FOR MOONEY'S RELEASE San Francisco, Sept. 17: A demand that Tom Mooney be immediately released and given full compensation for suffering endured is contained in resolutions recently adopted at a mass meeting in Gothenburg, Sweden, the Mooney Defense Committee announced today.

The resolutions urge "all the workers in Sweden to arrange protest meetings and consider ways to means to bring pressure to bear on the officials of the State of California."

That California is "unworthy" being considered a civilized state long as Tom Mooney remains in prison is an opinion expressed in the resolutions.

Sporting clubs throughout Sweden are urged "to refrain from participating in the Olympic Games scheduled to take place in Los Angeles this year."

The resolutions hold that "the innocence of Tom Mooney was clearly proven by documentary evidence as well as by investigations made by representatives of the late President Woodrow Wilson."

G. A. Karlsson presided at the meeting which was attended by 50 men and women.

Copies of the resolutions were sent to the American Embassy in Stockholm and another to Governor
