

# Social-demokratska stranka ustanovljena

### Rezultat razkola v socialistični stranki v Clevelandu

#### THOMAS SPET KANDIDAT

Delegatje desnega krila ali t.i. "stare garde" v socialistični stranki iz New Yorka in drugih krajev vzhoda, ki so bili izključeni iz konvencije socialistične stranke v Clevelandu zadnjega nedelja, so se še tisti dan sestali na posebnem štantu in ustanovili novo socialistično stranko v Združenih državah, kateri so dali ime social-demokratska federacija.

V začasni splošni izvršni odbor nove stranke so bili izvoljeni sledeči: James Maurer iz Pennsylvanije, predsednik, August Gerber iz New Yorka, tajnik, Morris Berman iz New Yorka, blagajnik; ostali člani eksekutive so George R. Kirkpatrick iz Californije, Ed. C. Thompson iz New Jerseyja, James Oneal iz New Yorka, Lester C. Coy iz Ohijskega in Algernon Lee iz New Yorka.

V nekaj tednih bo sklicano splošno zborovanje social-demokratske federacije in takrat bo sprejeta platforma in določene smerice novi stranki.

Ustanovitelji nove stranke so večinoma stari socialisti, ki so bili 30 do 35 let aktivni v ameriški socialistični stranki.

Osnovno načelo nove stranke je: brez demokracije ne more biti socializma in brez socializma ne more biti demokracije! Cilj delavskega razreda mora torej biti socialna demokracija!

Cleveland, O., 26. maja.—Norman Thomas je bil včeraj že tretji nominiran za predsedniškega kandidata ameriške socialistične stranke. Protikandidata ni imel, ampak nominacija ni bila soglasna; delegatje "stare garde", kolikor jih je ostalo na konvenciji, so glasovali proti njemu. George Nelson iz Wisconsinja je bil nominiran za podpredsedniškega kandidata.

Ponudba komunistične stranke, da se socialisti in komunisti združijo in postavijo skupne kandidata v letošnji volilni kampanji, je bila odklonjena. Profesor Krueger, član eksekutive socialistične stranke, je izjavil da socialisti v Ameriki se ne zanimajo za komunistični socializem — "starogardisti" rekli, da bi oni socialisti, ki korakajo v komunisti vred v pohodih in z njim vred vzklikajo ter prepevajo internacionalo, morali sprejeti ponudbo za "enotno politično fronto", če so dosledni...

### Bojazen pred novim terorjem v Floridi

Bartow, Fla. — Nov val terorizma bo zajel sadni pas v Floridi, ko bo obravnavana proti petim bivšim policajcem iz Tampa, ki so obtoženi sodelovanja s člani drhali, kateri so ugrabili pri delavski organizatorje, jih odvabili zunaj mesta in silovito pretepli, končana, se glase napovedi. Shoemaker, eden od bivših drhalskega nasilja, je bil tako pretepen, da je deset dni pozneje umrl. V teku obravnave, ki je bila že parkrat pretrgana, je terorizem pobojnikov, ki so v zbirni vešeposestnikov, nekolicina penehal, a bo nedvomno uspešna a dan s podvojeno silo po končni obravnavi. Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Konvencija Splošne lige ženskih strokovnih unij je sprejela resolucijo, v kateri pravi, da industrijska forma unij nudi najširše polje za agitacijo, da se privede neizurjene in napoli izurjene delavce in delavke v ameriško delavsko gibanje.

Resolucija poudarja, da večina ameriških žensk opravlja navadna dela v industrijah, kar jim onemogoča vstop v poklicne unije. Iz tega razloga je Liga podprla industrijski unionizem za neizurjene in napoli izurjene delavke, ki predstavlja najbolj efektivno formo organizacije.

Konvencija je pozvala eksekutivno Ameriške delavske federacije, naj organizira kampanjo, da se privede delavke v unije. "Velik prestiž Ameriške delavske federacije bo omogočil uspešno kampanjo," je rečeno v poročilu, ki ga je konvencija odobrila. "Eksekutivi ADF priporočamo, naj skliče sestanek uradnikov vseh mednarodnih unij, na katerem naj razpravljajo o načrtih organiziranja žensk v industrijskih unijah."

Washington, D. C. — Federalno delavsko razsodišče je obvestilo Wheeling Steel Co., da mora takoj prenehati s financiranjem kompanijske unije, katero ono ne priznava za delavsko organizacijo. Dalje je odločilo, da mora kompanija ponovno uposliti večje število delavcev, katere je vrгла na cesto, ker niso hoteli postati člani kompanijske unije.

### Časopisni delavci so zdaj za federacijo

#### Organizacija izkazuje velik napredek

New York. — (FP) — Krajevna postojanka Ameriškega časopisnega gilda, ki ima nad dva tisoč članov, je instruirala svoje delegate, naj na prihodnji konvenciji glasujejo za pridružitve k Ameriški delavski federaciji. Gild naj bi imel v federaciji status mednarodne unije.

Sentiment v prilog združiti narašča v vseh mestih, v katerih ima gild svoje organizacije. Na lanski konvenciji gilda je manjkalo samo 35 glasov do dvetretjinske večine, ki je bila potrebna za sprejetje predloga, da se organizacija časopisnih delavcev pridruži Ameriški delavski federaciji. Močna opora, katero so časopisni delavci v stavki proti Hearstovemu listu "Wisconsin News" v Milwaukeeju dobili pri delavskih unijah, je mnogo pripomogla, da se je sentiment v prilog pridružitvi ADF povečal.

Poročila, ki prihajajo v glavni urad Ameriškega časopisnega gilda, govorijo o novih aktivnostih med časopisnimi delavci v vseh krajih dežele. Povsod se ustanovljajo nove postojanke in število članstva skokoma narašča.

### Belgijski klerofašisti dobili 21 mandatov

Bruselj, 26. maja.—Nova katoliška stranka v Belgiji takozvanih "reksistov" je fašistična. Njen vodja je prof. Ksavier de Graunne in njeno ime pride od "Christus Rex" (kralj Krist), ki je geslo teh fašistov. Reksisti, ki so pri volitvah zadnje nedelje odvzeli ortodoksni belgijski katoliški stranki 21 mandata, imajo isto taktiko kakor komunisti ali nemški naciji: zmerjajo kapitaliste in socialiste in povsod izvajajo krvave in pretepe.

### PUBLICITETA PRI MOONEYJEVI OBRAVNAVI

#### Značilna izpoved bivšega pomožnega pravdnika

#### NIKOMUR NI BILO ZA RESNICO

San Francisco, Cal.—(FP)—Iz ust Jamesa F. Brennana, bivšega pomožnika v uradu distriktnega prosekutorja Charlesa M. Fickerta, je prišla izjava, da so se hoteli vsi, ki so bili uposleni v uradu prosekutorja, okoristiti s publiciteto v zvezi z obravnavo proti Mooneyju, ki se je vršila v letih 1916 in 1917. Brennan je na sodišču, ki vodi zaslišanje o Mooneyjevi zadevi, rekel, da se je Fickert čutil prikrajšenega, ker ni dobil svojega deleža publicitete.

Fickert, ki je sedaj strt mož brez vsakega vpliva, je, ko je bil postavljen na svedočki stolec pred nekaj tedni, pri navskrižnem izpraševanju priznal, da je namenoma predložil sleparsko evidenco kot Mooneyjev prosekutor. Posledica je bila smrtna obsodba, toda Mooney je bil rešen smrti, ko je bila kazen spremenjena v dosmrtno ječo.

Warrena K. Billingsa je prosekutorial Brennan, ki je sedaj priznal, da ne bi smel biti ne Mooney in ne Billingsa obsojen na podlagi predložene evidence. On sam je v zadnjih letih večkrat poskušal, izposlovati oprostitev za oba obsojenca, ker se je uveril, da sta nedolžna, žrtvi omreženja. Na zadnjem zaslišanju je sicer zanikal, da je kdo pritiskal nanj, naj pošlje Billingsa v smrt, priznal pa je, da ga Mooney-Billingsov slučaj tlačil kakor mora, odkar so nekatere priče, ki so nastopile proti Mooneyju na obravnavi, preklicale svoje izpovedi in izjave, da so pokrivem prisegle.

To je že šesti slučaj nasilne smrti v tukajšnji slovenski naselbini. Pred leti je utonil v morju tik luke Jakob Pavlin iz Solkana pri Gorici; za njim je bil zastupljen Janez Dekleva iz Selc pri St. Petru na Krasu; lani so našli ustreljenega v neki koči na reču Janeza Bošnjaniča iz Ilirske Bistrice, kmalu za njim se je pa pri avtni nesreči smrtno ponesrečil Vinko Batistič iz Mirne pri Gorici; končno je bil pri delu ubit Franc Andlovec iz Lozice na Vipavskem.

### POLICIJSKA GONJA PROTI TERORISTOM V MICHIGANU

#### Preiskava se vrši tudi v Ohiu, Pennsylvaniji in W. Virginiji

#### TRINAJSTORICA V ZAPORU

Detroit, Mich., 26. maja. — Energična policijska kampanja proti tajni teroristični organizaciji Črni legiji, katera je izrastelek famoznega Kukulsklana, se je razširila po vsem Michiganu. Policija je pozvala na pomoč tudi federalne detektive in preiskava se vrši tudi v državah Ohiu, Pennsylvaniji in West Virginiji, kjer ima Črna legija menda svoje podružnice.

V Detroitu je 25 črnih legionarjev v zaporu v zvezi z umorom Chas. A. Pooleja, mladega delavca WPA, in trinajst od teh ne more biti izpuščenih pod kavčij. Medtem so v teku preiskave glede drugih umorov in sumljivih "samomorov", katerih prihaja vedno več na dan v Detroitu in drugih michiganskih mestih.

Včeraj se je izvedelo, da je Črna legija močno razširjena tudi v Flintu, Pontiacu in Jacksonu in baje je včlanjenih tudi mnogo policajev in drugih javnih nameščencev. Iz vseh teh krajev prihajajo vesti o misterioznih terorističnih činih: pretepanju in nasilnih smrtnih slučajih v temni noči in pokilih.

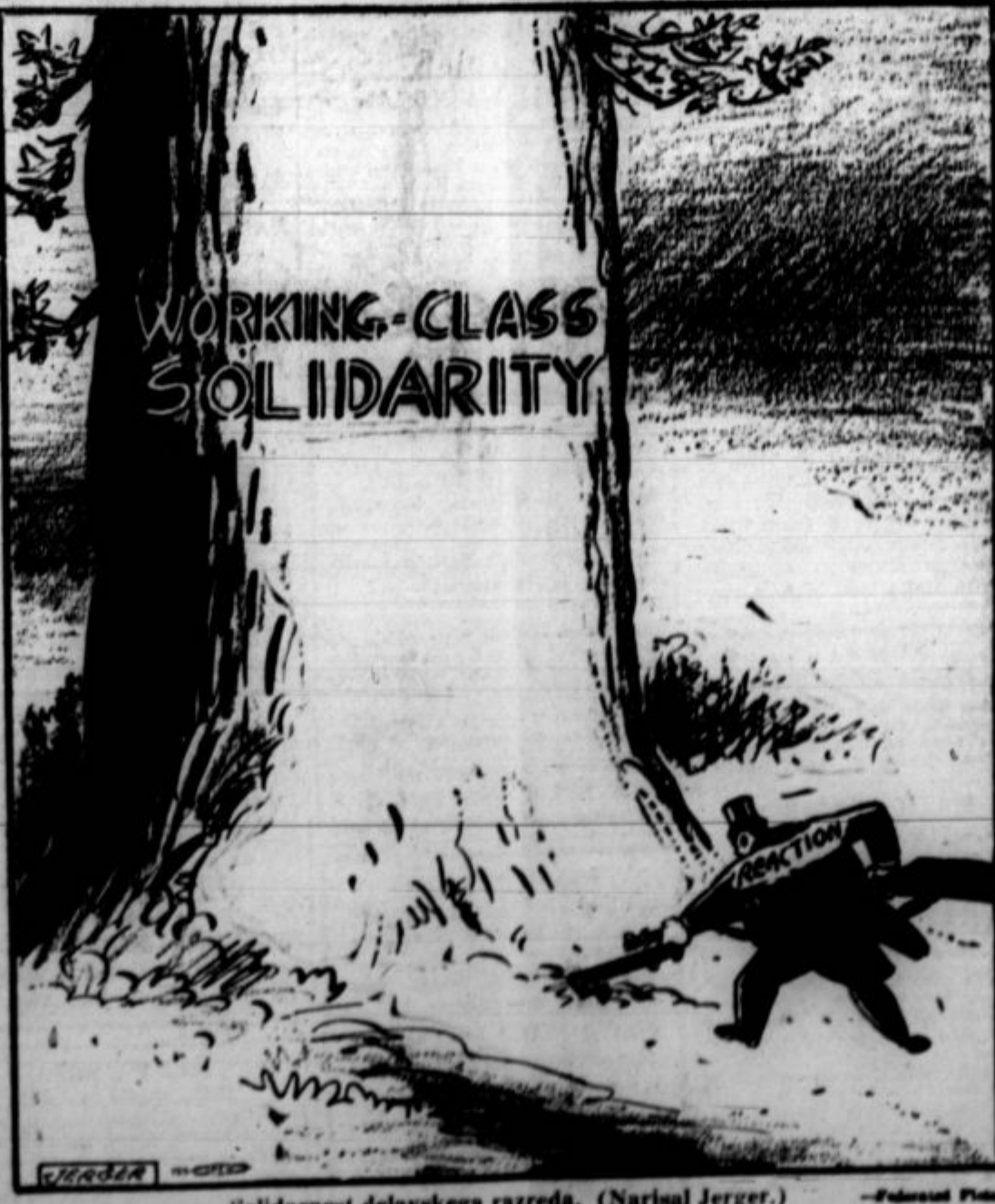
Črna legija je tajna armada, ki je organizirana po vojaško s lokalnimi poveljniki do brigadir-generalov in major-generalov na čelu državne organizacije; vsi člani morajo biti oboroženi in kadar so poklicani na "nočno vožnjo" v avtih, morajo brezpogojno ubogati. Vsaupor je kaznovan s tepežem ali smrtjo.

Vsak član Črne legije mora ob vstopu prisesti "v imenu Boga in hudiča, da daje svoje srce, možgane, ude in vse telo v službo legiji, da bo vse svoje življenje pokoren svojim komandantom in da bo po vseh svojih močeh pomagal uničevati katoliško cerkev, Jude, anarhiste, komuniste in črnce".

### Zupani ameriških mest nočejo biti Hitlerjevi gostje

New York. — Kongresa Mednarodne zveze krajevnih avtoritet, zborovanja županov in mestnih uradnikov iz vseh krajev sveta, se ne bo udeležilo veliko število reprezentantov iz Amerike, Velike Britanije, Francije, Švice, Skandinavije in Čehoslovaške, ki se otvori 7. junija v Berlinu. Newyorški župan LaGuardia je v imenu Konference ameriških županov izjavil, da so se pridružili drugim demokratičnim državam, ki nočejo pošiljati svojih reprezentantov v Nemčijo, dokler je nacistični režim na krmilu. S to izjavo je LaGuardia je podprl stališče ameriških županov, ki so ga osvojili na svojih konferencah, da ne marajo biti gostje nacističnega diktatorja. "Bilo bi nekaj paradoksnega, če bi se mestne avtoritete zbirale v Nemčiji, da bi tam diskuzirali probleme samovlade," je rekel LaGuardia. "Nacistična Nemčija je država, ki je v dobi Hitlerjevega režima popolnoma odpravila samovlado v vseh mestih." LaGuardia je dalje rekel, da bodo London in druga velika mesta v Angliji, kakor tudi v Franciji, Švici, Skandinaviji in Čehoslovaški bojkotirala berlinsko konferenco.

## Timely Thoughts

### Power to Grow and Expand

The strength of any fraternal society rests in its power to grow both numerically and financially. A steady, constant growth to retrieve natural losses caused by death and to increase the present membership must be had because it is essential.

A healthy growth in our membership is desirable especially among the young members. This is important. Fraternal societies must seek to increase their membership by enlisting young blood. Large number of members of advancing age must ever be reinforced by large number of youth. Real progress of our organization, of any organization, depends on its ability to enroll and hold its young members.

Our organization is doing its part in promoting its growth. It rests with the local lodges and their active members to execute its plans by bringing into their fold every possible prospect.

Now and during the coming months there will be a period of splendid opportunities for all the members of the SNPJ to call attention to the many campaign features our organization is offering to new members and campaign workers. Federation and lodge festivals which are being planned on a large scale, in different parts of the jurisdiction should offer additional incentives in helping to increase their ranks.

Successful festivals will be only those which will advertise the Society and reap material gains along with moral achievements. Both of these elements will enhance the growth of our membership.

### Incentive Stirs Action

The present Juvenile Campaign conducted by the SNPJ to increase the membership of our Juvenile Department is well on its way to success. It must be brought to a successful conclusion. Let this be our motto, with the hope that it may prove an incentive to stir our latent energies to action.

Membership campaigns are being conducted to stimulate into motion that which is at rest within us—to awaken us from slumber or a state of inactivity—to animate when there is an inanimate tendency among our branches. It is a known fact that many an opportunity to enlist new members would have been lost had it not been for these periodic membership campaigns.

Action in the right direction is essential. Our branches which in the past have been active in many lines of endeavor have also been successful in the securing of new members, and their present membership is satisfactorily large.

Depression, with its attendant evils of unemployment, decreased earnings, shrinkage of values, and all their kindred ills, is still with us although not in its past form of a few years ago. Campaign workers active in the jubilee campaign two years ago have done a splendid work in much worse situation than it is today. So it follows that our active members are given a much better chance to increase their ranks during the present campaign than they had then.

### Spontaneity and Work

Spontaneous action and satisfaction in any large-scale work are important factors for any success. These must be stimulated by an incentive which will spur the concerted work further on and bring it a rung higher on the ladder of success.

Some say that it is human nature to move along the lines of least resistance, and most of us soon would lapse into a slumber, a listlessness from which to arouse us would require a jolt. People have been known to allow themselves to get into ruts from which nothing but stark starvation could jar them, and sometimes it is even then too late for redemption.

Our youth must keep step with the never-resting evolution in our present economic and social demands. It must organize fraternally, industrially and politically in workers' organizations. Duty and sound common sense should tell our youth that they must free themselves from the foolish fear of their own helplessness. The old saying "It can't be done!" or "It is no use trying!" must be thrown into the historical waste-basket.

Youth must organize itself. By means of your organizations you will be able to emancipate yourselves from the economic enslavement. Then your will power will take the place of fear and your determination will overcome all obstacles of the present economic and social evils.

## Recovery and Relief

Still more official figures show that despite continuing improvement in business conditions the number of those requiring relief is on the increase. A survey by the Emergency Relief Bureau of New York City reveals an alarming situation. The survey shows that the number of relief cases has increased no less than 10 per cent in the nine months from July 31, 1935 to May 1 of this year! This is a catastrophic trend and emphasizes our repeated conclusion that a drastic reduction of hours of labor is essential to give the workless employment and to reduce the number of unfortunates on relief.

In New Jersey emergency relief is being reduced to a subsistence dole over wide areas of the state, the jobless receiving little more than food. The State Emergency Relief Administration is being scrapped and the problem is being passed over to the municipalities and the Overseers of the Poor, the latter carrying with it the stigma of pauper relief, which is hateful to masses accustomed to earning their own bread. Although a recent law of the state permits cities to borrow for relief purposes in excess of their statutory debt limitations, many are not in a financial condition to borrow.

Industrial recovery evidently does not mean human recovery of jobs, of self-respect and even a pet animal standard of living.—The New Leader.

## Heckling Townsend

In attempting to prove that Dr. Townsend founder of the famous Old Age Assistance Plan organized his movement to line his own pockets with shekles from easy-marks, some people are making themselves look mighty ridiculous.

One would think that the Doctor's enemies are lily-white philanthropists who never, never thought of anything so base as hoodwinking the public. As a matter of fact, they are staunch supporters of an economic system which legalizes fraud and dupes the public into acceptance of the Capitalist racket.

Even if the foes of Townsendism should prove that Dr. Townsend is a racketeer, he would still appear as a piker beside the respectable bigwigs of the Capitalist system.

Take the millions and billions in the hands of idlers. Take the year-by-year incomes of stockholders and bondholders and the aggregate amount represents the extent of the loot which those who own grab from those who work. But that grab does not bother Townsend's hecklers.

We are not Townsendites although we are keenly in sympathy with the fundamental propositions that old age must be made secure and purchasing power spread among the people of the nation. However, we can not help commenting upon the hypocrisy of those who make a loud noise about one man's rake-off while they sanction an economic racket which is based upon robbery by legal decree.—Reading Labor Advocate.

## An Old Policy with New Dangers

Leaders of Organized Labor who organize nonpartisan support for Roosevelt are doing nothing new in rewarding "friends" and punishing "enemies". The role they play is opportunistic, reflects regard for group rather than class interest, and, to the degree that leadership, rather than basic principles, sways them, is fascist in its ultimate implication.

By the tactics of Lewis and Berry, Organized Labor may become the favorite child of a "fuehrer"—with the millions of unemployed in a third social class the underprivileged wards of a managed economy in which they will play no part.—R. L. A.

## And So It Goes

The house appropriation committee would like to have the United States withdraw from the International Labor Office because it costs this country \$385,000 a year.

That's only about a third of a million dollars and it is for purposes of understanding and peace. Of course, it is all right, from the standpoint of superficial and jingoistic thinkers, to spend, not a third of a million, nor a third of a billion, but a cool and complete billion dollars a year on armament—for purposes of misunderstanding and war.

And so it goes—for the reason that compromise is made up mainly of Democrats and Republicans.

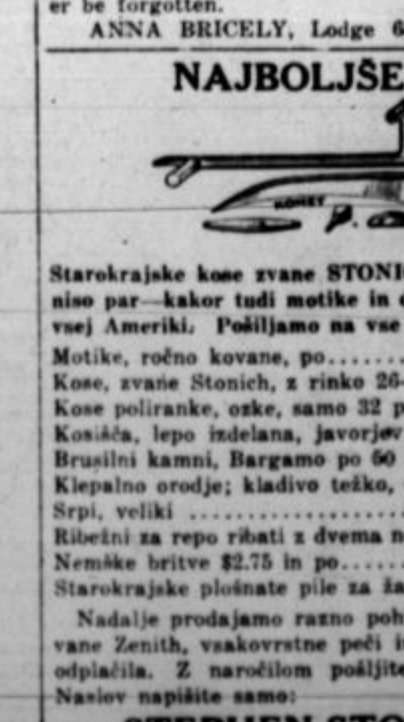
