## Španske stavke se razširijo po vsej deželi

200,000 delavcev odložilo orodje v Barceloni. Eden ubit in 200 ranjenih. Španska monarhija poka

Barcelona, Španija, 18. nov. — Generalni štrajk, ki je včeraj izbruhnil v Barceloni, je popolnoma paraliziral vse promet v mestu. Stavka, katere se je udeležilo čez 200,000 delavcev, je spremljana z velikimi nemiri. Včeraj je bilo večje število spopadov s policijo in ena oseba je bila ubita ter okrog 200 ranjenih! V prejšnji noči so stavkarji zaprili elektrarno in vodovod in mesto je bilo brez razvodov in vode.

Stavkarji korakajo po ulicah z redčimi zastavami in klici "Dol z monarhijo, smrt kralju, živela republika!" Slišijo se tudi vzhiki "Živela sovjetska republika!" Delavcem so se pridružili tudi vseučiliščni dijaki, ki pomagajo pri demonstracijah. Policija je bila včeraj v več slučajih brez moći, kljub temu niso oblastniki poslali vojaštva na ulice.

Medtem se stavkovno gibanje razširja po vsej Španiji. Generalni štrajk v Madridu, ki je trajal 48 ur, je bil končan v nedeljo o poledni, ko je že lakota pretih mestu. Tam sta bila dva ubita in več ranjenih. Stavka je v temu tudi v Valenciji, Bilbau in Ovideu; v Austurisu, kjer je že zadnji teden zastavalo 20,000 rudarjev, je vse mirno.

(Barcelona je največje industrijsko mesto v Španiji, ki ima milijon prebivalcev. Nahaja se na obrežju Sredozemskega morja.)

## Nepokoj med čevljarski- mi delavci

Tovarnarji so pričeli z znižavanjem mezd

Philadelphia, Pa. — (FP) — Čevljarski tovarnarji v Philadelphia so te dni znižali mezdu deset odstotkov. Znižanje, pravijo, je začasno in bo trajalo, dokler se ne izboljša položaj v tej industriji. To je že druga redukcija mezd v proših štirih mesecih.

Cevljarska industrija v Philadelphia upošluje v normalnih časih štiri tisoč delavcev, toda sedaj jih dela komaj polovica in še ti samo par dni na teden.

Radi redukcije je nastalo veliko nezadovoljstvo med delavci in širijo se govorice o štrajku. Delodajalcji seveda oblijubujejo več dela delavcem, če se ne bodo upirali mezdni redukcijam.

To je stara pesem, ki se ponavlja v vseh slučajih, kadar delodajalcji skušajo potolažiti svoje delave.

Cevljarski delavci se spomnijo prejšnjih oblub, ki se niso urešnicile, zato tudi sedaj ne verjamajo delodajalcem, ki jim stalno znižujejo njihov življenski standard. "Potrebujemo militante unije," naglašajo veterani v tej industriji. Independent Shoe Workers unije, levčarska organizacija, ki je pred enim letom vodila uspešno stavko pri Laird-Schobler Shoe Co., je podvijala svoje organizatorne aktivnosti, da pridobi vse čevljarske delavce v organizaciji, ki je zmožna voditi boj proti nadaljnji redukciji mezd.

Komitej za brezposelne urgira appropriacijo četrto milijono dolarjev v pomoč revnim družinam

Philadelphia, Pa. — (FP) — Valed naraščajoče armade brezposelnih, je kapitaliste v Philadelphia prevzela bojanec pred izgredi in revolto, ki lahko pride na zimo. Tako je bilo razvidno izjav, ki so bile izredene na konferenci komiteja za pobiranje brezposelnosti. "Revolucion se pripravlja in nihče se ji ne bo mogel ustavljati, če v kratkem ne podvzamemo korakov za omogočenje obstoječe situacije," je dejal Herbert Til, predsednik Strawbridge & Clothier Co., ki je ena največjih departmentnih trgovin v Philadelphia. Župan Mackey pa je izjavil, da ne bo odgovoren za izgred, ki se postane položaj slabši kot je že sedaj. Človek s praznimi želodcem ne more biti racionalen.

"Pozabiti ne smemo, kaj se je zgodilo z neko francosko kraljico, ki je svetovala ubogim ljudem, naj jedo potico, če nimajo hrku," je dejal Ellis Ames Ballard, pravni svetovalec za Philadelphia Rapid Transit Co. "Pomagajmo brezposelnim sedaj, kar je pametnejše kot imeti o pravku z izgradom."

Učence se mora vzgojevati na način, da bodo misili s svojimi možnimi, pravi Newlon

Buffalo, N. Y. — (FP) — Javne sole v Združenih državah odvračajo otroke od samostojnega mišljanja in jim preprečujejo, da bi si ustvarili intelligentno pojmovanje o ekonomskih in socialnih problemih, je dejal dr. Jessie H. Newlon, direktor eksperimentalnega šolskega oddelka na univerzi Columbia.

Dr. Newlon je govoril na učiteljski konferenci, ki se je nedavno vrnila v New York in katero se je udeležilo osentisoč učiteljev in učiteljev. Dejal jim je, naj se osvobode političnih vplivov, ki jim narekujejo učne metode glede gospodarskih vprašanj. Edino na ta način bodo biale zmocne trenirati učence, da bodo lahko misili s svojimi možnimi, je rekel Newlon.

## Važna odločitev pred kanadskim sodiščem

Od odloka je odvisno bodoče u-nijsko gibanje v Kanadi

New York. — (FP) — Kar je Taft-Valejev odlok pomenil za angleške delavce, tako bo tudi odlok glede spora med Society Brand Clothes Ltd. in Amalgamated Clothing Workers unijo pomenil za kanadake. E. Rabkin in New York, urednik židovskega lista Fortschrifta, ki je glasilo organiziranih židovskih krojaških delavcev, je odpotoval v Kanado, kjer bo takoj na odločitev kanadskega vrhovnega sodišča glede spora, ki ga je omenjena krojaška firma naslovila nanj.

Zadeva se vleče na sodišču že štiri leta in je nastala, ko so krojači zastavili pri Society Brand Ltd. Taškat so uredniki družbe izposovali injukcijo proti krojaški uniji, posneže so pa vložili tožbo za odškodnino v vsto \$38,000.

Zadeva je prišla prošlo leto pred sodnikom Cosinsom, ki je sicer podprt družbo v skoro vseh točkah, toda izjavil je, da ne more tožiti krojaško unijo za odškodnino, ker ni inkorporirana v Kanadi, obenem pa je razveljavil injukcijo. Potem je prišla stvar pred apelativno sodiščo, ki je restavriralo injukcijo in določilo, da morajo nekateri posamezniki, ki so vodili stavko, plačati družbi odškodnino za škodo, ki jo je trepla družba v skladu s tožbo za odškodnino v vseh stavkih.

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Pet stavkarjev in trije uredniki United Textile Workers unije, zastopajoči štiri tisoč tekstilnih delavcev iz Danvilia, Va., ki so zastavili v avto, da jim družba prinaša pravico do organizacije, se je to dan oglašilo pri James J. Davisu, tajniku svetega delavskoga departmента. Delegacija je apelirala na Davisa, naj vpliva na Hooverjevo administracijo, da prisili tekstilno družbo, da stopila v pogajanja z stavkarji. Družba je dosegla zavrnitev vse ponudbe za doseglo spravo.

In ves denar, ki se zbere, je v rukoh menjanec, ki v njem resno poslagajo kakor sami hocajo. Delavci, ki morajo prispevati, niso nobene besede pri tem razpolaganju. Geslo, ki ga so magnatje zapisali na zavaro svoje velike feštarske kampanje, se glasi:

"Vsi uposleni potom delodajalci za vse brezposelne!"

BANKO ZAPRJA VRTA PO VSEJ JUGU

V Arkansusu je 39 bank suspendiranih, osem v Kentuckyju in pet v Missouri

Finančna panika je v teku v južnih državah in po centralnem zapadu Amerike. V Arkansusu je 39 bank zaprlo vrata za pet dni, ko se je 17. novembra začel splošni navaj vlagateljev na zavode. Naval je prišel, ko so štiri banke skrashirale. Suspenderane banke imajo 27 milijon dolarjev na skupnem vlog.

V državi Kentucky je medtem propadlo osem bank s skupnim premoženjem \$75,000,000. Med temi je tudi National Bank of Kentucky, ki je poslovala 96 let. Vsi tji kraji so sledili polomu treh velikih bančnih zavodov v Tennessee, ki so zadržali delodajalci.

V Quincyju, Ill., sta dve banki zaprli vrata zadnji teden in takoj je sledilo šest krahov v Misuriju in dva v Iowi.

New York. — Konferenca za progresivno delavsko akcijo je razočarana nad rezultatom predlogov, ker neodvisne in radikalne stranke niso pokazale posebne napredke.
