BESNI BOJI OB REKI VOLTURNO

Amerikanci vztrajno potiskajo nacije nazaj. Anglezji podpirajo ameriško ofenzivo na drugem koncu fronte

Fronta v Italiji je bila včeraj izjemno krvavih in odločilnih bojov med Nemci in Amerikanci iz 5. armade. Nemške čete so napelje vse sile, da ustavijo prodiranje Amerikancev v dolini reke Voltorno. Bitka, ki traja že tretji dan, je v odločilni štadij. Nemci so potiskali, toda stalno potiskani nazaj. Včeraj so ameriške čete v hudih bojih, v katerih so imeli veliko vlogo tanki in topovi, napredovale pet milj, ameriški vojak, ki izgleda, jih čakajo še drugi boji, predno bodo naciji uspeli in se umaknili na novo obrambno linijo, ki so si jo izbrali v bližini Rima.

Na drugem koncu italijanske fronte so v akciji čete osme ameriške armade, ki so včeraj zaleto malo mesto Casacalenda, ki leži 20 milj jugozapadno od Termoli.

Novica o Titovem obisku v Kairu je prišla ob času, ko so Nemci priznali, da je bil imenovan maršal Edwin Rommel, katerega se vedno kliče tja, kjer se naciji nahajajo v največji stiski, da plomi odpor jugoslovanskih patriotičnih borcev.

Okrajni avditor John A. Zangerle je včeraj naznanil, da je ocenjevanje domov in stanovanjskih hiš v Clevelandu in okolici za davčne svrhe v polnem razmahu, in da bo v teku 60 dni delo izvršeno. Na zapadni strani mesta in v predmestju Lakewood so nove davčne vrednosti že določene, in primerjava dosežanih davčnih cenitev z novimi je pokazala, da se je davčna vrednost zvišala za 10 odstotkov.

Določanje nove davčne vrednosti za domove v ostalih delih Clevelanda se vrši sedaj. 4,500 Nemcev padlo

Pedestrian Safety Week

Mayor Frank J. Lausche in a proclamation has designated the week of October 18 to 23 as Pedestrian Safety Week in Cleveland. This move is directed to call attention to the loss in life and injury that traffic accidents are causing and sacrifice of man and womanpower needed by the war industries of the city.

Pedestrian fatalities and injuries constitute the greatest share of the traffic toll. More than seventy-five per cent of the deaths resulting from traffic accidents involved the man on foot and over half of the injury total traced to the lack of attention or carelessness on the part of walkers.

According to the records of the past few years it can be expected that the closing months of the year will be the most hazardous for both pedestrian and motorists. The longer hours of darkness coupled with adverse weather conditions are responsible. Extra care in both walking and driving will be needed to prevent the accident toll from rising far above the record for past months.

Drivers are urged to use all possible care in traffic and to accept their responsibility to do all in their power to avoid accidents that so frequently result in death or injury. Pedestrians are cautioned to cross streets carefully; as carefully as if their life depended upon it. It really does.
