

Sovražstvo in provizorična pravila S.N.P.J.

Brat Jacob Zupančič je po dolgem močanju prišel v javnost in se takoj v uvodu predstavil študentem in izrekel ali vsaj skušal izreči nepristransko sodbo o provizoričnih pravilih, ter nas posvaril, ker rabimo nepravilni izraz "provizorična pravila." O tem se ne bom prekal, mogoče ima brat prav, ker ne je opozoril na ta napadni izraz. Če je v pravem, naj razsodi naši sodniki, med katerimi se jaz še za enkrat ne prištevam. Konvencija bo pa sodila, če pod izrazom "provizorična pravila" razume to, kar pomeni pod izrazom omejitve pravil. Želim pa odgovoriti na nekatera trditve njegove razprave.

On pravi: "Meni ni znana vsa zgodovina pravil, toda brez dvoma so bila prva pravila posneta po kakšni takrat je obstajala podporni organizacija. Najboljši dokaz za to je določba glede narkotičnih strupov, ki se včasih iz pravil v pravila." Če bi se brat Zupančič potrudil prebrati zgodovino pravil S.N.P.J. bi našel, da je ta določba prišla v pravila zadnje časa, in to prav izrazito šele na zadnji konvenciji. Kolikor nam je ta določba potrebna, se ne bom prekal; to prepustim tistim, ki so jo zagovarjali, da je prišla v pravila. Zanimam se pa iskanje teh določb, v prejšnjih pravilih. Koliko se je kopiralo pravila drugih organizacij, ne vem, toda odkar sem bil jaz v odboru za provizorična pravila, smem reči, da zelo malo ali pa nič. Brat Zupančič se trudi prikazati nepristransko študentem. Zmota zadnje konvencije, katera je poleg drugih točk v pravilih sprejela tudi 17. točko, "Razne določbe," katero on smatra za zelo čudno potezo, katera pa dejansko po njegovem ni ne pomeni. Če je res v pravem, bo pokazala prihodnja konvencija. Vnaprej se mi pa dozdeva, da bo konvencija tolačila to točko precej drugače. Ni resnica, da je bila sprejeta radi tega, ker se je konvencija bavila predolgo s pravili, pa da je bilo mnenje da je zelo nesmiselno predlagati vsaki konvenciji vse točke pravil, pa da je tiste, katere so se iskale spornimi v organizaciji. Pojasnjeno je bilo, da je v smislu zakona vsaka točka sprejeta v pravila veljavna toliko časa, dokler jo ne spremeni konvencija ali splošno glasovanje.

Da je odbor za provizorična pravila to določbo popolno prejel, je krili zaključek zadnje konvencije, o čemer ni dvoma. Vsaka točka, pa če prav ni ne pomeni, po Zupančičevem mnenju pomeni, dokler je v veljavi, pa naj se sklicujemo na črter kolikor nam je ljubo in drago. Fakt je, da konvencija sprejme po določbah prejšnje konvencije. Lahko napravi spremembo in jo tako uveljavi, obvestiti pa mora tako zavarniški departament. Za to je nesmiselno govoriti o omejitvi pravice katerekoli konvencije, ali ji pa predpisovati moč, katere v resnici nima.

Odbor za provizorična pravila je izvoljen od konvencije in bo dal odločbo o konvenciji. Po Zupančičevem mnenju bi moral gl. odbor molčati, pa če odbor za pravila gaš preko vseh zaključkov konvencije. Ni mu dovolj zaključek seje gl. odbora, v katerem se svetuje društvu, naj za podlago razprav vsamega stara pravila. Ne vem, katera točka pravil zabranjuje to gl. odboru? Če je sprejel tak zaključek, so mogli biti tehtni viri za to, in pravila so jama, da je gl. odbor med konvencijo najvišja instanca. Brat Zupančič nam obljublja, ne kot član odbora za pravila, pa da kot član odbora za pravila, ki nepristransko gleda na cel dirinaj, o provizoričnih pravilih, da nam ta odbor vendar prinese soper na konvencijo mačka v šaklju, ter nas tolaži, da bo dimo toliko prijazni, da si ga vsaj ogledamo, kakšen je, kadar prileti v novi formi na konvencijo. Bratje, dvomim, da bo iz tega kaj; če je odbor za pravila prej pobral iz priporočil le, pleve, bo iz sedanjih le prah.

Da odbor za provizorična pravila ostane še nadalje, se strinjam, ne strinjam se pa s njegovim navetom, da naj v ta odbor prideta avtomatično gl. tajnik in urednik glasila. Nasprotno, noben gl. odbornik bi ne smel biti izvoljen v odbor za pravila. Dajejo naj samo nasvete, pa bomo veliko več dosegli, kot pa če ti odborniki skušajo uvesti v pravila svoje kaprice, ki le škodujejo organizaciji. Čim manj bomo volili v odbor za pravila gl. odbornikov in slovničarjev, tem boljše pravila bomo imeli. Zadnja konvencija je izvolila v odbor za pravila brata Turka največ radi tega, ker je bil gl. tajnik. Če se še dobro spominjam, je bil nominiran gl. tajnik, ne pa br. Turk. In bi se moral ta mandat transferirati avtomatično na gl. tajnika, kar je bilo zelo napadno. Mislim, da ni še v zgodovini jednote odeska, kateri bi tako odlično krili zaključke konvencije kot sedanjí odbor za provizorična pravila. Ali je priporočljivo, da so gl. odborniki v odesku za pravila? Po lastni skušnji sem prišel do zaključka, da je nepriljudno in ne praktično, da so člani gl. odbora v odboru za pravila. Vsa toliko časa ne, dokler ne bomo imeli v gl. odboru ljudi, ki niso prejeti s mislimi za splošno korist za organizacijo. Dobro se še spominjam, kako smo si kazali peeti pri sestavljanju provizoričnih pravil, ker nisem kot predsednik odbora za provizorična pravila upošteval sebična priporočila nekaterih gl. odbornikov. Mislim, da ne tega dogodka lahko spominja še maršalkateri gl. odborniki, ti več v Chicago in na tisti odborniki, ki so bili priča prisori, mi lahko priznajo, da je to resnica. Zato sem od

NAČELNA IZJAVA S. N. P. J.

Načelna izjava S.N.P.J. je jedro, njena podlaga in temelj, na katerem so zgrajena njena pravila in določbe in daje smer gl. odboru, v kakšnem duhu naj postopa pri reševanju vprašanj, ki se tičejo organizacije in njenih članov.

Ta načelna izjava nam pove, da soglašajo popolnoma z duhom ustanoviteljev Slovenske narodne podporne jednote. To potrjuje članki, ki so izšli v Glasu Svobode ob času njene ustanovitve in katerih smo nekaj priobčili v slavnostni izdaji, da se člani, ki so postali njeni člani kasneje, prepričajo, da se načelna izjava, drugi člen "Namen in sredstva," ki pove, kako naj se članstvo S.N.P.J. izobrazuje, in tretja točka XII. člena, ki govori o urejanju rednih letnih konferencij, prepričajo, da se članstvo S.N.P.J. ni oddaljilo od duha njenih ustanoviteljev in njenih pionirjev. Njeni ustanovitelji so pred pet in dvajset leti prišli do prepričanja, da v drugih slovenskih bratskih podpornih organizacijah ni zanje prostora, ker je bil duh, ki je preveval te organizacije preozek glede verskih nazorov in socialnih idej. Posledica tega prepričanja je bila, da ustanove bratsko podporno organizacijo, v kateri ne bo ozko določenih mej glede verskih in socialnih nazorov.

Ustanovitelji so takoj v prvih letih prišli do prepričanja, da je potreba zaradi njenih nasprotnikov, ki so se od zunaj posluževali raznih potov za ruvanje v jedrnosti, da naj ima Slovenska narodna podpora jednota svojo načelno izjavo, da ne bo nasprotnikom svobodne misli in naprednih socialnih idej tako lahko omajati S.N.P.J. In tretja redna konvencija v La Sallu, Ill., leta 1907 je sprejela načelno izjavo in jo zavarovala tako, da ne postane za protivnike svobodne misli in naprednih socialnih idej igrača, ki se lahko spremeni v slovensko bratsko podporno organizacijo, kakršne so že postale ob času njene ustanovitve. Ko je imelo priti do združitve, so nasprotniki S.N.P.J., ki so z zavistjo opazovali naraščanje njene moči v članstvu in premoženju, naglašali, da tisti, ki se združijo z njo, bodo morali kar čez noč zavreči svoje verske in socialne ideje in postati to, kar določata načelna izjava in njena pravila glede poduka in izobrazbe njenih članov. Tedanje članstvo je zopet spoznalo, da nameravajo nasprotniki S.N.P.J. z zbegavanjem članov bratskih podpornih organizacij, ki se nameravajo združiti s S.N.P.J., prepričati združenje slovenskih naprednih bratskih podpornih organizacij. In tako je združevalna konvencija v Clevelandu na podlagi pogodbe, ki jo je napravila za slučaj združitve z drugimi bratskimi podpornimi organizacijami dodala drugi odstavek k načelni izjavi, da se članstvo drugih organizacij prepriča, da trditve, da se bodo morali člani drugih bratskih podpornih organizacij, katerih želja je bila, se združiti s S.N.P.J., kar čez noč izpremeniti v svobodomislice in pripadnike naprednih socialnih idej, navadno prazno zbegavanje, ki nima drugega namena kot prepričati združevanje s Slovensko narodno podporno jednoto. Kako hudobno je bilo tako obrekovanje in besedičenje, nam pove načelna izjava, ki se glasi:

"Slovenska narodna podpora jednota je ustanovljena na svobodnemiselnem temelju. Ta temelj jednote ostane neizpremenjen, dokler ga ne ovržejo tri redne konvencije po vrsti s triletno večino navzočih delegatov in odbornikov ali pa članstvo s triletno večino oddanih glasov pri treh referendumih, toda od enega referenduma do drugega mora poteti najmanj tri leta časa. Jednota jamči članom osebno svobodo verskega, filozofičnega, etičnega in političnega prepričanja."

Drugi odstavek načelne izjave pove jasno in določno, da S.N.P.J. ne bo nikogar prezirala zaradi njegovega verskega, filozofičnega, etičnega ali političnega prepričanja in da ne bo nihče zaradi tega prikrajšan na podpori ali pa celo izključen. Jednota v tem oziru dovoli vsakemu članu osebno svobodo. Ona se ne briga za to, katere vere je, ali če živi v starih nazorih, da pride vse dobro ali slabo od nekega višjega nevidnega bitja, ali če ljudje sami zakrivijo vse zlo, ker trpe krivice družaben red in sistem blagovne produkcije in distribucije, ki sta skupaj roditelja vseh krivic, ki jih danes uživajo siromaki.

Slovenska narodna podpora jednota si je pridržala kot celota pravico do izobrazbe in poduka svojih članov, kar jasno povedo II. člen "Namen in sredstva" in razne

točke v drugih členih pravih S.N.P.J. To vse skupaj je pa tvorilo tisto privlačno silo, ki je vabila duševno dremajoče jugoslovanske delavce in jih spodbujala za pristop v njene vrste. To vse skupaj je duh pretežne večine njenih ustanoviteljev, ki je podžgal njene aktivne člane k neumorni agitaciji za pridobivanje članstva in k resnemu in dobremu gospodarstvu in k uvedbam ngotarij na bratskem podpornem polju. Kaj hoče razumen človek od bratske podporne organizacije več, kot da bratska podpora organizacija ravna z vsemi člani enako ne glede na njih versko, filozofično, etično in politično prepričanje in da svoje člane izobrazuje na podlagi svobodne misli, naprednih socialnih idej, podpira svoje člane duševno in kulturno z zbujanjem prave demokratične zavesti in v duhu načel naprednega, politično in strokovno organiziranega delavstva. Ali niso take naloge plemenite? Ali je še kaj bolj plemenitega na svetu, kot s podukom in izobraževanjem skušati osvoboditi svoje brate in sestre, to je člane svoje organizacije, verskih blođenj in zmot in jim prinesiti pravo luč spoznanja, od kje prihajajo in kam odhajajo; pojasniti jim vprašanja, ki so zanje prave uganke, ker niso imeli prilike v svojih mladih letih pohajati toliko časa v šolo, da dobe dobro podlago za svoj nadaljni duševni razvoj. Ali je še katera bolj človekoljubna naloga, kot učiti svoje brate in sestre, to je člane in članice ene in iste bratske podporne organizacije, da imajo vsi ljudje, ki opravljajo za človeško družbo koristno umsko ali ročno delo, enake pravice do obstanka in do sadov umskega in ročnega dela in obenem se jim kaže pot, kako se ta cilj doseže?

Slovenska narodna podpora jednota je v teku pet in dvajset let postala močna. Minutes of the meeting of the National Board of Athletic Control of the SNPJ, held April 14, 1929, called by president John Lokar Jr.

Roll call of officers—John Lokar, pres., Donald Lotrich, sec'y., Louis Zverinik, treas., and Frank Heidenreich, chairman of rules committee. Vice president Frank Ponce was absent. \$300.00 was asked of the Supreme Board to cover the expenses of the national basketball tournament. It was decided to strongly discuss athletics at the National SNPJ Convention. An appeal was made to the Supreme Board to purchase the winning team a shield instead of a trophy which should not exceed over \$25.00 and which is to be kept permanently. \$105.00 was allowed to John Lokar and \$30.00 to John Mauser for traveling expenses. Eleven players constitute a team. An investigation was ordered concerning the refusal of the bowling tournament to Wauegan. Rudolph Penna and John Mauser were appointed to investigate.

Bro. Lotrich tendered his resignation as secretary which was accepted, and Bro. Rudolph Penna was unanimously elected secretary. The final game for the national playground baseball championship was decided to be played off in the Eastern Division at Cleveland.

The Board adjourned to meet again at Cleveland after the championship game.

Discussion on By-Laws

The role of an immigrant fraternal benefit society in the immigrant colonial life can only be appreciated after a thorough understanding of the social and economic function. The most significant feature of the character of its function is corrective as opposed to creative. A radical society aims at reformation of the economic and social orders; its chief business is not the present happiness, but the future, where its theories and dreams will come true. The character of its aim makes it general, or international in its outlook, where an immigrant group has no more significance or at least it should not have it more than another group of people, if it is to remain true to its principles. An African Negro, or an Australian Bushman, or a Mohicanian is to a Socialist just as significant and just as important as a Slovene immigrant of Chicago; for his fundamental aim is to emancipate according to his views the entire humanity. The successful strike interests him not so much, because the worker or striker has attained a little better condition for subsistence, but because he is a step nearer to the new social and economic order; he is not interested to educate the workers to think for themselves, to analyze and criticize, to follow the truth wherever it leads but to think as he does, to support his theories, and to develop his principles—he is certain, if he is honest, that his principles are the soundest and subtlest and to divide from them is nothing short of treachery—hence he as a socialist can never be interested in an immigrant fraternal benefit society except as a means to further his party ends.

A capitalistic organization functions quite differently. The organization is individualistic-materialistic; and because of its individualistic material interests it must of necessity be exclusive and tyrannical without either cooperative or social elements. If these social and humanitarian elements are found in the system, it is not because they constitute an organic part of the system, but because the system is inefficient in itself. Strictly speaking, a capitalist as such looks upon a worker or humanity at large as a means to advance his personal interests, and only when he looks upon the world as a man, he becomes a member of it. The phrase "Business is business" sums up his attitude in a nutshell.

A religious institution constrains itself not so much with the happiness of its members here and now, nor for their future, but with the life hereafter. The reason that the religious leaders do take interest in the social and economic life of the people is not to make the life here more attractive but to improve the preparation for the future life. The worldly life in the eyes of a religious teacher in the strict sense of the term is a preparation for the life beyond, which is the true life—eternal and unchangeable—hence a religious leader as such cannot be interested in the immigrant problems, except as a means to further his own principles and aims.

An immigrant fraternal cooperative organization, on the other hand, had been called into being specifically as a protest against the disintegrating tendencies in the immigrant community and its expressed function is the amelioration of the social and economic conditions of its members. Its social aim is not to destroy the prevailing system of family life, nor to introduce the libertine love practices, as some of the more ambitious Slovene leaders believe, but to stabilize the social life, to make family relation happier, to make the home a real home and not a dormitory or a public house. It functions as a corrective and not as a creative institution, even in the case where it takes upon itself to maintain such educational institutions as colleges and university chairs.

Resolution

Whereas, we, members of the Western Athletic Division Board of the SNPJ, have had over one year of experience in the management, care, control and superintendence of inter-lodge athletics of the Western Division, and as our experiences have convinced us that inter-lodge athletic activities develop the moral, ethical, intellectual as well as the physical well being of the participants; as well as being one of the best media to advertise our fraternal Order among strangers with a view in mind of having them become members of the SNPJ; as well as to foster and develop that competitive fraternal spirit among lodges and members which makes them more active and more loyal members of the Slovene National Benefit Society: Therefore,

Be it resolved: That the Western Athletic Division Board of the SNPJ desires the 9th Regular Convention of the SNPJ to create a separate fund for the promotion of organizational work and athletics to be known as the SNPJ Organizational Fund; and

Be it further resolved: That each and every member of the SNPJ shall contribute at the rate of one cent per month into the said Organizational Fund; and that a sum not to exceed one half of the total contributions shall be expended by the SNPJ for promotional work by fostering and developing athletics while a sum not to exceed one half of the total contributions shall be expended by the SNPJ for promotional work by helping the subordinate lodges to share the expense of membership campaigns, of hiring halls and engaging speakers on such occasions, for buying and distributing literature and prizes.

Be it further resolved: That the Organizational Fund which shall be used for fostering and developing athletics may be used for the reimbursing of travel expenses of the players, prizes, for hiring of halls, parks, etc., where divisional or national championship games shall be played, for taking pictures at such events, for sharing of the expenses with subordinate lodges on such occasions when the subordinate lodges undertake the task of entertaining the teams, players, participants, guests and visitors, as well as to pay for the expenses of the Divisional and National Athletic Boards of the SNPJ; and for such other athletic promotional purposes as the National Athletic Board may deem it proper to expend the money.

Be it further resolved: That the Organizational Fund which shall be used for fostering and developing athletics shall be under the direct control, care, maintenance and superintendence of the National Athletic Board of the SNPJ and that the said Board shall publish semi-annually a complete data of all incomes and expenditures, in the Society's publications.

We were then served luncheon, and oh, what a lunch that was. Of course, Pauline Berger served us next, followed by the basketball game. We won by a score of 40 and 22. In the evening we had a whoopee of a good time dancing. Music was furnished by Barbie and Marinick. We left Chicago about 10 o'clock, coming home next day at 7:30 a. m., and that was the end of a perfect party.

Topics of the Week

Representatives of the five lodges, representing the original three lodges — the Lincolns, No. 567, the Integrity, No. 631, and the Sunlighters, No. 632, which merged prior to January 15, 1929, for the purpose of electing one delegate to the 9th Regular Convention of the SNPJ and the two lodges — Calumet Sentinel, No. 610, and the Spirit of St. Louis 659, which two have merged subsequent to January 15, 1929, with the foregoing mentioned three lodges; met either in person or by proxy, and have drafted the following instructions to be presented by their delegate to the 9th Regular Convention of the SNPJ.

1. As to the problem of our official publications:

First choice: That Prosveta should remain a Slovene publication while an eight page American edited weekly, of which the last page should be devoted to the interests of the Juvenile members should be published. The American edited weekly shall be published on the First Tuesday of every week beginning with the first Tuesday in the month of July 1929 while the official Prosveta should be published on every Thursday instead of Wednesday. Each member of the SNPJ shall receive at his option either the Prosveta or the proposed eight page American edited weekly free, and both if he desires to pay for them. (Three lodges voted in favor of this proposition while two were contrary).

Second choice: That Prosveta should remain a Slovene publication while a four-page American edited weekly of which the last page shall be devoted to the interests of the Juvenile members should be published. The American edited weekly shall be published on every Tuesday beginning with the first Tuesday in the month of July, while official Prosveta shall be published on every Thursday instead of Wednesday each week. The Juvenile Magazine shall be discontinued. Each and every member of the SNPJ shall receive both publications, the Slovene Prosveta as well as the proposed four-page American edited weekly. The Supreme Board is vested with the power to increase the size of the American edited weekly when it is deemed for the best interests of the Society to do so. (Three lodges voted in favor of this proposition while two voted contrary to it).

Third choice: That Prosveta shall be published twice weekly, and each edition of Prosveta shall have at least two pages of American edited reading matter. Each and every member is to receive one copy of the two issues of Prosveta each week. The Juvenile magazine is to remain as is. (Two lodges voted in favor of this proposition, while three were contrary, thereby expressing it as the third choice in this matter).

2. That a National Athletic Board shall be created to have control, care, superintendence and jurisdiction of inter-lodge athletic and sport events and of the Athletic Fund, consisting of five members to be elected by the representatives of the Eastern and Western Athletic Boards from the rank and file of the membership of the SNPJ.

3. That the SNPJ shall create an organization fund. That one cent per month, per member, shall be set aside from the General Fund to be known as the Society's Organizational Fund. That at least one half cent per month, per member, from this fund shall be expended for the promotion of the SNPJ through the fostering and developing of inter-lodge athletics, while the other half cent, per month, per member, shall be used for the promotion of the SNPJ by conducting membership campaigns, as of helping to share the burden of the expenses of the subordinate lodges caused by the fact that they conducted active membership drives, for the awarding of prizes to lodges or members; for renting of halls during such membership campaigns and of paying the expenses of speakers who speak on such occasions.

4. That the Supreme Board should be recognized as that the youth shall be given some representation on the highest and most honorable body within our Society by creating an office of Second Supreme President in charge of American-speaking lodges and by making the Chairman and the Secretary of the National Athletic Board members of the Supreme Board, while abolishing the present inactive Unity Committee which is now composed of three members.

5. That a system of budgetary control of receipts and disbursements shall be adopted.

6. That the Supreme Board be given no additional power.

7. No raise in salary of members of the Supreme Board, or other members engaged in lodge business, as for example, a delegate to the Convention.

8. That length of service on the Supreme Board shall be restricted to two consecutive terms on the same committee. This provision shall not be construed against the full time employed Supreme officers or against members on the supreme board who served two consecutive terms on the same committee, providing that they are candidates for office on a different committee.

9. No state politics in the Society or any of its lodges; no collections by them or thru them for state politics; no propaganda to be issued by them (then always herein meaning Society and Lodges) or thru them, and no subordinate or Supreme Lodge shall boost any state political party other than the one that might be recognized as a labor party by the American Federation of Labor.

10. That an American-speaking subordinate lodge conference shall be called prior to the convening of the next regular Convention of the SNPJ and that at said Conference each American-speaking Lodge having a membership of less than one hundred shall be entitled to one representative, while every American-speaking subordinate lodge having a membership of over one hundred shall be entitled to two representatives, but no lodge shall have more than two representatives.

11. That the Supreme Board shall be instructed to devise ways, means, and plans for the creation of Superannuation Insurance (Old Age Benefits) and submit at least three plans applicable and practical for an organization of our type before the membership for discussion at least one year prior to the convening of the next convention.

12. That investments of Surplus fund should be permitted to our members on loans secured by first mortgages on real estate, limiting the loan to cities having a population of over fifty thousand inhabitants or its suburbs, these loans shall not exceed two thirds (2/3) the value of the real estate or more than the sum of fifteen thousand dollars to any one individual, nor made for a duration to exceed fifteen years, at the interest rate of six percent (6%) and reasonable carrying charges, and repayments of principal and interest to be made monthly, however, providing, if a plan can be devised which will insure that it will be free from friendship rule while in operation.

13. That the Convention express a no-confidence vote in the Supreme By-law Committee for not performing their duties in accordance with the rules and by-laws adopted at the Eighth Regular Convention of the SNPJ and to request every member of said committee for his resignation.

14. That the delegate or alternate is hereby instructed to draft resolutions incorporating these views and present such resolutions before the delegates of the 9th Regular Convention of the SNPJ for their thoughtful consideration and decision.
