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## Slovenci v Jugoslaviji

Slovenci v stari naši domovini so se v zadnjih dveh desetletjih vsestransko zelo lepo razvijali. Od začetka skupne države Jugoslavije, katere živ ud so, so imeli Slovenci svojo oblast, sedanjo tako imenovano dravsko banovino, ki je zelo skrbela za njih dobrobit v vsakem pogledu: gospodarskem, prosvetnem, kulturnem. Tudi njih poslanci in politični zastopniki so se trudili v Beogradu, da so ustregli željam prebivalcev Slovenije. Tako so Slovenci dobili v tem razmeroma kratkem času marsikaj, kar je bila njih dolgoletna težnja, ki pa je ostajala v stari Avstriji neizpolnjena. Dobil so med tem časom svoji, sedaj že popolno slovensko univerzo, na kateri predavajo večinoma domači slovenski znanstveniki, dobili so celo Akademijo znanosti in umetnosti v Ljubljani. Šolstvo se je na splošno lepo razvilo in marsikateri kraj je dobil novo moderno ljudskošolsko poslopje. Nastalo pa je tudi nekaj novih srednjih in strokovnih šol. Učni jezik je bil vseskozi slovenski. Tudi narodno gledališče z dramo in opero je ves čas vzdržalo visoko raven in drž. konservatorij je oskrboval mladi pevski naraščaj. Vsak stan, pa naj je to pretežno kmetijski ali delavski, obrtniški, trgovski ali tudi uradniški, je po svojih organizacijah dosegel lepe uspehe v svojem prizadevanju za čim večjim blagostanjem. Marsikaj se je sicer kritiziralo pri tem, a če pogledamo na življenje Slovencev v Jugoslaviji v splošnem in ga primerjamo s prejšnjim v nekdanji Avstriji, ko so se morali kot nenakopraven delič kruto boriti za vsako najmanjšo drobtinico, ker na velik kos kruha ni bilo mogoče računati, vidimo šele prav vse blagostanje, v katerem so Slovenci v Jugoslaviji živeli.

Slovenci v Jugoslaviji pa so tudi prepričani, da jim je Jugoslavija dom po božji volji, dom, kakršnega ne bi mogli imeti v teh težkih časih nikjer drugje na svetu. Ta sedanji dom Slovencev v Jugoslaviji je tako naraven, da si bolj naravnega skoraj misliti ne moremo. Nič čudnega, da so se za ta dom borili Slovenci že od nekdaj, zlasti pa od leta 1870. dalje. Pogledati je treba samo na zemljevid srednje in jugovzhodne Evrope, da spoznamo, kako je Jugoslavija geopolitično s severno Slovenijo celota zase. Po madjarskem klinu, ki se je bil zaril med severne in južne Slovane, ni bilo možno drugega kot zbrati in strniti vse Slovane na jugu v močno državo, ki šteje danes že 16 milijonov Jugoslovancev, in to Srbov, Hrvatov in Slovencev. K tej jezikovni in krvni sorodstveni zvezi bi spadali na jugu le še Bolgari, ki so ostali ves čas z Jugoslavci v najboljših prijateljskih odnosih. Med slovenskim in srbohrvatskim jezikom so sicer razlike, a ne take, da bi se ne mogli razumeti. V zadnjem dvajsetletju pa so se vsi trije narodi, ki tako prirodno in tako skladno ustvarjajo Jugoslavijo, tudi že toliko medsebojno spoznali, da je postala vsem trem narodom Jugoslavija v resnici edini in pravi dom, ki so ga enako pripravljene braniti tako Srbi kakor Hrvatje ali Slovenci. Jugoslavija je bogata na svojih prirodnih zakladih, polna svežega zdravja po svojem prebivalstvu in krasna v svojem Primorju ob Jadranu, na ravninah in gričkih, jezerih in gorah, ki privabljajo zlasti v Sloveniji tudi mnoge tujce.

Kakor so danes Slovenci potrebni Jugoslaviji, tako je Jugoslavija potrebna Slovincem. To je zanje edinstveni življenjski prostor na soncu danes in tega se vsak Slovenec, ki res slovensko čuti, tudi v polni meri zaveda. Lahko rečemo, da je Jugoslavija Slovincem bitna osnova narodnega življenja, tako da bi jo morali ustvariti, če bi je že ne bilo. Vsi trije narodi so močno sedaj povezani in zrastle v eno skupnost. Daleč smo še v sedanjih razbesnelih borbah od mirnega kulturnega narodnega življenja, kakor si ga vsak resnično kulturni človek zamašlja, ko bo vsak narod prišel v idealni skupnosti v polni meri na svoj račun. Do tedaj, do izpolnitve tega ideala je za Slovence Jugoslavija najvarnejša streha, najtoplejši dom. Jugoslavija sama je že obstojen tak skupek junžnih Slovanov, ki — po Prešernovo — hrepene dočakat dan, koder sonce hodi, preprij iz sveta bo pregnan, ko rojak prost bo vsak, ne vrug, le sosed bo mejak.

Slovenci v stari domovini imajo še dobro v spominu, kako je bila trda zanje v stari Avstriji, kjer niso smeli v svojem jeziku kot v družini zahtevati svoje pravice, ko so trtili čas, da so odstranili zapreke in zavore, ki so jim jih tujerodni oblastniki stavljali na pot. Danes se posebno dobro zavedajo vse neprecenljive vrednosti, ki jo je prinesla svoboda v lastni državi, kjer si v svojem jeziku kot enakoverden in upoštevan ud družine prosti "volijo vero in postave," kakor je to lepo napovedal že Prešeren. Danes stoji zato vsi Slovenci kakor Srbi in Hrvatje na braniku meja te skupne svoje domovine, za katero so si njih predniki tolikanj prizadevali, vedoč z istim Prešernom, da "manj strašna noč je v črne zemlje krili, ko so pod svetlim soncem sužnji dnovi!"

Jugoslavija je v zadnjem dvajsetletju dovolj pokazala in dokazala, da je zmognila mirno in modro živeti s svojimi sosedi katerim neče ničesar prizadejati, in da je vredna vsega zaupanja in podpore v mednarodnem svetu. Morda so k temu bistven delež doprinesli vprav Slovenci na skrajnem koncu Balkana s svojo visoko kulturo in narodno prosveto.

## Monsignor Hribar 50 let v Ameriki

O tem pripoveduje sam velečastiti gospod monsignor:

"Iz stare domovine sem dobil pismo od svojega součence, velečastitega g. Nadraha, ki je generalni vikar v ljubljanski škofiji. Sporočil mi je, da so imeli naši preživelji součenci shod v spomin 50 letnice naše mature v Ljubljani, katero smo napravili meseca avgusta leta 1890 v stari gimnaziji na Vodnikovem trgu.

"V pismu nam razloži, da je 15 součencev še živih, 18 pa jih je umrlo. Živi so vsi v raznih službah kot duhovniki, sodniki in v drugih poklicih; mnogo jih je že v pokojju, posebno onih v svetnih poklicih.

"Ravno takrat ob maturi, je prišel iz Amerike Rev. S. Furdek in sicer iz Clevelanda iskat dijakov ali mladih duhovnikov za Slovence v Clevelandu. Oglasil sem se jaz na to povabilo. Moji domači so mislili, da je skrajno nespametno hoditi v Ameriko v negotovost. Nepremerno boljše bi bilo, da grem takoj po maturi iz Alojzijevega naravnost v semenišče v Ljubljani, da bi imel doma že dolgo zaželjeno novo mašo in bi bil duhovnik v domači zemlji. Mlad človek ima velike, nadepolne načrte, ki jih je skoval iz pisma, knjig, pripovedovanj v prejšnjem življenju — odloči se pametno ali nespametno za temno bodočnost.

"Sklenil sem zapustiti domovino in se žrtvovati za slovenski rod v tujini. Ko človek zapusti svoj dom v prvi mladostni zarji, ko zapusti svoje drage, lepo domovino, mu je kakor bi mu kdo porinil nož globoko v srce. Moja mati so bili celo mnenja, da tak mlad, neizkuššen fante sam itak ne bo nikoli prišel v Ameriko, da ga bodo gotovo na meji obrnili nazaj. A zgodilo se je obratno, ta fantalin je prestopil avstrijsko mejo in prišel končno tudi sam v daljno Ameriko.

"Vkrca sem se v Hamburgu na ladjo 'Gellert', to je bila slaba, majhna ladja. V medkrovi in v strašnem stanju. To potovanje sem bil že opisal v Amerikanskem Slovincu pod naslovom 'Iz Cirku v Ameriko,' s podpisom "M.V.V.," to je bilo leta 1892. Tam je popisano kako smo pionirji v tisti dobi potovali čez nemirni Atlantik. V New York smo prišli 5. septembra 1890. V Cleveland pa sem prišel 8. septembra 1890 k Rev. S. Furdeku, ki me je peljal k drugemu clevelandskemu škofu, prevzvišenemu Gilmour-u, ki je pa ravno takrat ležal bolan v Charity bolnišnici, da me sprejme v semenišče kot "Croatia."

"Za Slovence še sploh ni ve-

lelih storila mnogo koristnega za dušo in telo članic. To naj se vpošteva. Vse pomanjkljivosti pa naj se pozabijo. Popolna je samo ena organizacija, ta je brez vseh napak, v kolikor se tiče ustanovitve, ampak to je ustanovil Kristus sam — sv. Cerkev. Vsi drugi smo pa zmotljivi in torej bo tudi naše delo imelo pomanjkljivosti, pa naj bo to Peter ali Pavel, Lena ali pa Magdalena. Ako hočemo iti pravo pot naprej, potem moramo vzeti vse to v poštev in biti spregledljivi svojemu bližnjemu. Zlasti pri društvi in pri farnem delu moramo biti pazljivi, da nas ne premagajo naše slabosti kot je zaviljivost, nepotrpežljivost in druge take nečednosti. Omenjena društva sta šla lepo svojo pot in upamo, da jih bo peljal drugi rod prav tako na dalje. Ob 25-letnici naj ne bodo pozabljene tudi članice, katere so že odšle v večnost. Društvom pa čestitamo in jim želimo še mnogo plodonosnih let zlasti za dušo, za kar so tudi ustanovljena.

del, da bivajo na svetu. (On je bil spreobrnjenec — škotski protestant.) Od tam pa me je peljal v St. Mary's semenišče na Lakeside cesti, kjer danes stoji tovarna. Vodja semenišča je bil tedaj Nemeč, rodom iz Luksemburga. Po treh letih, 29. julija 1893 so me posvetili s mega v škofijski školski kapeli v pričo mojega očeta in brata, ki sta nalašč zato prišla sem, da prisostvujeta temu obredu.

"Oče so se vrnili takoj po novi maši v domovino, kajti njihova sodba je bila, da je v Ameriki taka puščava, da se ne bi pustili niti na slikati na steno v Ameriki. Po posvečenju sem bil takoj nastavljen še isti dan za župnika med Slovence v Clevelandu, Ohio. Kakor veš in znaš, kjerkoli veš in znaš, ustanovi novo faro, prvo slovensko župnijo v Clevelandu. Tako mi je bilo naročeno od škofa Horstmana, tretjega clevelandskega škofa, ki me je posvetil. Letos 5. septembra je minilo letno 50 let odkar sem stopil na ameriško zemljo.

"Izseljenec ima večkrat trde, hude ure, ko gre po svetu med tuj svet; ne pozna ne kraja ne jezika in ne navad. Domačini tuje zemlje ga večkrat gledajo po strani, kot nezaželjeno tujca vsaj v začetku. Hudo domotožje se ga dostikrat loteva, posebno če ne pride med svoje in znance. Neko dekle mi je reklo: 'En cel mesec sem prejokala, ko sem prišla sem...' Naši pionirji so imeli trda, da najtrša dela, dolge ure, male plače, male preskrbe v slučaju nezgode, če sploh kakšne.

"Sploh pa je bilo življenje trdo, včasih skoraj nezno;no;

skromni, z malim zadostno zdravju, pa smo vseeno prou celo najhujše. Mnogi so nesrečili, prerano pomrli, gi pa so še ostali, da pa sedaj kot list za listom v riški grob. Hudo domotožje je vsaj deloma poleglo; ci so prirastli na ameriško ljo; sedaj niti ne mislijo da bi se sploh še kdaj stalno v svojo staro domovino, čeprav so skoro vsi prišli z namenom tu bivati le za živno. Živo se seveda vedno minjajo svoje stare domovine, tihe želje imajo biti v pokopani če bi bilo to mogoče, a večkrat seveda bro vedo, da so to samo želje.

"Slovenec je prišel v Ameriko med druge ljudi, med raso, druge vere, drugo je — vse tuje. Kako se čiti tu? Slovenec je bil čan in Slovan; kako bo s slovanstvom? Duhovni tukaj trudi kakor ve in o svojim rojakom na ohranil največji zaklad, ga prinesli s seboj in to toliko vero. Mnogim vero ohranili, drugi pa so gli proč kot nepotrebnost ljago. Tu živimo med verci — pogani. Državno poročilo pravi, da v žavah 75 milijonov ljudi di v nobeno cerkev. 21 milijonov in pol katoliki drugi pa so različne testanti, judje in bogve vse.

"Ko izseljenec to vidi, no zmede, ne ve, ne kaj ko, večkrat nima duhovno rojaka, ki bi ga razume, ni bil pripravljen za čaje in če ni prav trde ličan in dobro moralno ljen, lahko hitro odpade hujša nadloga zanj je venski odpadnik, ki delo propagando v časopisih vih in tudi drugače, ki de in ga oropa vere in kar mu je bilo svetega.

"Danes so pa otroci ljence že dorastli, zato vimo v čisto drugačnih rah kakor so v prvih časih. Kako naj se stado gake tukaj rojenim mladiki tu rojeni mladiki krajskim naseljenjem v Amerika je "The Melting kjer se meša vse vrste in se, vere, nazorov itd. iz tega izcimilo — Bog je gotovo: najboljši in nejši bo zmagal. Kri to je, katoličanstvo bo zmagalo. To je popolno gurno, ker se je že zgodovini kot najboljši bolj žilavo. Slovenci imo li tukaj najdalje, če katoličani, če pa odpadajo do kmalu zginili iz ameriške zemlje.

TO THE VOTERS OF THE 23rd WARD

EDWARD J. KOVACIC Councilman 23rd Ward

At this time I wish to call to the attention of the people in the 23rd Ward some important facts that I think should be stressed as they have a direct or indirect bearing on our entire social and economic life.

WPA and Relief

It is common knowledge that our county WPA quota is far below our normal figure. Based on previous years' quotas (the Federal Government Fiscal Year begins on July 1st, 1940 and ends on June 30, 1941) we should have at least 35,000 people on WPA payrolls this year, which would be a 20% reduction, but instead we are faced with a 40% reduction and have at present only 22,000 on WPA as of the latest available figures.

From January 1940 to Aug. 7, 1940, 12,074 persons were laid off WPA. During this time private industry absorbed some but by no means all, thereby causing a heavier burden on the relief budget with the result that on the current basis of cost some \$1,300,000 will be needed for the year 1940 and approximately only \$675,000 will be the total resources available for this period leaving a deficit of not less than \$550,000.

Facing this fact, it was necessary to take some drastic action with the result that all single employable persons (numbering about 5,000) and in normal health are currently being removed off relief rolls and being encouraged to seek private employment. Unfortunately, many of these will not be successful and other means will have to be provided for their existence.

Sewage Disposal Issue

Council last week passed legislation introduced by 10th Ward Councilman, Edward L. Pucel, to place before the electorate of Cleveland on Nov. 5, 1940, the method they wish to employ to carry on the necessary functions of our sewage disposal plants. At present only two plans are available, either placing a .6 mill tax levy on property or reverting back to the water usage tax, which proved so unpopular with the people such a short time ago.

In the near future I will devote an entire column to this matter explaining both features of taxations in detail. It is my intention to give out as much information on this subject as it is possible by one means or another so that the voters will have a true and clear picture of the entire setup before casting their ballots for one method or the other. This is a very important matter and should be clearly understood by all the property owners and voters.

Registrations and Transfers

It is important that all citizens be properly registered or transferred, so that they will be eligible to vote on Nov. 5 for the president of the United States and the governor of Ohio, besides the other state and county officers.

In order to allow everyone an opportunity to do this, the Board of Elections has sanctioned the opening of every booth in Cuyahoga County on
