Pariz, 5. maja. — Leon Blum, predstavnik socialistične stranke v Franciji, ki je po zmagovalnih najmočnejših strank v francoski zbornici, je včeraj namanil, da je njegova stranka prvi v zgodovini tretje francoske republike pripravljena prevzeti vlast. S socialisti bodo sodelovali socialni radikalci in komunisti, ki so tudi pokazali voljo za vstop v vlado.

Premier Sarraut je sklical kabinetno sejzo zaradi panike, ki je nastala na borzi zaradi velike davke v Franciji. Borza je danes zaprta in vse glavne urke v Parizu so tudi ustavile, da se na ta način ustavijo na zlato. Bogatini so namreč uprizorili enega največjih ustavov na zlato, katerega poščajo v inozemstvo, največ v Ameriko.

Družava banka, katera ima v programu ljudske fronte nacionalizirana, se pripravlja na svojo usodo. Program socialistične stranke določa stopnjevanje nacionalizacije; državna banka je vrnita na vrati in kasneje pridejo vse industrije. Program socijalizacija bo pa zadržan, če socialni radikalci ne bodo hoteli kooperirati.

Vprašanje, kdaj Sarraut izroči vladu zmagovalnim delavcem, še ni rešeno. Po ustavi ima pravico vzeljeti do nastopa nove zbornice, katera se snide mesec in po volitvah.

Program nove notranje in zunanjosti politike socialistične vlade Francije, ki ima biti sestavljen sporazumu s socialistimi, radiči in komunisti, bo pripravljen še ta teden.

Washington, D. C., 5. maja. — Ameriško fizikalno društvo je pred nekaj dnevi prejelo poslov iz Carnegievega instituta o odprtju doslej še nedokončane sile, katera se nahaja v edrih ali srečih atomov in katera je stiřidesetkrat močnejša kot električna sila.

Fiziki zdaj ugotovljujejo, da ni tista kosmična sila, ki drži skupaj materijo vsega vsemira in brez katerga bi se vsa trda ravnina razkobilna v meglo vodikovega plina.

Jedro atoma je proton ali čista pozitivna elektrika. Atomi so sestavljeni iz jedra ali pozitivnih elektronov, in skorje ali negativnih elektronov. V Carnegievem zavodu so zdaj prevedli posebno-napravo izluženih vodoravnih atoma in dobljali silno moč teh izoliranih atomskih jedrov.

Senator Dickinson zahteva boljšo-in- špekcijsko

TRGOVINA CVETE!

Washington. — (FP) — "New dealerji" so iz ust burbonskega senatorja Dicksona (rep.) izlove sišali eno najbolj zgločih kritik, kar jih je bilo še izrecnih v senatu. Nad nje se je spravil vsled zanemarjenja inšpekcijske tovarne, ki producira konzervirani živež (večinoma mesne odpadke) za pse in — brezposelne.

Senator Dickinson je zahteval, da vladni inšpektorji pregledajo 100 milijonov škatel "pasjega živeža", ki ga na leto pokupijo suvereni po revni ameriški državljanji, ker si ne morejo privoščiti boljšega. Od 200 tovarn, ki izdelujejo živež za pse, jih je pod vladno inšpekcijo le 15. Dickinson je reklo, naj bi poljedelski departement raje skrbel, da bi brezposelni dobili "dober pasji živež" kakor pa trosil milijone za uničevanje poljskih pridelkov.

Blaginjski urad bo pre- vzel oskrbo brez- poselnih

Chicago, 5. maja. — Včeraj je bil predložen nov relifni načrt, ki dolgača, da mesto in okrajni blaginjski odbor prevzame odgovornost za nasičevanje brezposelnih refejev po 1. juliju, ko bo državna relifna komisija razpuščena. Različni relifni komiteji v mestu in okraju so predložili načrt mestnemu svetu v odobritev. Podrobnosti načrta je poznal Douglas Sutherland, tajnik Civične federacije in biroja javne sposobnosti.

Na podlagi predloženega načrta bodo mesto Chicago in politične enote v okraju Cook in po vsej državi prevzeli oskrbo brezposelnih po 1. juliju. Finančne viре bodo črpali iz dohodkov novega davka na posestva in hiše, ki bo 30 centov na vsakih stodolarjev ocenjene vrednosti, poleg dohodkov, ki prihajajo v državno blagajno od kupčinskega davka. Pred državno zbornicijo je sedaj Billmanov zakonski načrt, katerega je podprt govor Horner. Horner je dolgača, da okrajki preuzejo dolžnost zbiranja prispevkov in upravo relifnih sklepov.

Sutherland je priporočal, naj Chicago in okraj Cook poverita upravo relifa blaginjskemu biroju, prispevke v sklad pa naj imajo v rokah mesto in politične enote v okraju. Biro bo potrošil za oskrbo brezposelnih le vsoto, ki jo bodo zbrane te enote.

Leo M. Lyons, direktor državne relifne komisije, kateri je bil podaljšan življeno do 1. junija, je pojasnil, da se okrog 65 odstotkov mesečnih dohodkov v relifni sklad porabi za nasičevanje revnih družin v okraju Cook.

Meeting President Roosevelt's challenge private industry to find more jobs for the unemployed, the United States Chamber of Commerce has ordered a nationwide survey to determine how many jobs are available.

That's interesting and—if your sense of humor is working—laughable. The fact is that both Roosevelt and the Chamber are bluffing and any person who believes that any prosperity revival will come from such horseplay being duped.

Roosevelt's challenge to business was issued as though private employers throw people out of work for sheer spite. They don't. People are out of work by the millions because, in the very nature of capitalism, it is impossible for private industry profitably to employ them.

There's nothing private business would rather do than employ people. Any executive could win a bonus from his board of directors by showing them how to increase their working force and—here's the joker—MAKE A PROFIT.

Profiteers make their dividends by employing workers and exploiting them. They won't stop doing that unless they must. President Roosevelt knows that. And the Chamber of Commerce knows it too when they ask the membership to look around for jobs.

Of course, business could reduce working hours somewhat for those who are still employed. But that would cut profits and is therefore not to be considered. Moreover, even the ability to cut hours and increase wages is hampered by the fact that not every business man will go along with such a plan. And if only small sections of the employing class insist upon exploiting workers to the limit, they will soon compete their more humane brothers completely off the business map.

So what? Why, so private industry is going to find any jobs worth talking about.

Workers are being fooled by false hope. They're going to continue to be underpaid, overworked and insecure as long as the profit system will be tolerated. There's only one way out. That way is the Socialist way. Make the resources the property of the nation; scrap the profit system. Produce for use instead of dividends. There you have it. Use your political and economic power accordingly or continue to suffer the consequences.

Child Labor in South Assailed

The National Child Labor Committee has issued a scathing report on sweatshops and child labor in the South, written by James E. Sibley of the committee's staff after an extended tour of investigation through that region.

The serious competition which Southern industries are giving, the industrial states in the North, says Mr. Sibley, "would not be possible except for low labor standards in which child labor is the most powerful factor."

Noting that factories in numbers have moved to the South to take advantage of low wages, Mr. Sibley says:

"A listing of new industries brought to the Southern state because of such inducements showed the average pay per worker to have been \$500 per year. It would not have been possible (to get such low rates) without the competition of underpaid child labor."

"With \$500 the average pay, some of the workers must receive wages so low as hardly enough to provide even for food, with nothing left for clothing, rent or other necessities."

Max Meyer, member of the New York Industrial Council, commented on the report follows:

"With the passing of the NRA, new sweatshops for the textile industries have come into being. The runaway shop from New York is not a rarity today."

"The State of Mississippi and other backward states in the Union, through live chamber of commerce secretaries have successfully offered inducements to the textile and need trade industries, such as cotton garment and hosiery, to remove their plants from New York and with sweatshop labor, which includes the labor of children, have created a state of competition which is reflected in balance sheet as well as in tax rolls in the various communities of New York State."—N. L.

Herbert Morrison Speaks

Chicago.—One week ago Chicago was privileged to hear the dynamic Herbert Morrison at Ashland Auditorium, and listeners-in were accorded the same privilege through station WCFL.

Herbert Morrison, chairman of the London City Council, the London County Council, minister of transportation during the time of the labor government, member of the British Parliament, and leader of the British Labour Party, delivered one of those rare stirring, constructive messages heard all too seldom in this country.

"You may say it is imperfect. What about the cases of Italy and Abyssinia? The League is more satisfactory than any other measure.

It is the only hope of the world. But the League is imperfect because the governments that go to make up the league are imperfect; because most of the governments are capitalistic. The league is imperfect because the working classes are imperfect. Blame in part—blame your selves."

Speaking on this point he said that if the league is to become a working instrument it must be transformed by people who wish peace. Collective security must be organized. He considered it unfortunate only that all of the states did not play the game: it was true of the case of the present government; it was true of the government of France, and it was notoriously true of the Fascist government of Italy. His desire was to have seen the sanctions become complete and all of them strictly imposed. One of the first things that should have been done was to stop Italy's oil supply. But, he added, the Labor movement is not responsible for the actions of the English and French governments. It is for all the governments of the world to secure the support of the League and to elect labor governments instead of non-labor governments.

"It is not only individual states that require political action," said Morrison. "The world is too interdependent. World needs must be taken under consideration by every nation. The well-being of each nation depends upon the well-being of every other country. The world needs leadership. The world needs labor unions. Peace must be more than an emotional desire. It needs active, constructive, international organization. Peace requires its general staff just as any war."

International politics: "Workers all over desire peace," Morrison said. "The interests of all workers are common—suffering from the same misfortunes all over. While the standard of life may be the highest in Europe, all suffer from unemployment. In Great Britain there are about two millions. What is needed is that workers of all nations should unite with all other workers against the slaughters of each other."

"We desire peace," emphasized Morrison, "because we know that war falls heaviest on workers."

"Debt must be paid," he said.

Then referring to England with a good deal of humor, he said that England does not repudiate its debts, but it does not pay, because it is waiting to receive its payment from France, and France is waiting to receive its share from another country which is in turn waiting upon another. "It was a good thing," he added, "that it was a conservative government that would not pay; if it had been the Socialists . . ."

"But there is a great debt that must be met daily. No one has ever found out what good the war did, but the great burden must be carried by productive labor. Wars settle nothing; they do not achieve things. Victors know only that they are the strongest, not who is in the right.

"Treaties themselves contain indications of future wars. The treaty of Versailles produced the present unsettled. There was only one good thing that seemed to have been started out of the last war: the establishment of the League of Nations."

This statement was undoubtedly a surprise to a great part of the audience, and sensing that it had not

met with popular approval, Morrison hastened to emphasize:

"The idea was sound. It was perfectly fair. What was its basis? That the associated nations promise that if one nation has a dispute, they shall refer it to the league for argument and arbitration. The nations which disregards this is automatically an aggressive nation, and there can obligate no nation of the league to finance, trade, or give facilities for war."

"You may say it is imperfect. What about the cases of Italy and Abyssinia? The League is more satisfactory than any other measure. It is the only hope of the world. But the League is imperfect because the governments that go to make up the league are imperfect; because the working classes are imperfect. Blame in part—blame your selves."

Speaking on this point he said that if the league is to become a working instrument it must be transformed by people who wish peace. Collective security must be organized. It needs active, constructive, international organization. Peace requires its general staff just as any war."

With a great deal of clarity Morrison brought out that there were two ways of running a rich world: (1) by permitting wealth to be produced on a competitive basis, and (2) that the human race uses the world collectively for the good of all of them. Is it not better that it be owned for all collectively? Socialists will need efficiency, he said—good business men; they must not be only theoreticians.

"I believe in Socialism, and I am a Socialist," he said. "I believe in a new social order not merely to be better fed, etc., but for economic and industrial security, an order in which the children will not have their better instincts destroyed, but an order of the greatest opportunities—of the greatest good sense."
