### We Turn to Our Juvenile Campaign

Our Anniversary Campaign in commemoration of the fifteenth birthday of our ESL's closed on May 31 with considerable success and brought to an end the official observance of our youth movement.

Plans for the eight-month Jubilee Campaign were laid by the Supreme Board at its semiannual meeting in August of last year, with October 1 as its opening date and the end of May as its closing period.

As announced a few weeks ago the results for the seven-month period showed that a total of 2171 new members were added to both departments—of this number 1386 were adult and 785 juvenile members.

At the beginning of the campaign it was suggested that an unofficial goal of 3000 new members be set—a quota which could have been easily reached if all ESL's would have participated in the drive. However, if the last campaign month, the month of May, brings in a little more than 300 new members (the average established in previous months), the final results will net us about 2500 new members for both departments. Therefore, the net gain will be impressive anyway, even if not spectacular.

The complete campaign returns will be announced soon.

However, we still have our Juvenile Campaign which has been in effect for the past eight months and which will close at the end of this year. It is a fifteen-month campaign designed by the Supreme Board to strengthen our Juvenile Department. Ever mindful of the importance of a strong Juvenile Department, the Board set forth plans for a vigorous juvenile drive with liberal awards for solicitors as well as candidates. In addition, medical examination fees up to fifty cents are paid for each juvenile candidate.

This gives an excellent opportunity particularly to those ESL's which did not take full advantage of the just expired jubilee campaign to make up by plunging into the Juvenile Campaign with greater vigor. During the next six months, then, by united action our ESL's can bring in hundreds of new juvenile members.

It cannot be stressed too often that our Juvenile Department is of vital importance to our Society. Its ranks must not only be maintained by constant additions but also steadily increased. Moreover, it is to each lodge's advantage to keep its juvenile roster strong as the main source from which to draw its future members. The stronger the juvenile membership a lodge has, the safer its future, which, in turn, makes our Society more secure. Briefly, then, a strong juvenile reserve presents a permanent assurance of a steady growth; it works as a life line for the entire system of our fraternal organization.

Therefore, there must never be a let-up in our endeavors to bolster our juvenile ranks. And the current Juvenile Campaign offers a splendid opportunity for the fullest expression and appreciation of fraternalism as exemplified by our Society.

# My Week

Most of our readers are acquainted with some of the major programs of the New Deal. One of these is the development of huge public power plants in various parts of the country to furnish the farmers and workers with cheap electricity. This policy has often been attacked as "socialistic" and the President was a "communist."

Last week in Congress Senator George W. Norris, veteran progressive of Nebraska and champion of liberal legislation, advocated government expansion of its Tennessee Valley Authority type of power development to the entire country. "In view of the present shortage of electrical energy for defense needs," he has been a staunch advocate of public power for years.

Senator Norris, who introduced a bill three years ago to create seven additional "little TVAs" to blanket the country with public power in accordance with the recommendations of the President, said that there would be no power shortage if the bill had passed then. He pointed out the fact that had it not been for TVA, which is now supplying power for the production of aluminum, its output would have been so curtailed that "our aerospace program would be defeated right now."

And so we see that it is this country's "socialistic scheme" which is today enabling the country to build its air force besides furnishing cheap power to the workers. Of course, it was the private power companies and their reactionary mouthpieces which hampered the passage of the bill which would furnish cheap power millions of people . . .

There is no doubt that if the reactionaries in Congress had not listened to their bosses who said the war would be over before we could complete the job, we would have more power than we have. "It's going to take us a long time no matter when we start," Norris said. "We are building battleships; they may be over before they are completed—everyone hopes it will. Let us be building them for con-

tinuity," he added.

The present unlimited national emergency gives the President almost unlimited power, and it is expected that he will use it both for a speedy defense of the country and for promoting such programs as will be of permanent value for the people.

My annual visit to La Salle, Illinois, for the Memorial Day observance was a pleasant one. It is only 10 miles inland from Chicago and Lake Michigan, where the temperature was in the lower 60's, but La Salle it was almost too hot comfort and even a heavy rain failed to cool things off very much.

# Guard Your Health

## CONSTIPATION

Constipation ordinarily means delay or incomplete bowel movement and tendency to abnormal hardness and dryness or a reduction in quantity of the stool. Constipation is not a distinct disease, but a symptom which may result from a variety of disturbances, either organic or functional.

## Various Causes

Constipation is due to nervous strain and in these cases it is found that the stoppage of stool is at the terminal end of the large bowel. In gall bladder infection, lower part of stomach obstruction, or chronic appendicitis, there is stagnation in the upper large bowel. Other causes of constipation are poor diet, abuse of physics, obstruction, abnormal large bowel, mucous colitis, pressure of tumors on the bowel, kinks from adhesions, twisting of intestines, functional derangement due to fatigue, old age, undernourishment, anemia, fevers and lead poisoning. Further causes may be weak muscles of the bowels, diseases about the anus or in the pelvis and in which the disturbance is due largely to the neglect of the calls of nature.

## Modern Living

The incidents of constipation are increased where there are over refined foods and nervous tension and a lack of fresh air and exercise. Constipation is said to be on the increase because of the unhygienic conditions of modern living. It is generally believed that constipation is most often produced by a diet which leaves insufficient undigested residue, irregular hours for defecation (inattention to the calls of nature) and inactive habits with insufficient outdoor muscular exercise. After it has developed, constipation may be aggravated by the use of cathartics or physics, these in turn, may cause increase of inflammation of the large bowel. Tobacco, alcoholic drinks and any of the agents just mentioned may set up a chronic constipation process. The habit of reading at toilet often has a tendency to lessen sensitivity of rectal nerves and leads to prolonged sitting at stool, with engorgement of the local veins around the anus, and the result is the development of piles.

Six to eight glasses should be taken daily.

The foods for treatment in constipation are buttermilk, sour-milk, koumiss, fruit juices, apples, cherries, currants, rye bread, whole wheat bread, butter, olive oil, linseed oil, mayonnaise dressings, clear soups, fish, meats except veal or pork, poultry game, ham, cabbage, cauliflower, brussel sprouts, celery, spinach, salads, onions, figs, prunes, dates, pears, grapes, bananas, strawberries, goose berries, jam, golden syrup, molasses, preserved fruits, coffee, beer, mineral waters. If eggs are taken they should be eaten in moderation and lightly cooked in the form of scrambled eggs.

The articles of diet that should be avoided are new bread, pastry, peas, beans, new potatoes and nuts.

## Hot Water

Avoid medicinal treatment as far as possible. Hot water with or without salt should be slowly sipped immediately on rising in the morning. Two wine glasses may be sipped while dressing. An equal amount of hot water should be drunk at bed time. Tea should always be freshly made and never taken strong or with meat. Abdominal massage by the patient for ten minutes upon rising, especially finger kneading in direction on the large bowel, should be carried out regularly. There should also be cold bathing or cold sponging followed by sharp friction with a rough towel and flesh glove to secure vigorous action of the skin. Drug treatment of constipation always requires caution. Physics are hardly ever indicated. The use of mineral oil of various makes is helpful in chronic cases of constipation.
