## Nemške čete predrle ruske bojne črte

Berlin naznani okupa-  
ljo estonskega mesta  
POPAD MED RUSI  
IN JAPONCI

Nov. 5. avg. — Tu so pri-  
čili, da so nemške čete predr-  
ruske bojne črte v bližini  
Smolenskem in Leni-  
nem. Prej objavljeno poro-  
čilo je omenjalo vroče bitke v  
severnih Kholmu in Smolen-  
skem, takor tudi na ozemlju med  
Odesom in Novim Sadom v Odesu, sovjetsko lu-  
čno Černem morju.

Nov. 5. avg. — Skoro vsa E-  
vropska vojska je bila okupirana po  
mehkih četah, ko so se Rusi u-  
stavili in Tape, železniškega  
poti, ki leži 45 milijonov  
od Talina, estonske pre-  
mice. Vrhovno poveljstvo  
je, da so ruske armade pri Ki-  
viju obkrožene in da se ne bo-  
moglo izmotiti iz pasti.

Finland. Finska, 5. avg. — Fin-  
ska je prodigala proti Pe-  
trovski, strategičnemu kri-  
su na progji železnice Mur-  
mansk-Leningrad, so razdejale  
ruski tanki in štiri oklop-  
istovomobile v bitki, ki se je  
v bitki na severni strani  
jezera. List Ilta Sa-  
pije, da ruski protinasko-  
vna ustavili prodiranje fin-  
čet. V bitkah na tej fronti  
so utrpljeli velike izgube.  
Torej poročilo pravi, da je  
to potništvo bombardiralo  
parneke v luki ob otoku  
Kagle so poškodovala  
parneke.

Angliji iz karlijskih pokra-  
jatov je moralna Finska od-  
stavila sovjetsko po podpisu pre-  
tekel leta, so bili in-  
strani, naj se prijavijo pri  
begunkih uradil. V  
bitki so bili dovoljenja za  
ček v svoje domove, ker so  
armade reokupirale vse  
mestne.

Nov. 5. avg. — V prodiranju  
Leningradu se je nemški  
čet na sovjetsko oboroženo  
povečal, pravi danes objav-  
ljeno uradno poročilo. Dve ru-  
ški enoti, kateri so Nem-  
ški pri jezeru Peipus  
fronti, sta se podali.  
Tukaj in ogriske čete so raz-  
deljene zvezke s  
vsi pri prodiranju v Ukra-  
jinu. Na južni strani Kijeva so  
torej sovjetsko bojno črto in  
prilej razviliti po dolini.  
Nemških armad na  
smolenskem sektorju so  
vzeti in preti jim uničenje.

Nov. 5. avg. — Vrhovno  
poveljstvo poroča, da se ljute  
v smolenskem sektorju in  
Bel Tserkovu nadaljujejo.  
Ruske armade so napeli vse sile,  
nemški ofenzivo, ka-  
teri je okupacija Kijeva,  
anglijska mesta Ukrajine. Pro-  
druženje nemških motornih kolon  
je ustavljeno pri Korostenju,  
kjer so iz 80 milijonov severozna-  
čnih Kijeva.

## HOPKINS OBISCE PREMIERJA CHURCHILLA

London. 5. avg. — Reprezen-  
tant sovjetske Rusije se bo ude-  
ležil prihodnje konference zave-  
zniških vlad v Londonu, na  
kateri bo končno zapečetena  
zveza med sovjeti in Veliko Britanijo. Konferenca, ki bo kma-  
lu sklicana, bo sličila oni, ki se  
je vršila 12. junija in na kateri  
so delegati zavezniških vlad  
sprejeli zaključek glede vzajem-  
ne pomoči v vseh akcijah proti  
osiušu Rim-Berlin.

Na prihodnji konferenci bo  
razprava o načrtih militaristič-  
negaja ojačanja zavezniških sil in  
morda tudi o problemih povo-  
ne rekonstrukcije, zlasti ekono-  
mike. Nadaljnjo znamenje, da  
Velika Britanija priznava sovjetsko  
Rusijo kot zavezničko, je na-  
znanilo, da je bil Ivan Majski, sovjetski poslanik v Londonu  
predlagan za člana klubu Hannen  
Swaffer.

Harry L. Hopkins, Roose-  
veltov zaupnik in administrator  
posojilno-najemniškega zakona,  
ki se je včasih povrnil iz  
Moskve v London, bo danes ob-  
ški premierja Churchillia. On  
bo govoril tudi s člani angleškega  
vojnega kabinta pred po-  
vratkom v Združene države.

List Daily Telegraph je obja-  
vil Hopkinsovo izjavo, da je bil  
njegov obisk Moskve, kjer je  
konferiral s Stalinom in drugimi  
sovjetiški voditelji, uspe-  
šen. Slednji so ga zagotovili, da  
so ruske armade sposobne za  
obdijanje naskokov Hitlerjevih kolon  
in napovedali polom nemških ofenziv.

Angleški tisk piše o skupni  
aktivnosti britansko-ameriške bojne  
mornarice na Pacifiku proti Ja-  
ponsku v slučaju izbruhova so-  
vražnosti. Ameriške bojne la-  
dije so koncentrirane ob Havaj-  
skih otokih in drugih strategič-  
nih točkah in lahko takoj stopi-  
jo v akcijo, če se bo pokazala  
nevarnost japonskega sunka  
proti Singapuru, največji angleški  
trdnjavji na Dalnjem vzhodu.  
Tisk napoveduje, da je konflikt  
z Japonsko neizbežen.

### Changes of By-Laws In Regard to Sick Benefit

Election of delegates for the Twelfth Regular Convention is over, which indicates that the time when we will come together in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, from all parts of the country, is not far away.

The by-laws are one of the most important matters to be dealt with at the convention. And rightly so, as they form the foundation to the very existence and progress of the Society. By them the sick benefits and other rights as well as duties are stipulated and provided for. They contain directions by which, within the limits of the prescribed regulations and provisions, the management is being conducted and the will of the majority of the members carried out collectively and individually.

Now it seems to be a proper time for me to explain to the membership the financial conditions in general and the need for modifying the by-laws concerning the sick benefits in particular. At the same time it is my intention to acquaint the delegates with these matters in advance so that a considerable amount of time may be saved by the Convention in this respect.

It is entirely plain that, whenever a financial difficulty arises in one or another class, the solution of such a problem can be reached in three ways only: by increasing the regular assessment, by ordering or levying a special assessment, or by reducing the payment of sick benefit.

In our Society we had no particular afflictions with the sick benefit funds **during the last eight years**. This is a gratifying and most important record. No one, neither the members nor the supreme or executive committee likes vexatious questions. But as there is nothing perfect in this life, new difficulties and troubles are inevitable. And having been able to cope with all the tasks in the past, there is no need for fearing that we could not solve the problems arising in the future.

After a long interval, the need for modifying the by-laws pertaining to the \$2 sick benefit class, became imperative. This class is decreasing financially ever since the present by-laws are in effect. Within a period of three and a half years the payment of the sick benefit in this class exceeded the assessments by more than \$60,000. Fortunately, there was a reserve at our disposal to cover the deficit, otherwise we would have been compelled to levy a special assessment. And as the reserve being almost exhausted, the coming Convention will have either to decrease the benefits, or raise the regular assessment.

The failure of this class to sustain itself by regular assessment is to be ascribed to the fact that the increase of **full benefit**, at the preceding Convention, was exceedingly too high, that is \$2 per day. Besides the scale providing a higher or more full benefit, that Convention has also adopted a provision directing 110, 130, and 150 days of full benefit within a period of 12 months, instead of 90 days, as it was provided for in the previous by-laws. In order to avoid further difficulties with levying special assessment, which is one of the worst setbacks for the Society, I advise the Convention to adopt the following scale which stipulates, by years, a 10 days full benefit in lieu of 15 days. With very few exceptions, it is the same as that of 1933, the total sum being the same.

Besides this scale the Convention ought to adopt, from the former by-laws, a provision allowing no more than 90 days full benefit within one year (12 months). These changes have to be made if we want this class to sustain itself with the present regular assessment. The regular assessment for this class is \$1.50 per month or \$18 a year, while the payment of benefit according to the present by-laws amounts yearly per member to a sum of \$20.35. This shows that the assessment is too low for at least 20c per member monthly. Therefore it is plain enough that, if the present by-laws are not modified, the regular assessment will have to be increased from \$1.50 to \$1.70 monthly upon every member.

The fact remains that the members were never enthusiastic for increasing the assessment and they certainly are not now, either. On the other hand, it is also more practical and from the viewpoint of an advertising campaign more attractive that the assessment stays as it is. But I ardently urge the delegates and advise the Convention to reduce full sick benefit by adopting the provision stated before so that this question will be solved again in such a way that the members won't be burdened too heavily.

Otherwise the by-laws pertaining to sick benefit are in fairly good order. Only a few minor amendments and technical corrections are needed. The \$1 sick benefit class is in good condition and so is the \$3 class. With circumstances demanding from us to keep them on sound basis, it is not advisable to make any reforms for these two classes.

Applications for assessment loans and special benefit were approved. (Details in Slovene minutes.)

### Meeting of June 18

Meeting was called to order at 1 p. m. All officers with the exception of treasurer were present. Minutes of the June 11 meeting were approved.

A letter from the treasurer of lodge 397, Crested Butte, Colo., was read asking if the Society would finance a float at the local celebration. Under the circumstances Committee does not recommend any such undertaking. The bids for cleaning and painting of the building that were submitted by three different concerns were read. After careful analysis of various provisions and specifications of all the bids, decided to award the bid to the Artmore Painting and Decorating Co., since their specifications contain everything we require, the price is considered moderate compared with the others and the bid of this firm is in every respect the most favorable.

Secretary Vider read a report from the secretary of lodge 91 with reference to the report on the election of delegate and alternate for the Twelfth Regular Convention, which report did not contain the signatures of the lodge president nor treasurer. The letter explained why they refused to sign, and 15 members of the lodge verified that the election of delegate was held in accordance with the by-laws at the May meeting. **What Did Henderson Say?**

Newspapers throughout the nation played up the speech made by Price Administrator Leon Henderson in Atlantic City two weeks ago.

But they played up only parts of it: the part in which he painted a "dark picture" of how the defense program is going to blight the American home through shortages in civilian goods, and the part in which he implied that there wasn't anything that could be done about it.

That wasn't the whole of Henderson's speech. For Henderson went on to say this:

"For the first time in their lives millions of workers are going to have the buying power to really satisfy their wants. We can't produce all the range of commodities they will desire to buy, because of armament drains on raw material supplies, but we can increase our production of non-competitive goods. These people are going to be able to eat better food, to wear better clothes, and to live in better houses. Such products are generally not competitive with the defense program or, if they are, the competition comes in fields where capacity is adequate to take care of both an increased civilian and armament demand. We should stimulate production of such goods."
