Stroške za vzdrževanje čet Zdrženih narodov na Srednjem vzhodu in v Kongu je izglasovala glavna skupščina ZN in ona jih je tudi razdelila na temelju ključa, po katerem pripadajo članice za kritje rednih stroškov ZN.

Družene države in njihovi zavezniki so prav zaradi tega prenesli razpravo o pošiljavi čet ZN na Srednji vzhod leta 1956 in v Kongo leta 1960 v glavno skupščino.

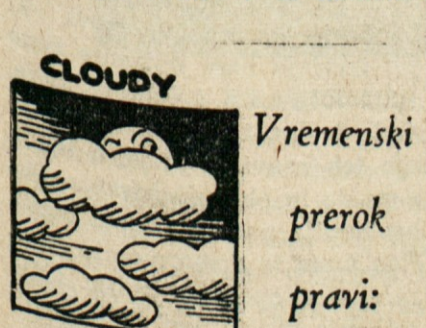

Indonezijski dijaki se vežbajo v požiganju knjig

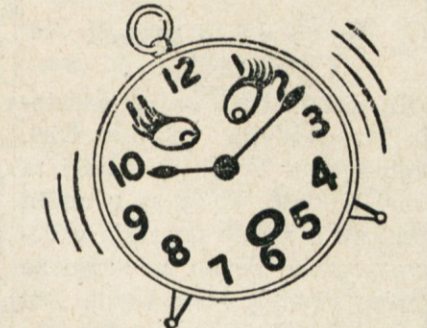

KARACHI, Pak. — Predsednik indijske vlade Sastry se je na poti s konference v Kairu pretekli teden ustavil tudi v Karachiju in se dalj časa razgovarjal s predsednikom Pakistana Ayubom.

Upanje da bi sestanek kaj zmanjšal napetost med Karacijem in New Delhijem, je bilo prazno. Komaj je dobil Ayub znova vabilo od nove sovjetske vlada za obisk v Sovjetsko zvezo, je to izrazil za nov napad na Indijo in posebno na Zdruzene države, ki so "voljne oborožiti vse dežele okoli rdeče Kitajske" proti njej.

Ayuba je povabil na uradni obisk že Nikita Hruščev, sedaj je povabilo v imenu novih vodnikov Brežnjeva in Kosygina obnovil sovjetski poslanik Nesterenko, ki je letel od tod v uradno glavno mesto Ravalpindi, da pojasni Ayubu ozadje spremembe v Moskvi.

Johnson vodi 2:1 na vsem Srednjem zahodu

Gallup je dognal, da je na Srednjem zahodu povprečno 63% volivcev za Johnsona in le 31% za Goldwaterja.

PRINCETON, N.J. — Demokratska kandidata vodita na Srednjem vzhodu z več kot 2:1 v sedanji volivni borbi za predsednika in podpredsednika ZDA. Ta predel obsega 12 držav, vse od Ohia do Kansasa in od Minnesote do Missourija. Povpraševanje je bilo izvedeno pred odstavitvijo Hruščeva v Sovjetski zvezi in pred razkritjem Jenkinsonove aretacije.

Gallup je ugotovil, da je razpoloženje volivcev skoro popolnoma enako v vseh državah Srednjega zahoda neoziraje se na to, ali so bolj na vzhodu, na jugu ali severu. Poročilo pravi, da je zadnje povpraševanje razpoloženja volivcev pokazalo, da sta demokratiški predsedniški in podpredsedniški kandidati v omenjenem predelu dežele pred republikanskima tako daleč kot nikdar doslej v tem stoletju, niti v času predsednika Roosevelta 1. 1936, ko je ta zmagal pri volitvah z 62,5% glasov. Gallup pravi, da so se volivci v začetku oktobra začeli v mali meri nagibati na stran Golwaterja, da pa se je to naglo ustavilo.

Težko je reči, kak vpliv imajo na razpoloženje volivcev spremembe zadnjega tedna v

Moskvi in Londonu ter razkritje aretacije pred sedmikovnega glavnega pomočnika v Beli hiši W. Jenkinsa zaradi nemorale. Sodijo, da so dogodki v mednarodni politiki nekako prekrili in odtehtali izgube, ki jih bi sicer prineslo demokratom Jenkinsonovo odkritje.

Ruska raketa močnejša od ameriške Saturn A?

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Predsednik Sovjetske akademije znanosti M. V. Keldysh je trdil, da je raketa, ki je pognala na pot okoli Zemlje vesoljsko vozilo "Vzhod" s tremi kozmonavti pretekli teden, močnejša od vseh, kar jih je bilo kdaj uporabljenih v te namene kjerkoli na svetu. Brez dvoma je mislil pri tem na ameriško raketo Saturn A, ki je pretekli januar pognala na pot okoli Zemlje 20.000 funtov težko breme in o kateri je svet doslej mislil, da je najmočnejša na vsem svetu. Njena potisna sila je po uradnih podatkih NASA 1,500,000 funtov.

Konstantin P. Feoktistov, znanstvenik, ki se je udeležil poleta z "Vzhodom", je razkril, da je bila ta vesoljska ladja opremljena s poleg običajnimi raketami za zaviranje tudi s posebnimi nove vrste, ki uporabljajo motorje z elektriko nabitih delcev. Te vrste raketni motor so preskusili v Združenih državah v letošnjem juliju. Kozmonavt je povedal, da je vesoljsko vozilo "Vzhod" pristajalo s pomočjo padala in zaviralnih raket, ki so njegovo brzi- no v bližini tal znižale na praktično nič in je bil zato pristonek brez vsakega sunka, kot bi se vsedel na posteljo.

Špijanski sateliti se zmeraj bolj uveljavljajo

WASHINGTON, D.C. — O delu in nalogah špijanskih satelitov molči Amerika pa tudi Rusija. Zato o njih vemo le malo. Drži le, da so poslali Rusi že 48 svojih špijanskih satelitov okoli Zemlje. Znani so pod imenom Kosmos. Prvi ruski satelit leta okoli Zemlje že od marca 1962. Naši strokovnjaki trdijo, da ima precej ruskih satelitov samo nalogo, da fotografirajo našo Zemljo.

Seveda tudi Amerika ne ostaja za Rusi. Koliko naših špijanskih satelitov leta okoli Zemlje, je tajna. Strokovnjaki pa ne taji, da skrbno opazujejo tudi vse, kar se godi na Ruskem in Kitajskem. Da smo lahko kdaj bodo Kitajci prvič presku-

sili svoje atomsko strelivo, so nam največ pomagali naši sateliti, ki so že 3 leta opazovali kraj, kjer so sedaj Kitajci napravili prvi uspešen poskus z eksplozijo atomskega streliva. Naši kot ruski sateliti letajo v višini 120 do 300 milj. Naši letajo nad Kitajsko v višini 300 milj, da jih kitajske kontrolne postaje ne morejo hitro opaziti in motiti.

Jamajka in Trinidad-Tobago silita v Organizacijo ameriških držav

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Le malo kdo ve, da imamo čisto blizu nas dve novi republiki: Jamajko in Trinidad-Tobago. Obe sta bili preje angleški koloniji. Obe se želita vključiti v Organizacijo ameriških držav, pa tega ne moreta doseči. V pravilih Organizacije ni namreč nikjer predviden postopek za sprejemanje novih članic.

Ko se je pred 16 leti ustanovila Organizacija, ni nihče mislil, da bi še kdaj želel priti v to družbo, in zato v pravilih ni nobenega paragrafa, ki bi omogočil obema republikama vstop.

Izvršni odbor Organizacije je sedaj dobil nalogo, da predlaga spremembo pravil in določi postopek za sprejem.

Politika mu je pokvarila ženitovanjsko potovanje

LONDON, Ang. — Konservativni politik Stanley je odložil svojo poroko na čas, ko bo sedel v angleškem parlamentu. Bil je res izvoljen in se hotel poročiti. Tu pa je zadel na nepričakovano oviro.

Stranka mu ne pusti, da bi šel na ženitovanjsko potovanje. Mora namreč stalno čepeti v parlamentu, ker ima socijalistična vlada samo 4 glasove večine in lahko izkoristijo konservativci vsako priložnost, da jo vržejo. Ima pa le eno tolažbo. Stranka mu je dovolila, da si med konservativnimi poslanci poišče usmiljeno dušo, ki ne bo hodila v parlament tistih 14 dni, ko bo Stanley imel druge važnejše osebne opravke.

Sv. oče daroval Indiji \$120,000

VATIKAN. — Sv. oče bo šel na evharistični kongres v Indijo. Kongres bo koncem novembra. Ker ve, kako veliko je pomanjkanje hrane v tej deželi, je odredil, da njegova administracija da \$100,000 za nakup ameriške pšenice in doda še \$20,000 za prevozne stroške.

Blago in prevoz bo oskrbela znana ameriška dobrodelna organizacija Catholic Relief Services. Organizacija ima svojo podružnico tudi v Rimu. Vodi jo še zmeraj msgr. Landi, ki ga naši begunci, ki so bili v Italiji, vsaj po imenu zelo dobro poznajo.

Mozambiška osvobodilna fronta objavila splošen upor

DAR ES SALAAM, Tang. — Mozambiška osvobodilna fronta, ki ima tu svoje glavno oporišče, je objavila te dni splošen upor proti oblastem v portugalskem Mosambiqu na vzhodni obali Afrike.

Portugalci trdijo, da je Mosambique enakopraven sestavni del Portugalske, afriški nasprotniki kolonializma pa smatrajo Mosambique za portugalsko kolonijo in zahtevajo, da se Portugalci od tam umaknejo in dajo deželi svobodo. Ker se Portugalci za te zahteve ne brigajo, so njihovi afriški nasprotniki organizirali Mozambiško osvobodilno fronto in ji pomagali izvežbati nekaj sto gverilcev, ki jih skuša sedaj spraviti preko meje v Mosambique.

Duhovit delomrznež

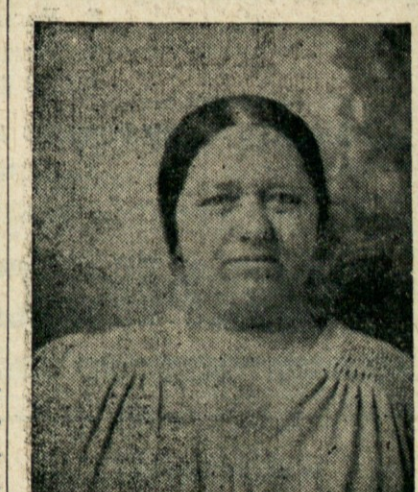

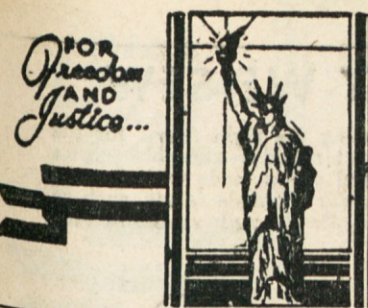

Nutritional Wages

Workers paid in food instead of cash are helping more than 40 underdeveloped countries from Indonesia to Bolivia to catch up with the 20th century. Under this United Nations operation, called the World Food Program (WFP), money-short countries can pay all or part of labor costs for new schools, roads or irrigation systems with commodities contributed by more prosperous governments. Administered by the U.N.'s Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the World Food Program has resources totaling \$91 million, mostly in cereals, milk, eggs, meat, fish, sugar, tea and other foods. The pooled foodstuffs are funneled to applicant countries for rigidly screened and approved projects. Thus, WFP pays workmen building school canteens in Togo, farm-to-market roads in Turkey or irrigation systems in Senegal. As WFP director A. H. Boerma points out: "Ours is not a relief program. Its purpose is to create jobs, improve nutrition and by helping others to help themselves—build projects that are of permanent value to a nation's well-being."

SHORTS ON SPORTS

Every Pilot Should Be Present At Series

How many major league managers were at the World Series? Not as many as should have been. It may be significant that among those present were Herman Franks and Billy Herman, who had just been appointed pilots of the Giants and Red Sox, respectively, and were receiving congratulations. It may be an indication that when a man is new in the job of managing, the World Series is something special. It may also be significant that Danny Murtaugh was there. By his own decision, because of ill health, Murtaugh no longer is a major league manager, but this was further proof of where his heart is. There were several other managers on hand, but unless all of them are present for the World Series, barring some vital excuse, it is a slap at baseball. The World Series is the greatest showpiece in sports. It commands the respect and attention of sports-minded fans around the world. It should command similar respect and attention from the managers.

Bo Will Seek Compensation For His "\$15,000" Suspension

San Diego, Calif. — The Angels' controversial southpaw, Bo Belinsky, said he intends to file a court claim to receive compensation for his suspension. Following a pool exhibition with Angels' pitcher Dean Chance, October 8, Belinsky said he hopes to meet with Commissioner Ford Frick on November 12. Belinsky was suspended following an argument with Los Angeles Times sports writer Braven Dyer in a Washington hotel, August 14, in which Dyer claimed the pitcher knocked him unconscious. The pitcher says the suspension cost him \$15,000 in salary, legal fees and loss of bargaining power for next season. He said he is sure that he will be traded and that the team he signs with will ask him to drop the suit. "I'll tell them all the same thing," he said. "I won't do it."

Series Games Shown Live On Television In Mexico

New York, N.Y. — For the first time, World Series games this year were televised live in Mexico, thanks to arrangements made by the Gillette Safety Razor Company. The picture signals were transmitted over the microwave facilities of the Mexican national telephone company to television stations in Mexico City, Monterrey, Guadalajara and other cities. However, instead of using the U.S. descriptions, the telecasts picked up the voices of Gillette's team of three Spanish-speaking announcers. They were Pablo Ruelas Nunez, a Mexican living in New York City; Musiu LaCavalerie, a Venezuelan, and Felo Ramirez, a Cuban residing in Puerto Rico. Their accounts also were carried by radio to Mexico, Venezuela, Colombia, Puerto Rico and all Central American countries. Fidel Castro notwithstanding, Cuban fans listened to the broadcasts, it was learned.

Mele Owns 306-272 Log In 3 1/2 Seasons as Pilot

Twin Cities, Minn. — Sam Mele has a 306-272 record as manager of the Twins, his only managing job. Mele replaced Cookie Lavagetto as Twins' manager in June, 1961. The Twins won 45 and lost 49 the rest of that year. In 1962, they were 90-70, finishing second. In 1963, they were 92-70, finishing third, and this year they had a 79-83 mark, finishing in a tie for sixth.

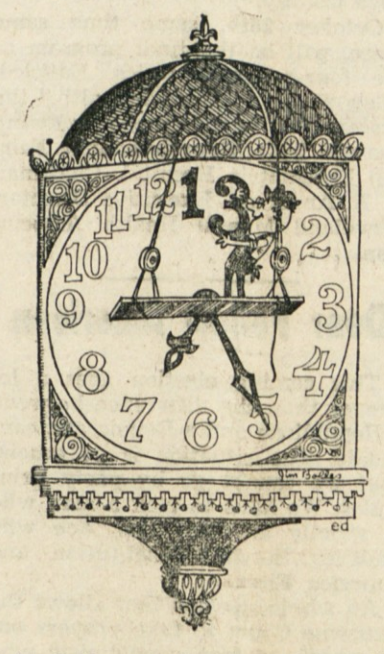

United Appeal

Newcomers to the United States, hampered by a language barrier, often find themselves beset with difficulties in adjusting to a new way of living. The Nationalities Services Center, a Red Feather agency, supported by United Appeal campaign funds, is a haven for the immigrant, helping him through the difficult period of orientation in his new country and encouraging his participation in community life.

One of the Center's activities is helping immigrants who wish to become citizens with the technicalities of filing various papers required by the government such as applications of naturalization, creation of record of lawful entry and extension of visitor's stay.

Occasionally, the center is confronted with an unusual case such as that of Mrs. H., a native of Germany who immigrated to the United States with her parents. When her father was naturalized several years later, Mrs. H., still a minor, derived citizenship through him.

Since she had never taken the trouble of applying for a certificate on naturalization for herself, Mrs. H. had no record of citizenship when she applied for a passport years later in order to visit relatives in Germany. The Nationalities Services Center assisted Mrs. H. in filing an application for a certificate of derivative citizenship which included documents proving her relationship with her father. A representative of the center also called on the immigration Service, explaining that Mrs. H.'s vacation plans had already been made and expedited processing of her application.

Mrs. H.'s "sentimental journey" to the country she had left as a small child took place on schedule. Immigrants may learn of American Life and customs at Center-sponsored classes on everything from the English language and American history and government to traffic safety.

In 1963, the Center provided technical assistance in immigration matters to over 180 cases each month. The United Appeal 1964 goal of \$13,915,000, if raised, will provide the Center with funds to maintain its services and programs for newcomers of all ethnic groups. From Oct. 19-29th a volunteer army of over 50,000 Greater Clevelanders will solicit funds for Nationalities Services Center and 149 other Red Feather agencies and the Red Cross.



Euclid Says "Help"

by ROBERT M. DEBEVEC

Do you spend more money for food, clothing, shoes and other necessities than you did twelve years ago? There's no question about it, because the cost of living has been going up pretty steadily since 1945.

A fact you may not have thought about is that naturally the cost of running a city government, such as the City of Euclid, has also been going right up along with your expenses. The only difference between you and the City is that your wages have been keeping pace with living expenses, while Euclid's income for operating expenses was fixed by its Charter in 1932 at six mills.

The Charter Amendment which you will vote on November 3 if you live in Euclid, would increase the tax limitation for operating funds by only two mills. This represents \$2.00 per thousand of tax valuation. This is certainly cheap insurance for adequate police and fire protection, street maintenance, rubbish and garbage collections and other needed services in Euclid.

All but one department of Euclid are operating at a lower financial standard than other county and suburban averages.

Louis J. Zgonc, president of the Euclid Chamber of Commerce says that the Chamber is 100% for the passage of this Charter Amendment.

The Euclid Democratic Club has gone on record as favoring passage of the Charter Amendment.

Mayor Sims says the Charter Amendment must be passed "to maintain adequate protection of life and property in the City."

Euclid Public Library

The Library building levy will be on ballot November 3, 1964. The Main Library is literally bulging at its seams. Over 45,000 books are housed where only 30,000 should be. The children's room is much too small — the adult reading room is much too small.

The proposed addition will cost over \$600,000. The Library Board has accumulated over \$300,000. The one mill levy would bring in about \$300,000.

One mill for one year is 10 cents per one hundred dollars of home evaluation. For a home evaluated at \$6,000, this would mean about \$6.00 a year to the taxpayer FOR ONLY ONE YEAR.

This new addition one and one half times as large as the present building would provide: more room for books, more room to browse and read, more reference space, more conference and meeting areas, more children's and young adult facilities, more office and storage space. The Euclid Public Library with its Main Library and fifteen school libraries serves a community of close to 70,000 people. It is the place where children from public and parochial schools go to get the much needed additional assigned reference book and recreational books. To give the type of service that Euclid needs and expects, this new addition is a must FOR the people of Euclid.

The greater our material abundance, the more faithfully we should build and sustain our spiritual values.

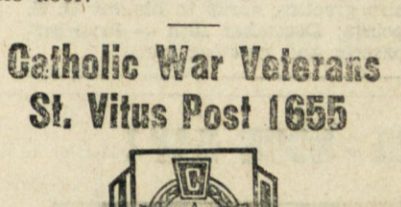

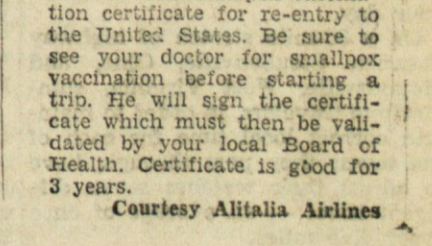

VETERANS PENSION ACT. On the last day of the 88th Congress the House and Senate took final action on H.R. 1927, to improve and liberalize the non-service-connected pension program for veterans. It is estimated that approximately 1.3 million veterans, widows and dependents of World War I, World War II, and the Korean Conflict will benefit under the provisions of the new legislation.

Those in the lowest income brackets will benefit most. For example, a single veteran with income of \$600 a year or less will get \$100 a month (beginning January 1, 1965), a \$15 increase. The pension of a veteran with two dependents and income of \$1000 a year or less will increase from \$95 to \$110 a month. A widow with one child and annual income of \$1000 or less will get an increase from \$75 to \$80.

Many veterans with non-service-connected disabilities who have been barred from pensions because of their wives' income will now be eligible. Under the old law, any income of a spouse in excess of \$1,200 a year was counted as income of the veteran. Under the new law, all earned income of a spouse is excluded in computing the veteran's income. Earned income is that derived from wages or self-employment.

Veterans with non-service-connected disabilities should check their eligibility for these new benefits also: (1) They can exclude certain income, such as profit from sale of non-business real or personal property, in determining eligibility for pensions. (2) The additional allowance for those so disabled that they need the assistance of another person is increased from \$70 a month to \$100 a month. (3) For the first time, veterans who are permanently confined to their homes will draw \$35 a month in addition to their pensions.

In addition to the pension provisions, the new legislation permits a reopening of National Service Life Insurance for veterans with service-

connected disability and also for a limited group with non-service-connected disability who are generally rated as uninsurable by private companies. Veterans have a year, starting May 1, 1965, in which to apply.

Americans have long believed that the men who have defended this country in wartime deserve the protection of pension programs. This new bill provides a long-needed revision. It is an important step in the direction of telling time to veterans and their widows will be able to afford the goods and services essential for a healthful and self-respecting life.

PEACE CORPS AND PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS

When the Peace Corps was organized many of us were concerned about the effect of such an agency on the work of American private organizations already abroad. However, real cooperation between such organizations as CARE, 4-H Foundation, National Grange, Co-op League and others, has taken place. Over 60 projects have been undertaken with these groups. The Peace Corps has significantly augmented private activities in the field of service to foreign countries, and at the same time private organizations have been of considerable assistance to the Peace Corps.

CHRISTMAS MAILINGS

There is less than a month left in which to mail Christmas packages to service men and others overseas who get their mail through Army, Air and Fleet Post Offices. The U. S. Post Office Department has set November 10 as the deadline for such Christmas mailings. Other suggested mailing deadlines: November 30 — all surface mail to Alaska and Hawaii; December 5th — all gift parcels to distant U. S. points; December 10th — air parcels to APO and FPO addresses; also greeting cards to distant U. S. points; December 15th — local gift parcels and greeting cards.

Big Ben in New York's Grand Central Station, requires TWO men. One must climb INSIDE the clock to move the hand.

Then there are the countless household Baby Ben clocks that must be adjusted. When you set your Baby Ben back one hour on October 25th, will you still follow superstition and move it ahead 11 hours? Westclox engineers say that any clocks or watches, with the exception of chime clocks, can be turned back without damage to the timepiece.

Practically as difficult as keeping track of daylight saving time is keeping track of the country's four time zones — and these time zones were designed to take confusion out of telling time. Before time zones, each town and city in the U. S. kept its own time according to the sun. For example, there were some 27 local times in Michigan, 38 in Wisconsin, 27 in Illinois and 23 in Indiana. Some 100 different time zones operated nationally, none of which were clearly definable. The railroads alone used 68 local times. Traveling from Maine to California, a traveler had to set his watch at least 20 times — shortening and lengthening his days as often.

Finally, the railroads — finding it impossible to operate when their conductors had to readjust watches every time they came to a town, and when passengers kept missing trains — standardized their timetables by setting up the four time belts.

To many people, this system is fine, but it is often disadvantageous to business men. To a large company with a plant in California and home office in New York, there is actually only one hour in the day — 2 p. m. to 3 p. m. (E.S.T.) — when executives from both locations can conveniently get on the phone and discuss business. They only have a one-hour day! Complicating matters even more is the fact that communications are becoming so simple that people think nothing of making calls to the other side of the world... forgetting that the phone will ring there in the middle of the night.

Going from the sublime — our happy little 24-hour day — to the ridiculous... for a man standing at the North Pole, a day could be as long as a turn of the head. For him, it would be noon at his nose, 6 a. m. at his right ear, 6 p. m. at his left ear and midnight at the back of his head.

There are all sorts of ways to lengthen or shorten your day, but October 25th is the opportunity at hand. Just be sure you don't waste your extra hour trying to figure which way you turn the clock. Here is a reminder from Westclox: Spring forward, fall back!

As announced recently, one of the new rides for the 1965 season will be a 315-foot tower ride which will be built near Cedar Point's famous Mile-Long beach.

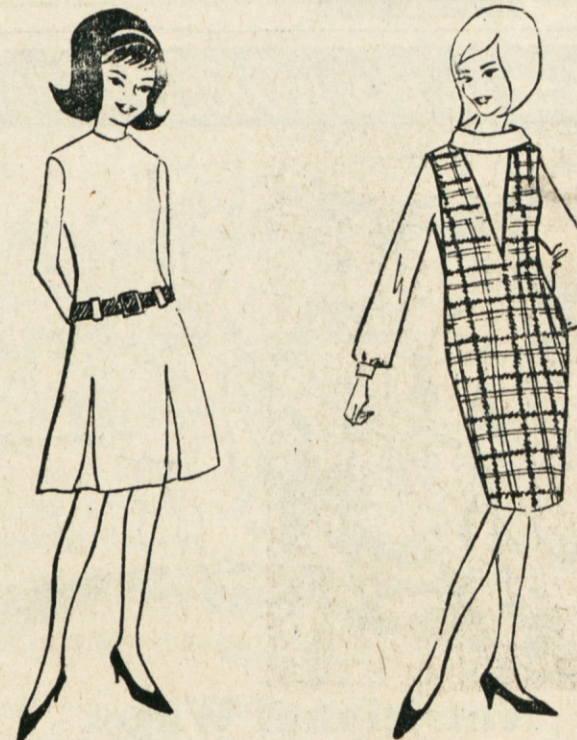
"Providing fun for nearly two million persons is not the easiest job in the world," said Roose, "but it certainly can be classified as one of the most interesting."

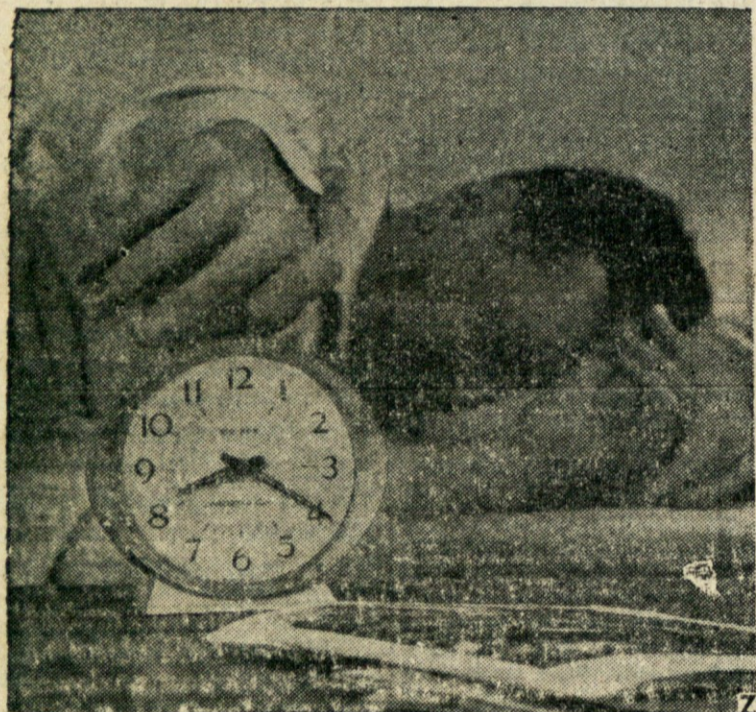

COMING — THE 25 - HOUR DAY!



Getting up is difficult enough on normal days. Don't get up an hour too soon on your 25-hour day. Remember to turn alarm clock BACK when Daylight Saving Time ends this year.

Time WILL wait for millions of people this October 25th. One whole hour! That's when clocks go counter-clockwise — from daylight saving time to standard time — for nearly half our population.

Who hasn't said, "if only I had more time..." Well this is it — the one day of the year with 25 hours! Experts at Westclox, world's largest manufacturer of timepieces, researching what the average American does with this precious gift of time and the effects caused by inconsistent use of Daylight Savings Time, found that over 50% actually spent it sleeping. The average person reads 250 words a minute and with the extra hour some will make a 15,000-word dent in their favorite books. Music lovers can listen to three extra 20-minute LP recordings. Political candidates can shake an extra 1000 hands before Election Day.

But, this can happen only in certain places. Why? Because daylight saving is a crazy quilt of inconsistency — some have it while others do not. Often communities right next door to each other go by different time systems... and confusion is king. For instance, not too long ago, charter-bus operators carrying football fans to a Notre Dame game in South Bend, Indiana, arrived at the stadium one hour AFTER kick-off. The bus company was operating on Eastern Standard Time instead of Daylight Time. Nonetheless, there was a humorous ending: strains of "I Didn't Know What Time It Was" rose from the spectators who experienced a 23-hour day.

On a 35-mile stretch of highway between Steubenville, Ohio, and Moundsville, West Virginia, summertime travelers, in order to maintain correct local time for each of the towns they pass through, have to adjust their watches seven different times — an average of once every five miles.

For someone living in a daylight saving zone, October 25th will be

the 25-hour day. But should he decide to take a trip, it's a different story altogether. If he lives in the East and flies to the West Coast, his will be a 24-hour day — unless, of course, he flies into a section not on daylight saving time. Then he will have a 27-hour day. Someone on the West Coast flying East gets the rough end of the deal — his day is only 22-hours long... or 21, or 23, as the case may be. Obviously, our "shrinking world" makes a sham of our ability to tell time... or to determine how long our days are. And just when we think we've got it figured out, daylight saving creates confusion again.

Depending on your attitude about daylight time, you'll either laud or lampoon frugal Ben Franklin. It was his idea to begin with, but it wasn't until 150 years later that his suggestion was put to use. During World War I the Americans and Germans agreed to wage war by daylight saving time to conserve electricity. After the war, farmers argued so vehemently against the daylight system, complaining of confused cows and uncooperative chickens, that it was dropped. World War II forced the issue again putting the entire country on War Time and in 1947 it was left to the states on an optional basis.

Not only are mental gymnastics involved in telling time these days, economic and physical effort is needed, too. Railroads spend about half a million dollars every year to print timetables with the correct schedules for summer time. TV stations and networks spend \$1.6-million to tape programs for retransmitting to viewers so the shows will reach them at prime times.

Then, there are the millions of clocks that have to be moved ahead or back an hour in the daylight saving sections. In scores of cities all over the country men have to change the time on tower clocks by hand. Changing the hands on the world's largest indoor clock, the Westclox
