Washington, D. C., 22. jun. — Predsednik Roosevelt je sinoči poslal telegram načelnikom Youngstown Steel Corp. in Youngstown Sheet & Tube Co., naj ne zaprejo tovarn. Predsednik pravi, da se je s tem pridružil vladi predloženemu odboru, ki bil imenovan, da poravnava konflikt.

Rooseveltov poziv je bistveno pomemben. Dobil sta ga Tom Girdler, predsednik Republic Steel Corp. in Frank Purnell, predsednik Youngstown Sheet & Tube Co. in se glasila:

"Delavska tajnica me je obvestila, da je vladi predložila odbor, kateremu načeluje Charles P. Taft, apeliral na vas, da ne obnovite obrata v tovarni v Youngstownu. V interesu vaše varnosti in mirne poravnave spora, kar lahko pričakujemo in tudi dosežemo, se pridružujem temu apelu."

## VLADNA KRIZA V FRANCIJI ŠE NI KONČANA

Policija potlačila socialistične demonstracije  
BLUM DOBIL ZAUPANICO

Pariz, 22. jun. — Policija je danes razpršila okrog 3000 socialistov, ki so organizirali demonstracije v priloge Leonu Blumu v parku Luna in na trgu Place de la Concorde. Blum je podal ostavko svojega kabineta zadnje nedelje, ko mu je senat odrekel izjemno oblast, katero je zahteval, da potegne Francijo iz finančne krize.

S klci: "Mi hočemo Bluma!" so socialisti prikorakali na trg Concorde, kjer jih je že čakala policija. V kratkem času jih je razpršila in vzpostavila mir. Govorniki na socialističnem shodu so silovito napadali senatorje, ker so odklonili izjemno finančno oblast Blumu in v tem povzročili padec njegove vlade. Kdo bo nasledil Bluma, še ni znano, dasi izgleda, da bo Camille Chautemps, socialni radikal in bivši premier, organiziral novo vlado. Socialisti so na svojem shodu naglašali, da zaupajo Blumu.

Predsednik Albert Lebrun je poveril sestavo nove vlade Chautempsu, ki je bil državni minister brez portfelja v Blumovem kabinetu. Da li bo Chautemps ušel, še ni gotovo. Včeraj se je povzpotal z voditelji stranke, ki tvorijo ljudsko fronto. Ker tvorijo socialisti najmočnejšo politično stranko v Franciji, je Chautemps odvisen od podpore te stranke. Vešč se glasja, da je ponudil ministrsko pozicijo Blumu kot voditelju socialistične stranke, če mu bo pomagal pri sestavi vlade.

Velike razlike ne bo ne glede na to, kdo sestavi vlado. Gotovo je, da bodo imeli v novem kabinetu glavno besedo predstavniki političnih strank, ki so združene v ljudski fronti — socialisti, socialni radikalci in komunisti.

## Hitler podržavl 900 katoliških šol

"Cerkve morajo nas ubogati!" pravi Goebbels

Berlin, 22. jun. — "Stari časi so za vaslejši odšli! Duhovščina pravi, da najvišja oblast je Bog, mi pa pravimo, da najvišja oblast v tej Nemčiji ni te zemlji smo mi in cerkev mora nas ubogati, če hoče živeti!"

Tako je rekel včeraj dr. Paul Goebbels, Hitlerjev minister propagande, ko je govoril tisočem v berlinskem olimpijskem stadionu ob proslavi poganškega praznika solnčnega obrata.

Medtem je bila objavljena vest, da je vlada izpremenila 900 katoliških privatnih šol na Bavarskem v javne šole "z dovoljenjem staršev", ki so baje z večino odlašovali za ta preobrat. Mnogo privatnih katoliških šol je pa bilo zaprtih zaradi nemoralnih činov, izvršenih nad šolarji.

## Olajšava ponovnega pristopa

Enajsta redna konvencija je odobrila naslednjo resolucijo v olajšavo onim, ki so morali iz enega ali drugega opravičenega vzroka pustiti jednoto ali si znižati zavarovalnico:

VPRAŠANJE OLAJŠAV ZA PRISTOP BVŠIH ČLANOV IN ONIH, KI SO MORALI VSLED RAZMER ZNIZATI ZAVAROVALNINO

V olajšanje onim, ki so morali odstopiti od SNPJ radi brezposelnosti ali kakih drugih opravičenih vzrokov, in dalje v prid onim, ki so morali radi istih vzrokov znižati poverilnostno zavarovalnico.

Enajsta redna konvencija SNPJ sklene, da odstopli člani lahko pristopijo nazaj kot stari člani, to je z nepretrganim včlanjenjem, ne glede na njihovo sedanjo starost, pod pogojem, da se podvržejo v smislu pravih zdravniški preiskavi in poravnajo ves zaaostl asessment po merilu svojih novih zavarovalnin, toda po lestvicu, po kateri so plačevali pred odstopom. Kdor za poravnaje zaaostlega assessmenta nimá aredtvev, se mora ob pristopu obvezati, da SNPJ odračuna dolg od njegovih podpor, kadar je do njih upravičen in so mu nakazane, če pa do teh ni upravičen, se dolg odračuna po njegovi smrti od smrtinske zavarovalnice.

Onim članom, ki so morali radi še navedenih vzrokov znižati smrtinskega zavarovalnico, jo lahko obnove do prejšnje višine ne glede na njih sedanjo starost po lestvicu, kakor so jo plačevali ob času znižanja. Ves zaaostl asessment mora poravnati na podlagi istih olajšav, kakor so v tej resoluciji navedene za bivše člane.

O vsaki aplikaciji sklepa v obeh slučajih na podlagi pravih in interesov SNPJ upravni osek.

Ako aplikant, kakršni so zapopadeni v tej resoluciji, smatra, da mu je upravni osek z odklonitvijo aplikacije storil krivico, se sme pritožiti glavnemu odboru in navesti mora razloge v podprte svoje pritožbe.

Ako se bi izkazala ta resolucija v kaki zadevi nejasna, naj jo v razrešitven slučaj tolmachi glavni odbor. Doba, v kateri prisadeti člani lahko pridejo nazaj v organizacijo pod navedenimi pogoji, je od 1. julija do 31. decembra 1937.

V smislu navedene resolucije lahko opet postanejo člani oni, ki so bili primorani jednoto pustiti radi brezposelnosti ali finančnih poteškoč, istotako člani, kateri so morali znižati smrtinsko zavarovanje, lahko istega svidajo, toda pod pogojem, da prestanjo ZDRAVNIŠKO PREISKAVO, kateri se morajo podvržeti prvi kot drugi. Starost v teh slučajih ne dela razlike, to je, da lahko nazaj pristopijo tudi oni, ki so prekoristili 50. leto.

Assessment mora biti od člana, kateri si hoče obdržati stare pravice smrtinskega zavarovalnin, poravnati za ves čas, odkar je prenehal biti član in sicer za smrtinsko zavarovalnico, za katero se želi zavarovati SEDAŠ. Kdor assessmenta — v času, ko ni bil član — ne more poravnati takej, je v resoluciji pojasnjeno o vseh izbovah, katerih se ima držati vsak, aka hoče postati član.

Za boljšico in odličnostno podporo pa zavarovanje velja od dneva ponovnega sprejetja v jednoto, kar pomeni, da za imenovano zavarovanje ne mora ničesar plačati za dobo, ko ni bil član. Sprejeta resolucija velja LE ZA SMRTINSKO ZAVAROVANJE.

Pripomnimo še, da kdor se priliki ne bo poslužil v času kot resolucija določa, do 31. decembra tega leta, POZNEJE TEGA NE BO MOGEL STORITI, kar naj vsi prizadeji upoštevajo.

GOMPERS AVKLONJEN CIO

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Samuel Gompers, sin bivšega predsednika Ameriške delavske federacije, je bil suspendiran iz te organizacije, katero je njegov oče ustanovil.

Gompers je uposlen v federalnem delavskem departmentu in član krajevine unije Ameriške federacije vladnih uslužbencev. To in pet drugih je eksekutivni svet Ameriške delavske federacije suspendiral, ker so vodile opozicijo proti ADF Uniji, katero član je Gompers, je bila tudi obdožena, da drži v vodstvu prevatne elemente. Proti Gompersu nima eksekutiva ADF ničesar in ga je celo povabila, naj vstopi v novo unijo, ki je bila ustanovljena po suspenziji "upornih" unij, kar pa je odklonil. Dejal je, "da je proti dualnemu unionizmu, kakor je bil njegov oče."

Gompers je glavni klerk v delavskem departmentu. Poleg njega je bilo suspendiranih več drugih prominentnih osebnosti v delavskem gibanju, med temi Katharine Lenroot, večletna načelnica vladnega senškega biroja, in Grace Abbot, načelnica otroške divizije delavskega departamenta.

Podvzeti so bili že koraki, da se suspendirane unije pridružio k Lewisovi organizaciji CIO. Na zadnji konvenciji ADF je bilo suspendiranih pet drugih unij in te so tudi naznanile, da se hočejo združiti s CIO.

## Sovjetski letalci po- tujejo po Ameriki

Včeraj so poleteli v San Francisco

Oakland, Calif., 22. jun. — Trije ruski letalci — Skalov, Bajdukov in Beljakov — ki so prvi poleteli iz Moskve čez severni tečaj v Združene države v 63 urah, so včeraj prišli v San Francisco po zraku, toda v ameriškem letalu. Njihovo zgodovinsko letalo je ostalo v Vancouverju, Wash., kjer je prišlo na tla; tam bo razloženo in odposlano v zabojih v Moskvo.

Letalci nameravajo obiskati vsa večja mesta po Združenih državah in obiski bodo trajali okrog mesec dni. Rusi so gostje svojega poslanika Trojanovskega, ki je tudi njihov tolmach in z njegovo pomočjo so informirali javnost, da njihov prihodnji polet bo spet iz Moskve čez severni tečaj v New York.

Rusi so povedali, da jih je ta polet marsikaj naučil. Ni res, kar so prej trdili znanstveniki, da visoko nad severnim tečajem ni oblakov. Oni so bili do 6000 metrov visoko, a še ni bilo jasnega neba. Najnižja temperatura nad tečajem je bila 22 pod ničlo. Led na šipah je največje zlo za letalca. Istotako se led neprenehoma nabira na krilih letala. Neprenehoma so morali čistiti okenca in krila.

Namen konference je bil seznaniti upravni odbor z željo unije in pomožnih urednikov in pripraviti teren za razgovor ali pogajanje z glavnim odborom.

Ko se je pričela letna seja, je unija skušala aranžirati sestanek z glavnim odborom, toda ni uspela. Ko na par komunikacij ni dobila odgovora, je v petek popoldne prišel unijski odbor v urad na lastno iniciativno prav v času, ko smo bili pomožni uredniki pred glavnim odborom, da brani našo delo in čast... (Unija je bila pod vtisom, da smo šli preko odbora, kar pa ni odgovarjalo resnici.) V kratkem povedano: glavni odbor je v jedru zavzel alično stališče napram časnikarski uniji: kakor na prejšnji seji napram uniji uradniških delavcev. Nova pragmatika celo vsebuje točko, katere ne more podpisati nobena unija, namreč glede odslovitve uslužbenke v slučaju mojitve. Ako bi bil na splošno uveden ta princip, bi ne delala za plačo nobena poročnica.

Konvencija je imela vso moralno pravico, da instruiira upravni ali pa glavni odbor, na podlagi kakšnih pogojev se naj pogaja z unijami uslužbencev ali tiskarskih delavcev, ker je to pač gospodarsko in delavsko vprašanje jednote. Če bi bila to storila, bi ne bilo nobenega protesta s strani unij. Toda instrukcije so ena stvar, definitivni zaključki pa druga stvar. Pri kolektivnem pogajanju pa veljajo le taki zaključki, na katere pristanejo obe stranki kot rezultat skupnih razgovorov. Staro načelo, kar velja za Janeza, mora veljati tudi za Jožeta, še vedno drži in bo držalo. Je tudi jako demokratično.

Končno še o pridigah in lekcijah, da uslužbeni SNPJ ne potrebuje unije, oziroma naj njih unije ne smatrajo jednote kot navadnega delodajalca. Nekoč sem bil tudi jaz slinčnega nazora, toda človek se marsikaj nauči, ako se hoče učiti. Delodajalec so res različni: dobri, vzdržljivi in slabi. Jednoto sem vedno smatral za dobrega delodajalca in jo smatram še danes. Ampak tukaj imamo opraviti z relativnim pojmom, v kar se pa ne bom spuščal.

Noben delodajalec pa ni tako dober — tudi ne vedno — da bi delavcem ne bila potrebna strokovna organizacija. To velja za privatnika, korporacijo, vlado, ali pa delavsko organizacijo. Yes, tudi delavci znajo biti tiranski in samopašni kot kolektivni delodajalec. Deseta konvencija je na primer gledala na uslužbenke kot na nekakšne zajedalce. Njene odseke za plače se ni pri sestavljenju pragmatike zdelo niti vredno zaslišati uslužbencev, čeprav je potem konvenciji poročal, da je to storil. Konvencija smo morali tudi ponizno — in ponizjuče — prositi, naj se nas vendar usmili in nam pusti počitnice.

Iz zapisnika je razvidno, da je tudi prošla konvencija nas smatrala kot nekakšnega neobdiga-treba, vsaj se je pa čutila užajljena, ker smo po naših unijah zahtevali BONA FIDE kolektivno pogajanje. Pri vsem tem je zanimivo to, da imamo pri jednoti dvojno merilo: eno za uradniške delavce, drugo za tiskarje. Za slednje je BONA FIDE kolektivno pogajanje all right, za uslužbenke v uradu odveč, "ker smo bratje" (par članov dela tudi v tiskarni, toda nad temi se ne jokamo, da bodo nas upropastili). Gospodarski obstoj Prosvete je na primer odvisen le od pomožnih urednikov po izvajanju nekega delegata — od treh relativno najslabše plačanih uslužbencev izmed 21 moči, ki delajo v tiskarni in pri Prosveti. — Včasih smo pač čudni unionisti, čudni bratje in tudi čudni socialisti. Pa brez zamere!

Iz zapisnika je razvidno, da je bila konvencija zelo užajljena nado "predrnostjo" prizadetih unij in uslužbencev, oziroma nad "žaljivijo članstva, zastopaneega po delegatih", kakor se je izrazil eden izmed govornikov. Za to "predrnost" ali "žalitev" je konvencija uslužbenice in njih uniji "na lep način pokarala," kakor je bilo poročano v konvenčnem poročilu v Prosveti dne 1. junija.

Ker je slika o tej zadevi precej enostranska in tudi nejasna, želim podati drugo stran slike, da bo članstvo vedelo, kakšna je prav za prav vsa stvar. V boljše razumevanje je potrebno, da posežem nekoliko nazaj v našo unijsko zgodovino.

Pomožni uredniki smo se organizirali v American Newspaper Guildu meseca marca 1936, ali kakor hitro smo izvedeli o njegovi čikaški postojanki, ki je bila ustanovljena nekaj mesecev prej. V to sta nas gnala dva faktorja: želja po pripadanju k uniji kot razredno zavedni delavci, in drugič želja po protekciji in izboljšanju našega statusa kot medni delavci, kar velja za vsakega posameznika. Glede tega tudi uslužbenice jednote nismo in ne moremo biti izjema, pa naj nam kdo še bolj levite bere o "bratstvu" in podobnem. Nekaj mesecev pozneje so se organizirali tudi uslužbenici v tajniškem uradu in upravništvu.

Vprašanje unije uslužbencev v glavnem uradu je prišlo prvič pred glavni odbor na pelletni seji lanskega avgusta. Splošila ga je federalna unija Stenographers, Bookkeepers, Accountants & Assistants, ki je bila zadnje vržena iz Ameriške delavske federacije, ker ni hotela sketati proti stavkarjem CIO pri National Tea Co. Glavni odbor je zavzel stališče, da mu pravila veže roke in se končno rešil za deva s predlogom, da se vprašanje unije uslužbencev v glavnem uradu prepusti konvenciji.

## The Tide Turns

An analysis of the reports of 230 fraternal benefit societies for the year 1936, as contained in the 1937 edition of the Fraternal Compend-Digest, annual reference book of the fraternal system compiled and published by the Fraternal Field, indicates that, after losing ground during the readjustment and depression period, the tide has apparently turned and the fraternal system as a whole has resumed its merited growth.

For the second successive year there was a net gain in both adult and juvenile membership, which of course is the basic indicator of progress. Assets again showed a material increase, and a number of societies joined the ranks of the great majority now on an actuarially sound basis. There was a small decrease in total protection in force, but this was no doubt to be expected due to the readjustment in a number of cases of a considerable amount of insurance to a permanent level basis. If allowance were made for these readjustments, which affected the amount of insurance to a greater extent than the number of members, there would also have been a substantial gain in protection in force.

At the close of 1936 the societies listed in the Compend-Digest had a total benefit membership of 7,872,237—a net gain of 34,843. Total adult membership was 6,799,076—a gain of 22,731, and total juvenile membership was 1,073,261—an increase of 12,112. If these gains seem rather small it must be remembered that when a trend is reversed the change is scarcely noticeable at first, but if the necessary impetus is continued the momentum will gradually increase.

Total juvenile protection in force amounted to \$413,266,923—a net gain of \$14,177,950. Total insurance providing the usual death benefits was \$6,217,920,380, and in addition three societies providing accident benefits only had \$740,898,000 in force, making a grand total of \$6,958,818,380 of fraternal protection in force.

The soundness of the fraternal plan of operation was again demonstrated by a gain of approximately fifty-one million dollars in admitted assets during the year, the total on December 31 being \$1,168,827,403 as compared with \$1,117,614,680 on Dec. 31, 1935. The rapid growth of the funds accumulated by the thrift of fraternal members is indicated by the fact that on Dec. 31, 1936, there were 141 societies with admitted assets of more than \$1,000,000; 27 with more than \$10,000,000; 10 with more than \$25,000,000; 3 with more than \$50,000,000; while one had passed the one-hundred million mark.

With respect to the growth of the juvenile movement it is interesting to note that 133 of the 230 societies now have juvenile departments. Of these 35 have a juvenile membership of over 10,000; 11 have over 25,000; and three societies have more than 50,000 juvenile members. None of the juvenile departments have been in existence for much more than twenty years, while the majority have been organized within the last ten years, so the possibilities for future growth in this field are very apparent. Societies which have had juvenile organizations for a number of years are finding them one of the best sources of additions to the adult departments.

One troublesome factor with which fraternal executives, in common with life insurance companies and other financial institutions, have had to contend during the past year, is the continuing trend toward lower interest returns on sound securities. In some cases, among both the fraternal and commercial institutions, this has led to the adoption of more conservative interest assumptions. While no one can speak with assurance as to the future, many financial experts seem to be of the opinion that the bottom has been reached in this respect, and that a return to more reasonable interest rates will soon be apparent. Earnings on the investments of fraternal societies on the whole have held up very well, in view of the difficulties encountered, a fact for which fraternal management should receive due credit.

### REAL LABOR LEADERS WANTED.—INSURANCE COMPANY FINDS UNDERWEIGHT GOOD

Never in the history of America has there been a period so critical for the American workers as the present. Consciously or not, American labor is now undergoing its major revolution which will profoundly change the economic and social standards of life in general.

Confronted with such an extraordinary situation, characterized by new labor legislation and mass organization by industries, the workers of this country are facing today an urgent necessity for leaders of the extraordinary type and with the finest quality.

True, the ordinary leaders are not lacking; there are even some above the average and with plenty of courage and vision. These would suffice in normal times, but as stated, the present period is different. Tragically enough, in normal times there are many good leaders, eager to act but lacking opportunity to demonstrate their abilities; now there are mountains of chance—and a very few leaders to tackle the job.

What the American laboring masses need just now are a half a dozen real leaders. They need men and women—yes, women, too—with knowledge and principles, the social and economic character and honesty. Only such men and women can lead the masses through all sorts of trying circumstances, intrigues, provocations, extremist pitfalls and disregard for honest democracy, and all kinds of danger of violence; only such men and women can lead intelligently and not be swayed by emotion and passion.

Only such men and women as leaders will deserve and reap the everlasting respect and honor of millions of the workers regardless of the fact that they will be maligned, cursed, and charged with all possible crimes by their enemies outside and inside the working class.

### News from the insurance field:

The Metropolitan Life Insurance Company employs a corps of statisticians who have just given out a report entitled "Girth and Death", according to the daily press. In this report they declare that "distinctly obese men, those who are 35 per cent or more above the average weight, have a mortality one and a half times greater than that of men of average weight."

This is what they have found: Men from 25 to 34 per cent overweight have an "excess mortality" of 45 per cent, while among those 15 to 24 per cent overweight the excess mortality is 30 per cent.

Moreover, according to this yarn, the underweight after maturity is a favorable factor for long life. The best weight for longevity varies according to age: up to 30, slight overweight; 30 to 39, average weight; 40 to 49, slight underweight; ages 50 and over, an appreciable degree of underweight.

## Labor Unrest

The strike wave sweeping the nation now has inspired a great deal of questions on the part of the public as to what is behind the agitation. Henry Ford explains it away by an asinine statement that international bankers have taken over the trade union movement and that Labor troubles are only a part of their plan to institute a financial dictatorship in America. The Chamber of Commerce has its own explanation: Labor trouble is foreign. Labor trouble has its roots in Moscow. Labor trouble is communistic, un-American, anti-social and revolutionary.

It apparently has not occurred to the big chiefs of industry that organized Labor has invoked the right to strike for higher wages in order to earn more money with which to pay the constantly rising costs of living program by industry.

All during the depression, with millions of men out of employment, industry was on strike against the public because the public lacks buying power to consume the products of industry. The banks went on strike and refused to loan out needed capital to keep the blood stream of industry active. Everyone was a strike except Labor.

As soon as the federal government has dumped billions of dollars into the arteries of trade and commerce industry began to recover its losses by speed-up programs, by Labor displacing machines, by longer hours and lower pay. The bankers howl against PWA, AAA and the other federal projects. The industrialists echo the howls of the Chamber of Commerce. Yet it was these billions which revive business. It was boondoggling that started the wheels of industry. It was the "wild spending" of the government that opened the shop factories, mills and mines. And big business is prospering. All foodstuffs, clothing, building materials and the common necessities of life are booming. Long passed dividends are being paid, huge bonuses are being issued to favored stock owners, extra dividends are the order of the day.

But Labor's share in the profits of recovery are small and employment is on the decrease. There are more than 9,000,000 able-bodied workers idle today, and big business is trading on that surplus of Labor to depress wages and to increase hours of employment.

In the light of these facts it should not be hard for anyone outside the Labor movement to understand why there is Labor trouble in this country.—Minn. Union Advocate.

## "Living Wage" Not Enough

By Dr. Charles Stelzle

When the worker is compelled to struggle for the barest necessities—when he receives merely a "living wage"—there is little opportunity for the growth of the finer instincts which lead to the creation of a fuller life.

His struggle for self-preservation prohibits the development of self-culture. This is said with full appreciation of the strength of character which is developed even in the midst of poverty. But how can culture be nurtured in the soil of filth and want?

Many a shop girl, after a hard day's work, is compelled to spend her evenings in further monotonous toil in the home, because of the poverty of her parents or because of her own limited means. To such there can be little or no development of those qualities which make for the highest type of womanhood. The harshness of their daily toil crushes out many of the softer and gentler qualities.

The tragedy of such an existence lies in the fact that a woman is deprived of the greatest happiness of a normal woman's life, and at the same time she is unable to enter into her daily occupation with enthusiasm and vigor.

The woman in her home, crowded in by four walls of her kitchen; the workingman, whose daily path is from his home to the shop and from the shop to his home, cannot fail to show the influence of this restriction. The "reactions" which must come to them, especially in the case of the men, appeal merely to the physical side of their nature.

The limitations of poverty, then, are the terrible pressure due to a low standard of wages, and hence a low standard of living, and the lack of the power to appreciate the best things in life, because the higher instincts have been systematically ground out through long years of deadening toil.

The demand of the worker for a "living wage" is not enough. He has a right to demand a "cultural wage"—a wage that will lift him out of the realm of the beasts of the field—a wage that will give him not merely a LIVING but a LIFE.



# SNPJ Opens Doors to Former Members

**RESOLUTION ENABLING FORMER MEMBERS TO REENTER**

The eleventh regular convention of the SNPJ adopted the following resolution which enables those, who for sufficient reason, were forced to drop the Society, to re-enter; those, who for the same reason decreased their insurance, to increase it now to the previous level.

It enables former members of this Society, who were cancelled due to unemployment or other sufficient reasons to become members again, as well as to allow those members who decreased their insurance for the same reasons, to increase it to the original amount.

The eleventh regular convention renders a decision by which former members may be reinstated as old members under the previous age rate regardless of their present age, providing they pass a medical examination, and shall pay all arrears of assessments into the mortuary fund; assessment shall be based on the scale for the new amount of insurance, but according to the age rate previous to cancellation. In case that a member is financially able to pay all his due assessment at once, he must re-entering the Society, obligate himself that the Society deduct the amount due from his or her benefits when he or she is entitled to benefits which also include death benefit.

Members who were forced to decrease their insurance, as already stated above, may increase it to the previous amount regardless of their present age. Their assessment shall be based on the age rate before the decrease took place. The regulations apply for the members who want to increase their insurance, as the ones who desire to become members again.

The Administrative Committee shall decide upon every application for reinstatement of a member. In case that an applicant is rejected by the Administrative Committee, and he feels that injustice has been done, such applicant may file a complaint with the Supreme Board, providing that he has sufficient proof supporting his complaint.

Furthermore, if any part of this resolution is not explicit enough, it shall be interpreted by the Supreme Board. The period during which applicants may become reinstated according to the above provisions, shall be from July 1 to December 31, 1937.

In accordance with the above resolution former members who were cancelled due to unemployment or other financial difficulties may become members again; likewise, those members who were forced to decrease their insurance for the same reasons may increase their insurance to the original amount under the condition that these applicants pass medical examination. This regulation applies for both instances. It does not matter what age the applicant is at the present time for he may re-enter even though he is over 50 years of age.

Arrears of assessment must be paid for the entire period of cancellation, if the applicant wishes to retain his previous rights, i. e., the amount of insurance that he wishes to carry at present. If the applicant is unable to pay his assessment in arrears immediately, he may do as prescribed in the foregoing resolution.

Furthermore, the above resolution applies for death benefit insurance only. Sick and disability benefits of such reinstated members shall become effective from the date of entering the Society a second time, which means that no one can pay back for the amount of cancellation for sick and disability benefit insurance.

The period in which a cancelled member may join the Society according to this resolution is from July 1 to December 31, 1937. Those concerned should take this into consideration, for after that date they will not have this opportunity.

No one among the bluecoats was chagrined at seeing his brother reduced to the status of an animal, and suffering.

And not so very long ago—during the time of our recent convention—we all sat in at a meeting of one of our progressive groups and listened to their speaker deride people who read books and who study—listen to him say that we have too many people who are smart through book knowledge but not capable of distributing a leaflet—that such people will never amount to anything in service to the People.

**LOS ANGELES, CAL.**—Some time ago Upton Sinclair was asked in a telegram by Managing Editor of Literary Digest what he thinks of sit-down strikes as a new form of labor protest. He invited him to wire his opinion charges collect.

"For seventy five years big business has been sitting down on the American people and now I am delighted to see the process reversed. Big business denial of the right to organize has been an underground civil war all through my life time. Democracy is dead if the workers are defeated."

Uppy is right!

Why strikes? Strikes are tolerated as a means for minimum gains from time to time in the struggle for more and more life and civilization. Employers don't like such means. They want workers to take whatever they get from bosses and then they should keep their mouths shut.

The wage census for 1935 shows that average wages were \$831—\$2.76 per day. Some American incomes were over a million, or \$3,333 per working day, over 1200 times the average producer's pay.

Has the workman a grievance? Do some people produce 1200 times as much as the average working man?

It is clear that such is not the case, so the grievance is real. The strike is not necessarily the right means for the purpose. If not, why don't these brilliant captains of industry suggest some better or more proper means? What is the matter with their intellect? Don't they know how? Are they rugged wizards only when their personal gain and greed is concerned?

They don't like Roosevelt methods nor Socialism nor anything else that tends to curtail their never-satisfied gusto for more and more, thinking of the old Mark Hana slave driving racket which creates underconsumption and ties up business with depressions.

It won't be long now before another will embrace us if Roosevelt legislation will not be far-reaching enough to avert it. —PARTICLE.
