San-a-Visions

The championship series is over, with Stalwarts coping the honors in playground ball and the Wolverines in baseball. Congratulations to the victors and sympathies to the losing teams—the Loyalites and the SNPJ Sports Club of Waukegan.

The Athletic Board meeting in conjunction with representatives of the subordinate lodges was a hot session. The delegates criticized the actions of the last Supreme Board Meeting and approved the activities of the National Athletic Board. The delegates re-elected Brothers, Frank Heidenreich, Pres.; Roddy Penna, Sec'y.; John Mauser, Treas., and elected Brothers Otto Tekauts and Jacob Novak as new members on the National Athletic Board.

Next meeting of the Sun glare Lodge No. 632 will be held at Vack's Hall in Cicero, Friday, Sept. 12. At our last meeting we had several visitors. Bros. Mladic from the Strugglers of Cleveland, J. Zvertnik from New Jersey; Gus Kramer from the Integritys, and Sister Kaye D. Zvertnik was admitted by transfer as a member. Formerly, she was with the Badgers of Milwaukee. She gave an interesting talk on the activities of the Badgers. Let us have more visitors and applicants for membership at this coming meeting.

Our country faces serious economic crisis. We find that during the last month four banks closed doors in Gary while a similar member closed its doors in Chicago. Among these banks happened to be one which had hundred of Slovene depositors—The Millard State Bank. Whenever a bank closes the workingmen suffer the most, yet we find that progressive thinking workingmen deposit their money in capitalistic banks instead of their own institutions like the building and loan associations.

In Chicago the progressive Slovene element controls the Jugoslav Building and Loan association which has approximately four hundred thousand dollars of assets. This institution is under the supervision of the State of Illinois, and is safer and sounder than any bank.

What makes a building and loan association safe is the character of its business. A building and loan association invests its money only in first class mortgages to its members which must be paid off in weekly or monthly installment. A bank usually loans its money on notes and straight first mortgages. Whenever there is a depression, the security of a straight mortgage decreases in value whereas the security in a building and loan mortgage does not decrease in value because the members in the course of two years have repaid to the building and loan association one-third on their mortgage. The weekly and monthly installment payments which are required by building and loan associations prevent the assets in such institutions from becoming frozen.

Let us deposit our surplus money with our own institutions like the Jugoslav Building and Loan Association with its offices at 2552 South Central Park avenue.
