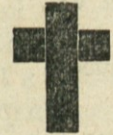

May 1962 put in your hands health, work, play, increased vision and greater capacity to attain the joys you seek—Heaven blessing you.

SECOND SESSION, 87th CONGRESS. In just a few days—on January 10th—the Congress will reconvene for the opening of the second session of the 87th Congress. Among the first items of business will be the election of a Speaker to succeed the late beloved Sam Rayburn. Prior to that election the Democrats will meet in a caucus and decide among themselves whom they will support. Then on the Floor of the House they will nominate their man, and most likely the Republicans will nominate their choice—the minority leader, Charles Halleck of Indiana. Of course, since the Democrats have the majority in the House their choice will prevail. At one time the members of one party helped to select a Speaker of the opposite party, but this was early in our history before party lines had become hardened. It is not likely that this situation will occur under the present two-party system.

Because of the vital role which the Speaker fills, it is understandable that there is great interest in the selection of a new Speaker. The Speaker not only presides over the House, but has many other duties and great influence which make his office much more significant than merely being the Chairman of House proceedings. When the House resolves itself into a Committee of the Whole, it is the Speaker who appoints the Chairman to preside over the Committee's actions. The Speaker also appoints special or select committees, conference committees, and in recent years he has designated some of the members of many governmental commissions and boards. He makes many important rulings and decisions in the House and any member of the House must first be recognized by the Speaker before he can obtain the Floor. He is both a spokesman and a

policy maker for his party. The Speaker is also in the line of succession to the Presidency and in the event of the death or disability of the President and Vice President, he would succeed to that office. For all of these reasons the selection of a new Speaker is of commanding importance.

STAMP HONORING NURSES

It was a pleasure to have participated recently in the ceremony at which a new four-cent commemorative stamp was issued honoring the nursing profession. Because of my long-time interest in the profession of caring for the sick, I was very glad to see this recognition given to nurses by the Post Office Department and the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. The stamp features a young woman, who has finished her probationary period, lighting the traditional candle—symbolizing her dedication to the profession. The Cleveland Postmaster presented a first issue block of stamps to the Council and League for Nursing; Greater Cleveland District of the Ohio State Nurses Association; Future Nurses Club Intercouncil; Student Nurses Organization of Cleveland and Elyria; and Division 4, Practical Nurses Association of Ohio.

SOCIAL SECURITY TAXES INCREASED

The Social Security Administration reminds everyone that Social Security taxes were increased slightly as of January 1st. The rate increase is from 3 to 3-1/8 per cent each on employee and employer, and from 4.5 to 4.7 per cent for those who are self-employed. This applies also to persons employing household workers such as a housekeeper, maid, cook, etc. For those desiring more information there is a pamphlet available through any office of the Internal Revenue Service entitled "Household Employer's Social Security Tax Guide."

Free Dental Party

Good old-fashioned wholesome fun is in store for children who will attend the free dental party at Public Music Hall on Sunday afternoon, February 4, 1962. "Circus Time" is the theme of the show, and the big stage will take on the atmosphere of the big tent. This will be the 22nd annual party sponsored by members of the Cleveland Dental Society, and again Captain Cleantooth will head the welcome committee. He promises free balloons and toothbrushes for the first 1,500 youngsters. Door prizes will be given to the luckier ones who will become owners of gifts such as bikes, transistor radios, ice skates and a live dog. The show begins at 2:00 p.m., but children had better be there much earlier than that, and they should be sure to have an adult with them. Doors will open at 12:30 p.m.

This FREE Children's Party, to which all children and their parents are invited is held in celebration of Children's Dental Health Day which had its origin in Cleveland 22 years ago.

Dr. R. Edward Basista, Chairman of the Children's Party, has arranged for WEWS' Television personality Ron Penfound, better known as "Captain Penny," to serve as Ringmaster of Ceremonies for "Circus Time."

A gigantic circus act known as "The Conley's" has been engaged as the feature attraction. This act has appeared in the best circuses in the country, on TV's Super Circus, and Ed Sullivan's TV shows. Unusual feats of juggling and daring acrobatics will be seen. Children in the audience will also have to be on the alert for the unpredictable antics of "Harvey" the clown and his troupe.

In addition, there will be filmed cartoon, Olympic gymnasts, and a baton twirler. The band music will be furnished by Al Angelotta and his "Musical Clowns." Designed originally to remind parents and children of the importance of good dental health habits begun early in life, the Captain Cleantooth Dental Party is a reward to all the children of Greater Cleveland for their efforts in safeguarding one of their most precious possessions—their teeth.

Dr. Walter H. Maurer, President of the Cleveland Dental Society, remarked, "The hundreds of children who have worked so diligently to improve their knowledge of better dental health these past months, deserve this party for their efforts. I'll be there to welcome them."

In the course of the afternoon the winners of the Society's Annual Dental Poster Contest will be presented and awarded their prizes. This contest, co-sponsored by the Cleveland Press, is conducted in the elementary and junior high schools. The cooperation of the public and parochial schools in this contest is secured through the activities of Dr. Herbert P. Janke, who is Chairman of the Dental Health Education Committee. The latter conducts an all-year round program of providing dental health educational material for school children and the lay public.

Winners of the Mouth Hygiene Award Contest, co-sponsored by the Cleveland Press and the Dental Society, will also be announced. This year's Mouth Hygiene Award will be based on a slogan and coloring

contest conducted in the Bizzy Bear section of the Cleveland Press.

Aside from the professional acts, on hand will be Captain Cleantooth himself, this year portrayed by Dr. Sanford Neuger.

Dentists will meet on Monday, February 5, for the professional phase in all-day sessions at Hotel Carter. Subjects dealing with dentistry for children, with particular emphasis on preventive measures, will be featured.

The American Dental Association will present a one-hour network TV spectacular starring Henry Fonda on Tuesday night, February 6, 1962.

Dental Hygienists and Dental Assistants will help the dentists in the preparations for this 22nd Annual Dental Party.

March of Dimes

Mr. Morton Stotter, campaign chairman, also said the March, which is the final and major event of the 1962 New March of Dimes campaign, will be held on the night of January 30th.

Mother's March funds will be used by The National Foundation to help provide support for its research program, patient aid and professional education — all aimed at the conquest of the three disabling diseases.

"More than 11,000,000 persons in America are afflicted by arthritis or the rheumatoid diseases," the campaign director declared. "There are 250,000 infants born every year in this country with birth defects.
