## Petsto fašistov zgorelo, ogenj zanetili fašisti!

**Ne pozabimo prirede SNPJ dne 6. in 7. septembra**

Italija ovira pogajanja glede sklenitve nevtralnostnega pakta

700,000 MOŽ ZAVODEVANIH

Saint Jean de Luz, Francija, 18. avg. — Podrobnosti, kako je petsto fašističnih talcev, kateri je madrinska vlada držala v nekem skladislu v pristanskiem mestu Bilbao, zgorelo v ognju, katerega so zanetile granate z rebelne križarke, so opisali mornarji nemškega russka "See-Adler", ki so opazovali bombardiranje. Ti so povedali, da je več sto drugih rebeleb, ki so bili zaprti v skladislu, dobitio težke opekline. Tem so nemški mornarji dali prvo pomoč predno je rušilec odrinil proti francoskemu pristanišču. Skladišče je bombardirala rebela križarka "Espana", ki je zadnjo soboto razdelila velike vladne gasolinske tanke in obstrevala pristanišče. Prvi poskus, ko je nameravala rebela križarka "Almirante Cervera" uniciti skladislu gasolina, so izjavili, ker so vladne čete postavile pred tanke fašistične talce. Križarka je potem odrinila naprej, nakar je tako rebelo letalo metalo bombe na tanke, ki pa niso zadele cilja. Zadnja poročila se glase, da je vse obreže mesta Bilbao še vedno v plamenih.

Madrid, 18. avg. — Sedaj se izvedelo, da se 80 odstotkov spanskih armade, okrog 235,000 mož, bori na strani fašistov proti spanskemu ljudski milici, ki je bila v naglici mobilizirana in steje okrog pol milijona mož. To pomeni, da je v civilni vojni, ki divja v Spaniji, zapletena oborožena sila nad 700,000 mož. Statistika vojnega departmента, ki je bila objavljena pred izbruhom revolte, kaže obseg spanske oborožene sile. Armada na spanskem ozemlju je imela 117,350 mož, 32,000 mož divilne garde, 16,000 obmejnih stražnikov, 18,000 pomorskih in 17,000 policajev. Armada v Maroku, katero so tvorili regularni vojaki, legionarji in domaćini, je imela 38,000 mož.

Rim, 18. avg. — Razgovori med francosko in italijanskim vladom skleniti nevtralnostnega pakta z ozirom na civilno vojno, ki divja v Spaniji, so v začetku, se glasijo poročila iz zadnjih virov.

Francoski poslanik v Rimu Charles de Chambrun in E. M. B. Ingram, član angleškega poslaništva, sta včeraj posetila italijanskega zunanjega ministra Galeazza Ciana. Na tisoče članov SNPJ je uposlenih v jeklarski in železarski industriji po Združenih državah. Sploh je ta industrija ena glavnih, poleg premogarske, v kateri si večina naseljencev že dolga desetletja služi svoj kruh. V Pennsylvaniji je največ mašin članov in devetdeset odstotkov slovenskih delavcev, kolikor jih dela, je tamkaj uposlenih pri plavilih in v jeklarskih tovarnah ali premogovnikih.
