BERLIN JE TRETJIČ BOMBARDIRAN V TEKU 11 NOČI

Nočni napad od strani angleške zračne sile je sledil težkim ameriškim napadom na baze v Franciji

Danes zgodaj zjutraj se iz Londona poroča, da so angleški bombardniki snoči vprizorili težak zračni napad na Berlin, kar pomeni, da je bil Berlin tretjič bombardiran v teku enajstih noči.

Prva vest o velikem novem napadu je prišla od nemške D. N. B. agencije, ki ne skuša prikriti, da je tretji napad povzročil v nacistični prestolnici grozljivo razdejavanje.

Napad na letalske obrate

Tekom dneva so ameriške letalske trdnjave vprizorile enega največjih zračnih napadov na baze v Franciji. Tudi najhujšega napada so bili Hitlerjeve tovarne za proizvodnjo bojnih letal v bližini Pariza.

Rdeča armada je zavzela nadaljnjih 410 naseljenih krajev

Glasovi iz Moskve je znanost Rdeča armada včeraj zavzela 410 novih krajev v porečju Donjece, pri čemur so bili Nemci na mnogih sektorjih pognani nazaj. Rusi so tokom dneva zavzeli velike zaloge vojnega materiala od topov do popolnoma otovorjenih vlakov in dobili mnogo ujetnikov.

135 milj od Kijeva

Rusi so okupirali mesto Alotovo, ki leži 14 milj severno od Komotopa. To pomeni, da so v bližini sektorja napredovali 12 milj in pol in da se je na poti do Kijeva, glavnega mesta Ukrajine, skrčila na 135 milj. Dalje to pomeni, da so Rusi samo še 23 milj od mesta Račnaja, iz katerega teče pet glavnih železniških prog.

Silno napredovanje v porečju Donjece je Rdečo armado postavilo samo 23 milj vzhodno od mesta Stalino, ki je 12. najdaljše rusko mesto. Na tem sektorju so okupirali mesto Alotovo, ki leži 14 milj severno od Komotopa. To pomeni, da so v bližini sektorja napredovali 12 milj in pol in da se je na poti do Kijeva, glavnega mesta Ukrajine, skrčila na 135 milj. Dalje to pomeni, da so Rusi samo še 23 milj od mesta Račnaja, iz katerega teče pet glavnih železniških prog.

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Nov udarec za tajnika Cordella Hulla

Uradnik za živilsko produkcijo je ožigosal državni department in položil resignacijo.

Včeraj je James D. Lecron odstopil v Washingtonu kot uradnik akcije za povečanje živilske produkcije v Južni Ameriki in ob tej priliki je podal javno, v kateri je ostro kritiziral državni department radi "nesposobnosti, obstrukcije in nesposobne diktacije."

To je nov udarec za državnega tajnika Cordella Hulla, ki je bil te dni tarča kontroverze radi odnosa s Sovjetsko unijo.

Prijatelj Wallace-a

Lecron, ki je prijatelj podpredsednika Wallace-a, je v svoji resignaciji zapisal, da se je "naveličal tolči z glavo ob zid nesposobnosti in vmešavanja."

Lecron je resigniral kot direktor živilske divizije v uradu koordinatorja za med-ameriške zadeve. Njegova naloga je bila, pospeševati produkcijo živil v Južni Ameriki v skladu s potrebami združenih narodov.

BOLGARSKI PREMIER PRI HITLERJU

New York Times prinaša iz Berna, Švica, poročilo, da je bolgarski premier Bogdan Filov, sledeč stopinjam nekdanjega jugoslovanskega premierja Dragiša Cvetkovića, z aeroplanom odletel v Berchtesgaden, kjer je imel tri ure trajajoč razgovor z Adolfom Hitlerjem.

Ko se je Filov vrnil v Sofijo, je takoj sklical sejo voditeljev vladne stranke voditeljev "tolerirane" opozicije, in predsednikov obeh zbornic, katere se je vršila včeraj zjutraj. Neko drugo poročilo dostavlja, da se parlament snide danes zjutraj, pred pogrebom kralja Borisa v nedeljo, in da bo ob tej priliki podana "važna deklaracija."

Ugibanja o invaziji na Balkanu

The Christian Science Monitor prinaša pod naslovom "Na Balkan preko Italije" — članek o možnostih invazije Balkana preko Italije, iz katerega navajamo nekatere izvečke:

"Pred invazijo Sicilije so oznanjali ta zavezniški cilj napadi na letišča, železniška križišča, na ladje in luke. Zdaj pa se je začelo še mnogo težje bombardiranje vseh prometnih sredstev v južni Italiji.

"Pustošenje tega ozemlja pomeni najbrže, da gredo zavezniški svojo pot naprej, ne da bi prikrivali svoj namen. Sicer bi bilo nerazumljivo, zakaj so poslali 700 letal, da porušijo drugorazreden cilj kot n. pr. železniško križišče Foggia.

"Z vojaškega stališča je stvar verjetna, kajti zavezniški imajo tam svojo silsko bazo čisto v bližini evropske celine, dočim je Nemčija zelo daleč.

"Nastaja torej vprašanje, kam naprej iz južne Italije? Peta italijanskega škornja bi bila izvrstna baza za pohod v Jugoslavijo, kjer bi najbolje organizirani partizanski pokret z veseljem pozdravil prihod zavezniških vojakov. Foggia se kar najlepše sklada s tem načrtom. To je železniško križišče, v katerem se sečejo vse prometne linije v peti italijanskega škornja — Foggia je eden od ključev Jadranskega morja. Ako nameravajo zavezniški udariti preko Italije naravnost na albansko ali jugoslovansko obalo, bi bil brez dvoma prvi korak na tem potu popolno uničenje Foggie."

ANGLEŽI NAPREDUJEJO SKOZI KALABRIJO

LONDON, sobota, 4. septembra. — Semkaj se poroča, da osmi angleški armadni zbor na italijanski vojni fronti nadaljuje z napredovanjem proti prvim večjim obrambam osi blizu Palme, ki leži več kot 20 milj od mesta Reggio Calabria na obali.

Iz tega je sklepati, da so Angleži prodrli okoli 20 milj globoko v notranost italijanske celine.

Britski osmi armadni zbor se je snoči boril v lemonskehi nasadih na konici italijanskega "škornja", medtem ko je stalo več armad pripravljenih, da začeno z novimi vpadi v osiščno Evropo.

Nemci beže severno

Iz Berna v Švici med tem prihaja vest, da nemške čete z veliko naglico bežijo iz italijanske konice na jugu, v strahu pred novimi zavezniškimi invazijami dalje proti severu. Poročilo pravi, da so nacisti pograbili vsa sredstva in druga prevozna sredstva in prepustili Italijane njihovim usodi.

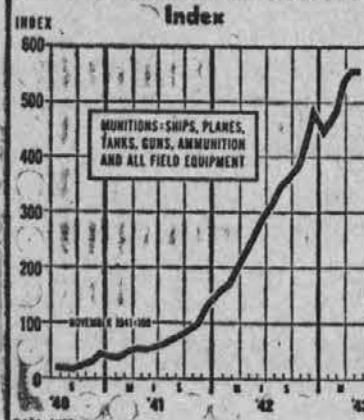

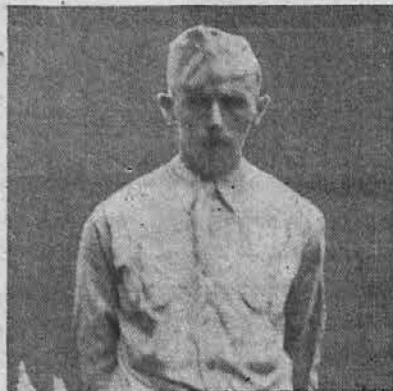

President Roosevelt's ringing challenge to Hitler, in his speech at Quebec, is presented in newsreels at the Telenews Theatre, in the new program which started last night. He is the dramatic master of oratory, a vigorous fighter, in a speech advising the Nazis to surrender.

Additional pictures from Munda show the Americans battling the Japs in bitter jungle warfare. Lord Louis Mountbatten, new commander of Southeast Asia forces, tells the newsreel audience of his aims to prosecute the war against Japan vigorously, giving China full assistance.

"Glamour Girls of 1943" don't wear bathing suits, but they look just as attractive in slacks and welders' uniforms, in a government featurette at the Telenews. "Unusual Occupations" is another in the series of features about people who have made careers out of their hobbies.

"Confidentially Yours," with Arthur Hale, is a documentary film covering such subjects as Soviet-American relations, the coming Nazi peace offensive, and the Fifth Column in reverse. In addition, the program of first-run newsreels covers personalities and world events in the four corners of the globe.

Sgt. Petrovic is attached to the 37th Division, 145 Infantry, and has been in the combat activities recently reported on the Solomon Islands.

His letter, dated August 12, reads in part as follows:

"I suppose you have already guessed by now that I've been in action, and I got through in good shape so far. We had the Japs going right off the bat. I bet you read all about it in the papers. We are now hoping and praying to be sent some place for a long rest, and I hope it is the States. Well, wherever we go, I hope we get settled, so I can start writing regularly again.

"I received the two pictures Ma sent the boy and you folks look swell! I'm receiving your letters, so keep up the good work.

"I'm now a Staff Sergeant—that is, three above and one below, and if I ever get back there I'll be decorated like a Christmas tree. Speaking of Christmas trees, it would be swell to be home for Christmas.

"I'll only have time to write about one scribbly letter a week, so don't worry about not hearing from me very often. I can't write about my experiences, but some day I'll tell you the help your prayers were."
