

SEOUL. — Včeraj je padlo glavno korejsko mesto Seoul brez boja v oblast zavezniških čet.

V centralni Koreji je ameriška prva divizija prekoračila reko Hongchon ter prodrla 18 milj do 38. vzporednika. Mesto Seoul včeraj še ni bilo popolnoma zasedeno, toda poročevalci poročajo, da ni nikjer sovražnika na spregled.

V Seoul so vkorakale južnokorejske čete, ki so izvesile zastavo republike na stolpu kapitola mesta, ki je že štirikrat menjalo svoje gospodarje, odkar se je 25. junija začela korejska vojna.

### Ubiti iranski premier je bil velik prijatelj Zedinjenih držav

Sin ubitega premierja študira tehniko na kolegiju v Syracuse.

WASHINGTON. — Strel, ki je ubil iranskega premierja Ali Razmara, je hkrati podrl enega najmočnejših stebrov ameriškega prijateljstva v Teheranu. On je bil smatran kot močan mož in spreten politik, ki je znal parirati sovjetsko zadržanje, ki je danes prijazno, jutri sovražno. Njegov morilec je 26letni mizar Abdullah Rastegar, pripadnik neke fanatične sekte, na katere shodjo so komaj dan poprej govorniki žigosali vse tuje vplive in njihove predstavnike: premierja Stalina, predsednika Trumanu in angleškega kralja Georga.

SYRACUSE, N. Y. — Novzat Razmara, 20-letni sin ubitega iranskega premierja, študira tehniko na kolegiju v Syracuse.

### ELEKTRARNA BO SVOJO SILO POVEČALA, DA BO ZADOSTILA VSEM ZAHTEVAM

Da bo v stanu zadostiti vsem zahtevam po električni sili, bo Cleveland Electric Co. do konca 1953 zvišala obseg kilowatov za 1.500.000. To je skoro še enkrat toliko, kolikor kilowatov je imela ta elektrarna pred dvema letoma.

Predsednik družbe, Elmer L. Lindseth, je naznanil za 50 odstotkov povečanje podružnice v Eastlake. Delo tam so pričeli že lansko leto. Začetkom so imeli namen, da zgradijo tam elektrarno za 250.000 kilowatov sile, zdaj so pa določili, da bo imela ta elektrarna 375.000 kilowatov električne sile. Instalirani bodo trije generatorji, vsak po 125.000 kilowatov sile. Prvi generator bo obratoval že prihodnje leto, drugi in tretji pa leta 1953.

Stroški za zgradnjo te podružnice so določeni na \$55.000.000.

### Iranski parlament je soglasno podpržvil petrolejsko industrijo

TEHERAN. — Iranski parlament je včeraj soglasno odglašoval podpržavljenje iranske oljne industrije, ki jo lastujejo Angleži in ki je bila eden glavnih pridobitvenih virov olja Zapadu.

Anglo-Iranian Oil Co., kontrolira vse iransko olje in ga prodaja zapadnim ter prozapadnim narodom.

Sovjetska zveza in vse prosovjetske struje v Iranu so podpirale to naredbo parlamenta.

### Značilna izjava češkega ambasadorja Bohuslava Kratochvila

Kdor sklepa kompromise s komunisti, zaslužuje otroke svojih otrok, je izjavil bivši ambasador v Indiji. SUEZ, Egipt. — Semkaj je dopel s parnikom v družbi svoje žene in sina dr. Bohuslav Kratochvil, ki je bil ambasador Českoslovaške v Delhiju, Indija, pa se je odpovedal svojemu položaju, ko ga je češka vlada pozvala nazaj v Prago. Ambasador je na potu v Anglijo, kjer je dobil politično pribežališče.

Bivši poslanik je dejal, da je komunizem organizirano zločinstvo in dodal: "Moje iskreno prepričanje je, da vsak, ki sklepa kompromise s komunizmom, zaslužuje s tem otroke svojih otrok." Kratochvila je imenoval za ambasadorja v Indiji tedanji zunanji minister Clementis, ki je zdaj zaprt in obtožen veleizdaje.

DAYTON, O. — Ameriška zveza urednikov je včeraj naznanila, da je brzojavila argentinskemu predsedniku Peronu, naj zavzame takoj potrebne korake, da se zagotovi v Argentini še nadaljnje izhajanje svobodnega časopisa. — (Akcija ameriških urednikov se nanaša na zatrtje lista "La Prensa.")

## ARETACIJA NADALJNEGA ZNANSTVENIKA V N. Y.

Zdaj je bil izročen federalni poroti William Perl, profesor kemije v New Yorku in odlični znanstvenik v aerodinamiki.

WASHINGTON. — Justični odedek je naznanil včeraj aretacijo Williama Perl-a, 32 let starega znanstvenika in inštruktorja fizike na Columbia univerzi. Obdolžen je krive prisega in krivega pričevanja. Njegov slučaj je bil izročen v sredo veliki poroti, ki preiskuje atomsko špionažo.

Obtožnica mu očita štirikratno krivo pričevanje dne 18. avgusta in 11. septembra, ko je zanikal, da bi poznal vohuna Juliusa Rosenberga in Mortona Sobell-a, čeprav ju dobro pozna. Prav tako je zanikal poznanstvo z ostalimi obtoženci, napram katerim je zdaj v teku obravnava.

Perl je bil rojen leta 1918 v New Yorku pod imenom Perl-mutter, pa si je l. 1945 s sodnijskim dovoljenjem spremenil svoje ime v Perl. Njegov oče je bil rojen v Rusiji, njegova mati pa v Poljski. Oba sta naturalizirana državljanca.

### Senatorji svarijo pred nenadnim in nepričakovanim sov. bombnim napadom

Izkušnje v Koreji so dokazale, da samo zračna in mornariška sila nista dovolj za obrambno vojno. — Za odpor proti agresiji so neobhodno potrebne tudi kopne čete.

WASHINGTON. — Senatni odbor za zunanje zadeve in odbor za oboroženo silo sta izjavila, da je zdaj "samo še vprašanje časa", ko bo imela Sovjetska zveza dovolj atomskih bomb, da zada "Zapadu nenaden in nepričakovan 'knock-out' udarec."

V sovjetski atomski ofenzivi bi bile najbrže vključene tudi Zed. države, ki bi bile "vsekakor prednostna tarča" teh bomb. Tozadevno svarilo je bilo sedaj vključeno v poročilu, v katerem se priporoča naglo odpremo ameriških čet v Evropo.

Oba odbora sta se odločno izjavila proti onim, ki zagovarjajo in propagirajo idejo, naj bi se Zed. države koncentrirale na dolgoročno zračno silo, kot priporoča n. pr. bivši predsednik Hoover. Senatorji pravijo, da kjer imajo na razpolago obe sili, pa se je izkazalo, da brez kopni oblasti Sovjetske, preden bi njih armad nista dovolj.

### Italijanska vlada želi Titovega posredovanja za preklic omejitev italijanske oborožitve

Jugoslovanski režim gleda z razumevanjem na dejanski položaj, ki ga je ustvarila napram Italiji Kominforma z oboroževanjem satelitov.

BEOGRAD. — Enrico Martino, italijanski poslanik v Beogradu, je izročil maršalu Titu poslanico svoje vlade, v kateri slednja pravi, da v očigled oboroževanja Madžarske, Romunije in Bolgarije bi se morala zdaj preklicati restrikcije glede italijanske oborožitve, ki jih je določila mirovna pogodba.

Italijanska nota naglašuje, da je Italija prav tako ogrožena po teh armadah kakor je Jugoslavija, zato bi bilo treba revidirati tozadevne okrnitve italijanske oborožitve.

## Ugled Vatikana raste

"Še nikdar v svoji dolgi zgodovini ni imel Vatikan tako obsežnih in tesnih vezi z vsemi deli sveta, kot jih ima danes," je nedavno izjavil visok rimski cerkveni dostojanstvenik, ko je govoril o Svetem letu. "Je ta pripomba upravičena?" se vprašuje neodvisni švicarski list "Die Weltwoche," po katerem tale članek povzemamo.

Papež Pij XII. je dovolil v Svetem letu nad 6.000 avdienc. Rim je obiskalo v tem času okoli 3 in pol milijona romarjev, medtem ko jih je prišlo v "Večno mesto" ob priliki predzadnjega Svetega leta (1925) komaj 600.000.

Sveta stolica vzdržuje zveze s celim svetom. Medtem ko je bilo pred prvo svetovno vojsko leta 1914 zastopanih pri Vatikanu komaj 17 držav, jih je danes 40, nevštevši Nemčijo in Japonsko, ki doslej še nimata pravice lastnega zunanjega zastopstva.

Papež je sprejel v pretečenem letu 36 državnih poglavarjev in predsednikov vlad. Glavni tajnik "Arabske Lige" Azzam paša je ob priliki svojega sprejema pri Sv. stolici izjavil, "da njegovo edino upanje na rešitev iz sedanje stiske sloni na sodelovanju islama in katolicizma v borbi s komunističnim. V islamskem svetu uživa papež izreden ugled."

Odkar obstoja v Franciji parlamentarizem, še ni nikdar v tej deželi obstojala kaka katoliška stranka, katere člani bi zavzemali najvažnejša in najvišja mesta v državi, kot se dogaja v zadnjih letih. Podobno lahko rečemo o Zahodni Nemčiji, Belgiji in Holandski. Ne moremo tajiti vpliva Vatikana na Italijo, kjer se vse od zedinjenja leta 1870 pa do danes ni nikdar mogla kaka katoliška stranka povzpeti do moči, ki jo uživa in izvaja danes "Democrazia cristiana."

Poleg tega pa uživa papež na apeninskem polotoku naravnost neverjeten ugled in priljubljenost. Delno moremo porast papeževе priljubljenosti v Italiji pripisovati tudi padcu monarhije v tej državi. Savojski so bili ves čas izraziti protikatoliški, lateranska pogodba na tem stanju ni veliko spremenila. Italija je bila vse čas pod vplivom dveh središč: Vatikana, kjer stoji papež in Kvirinala, kjer so od leta 1870 stolovali italijanski kralji. Ko so odstavljeni Savojski zapustili državo, se je ljubezen Italijanov osredotočila na papeža. Italijani so narod tradicije in ljubijo sijaj in slikovitost. Preje so v času stiske obračali svoje oči k svetnemu vladarju, zdaj se zbirajo okrog Kristusovega namestnika. To dejstvo napolnjuje morda nekatere z zadovoljstvom, pri drugih pa vzbuja divje ugovore, toda zaradi tega ostane še vedno dejstvo, ki ga ne moremo spraviti s sveta, ugotavlja švicarski list.

Porast vpliva katoliške Cerkve v ameriški javnosti, pa švicarski neodvisni list popisuje takole: "V 17. stoletju je na vsakih 100 Amerikancev prišel komaj eden katolik. To število se je sedaj povečalo na 18. Katolikov je v Združenih državah še enkrat več kot baptistov, trikrat toliko kot metodistov in petkrat toliko kot presbiterijancev. Katoliška cerkev šteje danes v ZD 28 milijonov vernikov s 50.000 duhovniki, 153 škofij, 21 nadškofij in 4 kardinale. To številno versko občestvo je med seboj trdnejše povezano kot prebivalstvo katerekoli evropske katoliške dežele."

Rastoči vpliv papeštva izvira iz različnih okoliščin. Duhovna razklanost sedanosti, ko se različne ideologije brezobzirno bore ena z drugo, ko se vse nekdanje vrednote poglagajo na tehtnico, ko skušajo nekateri vse, tudi ono, kar so ljudje nekdanj smatrali za temelj in cilj življenja, proglasiti za navlako, prihaja močno do izraza; preprost človek čuti danes bolj kot kdajkoli potrebo po nespremenljivi resnici, potrebo po duhovni enotnosti in po v večnem zakoreninjenju avtoriteti. Katoliška Cerkve s svojim tisočletnim naukom, s svojimi dogmami, s svojim izključevanjem dvomov in nepopustljivo enotno organizacijo odgovarja kot nalašč težnjam in hrepenenju sodobnega človeka. Zato se poleg nešteti vernikov obračajo danes proti Rimu tudi premnogi, ki vidijo v njem oazo stalnosti in trdnosti, ki jih bodisi zavestno ali pa tudi nezavestno privlačijo.

Papež se neprestano zavzema za mir. To potegovanje za mir je tudi prineslo svoj delež k poraslem ugledu papeštva, toliko bolj, ker se nihče ne upa dvomiti o jasnem značaju in pogumu papeža.

Vatikan ne prikriva, da hoče ostati popolnoma neodvisen in ohraniti nepristransko stališče med obema nasprotujočima si skupinama sil.

Medtem pa je popolnoma jasno, da vsak uspeh komunizma pomeni nevarnost za vero, torej tudi za katoliško Cerkve. Vatikan bo vedno zagovornik vseh obrambnih zvez in to do skrajnih možnih meja, v kolikor bodo take zveze služile ohranitvi miru. V novoletnem nagovoru je dejal Pij XII. diplomatskem zboru, da morajo biti najprej vse možnosti pogaňan izčrpane, pa še vendar morajo ohraniti vsi dogovori obrambni značaj. Tako stališče morda nekaterim političnim mogočnejšem ne ugaja, toda preprost človek, ki ga misel na novo vojno globoko vznemirja, je papežu za tako stališče hvaležen.

Končno je pa k naraščajočemu ugledu Vatikana doprinesel svoj delež tudi Kremeľ in njegovi pomagači. 
### Up High With the Air Force

# This and That from Washington

By Congressman Frances P. Bolton



Mrs. Bolton has been doing as much as I could on an individual basis, but of course, this could never solve the fundamental problems.

SO MANY small businesses in the District have been adversely affected by uncertainty in the defense picture that I have been greatly concerned as to the survival of many small enterprises in this most vital field of our economy. It is on the so-called "small fellows" that the ultimate production of the bigger plants depends. I have been doing as much as I could on an individual basis, but of course, this could never solve the fundamental problems.

It is therefore with a great deal of satisfaction that I am able to announce that the Small Business Committee of the House, headed by Mr. Wright Patman (D-Texas) and sponsored by Mr. Charles Halleck (R-Indiana) is organizing to tackle the problem of small business in an efficient way. While I am not a member of this Committee, I have been working closely with them, and this week I invited Congressman Patman and Halleck to send their first sub-committee on field investigations to the Cleveland area as being near the top of the list in the defense effort.

Arrangements are being made thru Mr. John Lucas, President of the Yoder Manufacturing Co. and Mr. S. R. Christopherson, of Smaller Business of America, Inc., 4500 Euclid Avenue, Cleveland, Ohio, to see that the committee is given all possible data and facilities on which to base their recommendations for the Cleveland program.

THE drafting of 18 year olds had its baptism of fire in the Senate this week. We, in the House, will have an opportunity to debate this vital question in the weeks to come. Meanwhile, I return to a statement I made early in January which I believe needs clarification. Some people seemed to think that I favored drafting the older groups, including veterans, before taking the younger men. What I did say was that the defense organizations should use the personnel they now have to better advantage in order to determine how low in the age scale they needed to go. I had in mind a sort of "job analysis" among the armed services in order to step up their efficiency. I still think much pressure could be taken off draft-age men by such a job analysis, and it is a thing which I am following closely.

There is another aspect of the Man Power situation into which I am inquiring diligently also. That is the uncertainty which prevails among members of the National

Guard and Inactive Reserves, where employment is concerned. An employer naturally does not want to take the Guardists or Reservists if they are subject to indeterminate call within a few weeks.

My first inquiries of the Army have started this chain of events: the Defense Department has reactivated what it calls its Civilian Components Policy Board to establish a definite time limit for recalling Guardists and Reservists. It would be comparatively easy if we were now under a full mobilization call for all-out war, because these conditions are definitely established in Army regulations. However, the Policy Board is working to establish similar time limits for the partial mobilization under which we now find ourselves. That schedule is now in the Office of Defense Secretary Marshall, and should be acted upon in the near future. Roughly, it will establish whether a man shall be called within 30 days, within 6 months, or within a year. Some will be stricken from the Reserve list altogether. Thus, both employer and employee should soon have a clear enough picture of the real situation so that these constant disturbances in the economic structure will not occur from this source.

I FEEL like giving you one little peep behind the scenes this week, although I do not, as you know, go in for bouquets. But in the matter of the meat-pricing mix-up this week, it gave me a tiny thrill to know that I had been of help to businessmen in my District. It was the case of an amendment to the price regulation, Amendment 2, which caused an unconscionable amount of bookkeeping in an impossibly short time, if the meatmen were not to be in technical violation of the regulation. Thru a telegram from Mr. Earl C. Gibbs, of the Gibbs Packing Company, my office was able to catch the Price Control Board at a top level conference and get them to consider an extension of time for this amendment. The extension was granted for a week, and the meat-packers tell me it did give them some relief. This is one of the many compensations which I derive from my job here.

THE challenge of big things to come is a constant inspiration to me. We are facing really big problems if America and the free nations are to retain world leadership. We must plan well ahead, not only for the year to come but for many years ahead. I myself am planning legislation not only for this Congress, but over a long range program in the Congresses that follow. . . progressive legislation that will make America even stronger and give her a position of greater leadership. We must go forward. We must prepare for the future. Legislation must keep pace with our world. It is this thought which keeps me constantly at my post, and which keeps me constantly planning for the future and for the consummation of such progressive legislation.

The volume, the gift of Walter H. Annenberg, editor and publisher of the Philadelphia Inquirer, will be distributed to the campers through the 541 Scout councils in the nation.

## Community Spirit

That the spirit of the Norwood Community Council is still alive, even though the Council itself is not very active, was demonstrated just recently.

Many years ago the people of Cleveland voted a bond issue for the building of another incinerator, for the disposal of garbage. Since that time the Director of Streets, Mr. Sam David, has been attempting to locate a suitable site. Originally, a section of the Glenville area was proposed, however fell thru when the residents of that area made it known that such a building was not desirable in their neighborhood.

It was then decided that the foot of E. 72nd St. would be a logical spot. How wrong this assumption was as evidenced at the session which the Council Planning Committee held at City Hall on Thursday afternoon March 8th. Councilman Edward J. Kovacic clearly presented the neighborhood objections towards this site. Over a hundred residents of the immediate area were there to back up his statements.

We are very happy to report that the ordinance was defeated and the Director of Streets instructed to look for another site less detrimental to neighborhood property. Councilman Edward J. Kovacic put his story across so ably it was not necessary for anyone else to state their objections, altho hundreds of voices would have, had they been called upon.

This incident again shows what can be done if you, your neighbor on the right and your neighbor on the left, join in a fight against a problem detrimental to your area. Let's keep this in mind as a classic example of what can be done if people are united.

While on this subject one wonders if consideration is ever given by our public officials, that some saving in hauling expense, as in this case, would be more than offset by the losses affected in the neighborhood because of property devaluation, etc.

Mr. Sam David, at the hearing, brought out the increase in tonnage of refuse the last ten years. One wonders whether the peak has been reached; the high cost of living which is bound to continue upward should make people less wasteful; years ago at the planning meetings we were shown that the City of Cleveland in the next 10 to 20 years is going to lose over 100,000 residents; more and more homes are providing themselves with garbage disposal units; the time may come when all new homes will have these. Maybe it would be cheaper in the long run if the City of Cleveland would subsidize the purchase of such units for all homes and eventually eliminate the collection and disposal expense.

All the above facts should tend to decrease the amount of refuse in the future and it might be entirely possible that we do not need another incinerator.
