Delavec je veliko, ki ponuja svojo delavno moč na prodaj. Velika tovarna za izdelovanje škroba P. F. kompanije je prenehal z delom v mesecu aprili. Pri Quacker kompaniji delavci le tri dni v tednu. Postaviti je dala nove stroje, ki bodo nadomestili prejšnje številne delavcev.

Centralna delavska organizacija debatira o vprašanju, ako bi ne bilo pametno, da se delo organiziranih delavcev omeji le na tri dni v tednu.

Tacoma, Washington. — V tej državi bodo primarne volitve dne 11. septembra. Kandidati starih strank nastopajo v vlogi farmarskih prijateljev in oblikujejo postave, ki bodo pospeševali zadružništvo.

Chicago, Ill. — Stavka sprevidnikov in železniških zaviracev na zgodnjih železnicah ne more legalno začeti preje kot v mesecu oktobru, akoravno v sprevodnikov in zaviraci do zadnjega glasujejo za stavko. Železniški sprevodniki in zaviraci vprav sedaj glasujejo o stavki in izid glasovanja bo naznajan dne 2. septembra. Pridružuje se da bodo sprevodniki in zaviraci soglasno glasovali za stavko. Toda odborniki njih organizacije ne bodo mogli proglašati stavko, ker jih Watson-Parkerjev zakon ovira skozi trideset dni. Predsednik Coolidge lahko proglaša stanje izredne potrebe in imenuje komisijo, ki dočne fakto. Vsaka stavkovna poteka se v teku trideset dni po končanem odglasovanju strog kaznjuje. Oni, ki odrede stavko, se lahko obsođajo v ječo uniju pa na pličio visoke denarne globe.
