Organizatorično gibanje med jeklarskimi delavci

Zdravilo zoper brezposelnost

Jeklarski trust ima svoje špione povsd, da prepreči unijoniziranje delavcev

Pittsburgh, Pa. — (F. P.) — Med jeklarskimi delavci je pričelo gibanje za organizacijo in v nekaterih krajih je dobito že priličen zamah. Tako poroča W. E. Chalmers, profesor ekonomije na Pittsburghski univerzi, ki je več mesecov študiral položaj delavcev v tem jeklarskem kraljestvu.

Od zadnje velike stavke jeklarskih delavcev je trust izpolnil svoj špionski sistem, da tako prepreči unijosko gibanje. The Amalgamated Assn. of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers, nad katero ima jurisdicijo Ameriška delavska federacija, se ne zanima, da bi organizirala druge delavce v jeklarski industriji. V akcijo, da popravi, kar je zamudil delavskemu uniji, je stopila Metal Trades Industrial unija, ki vodi na skrivajo agitacijo za pristop v unijo, toda do sedaj še ni dosegla posbnih uspehov, je dejal Chalmers.

Uvajanje novih tehničnih izvodov v jeklarske gre bolj hitro naprej kot v vseh drugih industrijskih. V treh letih se je število jeklarskih delavcev zmanjšalo za 25 % v raznih departmента, a kljub temu je produkcija narastila na več odstotkov.

Jeklarska industrija ni še nikdar uživala tako prosperitet kot v zadnjih par letih. Ako prav so skor vse industrije v zadnjem četrletju obutile depresijo, je U. S. Steel korporacija napravila največje profite v svoji zgodovini. Kljub visokim profitom, je trust redoma zniževal mende svojim delavcem.

V nekaterih departmента jeklarske industrije je v veljavni osemurnik, v drugih pa še vedno prevladuje deseturnik; celo dvanaest ur dela na dan in sedem dni v tednu ni nič ne-navadnega.

Poletku za organiziranje jeklarskih delavcev bodo naleteli na odpor, je dejal Chalmers. Jeklarski trust in njemu sorodne korporacije so od časa zadnje stavke jeklarskih delavcev organizirali uspešno špionazo. Kompanijske vasi in mesta so pod kontrolo družinskih agentov. Svoboda govora in zborovanja je nepoznana, kajti jeklarski trust ima povsod nastavljanje svoje vohune. Edino takoj organizatorično delo, kot ga vrši Industrijska kovinska liga, bo rodilo uspeh, ako se razmere v doglednem času ne izpremeni.

ARETACIJE RADIKAL-CEV NA KUBI

Delavci so odgovorili z generalno stavko

Washington, D. C. — (F. P.) — Vest iz Kube, da je dal predsednik Machado v strahu pred revolto arretirati radikalne voditelje delavstva in par konzervativcev, ki so nasproti njegovi vlasti, je dosegla v Washington.

Strokovne unije so pozvali delavce na generalno stavko v znak protesta proti aretacijam in proti odredbi diktatorja, ki je prepovedal zborovanja in diskusije o situaciji. Vrhovno sodišče Kube je odločilo, da ustava ne dovoljuje prepovedi zborovanja in svobode govora, nakar je sledil naval policije v privatno stanovanje delavskih voditeljev in aretacije.

Brat Peter Bernik ima v Prosveti z dne 12. marca o tem stvarna priporočila. Seveda, največje potežkoče bi bile s financiranjem, da bi se ta prekoristna ideja uresničila. Moje

mnenje je, da je stvar lahko izvedljiva. Prvič, SNPJ izda letno precejanjo vstopa na oglaševanje v kampanjah za pridobivanje novih članov ter za razširjanje glasila. To vstopa naj bi se obrnilo v "Radio-Fond SNPJ." To bi bila ena najboljših reklam za jednoto pod današnjim sistemom.

Drugo priporočilo je, da bi vsak član plačal 10c letno v radio-fond. 40 tisoč članov pomeni štiri tisoč dolarjev. Tretjič, pobirali naj bi se prostovoljni prispevki med vsemi rojaki.
