How can you find the St. Clair Ave. SNH? St. Clair Avenue is the last streetcar towards Lake Erie (north-east) if you drive, follow the car track from Public Square in the center of the city. Turn north, go one block and then turn right and you will find yourself on St. Clair; follow the tracks for just a little over 3 miles, look on your left and you will see the Slovenski Narodni Dom.

By train from the West or East you will find that the New York Central, Nickel Plate, or Baltimore & Ohio railroads will bring you right into the Public Square. Take any St. Clair streetcar and it will take you to E. 65th street (Addison road) where is the Dom.

From the Penny or Lake Erie railroads, step off at the East 55th st. station, and take the 55th streetcar north to St. Clair (as far north as it goes), buy a transfer for a penny (fare is 10 cents) and ride to the 3rd stop east from 55th street. The Dom is a short five minute walk from E. 55th street.

The bus terminal is at E. 9th street and Superior ave. From there walk north one big block to the next streetcar tracks which is St. Clair Ave. Take any St. Clair streetcar going east and get off at E. 55th street.

This Week

This weekend will see many SN-PJ members and friends in Cleveland, our Slovene metropolis, for the eighth annual national SNPJ Day celebration. The center of attraction will be the logical place—the Slovene National Auditorium on St. Clair Avenue, which is the largest Slovene auditorium in the largest Slovene community in America.

As our largest community in this country, Cleveland is the mecca for many a Slovene from near and distant points. This year's SNPJ celebration affords a rare opportunity to many of our people to meet their friends. It will be a pleasure indeed for hundreds of them to greet one another as well as the many new acquaintances. No doubt, Cleveland is determined to go all-out to show the visitors an interesting time.

In Cleveland, one thing is certain. As in perhaps no other Slovene community there is warmth and friendliness, real Slovene hospitality and wholesome entertainment on a large scale. Its very bigness and compactness enable our people in Cleveland to preserve their national spirit. Besides all this, Cleveland has a Slovene mayor which is no small achievement for any national group and a credit particularly to a relatively small nation such as ours. Cleveland is the sixth largest city in the nation, its population being one million.

Price Administrator Leon Henderson last week disclosed that during the last two years the profits of corporations, over and above all expenses, have increased more than 40 per cent! They are estimated this year at \$20,000,000,000, as compared with \$5,260,000,000 in 1939. This amazing showing has been achieved with the investment of very little additional capital. "The fabulous profits have gone into the coffers of a comparatively few giant corporations," says Labor, official organ of railroad unions, which prints the above information.

According to Labor, "even if the tax bill approved by the House finally goes through with its corporation levies unchanged, the corporations, on the basis of Henderson's figures, this year will have left after paying taxes about \$10,000,000,000, compared with \$4,000,000,000 'velvet' in 1941." If the tax bill should take 75 per cent of profits, says Labor, the corporations would still be more than a billion dollars better off than in 1939. And yet, about 32 per cent (almost one-third) of the American people have incomes of \$1,000 or less a year.

Spotlight on Books

America in the New Pacific, by George E. Taylor. The Macmillan Co., New York, N. Y. \$1.75.

This is the tale of complicated international conflict in the Orient concisely told—and quite free from nationalist bias. To Taylor the conflict is much more than a clash of tanks or a struggle amid air between Nippon's Zeros and our own Flying Fortresses. It is a life and death struggle between ways of civilization and basic human relations. On the basis of his own life and experiences in China, the author thus evaluates Japanese imperialist policy and practice: "They do not rule, they occupy; they do not tax, they expropriate; they do not compromise, they terrorize; they do not respect native culture, they ram their own mystical rubbish down the throats of people far more civilized than themselves." The author effectively traces the role of air power as an underminer of sea-power which was once the driving force of old-fashioned imperialism. With similar effectiveness Taylor makes it clear that the choice in the Orient is between a new freedom for a billion colonial and semi-colonial people and the terrible triumph for a modernized, savage, Nipponese new imperialism.

North America, Wheel of the Future, by Hawthorne Daniel. Charles Scribner's Sons, New York, N. Y. \$2.75.

In its historical narrative, this volume is lucid and factual, in its prophecies, the book is a bit too simple in form and content. He is putting too much in a nutshell. Let me illustrate: It's one thing to say that our country will be the economic center of the world, because that is already true and, barring an Axis victory, it will continue so. However, it's something else to speak of Holland's role in the future and say: "Even were their (the Dutch) limited home in Europe to be permanently overrun, they could transfer their empire capital to Java and still remain a sturdy and constructive nation." What a static world in the face of kaleidoscopic changes!

Christmas Mails to Armed Forces

OUTSIDE THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES

Christmas parcels and Christmas cards should be mailed during the period beginning October 1 and ending November 1, the earlier the better. Each gift package should be plainly endorsed on the address side of the parcel, "CHRISTMAS PARCEL." Special effort will be made by the Postal, War, and Navy Departments to effect delivery of all Christmas parcels mailed during this period in time for Christmas.

Christmas parcels must not exceed 11 pounds in weight, or 18 inches in length, or 42 inches in length and girth combined. In view of the urgent need for shipping spacers to transport materials directly essential to the War effort the public is urged by the War and Navy Departments to cooperate by voluntarily restricting the size of Christmas packages to that of an ordinary shoe box and the weight to not more than 6 pounds. Not more than one parcel shall be accepted for mailing in any one week when sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or for the same addressee.

Owing to the great distance this mail must be transported and the handling and storage it must undergo, it is absolutely necessary that all articles be packed in substantial boxes or containers and be covered with wrappers of sufficient strength not only to resist pressure of other mail in the same sack, but to withstand the weight of other sacks of mail, which in the long transit may be piled thereon. Many combination packages will probably be made up, including miscellaneous toilet articles, hard candies, soaps, etc. The contents of such parcels must be tightly packed, in order that the several articles may not be loosened in transit, damaging other contents of the parcel itself or causing damage to the covering of the package. Christmas kits or boxes should be enclosed in substantial containers. Candles in thin paste board boxes should be enclosed in wood, metal or substantial solid or double faced corrugated fibreboard boxes. Sealed package of candy, cigars, tobacco and toilet articles in their simplest mercantile form may be enclosed within parcels without affecting the parcel post classification of such parcels. Sharp pointed or sharp edged instruments, such as razors, knives, etc., must have the points or edges protected so that they cannot cut through their coverings and damage other mail or injure postal employees.

AS EACH PARCEL IS SUBJECT TO CENSORSHIP, DELAY IN HANDLING MAY BE MINIMIZED BY SECURING THE COVER OF THE PARCEL SO AS TO PERMIT READY INSPECTION OF THE CONTENTS.

The War and Navy Department have pointed out that the members of the Armed Forces are amply provided with food and clothing, and the public is earnestly urged not to include such matter in gift parcels. No perishable matter, intoxicants, inflammable materials (including matches of all kinds and cigar lighter fluids), poisons, or compositions which will kill or injure another may be included in any package.

ADDRESSES must be legible. Parcels addressed to overseas personnel of our Armed Forces should show in addition to the name and address of the sender, the name, rank, serial number (if any), branch of service, organization, A. P. O. number, if in the Army, Naval vessel or unit, if in the Navy, of U. S. Marine Corps Unit number, if in the Marines, of the addressee and the post office through which the parcels are to be routed, as, for instance: c/o Postmaster, Seattle, Washington. Units located within the continental limits of the United States may be addressed direct, using name, rank, organization and location.

POSTAGE must be fully prepaid, the rate on parcels of fourth-class (parcel post) being the zone rate applicable to the post office in care of which the parcels are addressed, i. e. if addressed c/o Postmaster, Seattle, Washington, the seventh zone rate would apply from Chicago. Parcels containing only books are acceptable at the special rate of 3 cents a pound. Magazines may be sent at the special rate of 1 cent for each 2 ounces, or the parcel post rate, if cheaper. Stickers or labels resembling postage stamps are not permissible on the outside of packages.

"MERRY CHRISTMAS," "Do not Open Until Christmas," "With Best Wishes" and the like may be placed on the covering of the parcel in such a manner as not to interfere with the address, or on a card enclosed in the package.

All packages containing Christmas gifts of more than ordinary value should be insured, and articles of considerable value, especially those of small size should be sealed and sent as first-class registered mail.

local foreign currency at the rate of exchange in effect on the date the orders are presented.
