RADO NAKRST (1906 — 1987)



Rado NAKRST (born Aug. 8, 1906, in Tisic). Actor. Member of the Slovene Theater (SNG) Tivoli, having received acting classes of Božilija Petekar and M. Špriniger in Maribor; he joined, in 1930, the theatrical company of the Drama. He acted upon the SNG stage until 1941 when he was compelled to leave for Yugoslavia. He acted upon the "Billars" of Stojan Štih until 1942 when he left for Tivoli. There he became one of the "pillars" of the theater company and founded its choir. At first he was assistant — in Maribor — the voices of voices and young people's voices, to be succeeded, later on, by more difficult operatic roles. He also worked with O. Hirščec's fine company in Ljubljana and sang

NAKRST Rado (4. avg. 1906 Trst). Igalec. Član SG Trst. Po obiskovanju igralskih šol Bratine, Pregarca in M. Skrbinška v Mb. je prišel 1930 v igralski zbor mb. D. Tu je ostal do apr. 1941, ko se je moral umakniti v Lj. Na odru D SNG je igral do 1945, ko je odšel v Trst. Tam je bil eden stebrov sloven. ansambla in vodilni karakterni igalec. Spočetka se je v Mb. uveljavljal v vlogah ljubimcev in mladih junakov, nato pa je igral vedno izrazitejše karakterne vloge. Nastopal je tudi v Ot. Razvoj je nadaljeval v Lj. in dosegel višek v Trstu. Vloge: Friderik (Veronika Deseniška), Puba Fabriczy, naslovna v Sleherniku, Protasov (Živi mrtvec), Pavlović (Dr.), Wurm, Improvizator (Golouh Krizalida), De Guiche, Gruden, Ivan (Bratje Karamazovi), Petruccio, Warwick (Sveta Ivana), Baron (Na dnu), Piccolomini, Cassio, Horatio (Hamlet), Hlestakov, Valer (Tartuffe), Maks (Kralj na Betajnovi in Školjka), Jerman, Peter-Kobar idr. Nekaj vlog v Trstu: Naslovna v Volponeju, Gremio, Kočkarjov (Ženitev), Sergej Petrovič (Vasa Železnova), Argan (Namišljeni bolnik), Mat (Anna Christie), Krizald (Učene ženske), Tartuffe, Ščuka, Naletel, Dr. Kostanjšek, (Kreft Veleizdajalec), Otto Frank (Dnevnik Ane Frank), Starček (Ionesco Stoli), Polonij (Hamlet), Kostiljov (Na dnu), Direktor (Ambrogi Birozavri), Kuligin (Tri sestre), Kardinal Caetani-Benedikt VIII. (Silone Prigode ubogega kristjana), Doktor S. (Svevo Zenova izpoved), Dolinar (Tavčar Prihodnjo nedeljo), Dr. Sigismund (P. Kozak Dialogi), Dr. Samson (P. Kozak Kongres), Ravnatelj (Vuga Bernardek), nekatere ponovitve idr. Poseben uspeh priznavajo kritiki njegovi vlogi Leona v Gospodi Glembajevih, s katero je gostoval po Jsl. Dobil je prvomajsko nagrado ZDUS in tudi Borštnikovo nagrado. Kot karakterni igalec je nastopal tudi v umetniških filmih *Tri četrtnice sonca*, *Veselica* in *Ples v dežju*.

Rado NAKRST (born Aug.4, 1906, in Triest). Actor. Member of the Slovene Theatre (SG) Triest. Having attended acting classes of Bratina, Pregar and M. Skrbinšek in Maribor, he joined, in 1930, the theatrical company of the Drama. He stayed there until 1941 when he was compelled to leave for Ljubljana. He acted upon the D SNG stage all until 1945 when he left for Triest. There he became one of the "pillars" of Slovene ensemble and leading character actor. At first he was assuming — in Maribor — the roles of lovers and young heroes, to be succeeded, later on, by more distinct character roles. He also worked with Ot. His career then continued in Lj. and achieved

its peak in Triest. Roles: Friderik (*Veronika Deseniška*), Puba Fabriczy, title-role in *Everyman*, Protasov (*Živi mrtvec*, Dead Alive), Pavlović (*Dr.*), Wurm, Improvisor (*Golouh, Krizalida*), De Guiche, Gruden Ivan (*Brothers Karamazoff*), Petruccio, Warwick (*Ste Jeanne*), Baron (*At the Bottom*), Piccolomini, Cassio, Horatio (*Hamlet*), Hlestakoff, Valer (*Tartuffe*), Maks (*King at Betajnova* and *Školjka, Shell*), Jerman, Peter-Kobar etc. Some Triest roles: title-role in *Volpone*, Gremio, Kochkaryoff (*Marriage*), Sergey Petrovich (*Vassa Zhelezova*), Argan (*Malade imaginaire*), Matt (*Anna Christie*), Crizalde (*Femmes savantes*), Tartuffe, Ščuka, Naletel, Dr. Kostanjšek (*Kreft Veleizdajalec*, Grand Traitor), Otto Frank (*Diary of Anna Frank*), Old Man (*Ionesco The Chairs*), Polonius (*Hamlet*), Kostilyoff (*At the Bottom*), Director (*Ambroži Bureausaurus*), Kuligin (*Three Sisters*), Cardinal Caetani-Benedict VIII. (*Silone Adventures of a Poor Christian*), Doctor S. (*Svevo Zen's Confession*), Dolinar (*Tavčar Prihodnjo nedeljo*, Next sunday), Dr. Sigismund (*P. Kozak Dialogues*), Dr. Samson (*P. Kozak Congress*), Ravnatelj (*Vuga Bernardek*), some reprises etc. Much praised by critics was his role of Leon in *The Glembayeff Gentlemen*, performed all over Yugoslavia. Twice he was awarded by First-May Prize "ZDUS" as well as the Boršnik Prize. As a character actor he played several roles in artistic films too, such as *Tri četrtine sonca* (Three Quarters of the Sun), *Veselica* (The Party) and *Ples v dežju* (Dance in the Rain).
