BILL TO REMOVE THE EARNINGS LIMITATION OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT. One of the first bills introduced on the opening day of this Congress was H.R. 315, to remove the limitation upon the amount of outside income which an individual may earn while receiving Social Security benefits. This bill, if enacted, will go a long way, I believe, in correcting what is perhaps one of the most serious inequities in the Social Security Act.

STATE DEPARTMENT CEREMONY

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAMS

Housing Administrator Norman P. Mason recently notified Cleveland authorities that the city has been recertified for Federal assistance in the elimination and prevention of slums and blight under the Community Improvement Program of the Housing Act of 1954.

Social Security Work Restrictions Eased

Among other changes made in the social security law in 1960 is one permitting its beneficiaries to retain more of their benefits than before, when they earn over \$1200 in a year. This change takes effect in 1961.

\$3150 a year. (Heretofore, no benefit at all could be paid in this case if the husband worked every month.) There is no change in the usual provision that no matter how much a worker earns, he may still get his social security check for any month he is not working—and this means neither earning over \$100 wages nor doing any substantial services in self-employment that month.

Warsaw Philharmonic to Play Here on First Tour of North America



The Warsaw Philharmonic one of Europe's most famous orchestras, will play at the Music Hall on Friday evening, January 27th at 8:30 p.m. under the sponsorship of the Cleveland Opera Association, managed by G. Bernardi.

Although its distinction has long been reported by visitors to Poland, the Warsaw Philharmonic has seldom played outside the borders of its own country.

For their first Cleveland appearance the orchestra will feature one of Poland's outstanding young musicians, the violinist Wanda Wilkomska. Under the baton of the distinguished Polish conductor, Witold Rowicki the orchestra will play the following program:

- Music for Strings, Percussion and Celesta Bartok
Concerto No. 1 for Violin and Orchestra Szymanowski
Symphony No. 1 in C minor, op. 68 Brahms

It was Rowicki who was largely responsible for rebuilding the Warsaw Philharmonic in the Polish capital, so terribly damaged by World War II. At war's end in 1945 he first organized the Polish Radio Symphony Orchestra and built it to an outstanding musical institution.

Tickets for the concert are on sale now at the Poznan Travel Agency, 6964 Broadway, at Burrows, 419 Euclid and at the office of the Cleveland Opera Association at 2816 Euclid Ave.

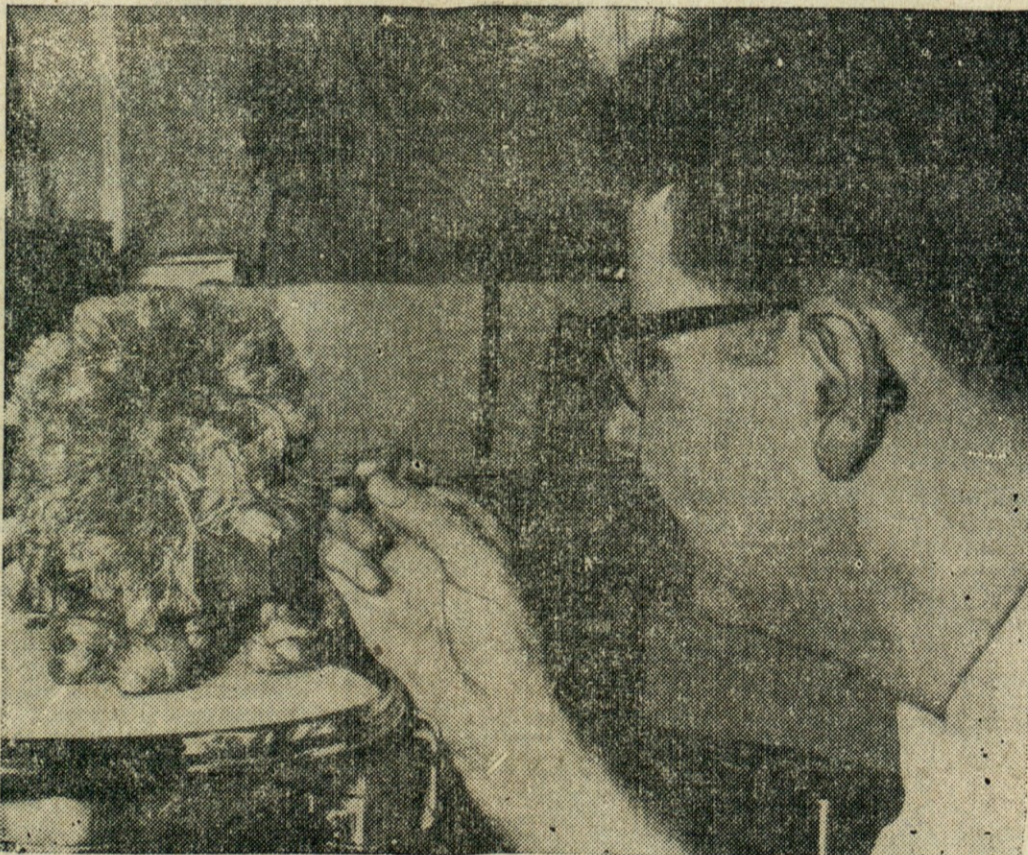
