The Senate Finance Committee has further amended and liberalized certain sections, increasing present Social Security and old age security benefits as much as 90 percent. Before adjournment, this beneficial legislation will be enacted into law.

SEASONING U. S. MONEY

You may think those crisp new dollar bills you get at Government offices are hot off the press. Actually, under ideal conditions, they're aged like rare old whiskey.

According to Treasury officials, it takes two to three months for folding money to "season" before it is in proper shape for circulation. The process, they state, is a "very nebulous thing, and you will find disagreement among experts, but... permitting a bill to season, to allow the ink to set firmly, will add to the durability of the bill."

Right now, officials say, they're worried because bills aren't seasoned enough. The demand is so great that they're coming out "raw"—averaging 10 days between the Bureau of Engraving and the pocketbook of the man on the street.

Mrs. Jones has a very good friend and neighbor, Mrs. Smith, who is expecting her first baby in September. On her last visit to the Newton D. Baker Health Center with Tommy, Mrs. Jones noticed a poster announcing classes for expectant mothers. She told Mrs. Smith about the classes. Mrs. Smith enrolled and now she is coming to the Newton D. Baker Health Center every Friday afternoon. She is learning how to take care of herself during pregnancy and gets practical suggestions for her diet and for inexpensive ways to provide her maternity wardrobe.

The last five classes will teach her how to take care of the baby when it comes; for instance, a demonstration will show her the most efficient way to bathe the baby. She also learns just what she needs for the baby's layette and how to provide it economically. After class she has a chance to make some of the baby's things with expert help when she needs it.

She can cut patterns for practically every garment the tiny baby will wear. Mrs. Smith enjoys the friendly sewing hour atmosphere and the opportunity to get together with young women who are sharing the same experience and problems. The series of ten classes is given by a registered nurse from the Visiting Nurse Association. A sewing period with a sewing instructor follows each class. A new series begins every five weeks. The classes are open to all expectant mothers in the vicinity of the Newton D. Baker Health Center and they may enroll by calling the Visiting Nurse Association TO 1-1544.

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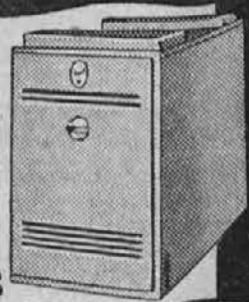
