

**Discover Your roots
at Cleveland State**

If you have roots in Yugoslavia, there is a Slovenian course at Cleveland State University that may interest you.

Modern Language Arts 210, a four credit course, is a tutorial program for students with some background in the Slovenian language.

The course is designed to improve performance skills in the language, and to increase knowledge in the history and culture of Yugoslavia, according to Dr. Bruce A. Beatie, chairman of the CSU Modern Languages Department.

Enrollment problems had caused the Slovenian class to be discontinued in 1972, but it was revived a year ago with the help of the Slovenian-American Heritage Foundation, Inc. of Cleveland.

The foundation has gone from financing one-third of the expenses of the course to completely financing it this quarter.

The Slovenian course is run on a tutorial basis, with students in contact with the instructor two hours per week, instead of the usual four hours for a four credit course. Students do more work on their own under this type program. There are no prerequisites for the class. Advanced Slovenian language students assist beginners.

Mrs. Milena L. Salehar is the instructor for the two classes offered spring quarter. She was born in Yugoslavia and educated at Case Western Reserve University.

She is currently preparing an innovative set of instructional materials focusing on specific problems of Slovenian-Americans learning or re-learning the language of their parents.
