Manj otrok, več starcev

Največji narodi Evrope polagoma izumirajo. To ni nobena domišljija, pač pa uradno dognano iz skrbno pripravljene statistike o rojstvih v Franciji, Nemčiji, Italiji in Angliji.

Najnovejša tozadevna statistika nam je na razpolago iz Anglije. Tekom prvih treh mesecev leta 1931 je znašalo nazadovanje porodov in Angliji precejšno število. Povprečno je bilo rojenih 15.3 otrok na vsakih 1,000 prebivalcev.

Nič boljši niso v Nemčiji. Najnovejša tozadevna statistika iz Nemčije, ki nam je na razpolago iz leta 1931, dokazuje, da je število rojstev v omenjenem letu najnižje, kar so ga še kdaj zaznamovali. Prejšnja povprečna "rojstvena kvota" v Nemčiji je bila 26.7 odstotkov na 1,000 prebivalcev, v letu 1931 pa je padla ta kvota na 16 rojstev na tisoč prebivalcev. In bojijo se, da bo v tem pogledu leta 1932 še slabše.

Tudi v Angliji pričakujejo v letu 1932 znatno manjše število rojstev kot sploh kdaj prej v zgodovini dežele. V Franciji pa je padlo letno število rojstev tekem zadnjih 35 let od 915,000 na leto na 741,000. Ako francoski narod ne dobi popolnoma drugačnega pojmovanja v prihodnjih letih, tedaj bo število francoskih rojstev tekem kratkih pet let padlo na 600,000 na leto. Pomniti je treba, da umre 800,000 Francozov v vsakem letu.

Tudi v Italiji, kjer si fašistovska vlada na vse načine prizadeva, da pomnoži število zakonov in rojstev, ni nič kaj bolje. V letu 1927 je znašalo število rojstev v Italiji 27 na 1,000 prebivalcev, v letu 1931 pa je že padlo na 25, kljub silnemu prizadevanju vlade, da to prepreči. Pomisli je treba, da je bilo še v letu 1884 v Italiji število rojstev 38 na 1,000 prebivalcev, in v letu 1900 pa 33.

In da ne gledamo samo na Evropo, se moramo ozreti tudi na Zedinjene države. V letu 1921 je znašalo število rojstev v Zedinjenih državah še 24.3 na tisoč prebivalcev, v letu 1930 pa je že padlo na 18.9.

Zlasti pa pada število rojstev v večjih mestih, dočim po kmetijah in po manjših mestih to še ni tako resno. Za prve tri mesece znaša število rojstev 14.6 na 1,000 prebivalcev, kar je pravzaprav še velika svota v primeri s številom v drugih večjih mestih. V Berlinu na primer pride le 8.8 rojstev na 1,000 ljudi, v Dresdenu 8.9, v Hamburgu 11.1, v Chicagi 14.3, v Parizu pa 14.5.

Nasproti velikemu znižanju rojstev skoraj po vsem svetu brez razlike, pa narašča število smrtnih slučajev. V Angliji na primer so prišli že tako daleč, da je bilo število smrtnih slučajev v prvi treh mesecih leta 1932 že višje, kot pa število rojstev. V Berlinu je v letu 1930 umrlo 10,718 več ljudi, kot se jih je pa narodilo.

Medtem se pa opaža, da ljudje dalj časa živijo, kot so živelii pred več leti. Zato se pojavlja med nami vedno večje število starcev, tako da znamo doživeti v bližnji dobi, da bomo imeli več starcev in stark, kot pa mladine. Kako prijetno življenje bo to, lahko sami uganete.

Zanimivo je tudi vedeti, da zlasti v katoliških deželah število rojstev narašča, dočim v protestantovskih pada. Irska, Španija, Portugalska imajo od leta 1928 naprej vsako leto višje število rojstev, dočim so pa v istih deželah tudi ljudje nenačadno visoke starosti. To je zlasti resnica za Poljsko. Število rojstev je bilo tam lansko leto 33.5 na 1,000 prebivalcev, in 526,000 ljudi je bilo več rojenih, kot jih je pa umrlo. Nasprotno pa pada število rojstev v čisto protestantskih deželah, kot so Norveška, Danska, Švedska in deloma Anglija. Tudi se ne opaža v teh deželah tolškega števila starcev.

Spoštna tendenca današnjega sveta pa je padanje rojstev in veče število starcev. Svet se je tozadevno v zadnjih desetih letih popolnoma spremenil.

Priredili bodo vsakovrstne sportne igre, smešne, hitre, počasne, za debele, kakor tudi za suhe. Kakor sem slišal od strani, da bo tudi oni šaljivi kontest, ko bodo ženske metale ponavljajo v uboge možičke. Prav gotov sem, da se mladina udeleži tega takozvanega "Olympic dneva" 100%. EDITORIAL

The SDZ Olympics and the Essdeeze election campaign, with their attendant hubub, have almost overshadowed the spirit of which they are born. Almost as the man-made monster devours its creator, so has the intense interest in the present undertaking almost buried the reason for the very existence of the SDZ. And that reason is fraternalism—the dominant spirit, the very essence of social life.

This is not a preaching against things that do not yet exist—hate, jealousy, selfishness—nor is it an indictment of the Slovenian youth. It is only a warning against the necessity of making such an indictment.

No matter with what kindness, and no matter the rose-colored glasses you wear, you, if you are a clear thinking human, will admit that in all undertakings which are the result of, and are dependent, upon the group, are successful only as long as the personal element is suppressed. When various cliques within cliques begin their hymn of hate, their sporadic efforts to undermine the structures of their original group, they are usually successful. The adage that a house divided against itself cannot stand is just as true today as it was when it was coined.

It has been interesting to watch the progress of the Central Committee. From very humble beginning it has grown into a smooth-functioning, powerful organization. Whatever degree of success it has attained it owes to the everlasting day after day co-operation of the members. Selfishness and personal factors were set aside; individualism made way for the mass. And the SDZ has profited. Those who are interested in such matters can easily find the actual material gain, but the goodwill the SDZ has gained can hardly be reckoned in dollars and cents.

Just as surely as co-operation has put the SDZ on the fraternal map so would factionalism wipe it off. It will be noticed that the writer makes the reservation, "would." The rejected plan, though trivial in itself, is sufficient reason to cause a feeling of bitterness and injustice among the supporters of the plan. There we

have the beginning of a faction. It is no hard matter to trace the twisted path of hate that follows. If the one who has suffered this alleged injustice is persistent he will in time convert others to his cause; all the while increasing his hatred and the extent of his injuries. Before long dissension holds full sway and with it comes the inevitable result—social death.

In your dealings with fraternal and social endeavor, forget that you are an individual. When important issues are to be decided, ask yourself not, "will it benefit me," but "will it benefit the majority?" It is true that at times the majority have blundered but in the long run their decisions are correct. Govern yourself accordingly.



PYORRHEA CAUSE OF MANY DISEASES

Pyorrhea has become almost as common as dental decay, and one of the scourges of our time. It has been estimated that 90 out of every 100 persons in this country suffer from pyorrhea in one form or another.

Pyorrhea is a disease which attacks the soft tissues about the teeth of man irrespective of race, sex, or occupation. It is confined to adult life and occurs most frequently between the ages of 18 and 60.

Most people recognize the term pyorrhea, but do not fully appreciate the meaning and the seriousness of the disease.

The causes of pyorrhea are many, but one of the principal causes is the accumulation of tartar or calculus upon the teeth beneath the margin of the gum. This deposit is something like the scale that forms inside of kettles and is very difficult to remove from even the sides of a kettle.

It is impossible for a person to remove this substance by brushing and as a result this deposit acts as an irritant and causes the gum tissue immediately about it to become red, swollen, and inflamed. The pain and swelling associated with the early stages of pyorrhea may subside
