Vsi so pred sodnikom priznali krivdo, nakar so bili obsojeni in puščeni na svobodo pod sodnim nadzorstvom.

Madžarski begunci v Jugoslaviji ne dobe vstopa v U. S.

WASHINGTON, D. C. — V Ameriko je bilo pripuščeno do sedaj 26,593 madžarskih beguncev. Od teh jih je bilo 24,114 že razposlanih v razne kraje po Ameriki, kjer so našli domove. Tok teh beguncev v Ameriko se nadaljuje; letala prinese vsak dan nadaljnjih 150.

Ampak vsi begunci so oni, ki so pribežali v Avstrijo, oziroma na Dunaj, kjer so jim bila izdana posebna dovoljenja, da se naselijo v Ameriki izven kvotnega zakona o naseljevanju v Ameriko. Madžari, ki so v času vstaje zoper komunistični režim pribežali v Jugoslavijo, ne dobijo dovoljenja, da bi se izselili v Ameriko.

Po navodilu Bele hiše

Kakor so pojasnili zastopniki zveznega urada za priseljenitvo in državljanstvo, je razlikovanje proti madžarskim beguncem v Jugoslaviji posledica ukrepa, ki ga je objavila Bela hiša. V smislu tega dekreta so izjemna dovoljenja za vstop v Ameriko namenjena le tistim Madžarom, ki so pribežali v Avstrijo; onih, ki so prispeli v Jugoslavijo, ta dekret ne krije, in malo verje, da bi administracija riskirala svoj sklep revidirati.

Eden izmed vzrokov utegne biti ta, da gotovi krogi v zveznem kongresu kritizirajo celo program, ki se izvaja v sedanjem obsegu.

Jugoslovanski notranji minister Svetislav Stefanović je pravkar objavil statistiko, da je v Jugoslavijo pribežalo 18,000 madžarskih beguncev. Od teh jih je 12,074 prosilo, da se jim dovoli, da se izselijo; na one, ki bi radi v Ameriko, jih odpade 4,593. Vize za izselitev so bile izdane 214 beguncem, ampak med temi ni nobenega, ki mu je bila izdana ameriška viza.

Spričo tega položaja se je že 976 beguncev vrnilo nazaj na Madžarsko. Kot poroča Stefanović, jih je to storilo 700 samo zadnji teden.

Na 18. januarja je umrl 78-letni samotar, ki je živel zelo siromašno. Sedaj se je odprlo njegovo varnostno shrambo, katero je imel najeto v Cleveland Trust Co. V njej se je našlo 43,000 dolarjev v gotovini. Bankovci so stare velikosti in vsa gotovina je ležala tam leta brez obresti.

V Nemčiji je bilo 31. januarja šest milijonov ljudi brezposelnih. To je najvišje število vseh časov.

Iz Vodic v Čigariji se je izselilo v zadnjih letih 66 družin, 14 v Jugoslavijo, osem v Severno Ameriko, ostale v Trst, Pulj in

Reko. V zadnjih dveh letih je šlo 16 posestev na boben. Napovedane so nove dražbe zlasti na malih posestvih. Pred leti je bilo v selu 22 konj, 862 ovac, 11 volov in 147 krav, sedaj le 13 konj, 400 ovac, en vol in 57 krav. Ljudstvo je popolnoma obupano.

Jugoslavija, ki je skozi ves čas pogajanj vodila vztrajno borbo za Trst, je končno podpisala italijansko mirovno pogodbo.

Z rdečim trakom prevezani dokument je podpisal v Parizu zunanji minister Stanoje Simić, ki je istočasno dal v javnost izjavo, v kateri je trpko protestiral proti trmasti akciji zapadnih sil, ki so odrekale Trst Jugoslaviji.

Grčija je isto protestirala ker se ni ugodilo njenim zahtevam proti Italiji. Kasneje tekom dneva so bile podpisane pogodbe z Rumunijo, Bolgarijo, Madžarsko in Finsko.

S podpisom je Italija prva sila, ki je izposlovala mir.

V Berlinu je nastal v neki plesni dvorani ogenj, v katerem je izgubilo nad 100 ljudi svoje življenje. Dvorana se nahaja v angleški okupacijski zoni. V noreči so izgubili svoje življenje trije angleški vojaki.

Ameriška zveza vlada je zaplenila tri slike, ki so se nahajale v Dayton, Ohio, v ondotnem muzeju. Slike, ki so vredne več sto tisoč dolarjev, so bile ukradene iz muzeja v Veimerju v Nemčiji. Slike sta prinesla dva

nemška vojaka, in kupil jih je neki Daytončan, ki je vedel, da so ukradene. Vlada jih bo hrnila in vrnila Nemčiji.

V Pulju je bil izvršen atentat na angleškega brigadirja R. M. Wintona. Umor je izvršila neka fašistična italijanska nacionalka. Winton je bil ustreljen in je na mestu izdihnil.

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America's Greatest Ballet Performances March 9th and 10th

American Ballet Theatre, directed by Lucia Chase and Oliver Smith, brings its entire company of 100 principals, corps de ballet and symphony orchestra to the Music Hall for Saturday evening at 8:30 p. m. and Sunday matinee, 3:30 p. m., March 9th and 10th.

Saturday, March 9th—Theme and Variations, the aristocrat of contemporary ballet. Balanchine created this glittering and handsome work. Provides further proof of his skill in deriving new sparkle, fresh nuance from the most traditional of occidental dance vocabularies. This classical ballet is danced to the music of the Theme and Variations of Tchaikovsky's Third Musical Suite.

Winter's Eve—On last January 18th, the high point of the company's season in Lisbon, Portugal was the world premiere of this new ballet by Kenneth Macmillan, the brilliant English choreographer whose earlier ballets performed by the Sadler's Wells Ballet are well known in England. The music for this ballet is Benjamin Britten's "Variation on a Theme of Frank Bridge," and the all new production and costumes were designed by Nicholas Georgiadis, whose earlier work has been seen at Sadler's Wells Ballet performances.

Helen of Troy—a bouffant version of Menelaus and the abduction of Helen. This Greek myth, depicts the manner in which Paris, with the aid of Hermes, accomplished the abduction of Helen. Music by Offenbach.

Sunday Matinee, March 10th—Designs With Strings, a lively performance of John Taras' classical and highly contemporary ballet in which there is not plot. You may detect a ghost of a drama, which like the emotions of certain chords and harmonic progressions in music, you are free to interpret as you will. Set to the "Trio in A Minor, Second Movement" by Tchaikovsky.

The Combat—the ballet suggested by Canto III and Canto XII of Tasso's poem, "Jerusalem Delivered," takes place in the days of The Crusades. An encounter of pagan girl and a Christian Warrior. Their final meeting—mortal combat. Only after he has wounded her fatally does he discover that his masked assailant is the girl he loves. Music by Raffaello de Banfield.

Pas de Deux: Black Swan, the Grand Pas de Deux from Act III "Swan Lake" Choreography after Marius Petipa and music by Tchaikovsky.

Graduation Ball—a delightful ballet that captures the spirit of the adolescent remarkably well. The story tells of a graduation ball given by a polite young ladies school, with boys from a neighboring Military Academy as guests. It takes some time for the boys and girls to feel at ease in each others company, but when they do, they enjoy themselves enormously; with a side flirtation between the head

mistress and the old General, add to the fun. Music by Johann Strauss.

American Ballet Theatre just returned from a five month tour of Europe and the Middle-East under the auspices of the State Department's International Exchange Program, where they played to sell out houses in twenty-three cities in thirteen countries.

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THIS WEEK IN AMERICAN HISTORY

On February 28, 1827—130 years ago—the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, the first passenger railroad in the United States, was chartered by the state of Maryland. An ambitious project for its time, the plan was "to construct a double track between the city of Baltimore and some point on the Ohio River, by the most direct and eligible route"—a distance of some 300 miles. On July 4, 1828, the venerable Charles Carroll of Carrollton, Maryland, then more than 90 years old and the only surviving signer of the Declaration of Independence, broke ground for the construction of the railroad. As he struck a spade into the ground he said: "I consider this among the most important acts of my life, second only to that of signing the Declaration of Independence." The old patriot was right, for without railroads, the westward expansion of the United States would have proceeded at a much slower rate, and the whole evolution of the country would have been affected. Today there are some 250,000 miles of railroad tracks in the United States, more than in any other country in the world.
