Free parking is provided.

All members selling tickets in advance must make their returns to Frank Kress before, or on, June 14 at 10 a. m. If possible, ticket returns should be made earlier to assure a proper accounting.

For the benefit of members and visitors unable to purchase SNPJ Day tickets in advance, the committee will sell tickets at the Park. The ticket booth will be in the center of the midway.

### Transportation

Members of the general committee have reported that each and every lodge will handle their own transportation problems. R., at 7:15 a. m. (eastern standard time). The train leaves Coraopolis at 7:30 a. m., and Aliquippa at 7:39 a. m. It arrives in Youngstown's Erie station at 8:40. Special street cars will meet the train and in turn transport them direct to Idora Park.

Transportation on the train will be \$1.45 for a round trip, including street car transportation. For children the fare will be 80¢ a round trip, including street car fare. For any additional, or last minute details, members are requested to get in touch with Frank Kress at 204 57th st., Pittsburgh, or phone him at Hiland 2976 on or before noon of Saturday, June 12. A complete report must be had at that time to insure sufficient train facilities. In Aliquippa, Joseph Micheic should be contacted. Should 200 or more make train reservations, a special SNPJ Day train will transport passengers.

People traveling by auto from the Pittsburgh vicinity are advised to take route 51 traveling through Ambridge, Beaver Falls and East Palestine. At East Palestine route 7 should be taken, which leads direct to Idora Park. For parties traveling from the West and Cleveland, use route 422, which leads direct to Youngstown by the way of Warren and Girard, O. Idora Park is located about five miles from Youngstown's city square.

The June 14 SNPJ Day celebration is one of the largest undertakings ever assumed by any SNPJ group of lodges. Favorable comments have been spoken and written, complimenting the E. S. Federation for its promotion efforts. Suppose a physician were faced with an epidemic of dysentery. He might administer treatment to the afflicted patients and send them to hospitals. But the disease would continue to spread, and he would soon doctor to other cities, employing more nurses and doubly overburdening the whole system of hospitalization. Not sufficient, you say. Yet, that precisely the method we have used in dealing with the problem of crime has up to the present time. When alarm we are witnessing increasing expenditures in coping with crime and what has been our answer? More officers of the law, increasing shrewd detective methods, more prisons, more judges and lawyers, more money spent—totaling some \$13,000,000 last year. We also like a physician who sets in to administer treatment without diagnosing the cause and eliminating the source.

It is safe to estimate that fully 90% to 95% of all crime originates from one cause and one cause alone. Money. Scan the pages of any daily newspaper and enumerate the various forms of crime: kidnaping, gun murders, thefts, of all descriptions.

What do they spring from? Money. The small percentage of crimes safely be attributed to abnormality, that is, measured not by accumulated wealth, but setting examples by tortures, not setting examples by electrocution, but simply: medical care. Such types are those arising from sexual abnormalities, jealousy, mental disorders. Even a great many of these when traced to their source will be found to have a basis in money about or with a connection to money.

Were this cause of crime removed, what incentive for crime would remain? What need to commit crime, or risk one's life if there were no return for it? Anyone persisting in belief of this kind believes that man is by nature a criminal.
