WASHINGTON, 16. nov.—Danes glede Pearl Harbor, danes prinesla na dan dejstva, da je ameriška mornarica pošljati konvoje za pomoč plovilom na Pacifiku, predno so Japonci 7. novembra 1941 vprizorili napad na Pearl Harbor.

DE GAULLE ODSLOPIL KOT PREDSEDNIK VLADE

PARIZ, sobota, 17. nov.—Gen. De Gaulle, ki je med vso vojno simboliziral francoski odpor proti nacizmu, je sredi radi spora s komunisti položil resignacijo kot predsednik francoske provizorične vlade, na katero mesto je bil po splošnih volitvah, ki so se vršile nedavno, ponovno izvoljen šele pretekli tork.

De Gaulle je odstopil, ko je sprevidel, da ne more formirati nove koalicijske vlade, sestojee iz predstavnikov treh najmočnejših političnih strank.

SANGHAJ, 16. novembra.—Gen. Wedemeyer je danes naznanil, da je poveljnikom ameriških marinov dal dovoljenje, da zavzemajo "primerno akcijo", vključivši zračne napade, ako treba, da se ustavi napade na marinske posadke v vasi med Tanhsanom in Chinwangtze.

Theodore Andrica poroča v "Cleveland Pressu" s svojega obiska po raznih krajih na Dolenjskem sledeče:

"V svojem prejšnjem poročilu sem poročal, kaj sem videl in slišal v Sodražici. Moj obisk v Sodražici in sosednjih krajih mi je omogočil slovenski časniški urad v Ljubljani, ki mi je za en dan dal avtomobil na razpolago.

"V spremstvu Dušana Omahna sem nekega jutra zapustil Ljubljano in ustavila sva se najprej v Rašici, kjer sem govoril s Jožetom Mustarjem. Njegov brat Anton živi v Clevelandu. Trije Jožetovi bratje so se borili s partizani, ampak so prišli iz vojne živi. Izmed 48 hiš v vasi so jih Italijani šest popolnoma požgali, nekaj pa jih je delno razdejanih.

Srečanje s sorodnikom Clevelandčanov v Vel. Laščah

"V Velikih Laščah sem govoril s Karlom Otoničarjem, ki ima v Clevelandu brata Jožeta in sestro Ano. Zadnje pismo iz Clevelanda je dospel semkaj leta 1940. Karel je rekel, da je prebil dve leti v nemškem suženjskem taborišču, dve leti pa je bil interniran v Italiji. Ena njegovih sester je pred petimi leti umrla v Velikih Laščah.

"Nekdo mi je naročil, da sporočim Brodnikovim v Clevelandu, da so vsi člani družine doma živi z izjemo enega fanta, ki so ga ubili belogardisti.

"Avgust Jaklič me je prosil, da sporočim njegovemu bratu Joseph Jakliču v Clevelandu, da so vsi v družini živi in da se je on sam boril s partizani. Govoril sem tudi z Marijo Saksidar, katere stric James Hočevar biva v Clevelandu. Povedala mi je, da je vsa družina v Vel. Laščah živa in zdrava.

Ribnica je bila v vojni skoro popolnoma razdejana

"Iz Vel. Lašč sva nadaljevala pot proti Sodražici in po večurnem obisku tam sva se podala v Ribnico, ki je poznana tišočerim Clevelandčanom slovenskega porekla. Medtem ko je

prav iz Ribnice prišlo v Cleveland primeroma malo ljudi, pa so okoliške vasi poslate tja na tisoče naseljencev.

"Ribnica je skoro razdejana in mnogo hiš je bilo poškodovanih od topniškega ognja. Cerkev je skoro porušena in sedaj so na delu, da jo rešijo popolnega razpada. V Ribnici je mnogo nemških ujetnikov, ki poravljajo poškodovane stavbe.

"V lokalni gostilni sva imela obed in tam sem srečal Avgusta Trojarja iz Jesenic, ki me je prosil, da sporočim pozdrave njegovemu stricu Johnu Moharju, ki biva v Clevelandu.

Vsi Kočevarji so zbežali z naciji v Nemčijo

"Iz Ribnice sva nadaljevala pot v Kočevje, kjer je bil nekdo center kočevskih Nemcev, ki so bili poslani v Slovenijo kot kolonisti pred več kot 600 leti. Mesto samo je popolnoma razdejano in tam danes nihče ne biva z izjemo oddelka vojakov in slovenskih civilistov.

"O Kočevju se mi zdi umestno poročati, ker je od tam prišlo v Cleveland na stotine družin. Ko sem se v prejšnjih letih ustavil v Kočevju ob okoliških vaseh, sem tam našel mnogo prijateljev in sorodnikov cleveandskih Kočevarjev. Danes v Kočevju samem in okoliških vaseh sploh ni nobenih Nemcev več. Kot razumem, se v Kočevju nahaja velik koncentracijski tabor, kjer sedanja jugoslovanska vlada drži ljudi, o katerih ne mara, da bi se svobodno kretali.

"V eni hiši, ki ni bila preveč poškodovana, sem našel Franca Beljana, nečaka Josepha Merharja iz 15804 Grovewood Rd. Merharjeva sestra Marija Beljan je umrla v juniju tekočega leta in naprošen sem bil, da sporočim to žalostno vest v Clevelandu. Dva brata, Jože in France Merhar živita v Dolenji vasi.

LYDICK, Ind., 16. novembra.—Najmanj 22 oseb je bilo ranjenih, med temi dve resno, ko se je v bližini tega mesta danes zjutraj pripetila velika železniška nesreča. Vlak Advance Commodore Vanderbilt, ki je bil na potu v New York, se je zaletel v razbite vagone tovornega vlaka, ki so stali na progi, po kateri je šel potniški vlak.

Sedem izmed 15 Pullman vagonov je bilo prevrnjenih skupno z lokomotivo. Večina ranjenec je bilo železniško osebje.

Ameriški znanstveniki poslali nujen apel na predsednika Trumana, da se prepreči nesoglasje med anglo-ameriški silami in Rusijo

WASHINGTON, 16. novembra.—Danes je 2,000 vodilnih ameriških znanstvenikov naslovilo na predsednika Trumana nujen apel, da takoj povabi Sovjetsko unijo, da se skupno z Zed. državami in Anglijo udeleži nove konference, ki naj bi bila sklicana za kontroliranje atomskih orožij.

Apel poudarja, da bi se taka konferenca morala vršiti kot dopolnilo k sedanji konferenci v Washingtonu, na kateri so zastopane Zed. Države, Anglija in Kanada, v svrhu tega, da bi se brez odlašanja organiziral mednarodni sistem za kontrolo atomske energije.

Ta akcija je bila podvzeta na inicijativo dr. J. H. Rush-a in dr. Francis D. Bonnerja, ki sta zavzemala vodilno mesto pri projektih, kjer so producirali atomsko bombo.

Dr. Rush je v uradu demokratske kongresnice Douglas iz Californije izjavil, da je slehernega znanstvenika prevzel strah v trenutku, ko so zvedeli, kaj se pripravlja. To je vzrok, zakaj so znanstveniki prvič v zgodovini sklenili, da nastopijo v javnosti, ker smatrajo, da je to njih dolžnost kot državljanov.

Kar se tiče sklepa, ki je bil objavljen včeraj, da se proces atomske bombe drži še nadalje kot tajnost, ni v Washingtonu nikogar zadovoljil. S sklepom so nezadovoljni tako člani kongresa, ki zahtevajo, da atomska bomba ostane brezpogojno tajna, kakor tudi oni, ki urgirajo, da se proces deli z ostalimi narodi.
