Supreme Board Proceedings

Montana Stars Plan Dance and Picnic

Figures Concerning Gains and Expenditures of the SNPJ; Decisions Relative to SNPJ Juvenile Circles; Matters Pertaining to Society and Its Cultural Activities

The Supreme Board of the SNPJ, meeting in regular semi-annual session at the Head Office last Thursday, Friday and Saturday, made several important decisions concerning the progress of the organization and its cultural movement.

A lengthy discussion took place concerning the SNPJ Juvenile Circles, a new movement within the SNPJ, which is rapidly gaining ground. A plan of rules and regulations, submitted by Supreme President Vincent Cankar, Director of the Juvenile Circles, was accepted. The Board unanimously approved the decision of the Supreme Executive Committee confirming the appointment of Brother Cankar as director of the SNPJ Juvenile Circles. All lodges and circles wishing any information concerning this movement, should write to him.

It was further decided that each Juvenile Circle select its own name; for this purpose the contest in Our School department conducted in the Mladinski List will be used whereby the children will select their own names for their respective circles.

The Our School contest in the Mladinski List will continue next year on a smaller scale, and the awards in that period shall not exceed the sum of \$200.

The Board allotted \$75 for the support of the juvenile singing societies of Cleveland.

Another lengthy discussion took place concerning the juvenile workers' singing society Slavčki of Trbovlje, Jugoslavia, which is contemplating a tour to the United States next year under the auspices of the SNPJ. The Cultural Committee of the Supreme Board submitted a tentative budget prepared by Brother Zupan, its chairman and member of the Finance Committee. Brother Zupan, who recently returned from a visit in the old country, reported that he heard this juvenile group in Trbovlje sing and he talked with their leaders about the proposed tour. It was decided that the Cultural Committee prepare an exact plan of expenditures concerning this proposition and submit it to the Supreme Executive Committee and to the rest of the Supreme Board members residing in Chicago; present at this meeting must be also Brother Medvesek, third member of the Cultural Committee. However, the final decision of this matter will rest with the Supreme Board voting on the proposal by mail.

The Athletic Board for the next year will consist of the old members who were reelected, with the exception of Bro. Lavrich of Cleveland who was replaced by Bro. Zadel. Bro. Klanshek, district vice president of La Salle, Ill., will serve as representative of the Supreme Board on the Athletic Committee.

The Judicial Committee reported that during the first six months of this year eleven cases of dispute were settled.

Supreme Secretary Vider reported that during the same period 437 new adult members and 1188 new Juvenile members were admitted into the Society. The adult department gained 1129 members. On the other hand, there were 165 deaths in the adult department while 416 dropped out or were canceled. In the juvenile department there were eight deaths, 159 were canceled and 629 boys and girls transferred into the adult department.

On June 30, 1938, the adult membership of the SNPJ was 36,467, and the juvenile membership 14,024; total membership in both departments 50,491, or 887 members more than six months ago.

In the first half of this year the SNPJ paid out \$21,047.50 for 308 cases of operations and \$5,250 for 21 cases of physical disability.

The majority of deaths—43—were due to heart attack, 38 to cancer, 23 to tuberculosis, 16 to pneumonia and 15 to cerebral hemorrhage.

During this period the Society paid out the huge sum of \$196,217.19 in sick benefit to its members, or \$32,758.19 more than during the previous six months.

Particulars of the proceedings will be published in the official minutes.

KNOW YOUR ONIONS!

When thieves laud good morals, when tools of foreign dictators sing glory to democracy, and when the American Bar Association goes on record as favoring the preservation of civil liberties—then it is time for laughter.

All this is not only a figure of speech. It is meant literally because things are constantly happening so.

Every so often our lodges are confronted with written or verbal appeals by groups or organizations of doubtful identity for moral or financial—more often the latter—assistance in the sacred name of "democracy . . ."

This same democracy, so despised, ridiculed, and scorned not long ago by so many all-knowing and self-righteous elements, is now a convenient cloak for every tool faithfully serving foreign dictatorships in this country.

And there is a goodly number of good friends of democracy in our midst who—alas and aleck!—are too short-sighted to see through the deceiving cloak, and so they contribute good-heartedly for every cause pleaded under the cover of democracy!

Good-hearted folks should take just a little effort to learn the truth about this "help-for-the-sake-of-democracy" scheme; it does not take a great deal of effort to find out. But for some good folks even to open an eye is too much.

What about reactionary lawyers proclaiming their readiness to defend civil liberties? This happened two weeks ago at their annual convention. Yes, they are ready! All those slick gentlemen who specialize in obtaining injunctions against the striking workmen in order to trample in the mud the civil rights of every worker who dares to stand for those rights, and all those who specialize in keeping multimillionaires either out of jail or from paying fines for dodging federal income tax—all such gentlemen are now ready to preserve civil liberties in the United States! — — —

Gullible people are likely to believe any charlatan anything he claims, but all the people are not among the gullible.

Next time, when you hear a familiar plea "for the sake of democracy", look out! Look out for those who would double-cross you and stab you in the back! They have done that many times in the past, and they will do so again.

And when you hear a pot-bellied attorney "defending civil liberties"—look out again! It is very necessary these days to know your onions thoroughly . . .
