ABOUT THE TABLE OF THE LAW

Do what thou wilt shall be the whole of the law.

The Table of the Law is an attempt at arranging the sheets of The Book of the Law in a form of a table as specified in the Book itself:

"Paste the sheets from tight to left and from top to bottom, then behold!

There is a splendour in my name hidden and glorious, as the sun of midnight is ever the son."

(AL III 73, 74)

Sixty-five sheets of The Book of the Law and the Commentary are arranged in six lines and eleven columns. The first chapter (22 sheets) is encapsulated by the first two lines, the second chapter (22 sheets) by the next two lines, and the third chapter (21 sheets + the Commentary) by the last two lines. The upper portion of the Table contains the manuscript (Liber XXXI), while the lower contains the transcription of the manuscript (Liber CCXX).

For the accompanying research, the Book of the Law and the rest of the Thelemic literature are recommended.

Since the matter in question is a holy book, it would be reasonable to place it in the "holiest" place of your dwelling. Should you perhaps feel that the energies of the Table are too intense, you can store it in a safe place until the matters have calmed down and balance has restored. You can also cover it in fabric when out of use.

Now a single view offers us the Law in its entirety and all the 65+1 sheets shine in their unique light. Originally, the sheets of the book are arranged from right to left and top to bottom, but it can also be read in arbitrary directions, sequence, randomly, etc. In the given form it can be used for meditation, divination...

The Table of the Law and the arrangement of the sheets of The Book of the Law is an act of art of the issuer himself and is not an official document of the Ordo Templi Orientis.

I would also like to use this occasion to express my gratitude to the Ordo Templi Orientis Slovenia itself, for enabling the circulation of this publication.
