Dorothy Judie and Marie Bergles getting many a thrill out of "This Is My Affair." Josephine Selan postcarding from Detroit, Mich.

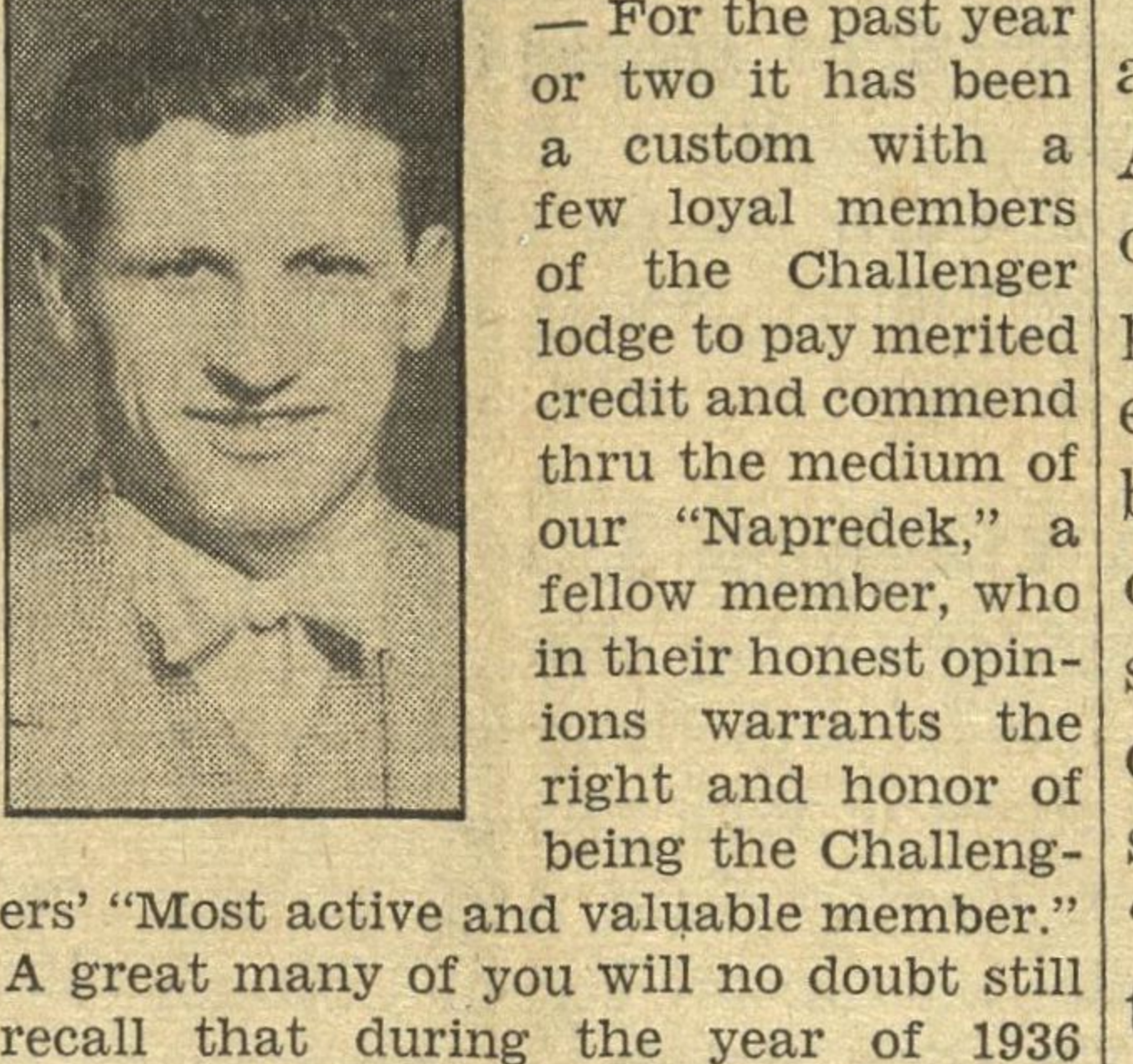

Well, folks, here's good news for you... We are happy to announce that the first official entry blank for our 5th National Athletic Meet has been received.

One thing all you Vrtec contestants and adults too, must keep in mind and that is that there can be but one champion in each event, that being the team or the player sporting the best record at the conclusion of the Meet.

IMPORTANT SOFTBALL RULES

The official diamond shall have 60 foot base lines with a pitching distance of 40 feet and other details as shown in the official diagrams.

Equipment

- a) The bat shall be made of wood, not more than 34 inches in length and not more than 2 1/4 inches in diameter at its largest part. Willow or fungo bats are prohibited.

Team

- a) A team shall consist of 10 players, whose positions shall be designated as follows: Catcher, pitcher, first baseman, second baseman, third baseman, short-stop, short fielder, left fielder, center fielder and right fielder.

Forfeited Games

- a) If a team fails to appear upon the field, or being upon the field, refuses to begin a game for which it is scheduled or refuses by the organization in which the team is playing, the umpire shall declare the game forfeited in favor of the team not at fault.

Pitching Rule

- a) Preliminary to pitching, the pitcher shall come to a full stop, both feet squarely on the ground and in contact with the pitcher's plate. The ball shall be held in both hands in front of the body.
