Slovensko narodno ozemlje na Koroškem skrčeno na eno četrtino!

Narodni svet koroških Slovencev je na seji svojega osrednjega odbora v Celovcu sprejel 8. marca letos slednjo resolucijo:

Člani osrednjega odbora smo v svoji funkciji kot zastopniki krajevnih odborov in občinskih zborov vseh dvojezičnih občin temeljito preverili položaj naše narodne skupnosti na celotnem ozemljju s slovenskim in jezikovno mešanim prebivalstvom na Koroškem ter stanje, ki je nastalo, ker je zvezni kancier ob sodelovanju treh parlamentarnih strank ukinil kontaktni komite.

Nočemo se spuščati v podrobno navajanje posameznih ukrepov, ki jih je vlada v preteklem letu do danes uveljavljala v škodo slovenske manjšine na Koroškem in Štajerskem, od izvedbe protiustavnega jezikovnega štetja, preko zakona o narodnih skupnostih, ukinitev bistvenih določil na področju manjšinskega šolstva, do poskusa dokončne likvidacije slovenskega življa na Koroškem in Štajerskem, s popolno razveljavljivijo člena 7 avstrijske državne pogodbe v stvarnem, osebnem in krajevnem pogledu. Okrepljeni od uspešnega bojkota ugotavljanja manjšine izvoljeni predstavniki NSKS ugotavljamo,

da odredba o manjšinskih sosvetih dejansko jemlje Narodnemu svetu koroških Slovencev in Zvezi slovenskih organizacij na Koroškem pravico do avtonomije in samoodločanja v smislu 1. odstavka člena 7, ki "govori o pravicah do lastnih organizacij, sosvetom pa daje "monopol zastopstva" in s tem krši omenjeno ustavno določilo člena 7. Mi koroški Slovenci se ne bomo nikdar odpovedali lastnim organizacijam in nikoli ne bomo sodelovali pri ukinjanju mednarodnih pogodb;

da pomenita dogovora strank o uradnem jeziku — ki ga že zakon sam stvarno in osebno skrajno zožuje — in o topografskih napisih nedopustno zožitev slovenskega naselitvenega prostora, kajti omejitev veljavnostnega območja člena 7 na pičjo četrtino slovenskega naselitvenega območja pomeni ustvarjanje brezvormne manjšine, ki se ji jemlje življenjski prostor avtohtone naselite. S poskusom uničitve manjšinskega ozemlja stremijo v koroškem deželnem zboru zastopane stranke očitno za tem, da odvzamejo členu 7 vsako csnovo in bi lahko postala njegova določila brezpredmetna.

Poudarjam, da odobravamo vse ukrepe Koordinacijskega odbora Narodnega sveta koroških Slovencev in Zveze slovenskih organizacij na Koroškem v zvezi z izvedbo člena 7, izražamo predsedstvu NSKS vse zaupanje in mu zagotavljamo vso podporo pri bodočih ukrepih v korist slovenske narodne skupnosti na Koroškem.

Prepričani smo, da bo samo vestno izpolnjevanje avstrijskih ustavnih in mednarodnih obveznosti porok za mir med obema narodoma na Koroškem. Zato zahtevamo, da avstrijska zvezna vlada ne odstopa od jasnih določil člena 7 avstrijske državne pogodbe ter zajame slovenskima manjšinama na Koroškem in Štajerskem narodno zaščito, obstoj in razvoj na celotnem ozemljju s slovenskim ali jezikovno mešanim prebivalstvom.

Zadnje vesti

ZDruženi narodi, N.Y. — Predsednik ZDA Jimmy Carter je sinoči govoril pred Združenimi narodi in jim zagotovil podporo ZDA, obrazložil glavne cilje politike ZDA in posebej poučaril, da so vse članice ZN sprejele človekové pravice, kot so jih ZN označili, ter so jih zato dolžne spoštovati. Carter se je postavil na stališče, da spoštovanje človekovih pravic ni nikaka notranja zadeva posameznih držav, ampak stvar vsega sveta, prav poseben tudi ZN. Predložil je, da naj bi se Komisija ZN za človekové pravice preselila iz Ženeve v New York, kjer bi bilo njen delovanje bolj vidno. Carter se je izjavil za enakost vseh ras in za vladu črne večine v Rodeziji in Južni Afriki. Doščena naj bi bila mirnem notom.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. — W. A. (Tony) Boyle, bivši predsednik Unije premogarjev, ki je bil obsojen zaradi ukazuma umora svojega unijškega tekmeča J. Yablonskega, je bil včeraj pod varščino \$250,000 puščen na svobodo, ko je bila prejšnja sodba razveljavljena in čaka sedaj na novo sodno razpravo.

HANOI, Viet. — Vodja ameriške delegacije L. Woodcock je dejal včeraj, da razgovori z vladom Vietnamu ugodno potekajo ter da bo mogel podati "konstruktivno poročilo" predsedniku Carterju.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Z današnjim dnem je dovoljeno potovanje na Kubo, v Severno Korejo in v Vietnam, kar zadeva vladu ZDA. Doslej je bilo to prepovedano.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Gvatemala in El Salvador sta izjavili, da odklanjata ameriško vojasko pomoč, dokler bodo ZDA skušale soditi njuno postopanje v pogledu spoštovanja človekovih pravic.

Mobutu prosi za pomoč

Vlada ZDA je poslala majno pomoč, za katero je zaprosil

ZDA POSLALE PROŠENO POMOČ V AFRIŠKI ZAIRE

V Washingtonu so objavili, da so ZDA poslale v afriške republike Zaire rezervne dele in vojaško opremo, za katero je prosila, ko so vanjo vdrli sovražniki iz Angole baje "pod vodstvom Kubancev".

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Ko so niso prešle skrbni zaradi Ugande, je Afrika znova pritegnila pozornost ZDA in vsega sveta, ko republika Zaire poroča, da so iz sosednje Angole vdrlji v njen pokrajino Saba, nekdanjo Katango, močne sovražne oborožene sile od vodstvom kubanskih častnikov. V Angoli je 15,000 kubanskih vojakov, ki so prišli tja koncem leta 1975 in v začetku leta 1976 pomagat levicaški skupini do zmagre v državljanski vojni.

Ceprav je Castro lani napovedal v pismu švedski vladni, da bo svoje čete iz Angole umaknil, so te se vedno tam, ker bi brez njihove podpore levicaški režim Agostinha Neta ne morel vzdržati.

Vdor pretekli teden

Zaire je že pretekli teden objavil vdor sovražnika iz Angola, pa najprej izjavil, da ga je potisnil že večinoma nazaj preko meje. Pokazalo se je, da je sovražnik stvarno prodrl dalje in zasedel nova mesta. Napadelci naj bi bili pripadniki nekdanjih oboroženih enot, ki so pod vodstvom Čornbeja hotela Katango odtrgali od ostalega Konga in jo napravili za neodvisno državo. To jim ni uspelo in po porazu so umaknili v sosednjo Angolo, kjer so ostali vse doslej.

Vlada Zaire je obvestila ZDA, da sodeluje pri napadu več tisoč bivših katanških najemnikov, ki dajajo vodilo Kubanci. Zadostniki državnega tajništva F. Z. Brown je izjavil, da ZDA verjamejo, da je vdor resničen, nimajo pa dokazov, da bi pri njem sodelovali Kubanci. Ce je to res, bi to lahko sprožilo resno mednarodno krizo in potisnilo znova v ozadje možnost izboljšanja odnosov med Kubo in ZDA.

Mobutu prosi za pomoč

Vlada ZDA je poslala majno pomoč, za katero je zaprosil

predsednik republike Zaire Mobutu Sese Seko. Prvo letalo je odletelo v torek zvečer z rezervnimi deli za prevozna letala C-130, ki so jih ZDA pred leti dobavile republiki Zaire, pa tudi z vojaško opremo. Za enkrat v poslani pomoči ni bilo nobenega orožja.

Državni tajnik Cyrus Vance je pred Domovim zunanjepolitičnim odborom dejal, da je doslej odobrena pomoč vredna okoli 2 milijona dolarjev. Prvotno so govorili le o 1 milijonu.



FAVORITE RECIPES**SWEET WHITE BREAD**

2 pkgs yeast
1/2 c warm water (dissolve together)
1 1/2 c warm milk
1/2 c sugar
2 eggs
1 c raisins (optional)
3 T orange juice concentrate (optional)
1/2 c Oleo
2 t. salt
7 c flour
In large bowl mix milk, sugar Oleo and salt. Add a little flour then add yeast, orange juice,

raisins and eggs.

Add rest of the flour, beat till smooth. Watch not to make dough too heavy (sometimes flour absorbs more liquid), beat till it all comes together and feels elastic.

Rub oleo on top and let rise until double in bulk about one hour.

Shape into three loaves and let rise to top of pan.

Bake 350° about 40 min. pans 8 1/2 x 4 1/2 x 2 1/2.

This makes delicious toast.

After forgotten, and we are forever grateful to the late Msgr. Ponikvar and Rev. M. Jager, for giving so much attention to the youth of St. Vitus Parish.

Our unassuming, always friendly Joseph Zelle was born on Feb. 25, 1912 to Michael and Jennie Zelle in Cleveland. His father was born in the village of Parje na Krasu (near Pivka), and his mother in Podslivnica pri Cerknici.

After completing grade school at St. Vitus in 1926, he entered Cathedral Latin School, where he graduated with honors in 1931. These were the Great Depression years, and Joe was unable to continue his higher education due to lack of funds.

Finally, in 1935, he enrolled in John Carroll University where, after only 3 years of studies, he received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in English with the honor of "Magna cum laude". He then continued on to Western Reserve University Graduate School, and there in 1942 received a Master of Arts Degree.

This talented man yearned for still more education, and after World War II again enrolled at John Carroll U., where he studied Electron Physics and Mathematics. All of his curricular requirements are completed, only final exams and thesis are required for a Master of Science Degree.

In the late thirties, Joe also became interested in radio engineering, and in 1942 enrolled in Capitol Radio Engineering Institute Correspondence School in Washington, D.C. He completed his studies with honors in August 1947, and became a professional radio engineer.

From 1941 to 1944, Mr. Zelle was employed by Columbia Broadcasting System in New York, where he was also connected with the "Voice of America" broadcasts.

For over 20 years he has been licensed by the Federal Communications Commission to practice his profession of Radio and Television Engineer, not only in Ohio but anywhere in America.

Joseph Zelle has been with radio stations WERE, WXEN, WJMO, WCLV, WABZ and WLVT for over 35 years. In addition to this, he operates his own Ham Radio Station, and converses with people all over the world. Many of us will recall that Mr. Zelle was one of the first to pick up signals of earth satellite "Sputnik", launched by the Russians on Oct. 4, 1957.

Our literate of many talents is also a linguist, and is familiar with some 12 languages, being most proficient in Slovenian, German, Russian and French. Joe is a member of many professional societies and associations too numerous to mention, and is also listed in "Who's Who in America."


