Dear Readers of Geodetski Vestnik,

Those of you who will be leafing through this issue in print will notice that it is fairly “heavier” than this year’s first issue. In its editorial, Dušan – fortunately – decided to cover the lack of people in land surveying and not the lack of contributions. No, there is currently no shortage of contributions, and there has never been. We only encountered minor technical problems during the transition to the “.si” domain. The magazine’s website remains “.com”, but it also works with the “.si” extension, which is now used for all email addresses of the editorial staff. Dear Authors, please consider this when sending emails in future.

Obviously, we do not have to worry about a lack of contributions. One may rightfully claim that Geodetski Vestnik is the central scientific and professional journal in the area of the former common state and beyond, about which many authors from this area are aware. The contributions for this issue only confirm this. Because we are one of the few journals that publish contributions from a rather diverse professional spectrum – ranging from classical surveying, satellite and geophysical surveying, photogrammetry, remote sensing, and spatial planning to the broad field of modern geoinformatics – without publication fees, there is no need to fear a lack of work in editing and reviewing. This fact is supported by numerous authors from less-developed countries. As a result, some contributions are perhaps less interesting for the Slovenian reader, as they often deal with topics and territories that are not so relevant to the Slovenian area (professional and geographical). Perhaps the editorial board will have to consider introducing a fee, which could also provide a source of additional funding.

Unfortunately, scientific publications have reflected similar trends to economic growth. The demand for more and more is constant, sometimes even at the expense of quality. We do not lower our standards in our editorial office.

We are pleased to note that this issue features three scientific contributions by Slovenian authors, and their decision to publish in our journal only confirms its international reputation. However, we would like to see more professional contributions, especially practical examples from Slovenian surveyors. After all, this is the primary purpose and mission of the journal. By publishing in Slovenian, we remain faithful to the Slovenian language, as we believe that the cultivation of the language and the development of professional terminology are extremely important for the development of a profession in any linguistic environment.

It is true that the days are getting longer, although the outside temperatures do not give the impression that summer is almost here. This also means vacation time. The cloudy days may stimulate potential readers to pick up the journal. In the summer heat, you can also choose the digital edition, although younger generations probably do not even think about the print anymore.
