

We have already described the operetta "Kovacev Student" that will be presented with orchestral accompaniment as one part of Zarja's Fall program on Sunday October 30 at the SND on St. Clair. The second and concert part of the presentation will consist of a variety of vocal selections that will prove as interesting as will the operetta. One is the unique combination of voices in quintet form with Steffie Polsak, Kate Jurman, altos; Aggie Polshak, Sally Strumbel McIntosh sopranos; and Frank Kokal as baritone offsetting the female voices. These five gave such a splendid performance at our last concert that they have been requested to enrich the very next program. And so the quintet has chosen to do "Zvonikarjeva" and "Zabucale Gore" two typical Slovene songs especially arranged for them.

Sophie Elersich, our outstanding contralto, will exhibit her clear ringing tones in "Sirota" and an aria from "Martha." Sophie's ease of singing will make

these songs really enjoyable to see and to hear, too.

Albert Fatur and Frank Elersich in a male duet are a new addition to the variety that Zarja has to offer on her program this season. The classic "Jaz bi rad ruceh rož" and the comical "Ve ženske, sem prite" will present a fine contrast in mood for Fatur's excellent first tenor and also for Elersich's robust second tenor.

A catchy tune in waltz tempo, originally heard in the musical "Radikalna kura" will be one of two songs by Josephine Turkman and Tony Perusek. The other "Ob poti tam za vasjo" is a new duet that Tony and Josephine shall add to their repertoire and Zarja's successes.

Jennie Fatur, Sophie Elersich, Josephine Turkman, will sing Dolinar's "Po gorah" and Ivan Hladnik's "Kaj ne bila bi veselja." Here again, our director Mr. Krabec worked from standard choral copies and arranged a pleasing three part harmony of these lovely old tunes nostalgically familiar to many, many American Slovenes.

Our ladies' chorus has chosen three lovely selections "Predica" "Bo kočico zidal" and "Lepo moje ravno polje" with Viki Poljsak as soloist.

The women's chorus will be additionally colorful for these fine old songs.

In mixed chorus, Zarja will sing the beautifully arranged "Pesem o svobodi," the lusty "Happy Wanderer" with wonderful Slovene wording translated by Leonard Poljsak, and Vodopivec's "Prstan" with solos by Frank Elersich and Josephine Turkman. To introduce the forthcoming spring presentation of the operetta "Planinska Roza," the mixed chorus will do an excerpt from this musical never yet done for a Cleveland audience. The tune is one of many that makes "Planinska Roza" one of the best among the meager supply of such works from contemporary Yugoslav composers. COME hear it! Cleveland's Red Feather agencies have set notable examples for the entire nation in the effectiveness of their services, but at every turn, they have been stopped short of their goals by lack of money.

Times are good now, but tensions and fears have mounted to the point where two of every hundred of our neighbors have emotional problems which are either seriously disturbing to their normal lives, or which actually make them mentally ill, weakening their earning power and demoralizing their families and the people with whom they work.

The history of the Community Chest contains many pages which demonstrate the awareness of its agencies to the changing and growing needs of our community, but agency facilities are being strained to the point of desperation.

For every child in our agencies for emotionally disturbed youngsters, there are ten more who should be under treatment. Every day they wait, their problems become worse — in too many cases, to the point of delinquency and crime.

Ours is a great community. We must share in the task of keeping it so. We must take our full share of responsibility to the Community Chest and its 126 Red Feather agencies, by giving generously — more than ever before. We can then take our share of the credit for a sound and healthy community — a community we are proud to live in, work in, and raise a family in.

Baritone Frank Bradach is celebrating his 25th year as a singer in the Cleveland Slovene circles.
