"Father" Coughlin kupil William Green vidi manj dela po Ameriki

Miglaj iz Washingtona o preiskavi razgalil radiopridigarja

Detroit, Mich. — Rev. Chas. A. Coughlin, znani radiopridigar in veliko zagovornik srebrne valute poleg zlata, je investiral \$20,000 v srebrno kovino. Za to vsoto je kupil pol milijona unč srebra v upanju, da se srebro podraži, ako se cene dvignejo na stopnjo leta 1926, kar je Rooseveltova želja. Investicija je bila narejena v imenu "Radio lige male rožice" in kot kupec je podpisana Amy Collins, tajnica in blagajnica te lige, katere ustanovitelj in vodja je župnik Coughlin.

Ta transakcija s srebrom, ki diši močno po špekulaciji, je zadnje dni izzvala slabe komentarje v Washingtonu; federalni zakladnik Morgenthau je nekaj omenil, da ta reč potrebuje preiskavo. To je razkačilo Coughlina in objavil je oster odgovor na naslov federalnega zakladnika s "pojasnilom", da radio liga investuje le začasno in kupuje le blago, ne pa papirjev na bozi.

V marcu je bilo brez dela skoraj 11 milijonov oseb

Washington. — (FP) — Predsednik Ameriške delavske federacije William Green vidi slaba znamenja v statistiki o uposlenosti in bizniški aktivnosti. Kljub naraščanju produkcije se armada brezposelnih le počasi zmanjšuje, veliko manj kakor pa se dviga produkcija.

Po podatkih federacije je bilo v marcu 10,905,000 brezposelnih, mesec prej pa 11,467,000.

Od lanskega oktobra do marca se je bizniška aktivnost izboljšala nad 9%, brezposelnost je pa padla le neznatno. V manufakturnih industrijah se je produkcija zvišala 7.9%, uposlenost pa le 4.1% ali skoraj polovico manj.

"Te številke pokazujejo, da je za uposlitev brezposelnih potrebno nekaj več ko zvišanje bizniških aktivnosti. Jasno je, da se podjetniki bolj zanimajo za zvišanje produktivnosti na delavca, kakor pa za kreiranje dela," pravi Green.

STAVKE V CLEVELANDU KLJUČ DO NOVIH BOJEV

Zmagi avtnih in gasolinskih delavcev bodo sledile stavke v drugih mestih. Magnet je se zavedajo položaja

Cleveland, O. — (FP) — V dolgi verigi stavk, ki so zadnji teden paralizirale to mesto, sta najvažnejši stavki pri Fisher Body kompaniji in boj gasolinskih delavcev. Stavki nista le lokalnega, ampak tudi splošnega pomena, ker sta ključ do novih bojov v avtni industriji in prodaji gasolina.

Če izpadejo te stavke ugodno za stavkarje, ni nobenega dvoma, da jim bodo sledili delavci tudi v drugih mestih. Tega se dobro zavedajo avtni in oljni magnati. Da preprečijo kapitulacijo tukajšnjih ravnateljev, so velike oljne družbe poslale semkaj svoje "mogule", visoke uradnike, tudi iz New Yorka. Slično tudi Fisher Body.

Gasolinskim družbam se dozeveda, da bodo imele opraviti s slično stavko tudi v drugih mestih, če kapitulirajo pred clevelandskimi delavci, ki zahtevajo priznanje unije in višje plače. Na gasolinskih postajah delajo večinoma mladi delavci, gradnarci srednjih in višjih šol. Zaslужijo kljub temu pa le od \$60 do \$90 na mesec.

Clevelandsko gasolinsko stavko opazujejo posebno gasolinski delavci v Detroitu, Akronu in v nekaterih drugih mestih, ki tudi govore o stavki. Če zmagajo njih clevelandski tovariši, ne bo dolgo, ko bodo tudi druga mesta stala pred "gasolinsko sušo", če se bodo družbe upirale priznati unijo in druge zahteve.

Voditelji Ameriške delavske federacije, pod katero spada unija gasolinskih delavcev, ki ima federalni čarter, očitveno niso naklonjeni stavki. Od tajnika Morrisona so prejeli brzojav, v katerem jih urgira, naj prenehajo s stavko, kar pa so delavci zavrgli.

Bolj diplomatično je Greenovo stališče glede stavke pri Fisher Body. Tej stavki on očitveno ne nasprotuje, ampak so delavci najbrž "odglasovali" zanjo, ker so nezadovoljni s taktiko avtne gasolinske delavske odbora.

Za avtne delavce je ta stavka velike važnosti, prav tako tudi za magnate. "Če jo ne zadržimo v povojih, se lahko zgodi, da bo prizadeta vsa delala," je rekel L. E. Scafe, ravnatelj tukajšnje Fisher Bodyjeve tovarne. Da bo prizadeta vsa produkcija Chevrolet modelov, je gotovo, ker bodo morale prenehati vse Chevrolet tovarne, če clevelandska tovarna Fisher Body ne zaobratuje. V tej tovarni ima družba namreč "master dies" ali velike žige za avtna ogrodja Chevrolet modela.

Stavkarji zahtevajo od voditeljev ADF za avtno industrijo, da pokličejo na stavko delavce tudi v drugih tovarnah Fisher Body in Chevrolet, predvsem v Detroitu in Pontiacu, Mich. Pri voditeljih ta zahteva ni takoj našla odmeva, vendar pa prihaja iz drugih centrov vest o možnosti splošne stavke pri tej družbi.

Tukajšnji delavci zahtevajo priznanje unije in zvišanje plač za 30%. Gotovo je to, če stavka izpade ugodno za tukajšnje delavce, bo Fisher Body imela na rokah tudi stavko v drugih mestih. Za Rooseveltovo "socialno inženirstvo", s katerim je zadnjič preprečil splošno stavko v avtni industriji s znanim čarovniškim kompromisom, je ta stavka prva večja klofuta. Rooseveltov kompromis sploh ni mogel roditi drugega, ker raz-

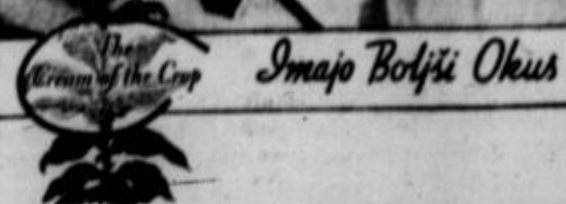

Your Health

Goiter

Goiter is a condition where there is chronic enlargement of the whole or a portion of the thyroid gland of short or prolonged duration.

The thyroid gland is a ductless gland lying in front of the upper part of the windpipe, extending laterally to both sides of the neck. It secretes an internal secretion for the body. It has influence upon metabolism or tissue change or chemical changes whereby the function of body nutrition is affected.

There are different types of goiter. One of the most common type of goiter is a simple or colloid goiter.

It is characterized by an extended enlargement of the gland, usually beginning at the age of puberty, especially in girls. This goiter is caused by excessive deposit of colloid or glue-like material brought about by the lack of iodine in water supply. There are usually no physical disturbances present and often appears spontaneously from ten to twenty years. In these cases small doses of sodium or potassium iodide given for two weeks, twice a year, its treatment often prevents the development of simple goiter in growing children.

Adenomatous goiter—made up of glandular epithelium cells—appears in children with enlargement of the thyroid gland, or later in life may be nodular (knob-like) and a non-resistent tumor mass. On examination this goiter is smooth, firm, and tender. There may be no physical disturbances present from ten to twenty years. Iodine should be given internally for this type of goiter.

Exophthalmic (hyperthyroidism) is a chronic disease caused by excessive, probably abnormal, thyroid secretion and is characterized by enlargement of the thyroid gland, bulging eyes, rapid heart action, nervous irritability, vomiting, diarrhea, and increased rate of basal metabolism. This disease most frequently develops in the thirtieth to fortieth year of life. It is more common in women than men. In many instances it follows an acute infectious disease, pregnancy, change of life, or severe mental or emotional strain.

Goiter in its various forms may occur in all countries, regardless of race and South America and Asia. Europe it is most frequently met in Switzerland, France, Austria, Germany, Italy, Jugoslavia, especially in Bosnia, and certain parts of England. In America, it occurs mainly in the Northern part of the United States, and Canada.

There are many causes for goiter. Iodine supply, which may be contained or lack iodine, deficiency of iodine in foods, and infected soil. Other causes are ameba, various infectious diseases, toxic products of metabolism, all flesh diets, various chronic diseases such as tonsillitis, catarrhal disorders of the thyroid, cavities and sinuses, chronic degeneration and pregnancy.

Children are known to be more susceptible to the disease than adults. The female is more frequently the victim of goiter than the male. Goiter is not hereditary.

Goiter patients are unaware of the disease until the symptoms appear. The symptoms occur only when the gland has become sufficiently large to interfere with the functions of the respiratory structures and their circulation of blood or difficult respiration as a prominent symptom of goiter which has reached sufficient size to compress either the windpipe and the arteries directly with respiratory blood vessels of the neck,

thus disturbing the circulation. Increase of pulse and palpitation of the heart are constant features. Hoarseness may be observed, paralysis of muscles of the arm, numbness of the fingers due to pressure, irritability, nervousness, restlessness, may be present. In spite of a goiter patient having a hearty appetite, there may be a loss in weight.

The cure of chronic goiter is always favorable under proper treatment, especially in children and young adults. In practically all fully developed chronic cases, operation should be done. The mortality is nil if operated early enough.

In the treatment of goiter, much depends upon the efficiency with which the primary cause, whether it be fecal origin as in waters, or in the intestinal canal, or toxins from tonsillar, nasal infections, or abscesses, etc., is eliminated. This must be done thoroughly. In contaminated districts no water should be used as a beverage, or for cooking, or to wash edible foods, salads, fruits, etc., that has not been thoroughly boiled.

All foci infection should be removed, such as infected tonsils, adenoids, abscessed teeth, etc. The amount of iodine to be taken for treatment should be prescribed by a physician. The general nutrition should be improved by rest, freedom from excitement, and a generous readily digestible diet. Applications of X-Rays to the thyroid gland are sometimes beneficial. When medicinal measures fail after a fair trial, operative treatment is indicated. After operation, medical supervision for several years is always necessary, especially in severe cases. John J. About This and That

DETROIT - SYMBOLIC OF YOUTH

Detroit. Detroit has felt the sudden upturn in business quite as quickly as it did the rapid decline in 1930. It seems to be sort of sensitive child, as eager in one direction as it is in the other. It has the complete aspects of modern youth. Let us briefly examine the case and see why.

It will be remembered by all observers that the auto industry has boasted, and still does, that they were the reason for the great epoch of prosperity during the post-war period. We must grant them that point insofar as we admit that it was the greatest agent of that boom. We may also observe the fact that it was the auto industry which felt the blow of the crash first and hardest, and it was the auto industry, which was the first and quickest to revive. In other words, we can gather from this that Detroit and its auto industries are vital factors in the country's economical stability. Its great antennae reach out and feel throbbing of the nation. When the pulse is fast, automobiles are in great demand; and when it weakens, there is no demand. Thus the so-called captains of industry take the fullest advantage of these sudden upturns and declines: They work their plants at full capacity and their employees to the limit of high production and efficiency. That is the reason they are so utterly opposed to the unionization of their plants. Unions would prevent this inhuman exploitation. In order to keep a market and to insure a predicted number of sales each year as well as a preventive from annihilation by competitors, the automotive experimental laboratories are constantly bringing out new and marked improvements in the construction and designs of cars.

I may add, these are not for the convenience of the buyer, but merely as new and improved selling points. What they want to say is, "Turn in your old 'jelly' on something new and better." But with all of their master minds, they have not as yet figured out a way to keep their own employees employed the year round. And what is more, I doubt if they care much whether they do or not. Men are merely tools in their hands. When they are worn out, they cast them to charity organizations and to the government with a mere, "Here, you take care of them, we don't need them anymore. They're too old." They remember that there are plenty of men waiting outside to take their places. But now I am getting beside the point.

We can compare the automotive industry in the capitalistic system as a huge surging wave on a seacoast, and the others of the nation's industries as break-waters of the port of capitalistic economical stability. This automotive wave comes rushing in on us at comparatively regular intervals. The other industries—and businesses or break-waters allow this surge to slowly sift through as mere ripples. These ripples last for some time after the retirement of the wave. They are the indicators which show that industry is still alive. They say, "Stand by, you fools! Another wave is coming." But personally I am afraid that more break-waters are being built from day to day beyond the immediate coastal ones. They are breaking the gigantic waves of the past too far off shore. The waves themselves are becoming mere ripples.

I do not mean to imply that the auto industry is the key to the whole situation, although I do mean that it is an important one. Industries are interdependent. The world is becoming too specialized to make any one independent of the others. The same holds for individuals. The days of rugged individualism have faded with the past.

But let us go on with our comparison of the youthfulness of Detroit. Detroit's industries are impulsive and eager to go forward. They have big ideas and are eager to put them over. Their passion for the "latest thing out" is predominant in their modernism in a conservative and worn-out system. (Note this in some new auto car by Chrysler or one of General Motors' cars resting on its knees by some curb.) The madness of youth is apparent in that killing speed with which they go to work, in the exhausting manner in which they do things, and in the final let-up when they stop as suddenly as they began. To them, they had finished their task. Their passions have cooled. What are they to do next? They have dissipated their life in one mad fling and now have nothing to do but sit around and think of something bigger and better to do next. When the opportunity comes, they go at it just as feverishly again until once more they fall prostrate. Is this not characteristic of the youth of today? Eager, energetic, radical, conservative, blundering, unthinking, ruthless and sympathetic, and most of all the makers of tomorrow, the progressors of the world!

Detroit seems to have its share of youthful industries which have matured into powerful overlords. They have been trained in the school of capitalism. Even in their stubbornness to yield, they have yielded to the mold of time. They make changes and give in just enough to keep up with the demands and to preserve that system upon which they have been weaned and raised to their present status. We must congratulate them upon their achievements. They do know how to handle the whip. I wonder how long Detroit and the rest of the country will let this go on? What do you think?

Now, here in this Detroit, in this god-head of youthful modernism and this turmoil of instability, some eight years ago sprung forth from its forebearers an organization and lodge called the Young Americans and since that time recognized by that word of Youthfulness. We were born from our parents, the Slovene lodges of the SNPJ. We were raised upon the principle on which that organization was founded 30 years ago, and taught in the school of hard knocks and unpleasant experiences. We live in that environment which I had characterized as being Detroit, and have always held the principles of the workingman foremost in our hearts.

We, the Young Americans and the Wolverines, are the Slovene youth groups of Detroit. We have been energetic and shall continue to be so. Detroit has influenced us in its ways. To others in the Slovene groups throughout the country, we may have appeared at times to be too radical and eager for changes. But we do not feel that way. We are proud of that fact. We want to keep that spark of our predecessors alive and full of spirit. We want the SNPJ to grow and continue to do its good work for its people. Those fundamental principles upon which it was founded and for which our pioneers struggled so desperately must be stressed to the youth. We must not keep them only to ourselves, but we must spread them to the world. Our future and that of mankind rests as much in our hands as it does in those of others.

This is the thirtieth anniversary of the SNPJ. The Slovene Youth of Detroit recognize the greatness of the work of our founders. We pay homage to the living and dead who have sacrificed and who have given their talent and energy that such a great and influential as well as beneficial organization be possible for us.

It is our duty to go forth with all of our energy in this jubilee. We must carry on that work which those before us have begun. They are passing and we are coming! Let us not shirk at our new responsibilities! Don't depend on the other fellow to do it all! He'll do his part. See to it that you do yours. Let's all go out and see these eligible young people. Let's make them members! All aboard for the good ship "Jubilee"! Let's bring back a worthy cargo! And so we say, "Bon voyage" and Good Luck!

On Adamic's "Return"

Pueblo, Colo.—Interesting and intriguing beyond compare is the word description of Yugoslavia by Louis Adamic. In this, his latest, he has outdone himself in writing. His descriptions are vivid, the people live and breathe; the whole book gives an air of vital strength, stolid stoicism, a certain "do or die" atmosphere.

To us—those who have been born in America from Slovene stock—Yugoslavia is synonymous with the "old country." A place vague and dim, but interesting, to be sure. It is a place where all are farmers, with the Alpine crests shooting into the sky. Interesting, yes, but too distant, too incomprehensible to us who have known nothing but the modern trend of speed, and mixed peoples, where each is for himself, and the devil take the hindmost. We listen with little attention, or none at all, to the tales of Yugoslavia the old folks have to tell. It is meaningless jargon to us.

But now, we can live in pleasant Slovenia; we can exchange gossip with the peasant. We can enjoy the peaceful rural life through the medium of "The Native's Return." In the book, the country, the people are real, startlingly real. Is it because Adamic compares its natural beauty with the artificially angular and powerful New York, or is it that it is so wonderfully different than his thoughts had depicted it? We can dimly guess at the author's hesitancy to enter the country of his birth, his uneasiness. We can perceive how his interest is awakened and spurred by the family, the country, and the people. His natural ability asserts itself and he records his impressions. His description of the Galachian colony in its barren mountain fastness drips with the romance of their struggle for life, their boundless courage and faithfulness for home. His description of Montenegrin life bears the burden of the hard struggle for life, of their strength against privations.

But there is no use i rewriting his book. It is enough to say that the story (it is more than a story) is one that when begun with will not be released until finished. It is what the young Slovenes in America need to make them see, and know of the courageous stock to which they belong. To know that they come from a people of high moral and physical courage, of a people who are able to think, to recognize a crisis, and yet be patient, and sympathetic. A people that are so full of hospitality that each literally lives to give.

A wonderful country, a wonderful people. A book to be read and enjoyed—and studied.
