Jugoslavija na poti v politično svobodo

Razvoj v zadnjih mesecih v Jugoslaviji je vzbudil ponok doma in v svobodnem svetu upanje, da je Jugoslavija na poti v večjo svobodo. Na veliki zvon so obesili podpis "Protokola" med Vatikanom in Belgradom, se nato na široko razpali o sklepah Centralnega komiteta Zveze komunistov Jugoslavije na Brioni 1. in 2. julija letos in v zvezi z obema napovedovali povečanje vseh vrst svobode v Socialistični federativni republiki Jugoslaviji. Pisali so o deželi z "eno in pol politično stranko", kar naj bi pomenilo, da Jugoslavija dejansko ni daleč od dvostrankarskega sistema, ki ga naj bi tvorili Komunistična partija in Socialistična ali Socialno-demokratska stranka.

Vse te napovedi in ugodne sodbe so se izkazale za prazne upe, ko je Mihajlo Mihajlov s svojo drzno roko stregal masko dobrodošja, človekoljuba v svobodljubnosti z obraza jugoslovanske komunistične diktature. Titova policija, ki je Mihajlova prijela in onemogočila njegov poskus ustanovitev politično, svetovnonazorno in kulturno neodvisnega lista "Svobodni glas", je pokazala, da Jugoslavija ni pravna država, ampak komunistična diktatura, kjer je Partija nad državo in njenimi zakoni.

Mihajlov je vrgel zahtevko po politični svobodi, po dvostrankarskem sistemu, po polnem priznanju vseh človekovih pravic, kot so jih označili Združeni narodi in jih je Jugoslavija priznala, v jugoslovansko javnost. Policia je preprečila sestanek za ustanovitev neodvisnega lista, one-mogočila bo lahko vse poskuse za kaj takega tudi v bodoče, toda misli same ne bo mogla spraviti s sveta. Dobivala bo vedno nove glasnike in nove pristaše in s tem izpodkopavala temelje komunistične diktaturi.

Mihajlov je brez dvoma vedel, da mu komunistična diktatura ne bo dovolila izdajanja neodvisnega lista, še manj seveda ustanovitev neodvisne socialistične stranke, ker doslej še ni bilo slučaja, da bi kaka diktatura, posebno še komunistična, sama dala oblast iz rok. Čemu naj bi kaj takega storila jugoslovanska? "Sladko je vladati," pravi starrek in le zelo redki so, ki prostovoljno oddajo oblast iz svojih rok. Tito in njegov "Novi razred" ne spadata med nje.

Četudi Tito in njegovi ne misijo na prostovoljni odhod, na prostovoljno uvedbo svobode v Jugoslaviji, se ta kljub temu kaže na obzorju. Morda je še zelo daleč, morda že blizu. Da bo nekoč prišla, o tem ni dvoma, kdaj pa bo to, tega se ne upajo napovedati tudi najboljši poznavalci sedanje jugoslovanske stavnosti.

Kaj povzroča Titovi diktaturi največje skrbi, kaj ji spodkopava tla?

Na prvem mestu so brez dvoma gospodarske težave, s katerimi se rdeči režim brezuspešno otepa že vsa leta. Z vedno novimi plani in poskuski skuša gospodarstvo, ki ga je sam uničil, spraviti zopet na noge. Gospodarska reforma, ki so jo lani uzakonili, naj bi končno prinesla rešitev in pomagala jugoslovanskemu narodnemu gospodarstvu iz prepada. Čeprav je pokazala nekaj uspeha, vendar ni izpolnila v prvem letu postavljenih upov. Vprašanje je, če ji bo do uspeha pomagala odstavitev "saboterja" Rankovića in tovaršev.

Tito in njegov režim sta se hvalila, da sta nacionalni problem v Jugoslaviji resila z uvedbo federacije. V zadnjih letih se je pokazalo, da so bile to le prazne, bahaške besede. Nacionalno vprašanje v Jugoslaviji je danes v neki obliki še bolj pereče, kot je bilo v času med obema velikima vojnoma. Ne gre le za politično in kulturno narodno svobodo, gre še večji meri za gospodarsko. Drug drugemu očitajo gospodarsko izrabljanie, Beograd pa še vedno drži trdo v svojih rokah skupno mošnjo. V tem pogledu ni sledo o kakih federaciji. Prav to pa tako jezi Ljubljano in Zagreb!

Komunistična partija je imela le nekaj tisoč pristašev, ko je začela svojo "osvobodilno borbo", toda ti so bili trdno med seboj povezani in enotni tako v ciljih kot volji. Odkar je komunistična partija na oblasti, so se vanjo vključili ljudje vseh vrst, v prvi vrsti oportunisti, koristolovci. Ti se za partitske cilje menijo le toliko, kolikor jim neposredno prinašajo koristi. Komunistična partija je notranje razkrojena. Čistke, najprej informbirojska, nato džilasovska in sedaj rankovičevska, niso le zrahljale komunistične vrste, so razbile tudi notranje enotnost in medsebojno zaupanje partitskih članov. Partija je bila nekdaj notranje trdna in strogo enotna v odnosih do drugih strank, sedaj je razdeljena v klike in skupine, ki iščejo oporo za svoje cilje in stališča v "množicah" izven partitske organizacije. Mladina, ki je bila steber partije, je že pred leti, kot je priznal Tito sam, komunizmu obrnila hrbet.

Vsaka diktatura sloni na strahu vladanih, tudi titovska. Ta strah, ki je bil v prvih letih po vzpostavitvi komunistične diktature močan, je začel plahneti, mladi, po revolu-

ciji zrasli rod ga ne pozna v obliku kot starejši, ki je bil priča vseh komunističnih nasilij in grozot. Jugoslovanski rdeči režim je v marsičem popustil vajeti in le težko jih bo nategnil znova, ne da bi s tem povzročil nevarno notranjo napetost. Svoboda ima nameč to lastnost, da izsil samavstop, če ji kdo vrata le malo odpre. V Jugoslaviji je zastavila nogo med vrata in podboje in ne bo odnehala, dokler ji vrata ne bodo odprta do kraja.

Po uRADnih poročilih Belgrada jih je v zahodni Evropi trenutno že preko 300.000. Ti ljudje spoznavajo, da na zahodu ni le zasluk večji, da je življenje veliko boljše, ampak dihajo tudi svobodni demokratični zrak. Kdor je svobodo spoznal, jo občutil na svoji koži, ta bo nesvobodo in zatiranje prenašal le v skrajni sili in s hudo nejevoljo. V kolikor se bodo jugoslovanski delavci, ki so sedaj v zahodni Evropi, vrnili v socialistično Jugoslavijo, bodo postali najmočnejši in naglasnejši propovedniki in zagovorniki svobode, postal bodo pravi dinamit za Titovo rdečo diktaturo.

Wilson: Razgovori z Rodezijo le prekinjeni

Predsednik britanske vlade ni voljan prepustiti urejanje rodezjskega vprašanja Združenim narodom.

LONDON, Vel. Brit. — Predsednik vlade Harold Wilson je v razgovoru z vodnikom konservativne parlamentarne opozicije E. Heathom dejal, da smatra Velika Britanija razgovore z uporško Rodezijo skozi vlado Iana Smitha le za prekinjene in ne za končno pretrgane, kot je izgledalo pretekl teden.

Wilsonova vlada je strogo ob sodila dolopnilo rodezjski ustav iz leta 1961, ki ga je pretekl teden proglašila vlada I. Smitha. Z njim si je prevzela pravice za "zapor nasprotnikov državne varnosti" brez predhodnega sodnega postopka. Proti temu dolopnilu se je izjavila tudi konzervativna stranka.

Države črne Afrike so skrajno nestrpne, ko vidijo, da Britanija noče uporabiti oborožene sile proti beli manjšini v Rodeziji, ki noče deliti oblasti s črno večino. O tem se razpravlja že lani na konferenci Afriške edinstvene stranke, ki so jo pretekl teden na Peipingu, ki so jo vodile katoliške redovnice, sestre Presv. Srca. Vanjo so pošljali svoje otrok v Peipingu bivajoči diplomi, delno tudi oni iz komunističnih dežel. Kitajska vlada je nato šolo zaprla, redovnice pa izgnala kot "vohunke". Preteklo sredo se so pripeljale sem z vlagom.

Redovnice so povedale, da so jih rdeči bili z bambusovimi palicami in da ves teden radi razmer niso spale. Bile so zelo izčrpane in dve so tako prepeljali v bolnico, kjer je včeraj 85 let stara s. Mary O'Sullivan iz Corke na Irskem umrla. Ta se je od slabosti sedela še na kitajski strani meje. Kitajski rdeči stran je pobjral s tal in jo "vrgel kot vrečo" na voziček, nato pa tega z nogo pognal preko meje v britansko kolonijo.

Angleži so zbegani glede vojskovovanja v Vietnamu

LONDON, Angl. — Gallupovo pozvedovanje je pokazalo, da je 37% Angležev za nadaljevanje vojne v Vietnamu, 40% jih je proti, 23% pa jih ne ve, kako bi se odločilo. Zato jih je pa 81% proti temu, da bi Anglija poslala svoje cete v Južni Vietnam; 72% jih tudi misli, da naj Amerika pristane na mir tudi v tem slučaju, da bi Južni Vietnam prisel pod komunistično kontrolo.

Kot se vidi, ni odstotek, ki govorja za Johnsonovo politiko, takoj majhen. Tisti angleški levčarji, ki so proti nji, so pač tako glasni, da ves svet misli, da Anglija ne odobrava ameriške politike. LABOR DAY - A TIME TO THINK



Labor Day, to be observed on September 5 this year, marks the termination of summer, in the minds of most people. It is the last long holiday of the season and is a time for the final outing of swimming, picnicking, boating, or just loafing. Critical Need For Health Service Workers

Washington, D.C. — The nation must attract 10 thousand recruits a month to the field of health services over the next ten years.

This critical need for health service workers is emphasized in "Training Health Service Workers: A Critical Challenge," released by Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz and the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, John W. Gardner.

The publication documents a joint Labor-HEW Conference held in Washington, D.C. February 14-17, 1966 as part of the President's Job Development Program.

In his greeting to the 300 conference members representing labor, management, government, education and health organizations, President Johnson noted that "One of the basic goals of the Great Society is to guarantee that our people receive the best possible health care."

He said that critical manpower shortages in the health services were hindering efforts to insure a healthy America.

Secretary Wirtz called for "auxiliary health manpower" to meet needs in the health fields. He also recommended establishing "job leaders" stepping up wages and opportunities to attract new recruits to these careers.

The Under Secretary of the Department of HEW Wilbur J. Cohen emphasized the importance of making modern medical science and health care readily available to all people.

Refresher courses for inactive professional health workers were considered as one possible method of increasing the number of qualified health workers.

Peace Corps To Test On Sept. 10

Cleveland area residents interested in putting their skills to use in developing nations around the world are invited to take the Peace Corps placement test at 9 a.m. on Saturday, September 10, at 4240 Main Post Office Bldg., W. 3rd and Prospect Avenue.

The Peace Corps uses the placement test to determine how an applicant can best be utilized overseas.

The test measures general aptitude and the ability to learn a language, not education or achievement. If test scores indicate a limited language-learning ability, for example, the Peace Corps tries to place the applicant in an English-speaking country.

The placement test requires no preparation and is non-competitive — an applicant can neither pass nor fail.

The application form, not the placement test, is the most important factor in the selection of volunteers.

Persons interested in serving in the Peace Corps must fill out an application, if they have not already done so, and present it to the tester before taking the test. Applications may be obtained from local post offices or from the Peace Corps, Washington, D.C. 20525.



Instant Potatoes Curried And Curled



Everyday foods — potatoes, perhaps — challenge an inventive cook the most. 1/4 cup very thinly sliced onions

1/3 cup flour

1 cup (8-oz. pkg.) small curd creamed cottage cheese

1/4 cup chopped parsley

In a heavy skillet, melt 1/4 cup butter or margarine over low heat. Add mushrooms and onions; sauté 10 minutes, or until tender. Stir in flour. Add cottage cheese, parsley, sherry, salt and pepper; mix well. Turn mixture into an ungreased 9-inch square or oval casserole. In a medium-size saucepan, combine water, salt and remaining butter or margarine; bring to a boil. Remove from heat; stir in milk and curry powder. Add potato flakes; stir gently until flakes are soft and moist. Beat briskly with a fork or wire whisk. With decorating bag, pipe potatoes over top and around sides of mushroom casserole. Place under broiler (about 6-inches from flame) 5 minutes, or until potatoes are lightly browned. Serve immediately.

LABOR DAY, 1966. On September 5th we will celebrate one of our most important holidays — Labor Day. I would like to take this occasion to pay tribute to the working men and women of America — the creators of so much of our Nation's strength, freedom and leadership.


When Peter J. McGuire, founder of the Carpenters' Union and co-founder of the AFL, first proposed a day to honor American working men and women in 1882, he could hardly have conceived that his suggestion would develop into one of our great national holidays. In a few days Americans will again observe Labor Day, honoring — in Mr. McGuire's words — "those who from rude nature have delved and carved all the grandeur that we know". The first Monday of September was chosen as Labor Day, also at the suggestion of Peter McGuire, as "so that it would come at the most pleasant season of the year, nearly midway between the Fourth of July and Thanksgiving, and would fill a wide gap in the chronology of legal holidays".

The significance of Labor Day was summed up some 50 years ago by Samuel Gompers, founder and long time President of the American Federation of Labor, when he said, "all other holidays are in a more or less degree connected with conflicts and battles of man's prowess over man, of glories achieved by one nation over another. Labor Day is devoted to no man living or dead, to no sect, race or nation. Labor Day, in short, is devoted to the achievements of the American working man and woman. It is a tribute to the contributions they have made to the strength, prosperity, and well being of our Country".

AUTOMOBILE AND HIGHWAY SAFETY. Last week the House considered and passed two bills aimed at helping to prevent loss of life on our highways, the Traffic and Highway Safety Acts. There are three major phases of accident prevention. One is the automobile, how it is made and whether it is constructed with prevention of accidents in mind. The second area is the driver, whether he is properly licensed and to what extent his education has trained him to meet the hazards of modern day driving. The third area is driving environment — the best constructed and maintenance of our highways in terms of safety requirements. The Traffic Safety Act (H.R. 13228) deals with the first of these problems; the Highway Safety Act (H.R. 13290) with the latter two.

The major thrust of the Traffic Safety Act is the establishment by the Secretary of Commerce of safety standards for all automobiles.

Boating Tips...



HANDLING CHARACTERISTICS

Bear in mind that your boat's stern always swings out when you turn. You have to get used to this, since it's different than driving an automobile; the front of the car veers right or left when you turn. When your Mercury outboard motor, mounted on the stern, turns to either side, propeller thrust is no longer parallel to the boat's centerline and the stern swings wide. Take this into consideration, or you will clip or bump moored boats, scrape against pilings, and otherwise get into difficulties. To check the boat handling characteristics on turns, pilot it past a marker at different speeds, beginning turns as you pass. Make fairly gentle turns before trying sharper ones to be sure you're acquainted with the boat. While you're "feeling out" the boat, make runs at full speed past the buoy. Cut the throttle as you come abreast of the marker and observe how little distance you need to come to a dead stop.







The War On Poverty

The anti-poverty program is set to be enrolled in 1966, now a year and a half old. Another operation is the Work Experience Program. Family heads who have been on relief with no background of employment are trained in fields for which there is need of workers. Experience indicates there is a definite drop in welfare cases when those trained get suitable employment and take their place as self-respecting workers earning regular pay checks. More than 100,000 are now being trained in this category.

Still another operation of OEO is Vista, or the Volunteers in Service to America. This is similar to the Peace Corps, except that its members work in the United States, instead of abroad. Vista already has 2,000 volunteers who are working in slums, hospitals and community social agencies. Another 3,000 will be enlisted this year. The age of 18 is the minimum one accepted.

Special programs call for technical aid to assist low income farmers improve their crops and increase their incomes. Aid is also being given to migrant farm workers and their families. Day care centers for their children and educational aid are backed up by small loans where these can help towards permanent improvement.

Of the 3,100 counties in the United States, the OEO has in one way or another reached more than 2,700. Mr. Shriver is said to have expressed the belief that the task is being faced with a full recognition of its enormity but with equal recognition that every day shows some degree of improvement in a situation that has developed over many years and will take a number of years to solve.
