My Week

Most of our readers are acquainted with some of the major programs of the New Deal. One of these is the development of huge public power plants to furnish the farmer and workers with cheap electricity.

Last week in Congress Senator George W. Norris, veteran progressive of Nebraska, and champion of liberal legislation, advocated government expansion of its Tennessee Valley Authority type of power development to the entire country.

Senator Norris, who introduced a bill three years ago to create seven "little TVAs" to blanket the country with public power in accordance with the recommendations of the President, said that there would be no power shortage if the bill had passed them.

And so we see that it is this Roosevelt's "socialistic scheme" which is today enabling the country to build its air force besides producing cheap power to the work-

The present unlimited national emergency gives the President almost unlimited power, and it is expected that he will use it both for the speedy defense of the country and for promoting such programs which will be of permanent value for the people.

My annual visit to La Salle, Ill., for the Memorial Day observance is a pleasant one. It is only 10 miles inland from Chicago and Lake Michigan, where the temperature was in the lower 60's, but La Salle it was almost too hot and comfort and even a heavy rain-fall failed to cool things off very much.

Striped wallpapers are a fashion in smart interiors this year. It is the vertical pin stripes in a shade of blue or green, one's figure added to one's height, so the interior of a house may well be tall for trimmer lines.

Among the many stunning wallpapers now at almost any wallpaper store are a number of patterns in unusual styles of stripes. Vertical lines in varying widths of harmonizing pastel shades create a refreshing atmosphere. They will also make a room appear higher and airier. Floral and leaf motifs may be worked into vertical stripes, and the added interest to an otherwise simply furnished room.

Because of the underpinning for homes and other buildings—urban and rural, is so important, the U. S. Department of Agriculture has issued a new Farmers' Bulletin on "Foundations of Farm Buildings." This is illustrated with photographs of drawings showing approved methods of constructing good foundations. In addition, there is a table of suggested depths for placing bottoms of footings under all buildings. There are also sections on selecting a site, and on foundations, cellar walls, and remodeling and repairs. Copies of this bulletin may be obtained from the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.

Guard Your Health

CONSTIPATION

Constipation ordinarily means delay or incomplete bowel movement and tendency to abnormal hardness and dryness or a reduction in quantity of the stool.

Constipation is due to nervous strain and in these cases it is found that the stoppage of stool is at the terminal end of the large bowel.

The symptoms of constipation vary greatly in different cases. Some patients have no symptoms.

No satisfactory treatment can be given until the proper cause has been determined by a complete physical examination by the family physician.

Good habit formation is important in the prevention of constipation. The most favorable period for stool is directly following breakfast.

Importance of Diet Diet is very important in the treatment of constipation. The diet must include sufficient vitamin content, many laxative constituents, sufficient number of calories for the support of the body, and sufficient amount of fluids, especially water.
