo Martel premislil. Unija Ameriške delavske federacije bodo podpirale kandidata CIO odprto ali drugače, če dobijo zagotovilo, da bodo prve agitirale za njena dva kandidata v mestni svet. Ako bo kupčija sklenjena, tedaj je možnost, da bodo vsi kandidati na listi obeh delavskih skupin zmagali pri volitvah 2. novembra.

Tukajšnji list Free Press objavlja senzacionalna poročila svojega dopisnika v Washingtonu. V teh je rečeno, da je Delavska neustrankarska liga potrošila \$250,000 v volilni kampanji v Detroitu. Delavski krogi se norčujejo iz teh poročil. Pravijo, da so v kampanji potrošili \$30,000 in ta vaota je bila zbrana med detroitskimi delavci.

Električna kontrola porodov prihaja

Znanost odkrila "absolutno zanesljivo" sredstvo

New York, 19. okt. — Dr. Harold Saxton Burr, profesor na univerzi Yale, poroča, da so v laboratorijih te univerze izpopolnili električen aparat, ki decela odpravi vse kontraceptivne naprave za kontroliranje porodov, čim pride v splošno rabo. Aparat ni nič drugega, kakor nekak kažipot, ki pokaže ženski, kdaj je podvržena oploditvi.

Vsaaka dozorela in normalna ženska je namreč neki čas v mesecu jalova ali nerodovitna, drugi čas pa rodovitna, omenjeni električni aparat je pa tako narejen, da natančno pokaže, kdaj je rodovitna. To je vse, kar je potrebno vedeti.

"To je prvo znanstveno sredstvo," poroča dr. Burr, "katero je z vsjo gotovostjo pokazalo razvoj ove (jajčeca) od dneva do dneva, dokler ova ne izgine." Iznajdba je bila izgotovljena pred enim letom, nakar so se vršile preizkušnje najprvo na zajkah in mačkah, nato pa na ženskah in vse preizkušnje so se obnesle stoodstotno. Aparat je majhen reč, ki obstoji iz štirih baterij, dveh radioevk, 11 resistorjev, galvanometra in štirih kretnic. Kadar se prične na telo, registrira električni tok, ki ga proizvajajo žive stanice.

Organizatorična kampanja se bo nadaljevala

BOJKOT JAPONSKEGA BLAGA

Atlantic City, N. J. — (FP) — Konferenca unij CIO je bila zaključena s pozivom na delegate, naj nadaljujejo borbo in potegnejo vse ameriške delavce v organizacijo. Konferenco je zaključil John L. Lewis, načelnik Odbora za industrijske organizacije. Trajala je pet dni in vršila se je v dvorani, kjer je bil ustanovljen CIO pred dvema letoma.

Lewis je pozval delegate, naj informirajo člane, ko se vrnejo domov, da bo CIO izvršil svojo nalogo. CIO se bo še nadalje borila, da potegne neorganizirane delavce v industrijske unije. "Ako se bo Ameriška delavska federacija odzvala našemu povabilu in poslala svoje reprezentante na mirovno konferenco, da se konča konflikt, bo vse dobro," je dejal Lewis. "V nasprotnem slučaju bo morala ADF prevzeti odgovornost za nadaljevanje boja. CIO je v pohodu in tega pohoda ne more nihče ustaviti."

Konferenca je sprejela resolucijo, v kateri je obsodila fašistične države, zlasti pa japonsko invazijo Kitajsko. Druga resolucija, ki poziva ameriški narod, naj bojkotira japonsko blago, je bila soglasno sprejeta. Ta pravi, da se Japonska ismed vseh fašističnih držav poslužuje najbolj brutalnih sredstev, da podjarmi Kitajsko. Njeni letalci napadajo neutrujena kitajska mesta z bombami in pobijajo civilne prebivalce.

Delegatje so podprli načela protinacističnega zakonskega načrta, okrcali ohijjskega gubernerja Daveya in druge javne uradnike, ki zanikajo delavcem civilne svobodiščine. Obsodili so gonjo v časopisu za delavskim organizacijam in se izrekli za oprostitev Mooneyja, Billingsa, Fitzgeralda, Beckerja in drugih delavskih jetnikov.

E. L. Oliver, podpredsednik Delavske neustrankarske lige, ki je nastopil kot govornik na konferenci, je dejal, da si morajo delavske unije priboriti tudi politično moč, če hočejo zavarovati svoje pridobitve. Unije CIO je pozval, naj sodelujejo z njegovo organizacijo pri formiranju močnejše politične mašine.

Konrad Heiden, najboljši poznavalec nacional-socialistične Nemčije in pisec obširne biografije o Hitlerju (knjiga je izšla v Svici, v Zürichu) je imel razgovor s poročevalcem avstrijskega časopisa "Der Morgen". Ta razgovor nam daje jasen odgovor na pompoznost nedavnih manifestacij v Berlinu, ki so tako očarale naše napredne in "radikalne" meščane.

Heidena so vprašali: Kdaj bo po vašem mnenju Nemčija sposobna za vojno?
Odgovor je: Nikdar. Kajti oboroževanje rodi protiboroževanje. Vsako kolo, ki se začne vrtni v nemški municijaki tovarni, zavrti kot po neki nevidni transmisiji koleasa v francoskih, angleških, ameriških in ruskih tovarnah. To je avtomatičen, iz katerega ne reši Berlina noben napor sil in noben iznajdljivski genij. Zato je nemško oboroževanje kot politično sredstvo napaka, ker drugi imajo več tovarn, več koleas, več surovin in več ljudi.

Na vprašanje o udarni sili nacionalizma pravi Heiden, da se tudi bodoča vojna, ako izbruhn, ne bo odločila z enim udarom, niti s pompozno, temveč bo šlo za to, kdo bo dalj časa vzdržal: "Ze v miru je diktatura do zadnjega napela in iscrpala materialne rezerve. Podobno počne z moralnimi rezervami. Trajno držanje ljudstva v duševnem stanju prinaša nevarnost hitrega utrujenja, ko bo šlo za rešev v svetovni vojni smo opazovali nekaj podobnega. Nemški elan pri napadu 1914 je hitro pojenjal; ostal vztrajnosti je še dolgo ostala, vendar se je celotna črta stalno nagibala navzdol vzporedno s pojemanjem materialnih vojnih sredstev. Pri napornikih Nemčije pa — izjemo Rusije — sta tekomo vojne naraščala tako volja do vojne"

Heidena so nadalje vprašali: Ali bi mogla Nemčija s spretno politiko zunanje-političnih zvez izenačiti svoje materialno vojaško slabost?
Odgovor je: Dogodki govore za nasprotno. Današnja nemška vlada je mislila ravno, da bo z oboroževanjem premaknila razmerje sil v Evropi in da se bo mogla s tem nekemu ponuditi kot dragocena zaveznica. Pri tem je prezrla dva faktorja: Rusijo, ki je danes Nemčiji mnogo bolj dorasla kakor je bila pod carjem, in Anglijo. . . Zveze rode protizveze. Taka zveza, ki pa povzroči močnejšo protizvezo, pa sploh ni nič vredna. Bismarck je sklenil zvezo z Italijo, kar je samo posepošilo nemški poraz, ker je s to zvezo varal ljudi z zaveznico, ki se je končno izkazala kot sovražnica. Pri slabi zvezi je treba vedno računati s tem, da zavezniki iz skrbi za svojo lastno varnost pustijo partnerja v resnem trenutku na cedilu. On Rim-Berlin je klasično ponavljanje take nesrečne zveze. Besede so se sicer prilagodile današnji vojaško-tehnični dobi, toda stvar je ostala ista; to je zveza s sorazmerno slabotnim, ki si je mogel preskrbeti neko vlogo samo kot tretji sredi evropskih nasprotij. Zveza, ki mora v naprej računati s tem, da bo zadela na močnej-

Na vprašanje o discipliniranosti in paradah rjavih srnjac pravi Heiden na koncu svoje knjige o današnji Nemčiji, da je človeku prirodno hrepenenje po svobodi in da vstaja močno svobodoljubno gibanje — in demokracija "bo našla višje oblike in močnejše geste, kakor je marširanje v četverstopenih in prebivanje z bikovkami. Kajti demokracija neče zasužnjiti ljudi, temveč jih osvoboditi; ona zahteva človeške pravice; zahteva enotnost Evrope, da da ljudem te zemeljske celine višjo skupno nalogo in mladini bodočnost, ki bo visoko nad sedanostjo.

To gibanje prihaja od znotraj. Mnogo srce se ogreva v njem in prišlo bo do izraza v tej ali oni obliki. Tisti, ki jih je najmočnejše zajelo — so nosilci svobode. Vprašanje glede socialne zaščite

Starostne pokojnine samo za potrebe starce

Vprašanje: Živim v Floridi, ali moj prvi dom je v državi New Yorku. Ali morem dobiti starostno pokojnino (Old Age Pension), ko imam tri otroke, ki prispevajo k mojemu vzdrževanju?

Odgovor: Starostne pokojnine (pri čemur mislimo Old Pensiona, ne pa letne dohodke, ki se bodo kasneje izplačevali na podlagi plačil za socialna varnost) se dovoljujejo le, ako se dokaže resnična potreba in ko se je stvar temeljito preiskala. Postarši ljudje, ki imajo otroke, ki jih lahko vzdržujejo, ne dobivajo starostnih pokojnin. Po zakonih večine držav — New York je med njimi — se sin ali neporočena hči smatra odgovornim za vzdrževanje očeta ali matere, ako je njegov oziroma njen gmetnik položaj tak, da to zmore. Ako vsi otroci skupaj ne morejo toliko prispevati, kolikor bi znašala državna pokojnina, bo država doplačala razliko med njihovimi prispevki in navadno državno pokojnino. Na primer povprečna pokojnina v državi New Yorku je med \$30 in \$40 na mesec. Ako vsi otroci skupaj ne morejo prispevati več kot \$24 za vzdrževanje roditelja, bo država nadoknadila razliko.

Zapuščina starostnega upokojenca

Vprašanje: Rad bi doznal, dali zapuščina človeka, ki je dobival starostno pokojnino, pripada k državi po njegovi smrti.

Odgovor: Mogoče bi bilo pravilno odgovoriti na to vprašanje, ako bi nam bili povedali, v kateri državi dobivate starostno pokojnino. Pokojninski zakoni raznih držav so precej različni, kar se tiče količine lastnine, ki jo prosilec za starostno pokojnino sme imeti. Nekatere države dajejo pokojnino le, ako prosilec izroči državi, karkoli ima lastnine. Druge države dovoljujejo, da sme prosilec za starostno pokojnino imeti in držati lastnino do vrednosti \$3000 in tudi več. Zakoni nekaterih držav določajo, da ima država hipoteko le, ako lastnina, ki jo je upokojenec zapustil, presega neko običajno znaša toliko kolikor je bilo izplačano na pokojninah in dodatno 3% do 5% obresti. V nekaterih drugih državah ima država hipoteko (lien) na vsa lastnina pokojnjega upokojenca razun na homestead. In zopet v drugih državah ima država hipoteko le, ako lastnina, ki jo upokojenec zapusti, presega neko gotovo vrednost — navadno \$2000 do \$3000.

Socialno vrednostne pristojbine in domače delo

Vprašanje: Delam doma in plačam sem (piece work). Ali morajo biti mezd, ki jih dobivam, zapisane v mojem socialno-varnostnem računu (social security account)?

Odgovor: Da. Delavci, ki izvršujejo industrialno delo doma na podlagi "piecework", so zaposleni one tvrdke, za katere delajo ravno tako, kakor delavci, ki delajo v delavnici. Oni in njihovi delodajalci morajo plačevati davke, ki se nalagajo v smislu socialno-varnostnega zakona.

Kazni za neplačevalce socialno-varnostnih davkov

Vprašanje: Ali Social Security Act določa kazni, ako kdo ne plačuje predpisanih pristojbin?

Odgovor: Da. Ako delodajalec ne plačuje pravočasno, se kazni nalaga v obliki obresti od pol procenta na mesec. Kazen postane še večja, ako ni plačila, potem ko je davčna oblast vposlala opomin.

Informacije o socialni varnosti

Vprašanje: Kje more mali obrtnik, ki zaposluje nekoliko delavcev, dobiti zanesljive informacije, ako mu ni vse jasno glede nekaterih določb socialno-varnostnega zakona?

Odgovor: Naj se obrne k najbližjemu davčnemu uradu (Collector of Internal Revenue). Ena njegovih dolžnosti je, da pomaga v reševanju takih problemov.

WPA in privatno delo

Vprašanje: Zaposlen sem na nekem projektu WPA, ali imam ponudbo za privatno delo. Ako to delo kasneje zgubim, bom mogel dobiti nazaj delo na WPA?

Odgovor: WPA je ponovno izrekla, da oseba na WPA, ki dobi privatno delo, je upravičena za uposlitev pri WPA, ako to privatno delo zgubi brez svoje krivde in je zopet potrebna pomoči. Na drugi strani oni, ki delajo na WPA in odklanjajo privatno delo, ako se jim ponudi, ne morejo več ostati v službi WPA.—FLIS.

Nad 4,000,000 nepismenih v Jugoslaviji

To je več kot 25% prebivalstva. Najmanjši odstotek nepismenosti (4%) ima Slovenija

Šolsko leto se je začelo, vendar brez vsakih vidnih sprememb, čeprav bi bile nujno potrebne. Pri nas prosveta še zdaleč ni dosegla tiste višine, ki bi jo morala imeti. Po podatkih splošne državne statistike ima Jugoslavija okoli 4 milijone populnoma nepismenih prebivalcev.

Letos je za osnovno šolo doraslo 242,000 otrok, toda mnogo izmed njih jih sploh ne more hoditi k šolskemu pouku, kajti v nekaterih krajih so šole oddaljene po več kilometrov od vas. Poleg tega je pot slaba, otroci so pa tako slabotni, da je ne zmorejo.

Po izjavi prosvetnega ministra bi bilo zato nujno potrebno, da bodo Jugoslavija še 3400 novih osnovnih šol in približno 10,000 učiteljev, kajti dosedan-

je učne moči nikakor ne zadostajo.

V 8585 osnovnih šolah s 25,039 oddelki hodi več kakor 1,405,032 učencev. Na en oddelk jih pride približno 58. Ker pa razdelitev ni povsod enaka, je ponekod v enem razredu tudi več kakor 70 učencev. Ze iz zdravniškega razloga bi to nikakor ne smelo biti, zelo naporno in odgovorno je pa to tudi za učitelja samega.

Osnovno šolo konča vsako leto okoli 400,000 učencev. Od teh jih skoraj 290,000 ne more v srednjo šolo, kajti v 185 gimnazij gre komaj 110,000 učencev, povrh je pa tudi profesorjev veliko premalo. V vseh naših gimnazijah je komaj 4958 profesorjev, tako da pride na enega več kakor 250 učencev. Vprašamo se: ali je mogoče, da lahko en sam profesor dobro vzgoji toliko učencev, ki bodo morali danes ali jutri igrati važno vlogo v javnem življenju? Zato ni prav nič čudnega, če diplomira na naših univerzah od 100 študentov samo 28, 72 jih pa študije opusti ali pa — in to se še pogosteje dogaja — zavlačuje učenje po več let.

V prosvetnem ministru je več kakor 1000 prošenj diplomiranih filozofov in vsi ti še leta in leta zaman čakajo na službo, čeprav bi Jugoslavija nujno potrebovala še najmanj 500 profesorjev.

Naši srednješolci se pritočujejo, češ da imajo preveč učne snovi. Morebiti je to res. Bolj bo pa držalo, da ima današnja srednješolska mladina težave pri učenju le zato, ker je v razredih preveč učencev, profesorjev pa malo in zato predavanja ne morejo biti takšna, kakor bi siicer morala biti.

Če vso to dobro premislimo, nikakor ne smemo pričakovati od učencev boljših uspehov. Nasprotno. Ker je dijakov vsako leto več, učnih moči pa zmerom enaka, jim bo učenje od leta do leta težje in tudi njihov uspeh ne bo posebno dober.

Delavska izobrazba

Delavska izobrazba pomeni, da delavec razume nekatere temeljne resnice, ki se tičejo ekonomskih razmer, v katerih delavec živi in od katerih zavisi njegova obstojnost.

Naravno niso te temeljne resnice omejene samo na delavca. Vsakdo, čeprav ni mezdni delavec, se lahko zanima za te resnice, jih sprejme zase in jih pomaga razširati zaradi njihove humanitarne in socialne pravičnosti, ki odseva iz njih. Iz tega razloga je delavska gibanje v preteklosti — in še danes se to dogaja — pritegnilo nase mnogo ljudi, ki niso bili delavci in ki so celo bili bogatini. Vzljubili so principe, ki so jih spoznali kot pravične in edino veljavne.

Ker pa se omenjene temeljne resnice in na njih sloneči principi v glavnem odnašajo na blagostanje in socialni napredek delavstva, se gibanje okoli teh resnic in principov imenuje delavska gibanje in izobrazba v smislu teh resnic in principov delavska izobrazba ne glede na to, da so nosilci teh idej in učitelji v tej šoli lahko vse kaj drugega kot bona fide mezdni delavci.

Danes omenjamo le dve temeljni resnici, dasi jih je mnogo več, ki obsegajo delavsko ideologijo oziroma izobrazbo.

Prva je, da je delo izvor vsega bogastva in blagostanja v človeški družbi. Običajno se odkrije te resnice pripisuje Karlu Marxu, toda znana in omenjena je bila že davno pred njim. Res pa je to, da je Marks temu principu dal znanstveno podlago, kajti šele v njegovem času, ko se je moderni kapitalizem naglo razvijal v vsej svoji goloti, je razodetje te resnice moralo priveriti na dan.

Razume se, da nasprotniki — to je stara šola ekonomije, ki ne bo nikdar priznala te resnice — radi pacijo Marksa in ne povedo tega, kar je Marks mislil s to ugotovitvijo. Ko je Marks znanstveno utemeljil princip, da je delo izvor vsega bogastva, je tudi povedal, da k delu pršteva vse one tehnike, strokovnjake in zvedence, ki vodijo delo; nikdar ni on zapisal, da oni, ki aktualno delajo z rokami v tovarnah in drugje, ustvarjajo vse bogastvo. Njegova utemeljitev je, da vsi, ki delajo z glavo in rokami, ustvarjajo vrednote. Vsi ti predstavljajo delo. Kapitalista je pa Marks postavil v drugo kategorijo. Kapitalist, ki samo poseduje kapital in najema navadne delavce in strokovnjake, ne prispeva s tem prav nič k vrednosti blaga. Kapitalistov kapital ni njegovo delo — on ga le pridobi od drugih.

Nepobitna resnica je torej, da delo proizvađa vse vrednote. Samo po sebi se razume, da v okvir dela spadajo tudi vse naravne dobrine (zemlja, kamen, rude, premog, olje itd.), kajti brez dela bi vse te dobrine ostale brez vrednosti za človeka.

Druga važna resnica — katere tudi noče priznati stara šola — je ta, da je gospodarstvo podlaga vsemu ostalemu življenju družbe. Z drugo besedo je to ekonomski determinizem. Marks je pa to imenoval historični materializem. Ta princip je važen, kajti kdor žudi za zgodovino človeštva odnosno človeške družbe v luči tega principa, bo gledal na zgodovino vse drugače, kakor pa gleda in nas učijo stara šola. Maršalkaj si bo razložil, kar mu bo drugače nejasno in zavito v mistične megle. Zgodovina družbe v idealistični luči, kakršno učijo stara šola, se kmalu razbline v pozijo in pravljice, če jo postavijo pod mikroskop ekonomskega determinizma. Ta mikroskop pokaže, da zgodovine niso razvijali junaki božanskih idealov, pač pa je bila vse veke — tudi pod najdebelejšo rjuho mističizma — na delu človeške sebičnosti, ki je, vedno gnana po iskanju materialnih dobrin, gradila svoji sebičnosti primerno kulturno, politično in socialno stavbo, v vsakem veku drugačno.

Vsaka nova resnica, zlasti pa ona, ki ima opraviti s temeljem tisočletja starih naziranj — se zelo počasi udomačuje. Desetletja, celo stoletja vzame, predno nova resnica prodre v večino umov in izpodrine staro zmotno. Pravkar navedeni dve resnici pa še nista stari niti sto let! Kljub temu sta si že osvojili na milijone pristaev, posebno v Evropi in kajpada največ med delavci vseh narodov.

Delavska izobrazba, sloneča na teh resnicah in principih, je torej hkrati nova šola in nov svetovni nazor, ki sega do dna vsemu dejanju in nehanju človeškega življenja. Delavec, naj bo še tako preprost, ki si pridobi to izobrazbo in jo razume ter si jo zna porabiti za razumevanje vsega, kar se dogaja okoli njega, je — bolj izobražen kot so vsi profesorji in "učenci" stare šole.

Katoliške svete svijače

Znano je, da katoliška duhovščina vodi kršarok vojno zoper kontraceptivno kontrolo porodov. Kontrola s kontraceptivami je po mnenju te duhovščine protinaravna, nemoralna in svinjska.

Ker pa gonja proti kontraceptivni kontroli ne pomenja nič niti pri katoličanih samih, so voditelji katoliške cerkve v Ameriki pred nekaj leti poskušali s "sveto svijačo". Odobrili so kontrolo porodov s metodo "varne periode", katero sta odkrila dva zdravnika, eden iz Avstrije in drugi iz Japonske. Takrat so se katoliški moralisti (tudi slovenski) na široko razpisali in povedali, da ta metoda ni pregrešna — ni svinjska! — ker ne uključuje nobenega "protinaravnega" preprečevanja ploda. "Saj drugače bom svoje življenje isto tako kmalu izgubil, samo na drug način — s pomočjo rahlja," je dejal nesrečnej.

Are you reading the Slovene section of our organ? Those of you who are must have noticed the unfavorable comments by a host of members of the SNPJ senior lodges on the proposed English daily page.

These comments have been appearing in every issue of the weekly Prosveta for the last five or six weeks under the "Glasovi" column, and they are still coming—as though enough has not been said in this particular matter. They are the result of the editor's invitation to the members at large to express themselves in regard to the proposal.

All comments from members—and some non-members, too—thus far come from regular subscribers to the daily Prosveta and old timers, many of whom have been subscribers since its beginning or for over twenty years. The Reveliers' Column

AMBRIDGE, PA.—Last week trustees of the Reveliers lodge made their quarterly audit. Financially, the lodge remains safe, although stationary. Where finances are concerned this lodge is as yet in no immediate danger.

On the other hand, the trustees found occasion for alarm in checking over the membership ranks for the first nine months of 1937. The Reveliers in September, 1937, numbered 88 adults and 19 juveniles. In January, 1937, they numbered 95 adults and 30 juveniles. The difference, and loss, presents a problem.

What makes the problem more acute is the fact that a few of those dropping Revelier affiliations had been members down through the years. Likewise, practically all who have discontinued membership had been on terms with pleasant association with all members within the lodge.

Internal strife has not been a factor. Nor have lack of activities. The secretary has not been lax in performance of her duties.

In Ambridge there are not many Slovenes. To build their memberships Slovene lodges have had to campaign locally among their Slav neighbors and friends. Campaigns, initiated and backed by SNPJ finances, have played their role in building upwards, the numerical strength of the Reveliers. Back in 1930, there were 26 young Slovenes who were charter members of Lodge 699. In 7 years this lodge has increased its membership over 300%. To keep growing it could use to advantage membership campaigns, although a few such new members eventually drop out.

The trustees made the following general recommendations to the lodge. *Primarily*, each member is urged to value his membership within the lodge. *Secondly*, members are asked to use their personal influence in efforts to retain membership. The *officers*, particularly the secretary, are exhorted to use their talents to safeguard the membership totals. The lodge is urged to sponsor activities to hold interest of the members.
