Hitler je preklel obdolžitve Francije

Nacijske glavarje je sram krvavega tedna in radi bi, da se vse skupaj hitro pozabi

Berlin, 10. jul.—Hitler je sklical nacijski "parlament" k zasedanju prihodnji petek z namenom, da poda poročilo o nacijski revoluciji in svoj zagovor glede drastičnega postopanja z uporniki.

Pariz, 10. jul.—Iz Alzacije je prišla vest, da je 60 nemških nacijskih "šturmarijev" v uniformi pribežalo čez mejo iz Nemčije. Begunci so povedali, da je življenje v Nemčiji nemogoče in da je stotine nacijev pobegnilo v Holandijo.

Berlin, 10. jul.—Nemški zunanji urad je včeraj preklel obdolžitve nacijskih voditeljev, da je Francija sodelovala v revoluciji proti Hitlerju in je napravila francosko poslaništvo za oproščene. Obenem je bilo ukazano fašističnemu tisku v Nemčiji, da mora takoj prenehati s napadi na Francijo in obaviti uradno zanikanje francoskega poslanika. S tem je bila zadeva novega spora s Francijo vsaj navidez poravnana.

Razburjenje v Nemčiji po "krvavi soboti" je nekoliko poglobljeno, čeprav govornice o novih aretacijah in menda tudi tajnih eksekucijah še niso prenehale. Nacijski voditelji bi radi, da se "nesrečni dogodki" čim prej pozabijo, kar pa ne bo tako lahko.

Zdaj poročajo, da je tudi bivši bavarski kronprinč Ruprecht zapleten v revoluciji. Ruprecht se nahaja zunaj Nemčije in dobil je svarilo, naj tam ostane. Katoliške organizacije v Šleziji so ustanovile obrambno fronto. Dalje poročajo, da je bilo v teku zmešnjave zadnji teden devet Judov ustreljenih pod pretvezo, da so "hoteli pobegniti".

V Berlinu je zmanjkalo krompirja; drugega živeža tudi primanjkuje.

Nad 12,000 rudarjev ob poklic Wilkes Barre, Pa.—Samo v tem mestu in okolici je 12,243 rudarjev ostalo brez poklica — in brez dela — vsled stalnega prenehanja obrata rogov, v katerih so bili uposljeni. V okolici Wilkes Barreja in Scrantona je 30,000 rudarjev, ki ne bodo nikdar več dobili dela v rudarski industriji, pravi Wyoming Valley Welfare asociacija. V drugih industrijah ga pa tudi ne dobe, ker je delavec povsod na preostajanju.

Klobučarske družbe se podale Danbury, Conn.—Sedem klobučarskih firm, ki so pred šestimi tedni zaprele svoje tovarne raje kot bi sprejele odlok arbitracijskega odbora, ki je odredil zvišanje plač, so zdaj zopet odprle tovarne in pristale na določeno mezno lestvico. Na delo so bili poklicani vsi delavci, ki so organizirani.

Unija zahteva discipliniranje Johnsona

Civil Liberties se je obrnila na predsednika, ker se je Johnson pokazal pravega openšarja

Washington. — (FP) — Civil Liberties unija urgira predsednika Roosevelta v pismu, naj stopi na prste direktorju NRA Hugh Johnsonu radi arogance, s katero je odslovil Johna L. Donovanana, predsednika unije NRA uslužbenec.

V tej zadevi se je Johnson pokazal pravega trinoga in openšarja. Donovanana je odslovil vsled unijskih aktivnosti med vladnimi uslužbenci. Kot predsednik unije se je potegnil radi odslovitve neke delavke v uradu NRA in direktorju prisilil, da jo je vzela nazaj. Pri tem je pa sam izgubil službo.

Johnson sicer pravi, da je bil Donovanan odslovljen radi "nesposobnosti in nepokorščine", kar je pa iz trte zvito. William Green, član vladnega delavskega odbora in predsednik federacije, pravi, da ni nolenega govora o Donovanovi nesposobnosti. Vsaj delavski odbor ga smatra za toliko kvalificiranega, da ga je imenoval kot delavskega zastopnika v odbor za izvajanje lesnega pravilnika.

Nobenega dvoma ni, pravi Civil Liberties unija, da je bil Donovanan odslovljen radi svojih unijskih aktivnosti. Roosevelta urgira, naj cenzurira Johnsona, ker je s to akcijo pokazal, da ne more imeti delavstvo nobenega zaupanja v administracijo NRA.

Svojo aroganco in openšarstvo je Johnson pokazal tudi pred novinarji, ko jih je na vprašanje v zvezi s to zadevo nahušil, da "ni dolžan dajati nikomur odgovora o nastavljanju ali odpušcanju uslužbenecov". Slično je tudi stališče vsakega openšarja.

Donovanova zadeva je zdaj pred delavskim odborom. Če odbor ne prisili diktatorja Johnsona na preklic te odslovitve, bo to največja refleksija na odbor in obenem nov dokaz, da je vsa "delavska naklonjenost" administracije največja farsa.

Likvidiranje zamorskih farmerjev

New York. — Zamorski farmerji, večinoma na jugu, so v procesu rapidne likvidacije že od 1920. Od tega do lanskega leta so zgubili tri milijone 300 tisoč akrov zemlje — dva milijona in pol med 1920 in 1930 in 800,000 akrov do konca lanskega leta.

Te številke je objavil John P. Davis, tajnik odbora za gospodarsko obnovo. On pravi, da vsa kreditna mašinerija sedanje administracije nima nobenega efekta, da bi med zamorskimi farmerji zaustavila ta tok. Seattle, Wash., 10. jul.—Deputiserif Steve S. Watson je bil ustreljen pri večerajšnjih izgredivih v pristanišču, ko je z drugimi vred ščitil stavkokaški avtostruk. Kdo ga je ustrelil, se še ni moglo dognati.

Portland, Ore., 10. jul.—Zastopniki 105 lokalnih unij so včeraj pooblastili centralni delavski odbor, naj pripravi načrt za generalno stavko v prid pristaniščem in mornarskim delavcem.

San Francisco, Cal., 10. jul.—Rooseveltove posebni posredovalni odbor, kateremu načeljuje nadškof Hanna, je včeraj začel z zaslišavanjem spornih strank. Andrew Furuseth, predsednik unije mornarjev, je dejal odboru, da zapravlja čas in ne bo nikoli odkril resnice, ako ne pojde do dna vsem problemom, ki se vlečejo že dolga leta. Voditelji stavkajočih delavcev so drug za drugim govorili o šikanah in kako delodajalci zlorabljajo NRA za svoje interese.

Rooseveltovega odbora se zdaj trudi, da odvrne generalno stavko. Organizirani vozniki so naznanili, da zastavkajo v četrtek, ako pristanišči in mornarski delavci ne dobe svojih pravic do polnoči v sredo. Gubernier Merriam je pomnožil vojaške čete, ki stražijo pristanišče v San Franciscu.

Minneapolis, Minn., 10. jul.—Nova stavka vozačev tovornih avtov je neizogibna, če se delodajalci ne podajo do četrтка.

Moskva. — (FP) — Velika suša, ki je letos udarila vso zapadno hemisfero, je v ruskih kolektivnih farmah našla velikega protivnika, ki se je namenil, da bo imel bogato žetev, pa naj bo "dež ali ne".

In v tem boju s sušo Rusija faktično zmaga. S splošno mobilizacijo farmerskega prebivalstva in v večji meri tudi mestnega ter vsega državnega aparata proti tej "šibi božji" zdaj izgleda, da bodo sovjeti faktično tudi v veliki meri uspeli. Pričakuje se skoraj tako bogata žetev kakor jo je Rusija imela lansko leto.

V tem optimizmu se bodo sovjeti mogoče nekoliko usteli, kljub temu je dejstvo, da s koncentrirano akcijo prebivalstva v prizadetih krajih in z umnim kmetijstvom delajo čudeže. Ti čudeži so zgolj produkt velikega napora za poraz suše.

Na umetno namakanje so se vrgli v vseh obvodnih krajih. Noč in dan so na delu pridne roke, ki kopljejo jarke od rok in drugih vodnih virov in jih polnijo z vodo, drugi zopet vozijo vodo v dolgih karavanah na višje ležeča polja. V nekaterih krajih sega ta irigacija do 50 kilometrov daleč.

V par slučajih, ko se je srečal z našimi člani v gostilni, jih je hotel fizično napasti. O tem župniku in o njegovih ne prav čednih delih bi lahko napisal celo knjigo. Tega seveda ne bom storil, ako me kdo k temu ne prisili, kajti on je že mrtev.

Ustanavljanje društev SNPJ pred 25 in 30 leti ni bila lahka stvar, posebno v krajih, kjer so bile slovenske in hrvatske župnije. Ustanovitelji so morali vse svoje proste ure in marsikateri dolar žrtvovati. Bili so šikanirani in pri družbah, kjer so delali, denuncirani. Marsikdo je radi tega zgubil službo. Tudi mene so pri družbi, pri kateri sem bil uposlen, tožili, da sem socialist, da ustanavljam unijo ter hujškam delavce proti družbi. Družba je pa bila toliko poštena, da je naročila mojemu delovodju (kapitanu), naj me zasliši ter pri drugih delavcih v rudniku polzve, koliko je resnice in obdolžitvah napram meni od strani denunciantov. Niti enega delavca ni dobil, da bi potrdil obtožbe denunciantov in tako se jim umazana nakana ni posrečila. Posrečila se pa jim je v štrajku leta 1914, ki ga je vodila W. F. of M. in katerega so pomagali zadržati tudi slovenski stavkolomci s svojim župnikom na čelu. Do 400 nas je prišlo na črno listo, med temi tudi nekaj članov društva št. 62, ki so morali zapustiti Calumet ter iti s trebuhom za kruhom v druge države. Drugi so pa morali iti k župniku po dovoljenje predno so mogli dobiti delo nazaj.

Prvi dve leti po ustanovitvi društva št. 62 sem kot tajnik hodil po hišah pobirat ašesment, seveda ne po vseh. Če ne bi tega delal, bi društvo gotovo razpadlo. V svoji sredi smo namreč imeli omahljivce, ki so bili kolikor toliko še pod župnikovim vplivom.

Leta 1908 so nastali precej kritični časi in v SNPJ so se pojavili notranji boji. Sklicana je bila izredna konvencija, na katero je društvo št. 62 poslalo delegata, čeprav je bilo finančno šibko. To čast je poverilo piscu teh vstic. Društvo je vedno stalo na braniku in bilo lojalno napram jednoti. Društvo si je štelo v čast, ko je bil John Verderbar, njegov član, izvoljen za gl. tajnika jednote.

Vedne intrige s strani nasprotnikov, ki so hoteli uničiti društvo, so povzročile, da aktivni člani nismo držali rok križem. Ko so nam pregovorili in odvzeli enega člana, smo pridobili dva na njegovo mesto. Ne smem pozabiti, da so pri tem delu pomagali in bili zelo aktivni Joe Švajger, Joe Klemenc, Frank Lesar, George Kralj (ti vsi so

že umrli), brata Rudolf in Joe Kočevar, Frank Japič, John Šeringer in Frank Vidervol.

Meseca aprila leta 1910 smo nasprotnikom priložili še posebno zaušnico. S pomočjo moje soproge in Anne Klemenc (sedaj omožena Savs) smo ustanovili žensko društvo Narodne Slovenke št. 128 in ga priklopili k SNPJ. Prva predsednica je bila Anna Klemenc, tajnica pa Katherine Junko, soproga spodaj podpisanega. Imena blagajnice in drugih uradnic sem pozabil. Kmalu nato sem s pomočjo rojaka Antona Gešelnja, bivšega gl. tajnika SHZ, ustanovil društvo št. 97 SSPZ z okrog 40 člani. Žal, da je to društvo, kot posnemam iz zvežinega glasila v članstvu nazadovalo.

Od leta 1907, ko se je ustanovilo društvo št. 62 SNPJ, pa do leta 1914 je društvo imelo tri mrličje. Prvi je bil ubit v rudniku C. & H. družbe. Bil je pravoslavne vere in njegovi prijatelji so dobili pravoslavnega duhovna iz Chicago ter mu plačali \$50 za izvršitev pogrebne ceremonije. Dasi je bila temperatura veliko pod ničlo, se je društvo udeležilo pogreba korporativno.

Drugi je umrl v bolnišnici v Jolietu za sušico. Bil je svobodomislec, ampak njegov rojak, pri katerem je stanoval, je bil cekmošter pri slovenski cerkvi in ga je s pomočjo duhovna na smrtni postelji prisilil, da je sprejel cerkvene obrede, podpisal spremenjeno oporoko, katere se je glasila na njegove starše v starem kraju, da se iz posmrtnine plača toliko za maše, toliko za sveče ter cerkev tako, da bi starši nič ne dobili, če bi pri tem ostalo. Vsa zadeva je bila potem izročena sodnji v Jolietu in sodnik je odločil v prid staršem ter ovrgel spremenjeno oporoko.

Tretji mrlič je bil Slovenec, ki je bil kakor prvi ubit v rudniku. Bil je samec ter stanoval pri bratu in mrtvaški oder je bil tudi v bratovi hiši. Poleg našega društva je bil član tudi fantovskega društva sv. Jožefa, katerega je ustanovil župnik Klopčič. Njegov brat nam je naznanil, da se župnik proti pokopati ga, ako ne bodo člani društva Bratska sloga odstranili na njegovo povelje regalij, ki so jih nosili. Kot odgovor na to smo sklicali izredno sejo, pojasnili članom, kaj nam je brat pokojnega povedal, jih bodrili in urgirali, naj nihče ne odstrani regalije, pa naj se zgodi kar hoče. Pogreb se je vršil iz hiše žalostja, za katerega je brat pokojnega posebej plačal. Naše društvo se je udeležilo pogreba v velikem številu in bili smo zgodaj na licu mesta, kakor tudi člani fantovskega društva sv. Jožefa. Vsako društvo je izbralo izmed svoje srede tri nosače, ki so šli skupaj v hišo, drugi člani smo pa čakali zunaj, ker za vse ni bilo prostora v hiši. Kmalu nato je prišel župnik ter rekel našim nosačem, da on ne bo mrliča pokopal, ako ne snamejo regalij. Regalij niso sneli, ampak so se vsi odstranili; vseh šest nosačev je bilo potem od katoliškega društva. Ostali nismo o tem nič vedeli, dokler niso prišli s pokojnikom iz hiše, nakar smo opazili, da naših nosačev ni zraven. Ko pridemo v cerkev, so društveni člani zasedli sedeže—člani Bratske sloge na desni, katoliški člani pa na levi strani cerkve. Iz zakristije je nato prišel župnik in se ustavil pred krsto, pogledal po cerkvi in zavpil: "Člani društva Bratska sloga, regalije proč!" To zahtevo je še enkrat ponovil, nakar sem jaz vstal ter rekel: "Gospod Klopčič, v kratki pred vami leži naš sobrat in mi ga kot sobratje spremljamo k zadnjemu počitku z znaki našega bratstva". Župnik je potem začel kričati, da je v cerkvi on gospodar, toda noben član ni hotel odstraniti regalije. Ko je župnik videl, da se regalij ne bo snemalo, je prišel s ceremonijami, katere pa je končal veliko hitreje ko pri drugih mrličih in bil je ves rdeč od jeze.

Leta 1912, ko se je vršila konvencija SNPJ v Milwaukeeju, Wis., je društvo št. 62 imelo nad sto članov ter poslalo na isto dva delegata. Za delegata sta bila izbrana takratni predsednik društva Frank Lesar ter spodaj podpisani, od št. 128 pa Anna Klemenc.

Novoprstiplim članom smo na društvenih sejah peli pesem "Naj čuje zemlja in nebo", kar

se je seveda slišalo smešno. Ob neki priliki je br. Molek protestiral proti temu, češ, kako in kaj naj čujeta zemlja in nebo, ampak v tistih časih je tako peetje vleklo. Novosprejetim članom se je to dopadlo in so se s svojimi znanci nečlani o tem pogovarjali. Pripovedovali so jim, kako so bili lepo s petjem sprejeti ter da ni res, da smo mi nekakšne neverske zverine, kakor nas slikajo nasprotniki.

Po izgubljenem štrajku v bakrenem okrožju so nasprotniki opustili napadanje tamošnjih društev in nekaj let po mojem odhodu iz Calumeta se je ustanovilo tretje društvo SNPJ, št. 390. Eno najstarejših društev je št. 22 v Painesdalju, Mich. Ta nasebina je oddaljena od Calumeta kakih 80 milj in omenjeno društvo se bo tudi udeležilo proslave z ostalimi tremi društvi v Calumetu.

To je moj opis zgodovine društva št. 62 do leta 1914, kolikor se morem spominjati po več ko dvajsetih letih, odkar sem bil od tam takorekoč izgnan, ker je moje ime prišlo na črno listo. Upam, da bo s tem dopisom članom ustrezno. Vsem skupaj želim veliko uspeha na vaši proslavi 30-letnice SNPJ. Živeli!

Pri vsakem izvinjenju, ako ni neznatno, je treba pozvati zdravnika kakor hitro mogoče. Accidents

One Never Knows Whose Turn Will Be Next to Meet with an Accident

Recently published official statistics in the Prosveta and other fraternal organs reveal that the number of deaths caused by accidents and sickness is ever mounting. The number of deaths by automobile accidents in the United States presents a startling figure. We are primarily concerned with the causes of deaths among our members.

More than half of the total number of deaths which occurred among our members, as recorded in the official report for April and May, were caused by various accidents, apoplexy and cancer; the total number for the two months being 67. Notwithstanding the efforts being made by civic authorities and other similar groups trying to prevent accidents, to emphasize safe and sane driving and the installation of safety appliances in factories and shops and mines, the number of deaths caused by these "instruments of death" is constantly growing.

Not long ago one accident insurance company released figures covering the four years ending with 1933, showing that, of the total number of claims paid by it, automobile and home accidents were the chief causes for the startling number of deaths. Basing its calculations on its own experience, it estimated that nearly three million home accidents occur annually in this country.

Among the leading causes of accidents among our people are still the inadequate safety devices and extremely bad conditions under which they work in the mines and factories. Our people are wage earners—they are working people—that is, they are in the employ of somebody else. They are part of the nation's backbone, industrially speaking. They are constantly exposed to danger and subject to minor or major injuries or instantaneous death. Scarcely a day passes when an accident, more or less serious, is not witnessed by our members, and too often do these happen either to ourselves or to members of our immediate households.

An accident to an adult, if fatal, suddenly deprives someone for all time of the one most needed. And if not fatal, it frequently deprives a household of a provider. In view of all these facts with which everyone of us is constantly being confronted, is it not strange that many of our people are still unprotected by a safe and sound fraternal insurance policy such as is offered by the Slovene National Benefit Society? The number of our people who are still unprotected is almost unbelievably great; or, reversing the order: the number of our people who carry fraternal insurance is small.

When you read these lines and happen to know some of your friends who are not insured, our advice to you is that you secure information among your friends as to their needs and acquaint them with the fraternal protection offered by the Slovene National Benefit Society. Act quickly. One never knows whose turn it will be next to meet with an accident.

A Disillusioned Na

As recently as six months ago I did not think it possible that the adjournment of Congress and the end of the first year of NRA would see such general disillusionment the principal features of the New Deal predictions concerning both NRA and, indeed, concerning the whole Deal are being obviously fulfilled with rapidity.

Unquestionably Mr. Roosevelt's personal energy, his optimism, his capacity for production produced especially in the months of his administration. No industrial Socialist or labor man can criticize the Deal from the standpoint of the real Republicans. Neither do I think it fair to criticize the New Deal from the standpoint of the sideline Liberal or academic observer who that at this or that point Roosevelt might have done thus or so. Possibly he might. Doing one thing with another, Roosevelt did as well as one could expect any President as long as that President sticks to the list order. It is not Roosevelt or the New Deal but a disintegrating capitalism which is primarily responsible for our present position.

What is that position? Immense industrial and presidential activity and in great economic insecurity. Over ten million people are still unemployed. The great farmers and workers, such as they are, mostly made before NRA and AAA have effect. Average weekly wages for non-agricultural workers employed in June, 1933, are a little lower than in 1934, in terms of purchasing power. The attempt of the administration to solve the scarcity, the farmer's dollar did not gain it made last summer. It will be less for him than it did then. The code encouraged monopoly and price fixing in big business. What has been happened well shown by statistics gathered by the Order Association of America. I quote a summary of the findings contained in Soule's interesting new book, "The American Revolution": "The prices of articles which were under no codes or codes free from price fixing provisions on December 15, 1933, 18 per cent below 1929. The prices of articles which contained outright price fixing provisions were, on December 15, 1933, 7 per cent below 1929. The prices of articles under codes which contained outright price fixing provisions were, on December 15, 1933, 3 per cent higher than in 1929. The prices of articles under codes containing price fixing provisions were, on December 15, 1933, 19 per cent higher than in 1926, and actually per cent above the boom level of 1929 while, prices of farm products were no more than half of the 1929 levels. On provisions were present in most of the important industries, especially those in which steel, prices had fallen relatively little since 1929."

No wonder, then, that 810 large corporations in 37 industries managed to show an aggregate net deficit of \$45,802,000 into an aggregate net profit of \$440,641,193.33. Again Mr. Soule is right: "The striking gain—indeed, the only gain of magnificent proportions—in the first year of the New Deal was the gain of the reduction of profits."—N. Thomas.

Much Ado About Not

Our European creditors, former erstwhile allies alike, have repudiated debts to the U. S. A. Therefore, great lament from Wall Street to back alley. "I'll tear one's shirt over nothing? If we put money into the European witch kettle the world from the Huns, as the authorities assured us during those years we got our money's worth, for the Huns certainly licked. On the other hand, if we had certainly grabbed to pull chestnuts out of the fire for the House of Commons, the fiscal agency of Great Britain, why not acknowledge that we made barreled asses of ourselves and swall loss as a matter of lunatic justice?"

The fact is that the huge sums we loaned Europe during and after the war will be paid, for the simple reason that they will be paid in goods and we dare not accept without throwing additional millions of work. Even the annual interest of half a billion dollars, if paid in commodities, would be sufficient to close the remainder of our stories.

It seems, however, that there is no authority who has the guts or gumption to tell the American people the naked truth and the forlorn hope of ending the farce. Spectacularly suggest that Congress employ a president to accept payment in a commodity that will not compete with American products and yet supply a crying need—bombs and fool's caps.—The American Guardian.

Your Health

Accidents and Emergencies

BRUISES. Bruises generally do little damage other than temporarily to disfigure. A black eye is considered a bruise. It is a painful swelling, which develops rapidly, increases in size and turns deep purple as to the result of the escape of blood under the skin. This color gradually passes thru different shades of green and yellow, until the blood has been absorbed. To prevent the swelling and discoloration to any degree, the treatment must be begun at once. Firm pressure may be kept up with a knife-blade, or compresses wet with ice water, very hot water, or alcohol and water may be continuously applied. The colorless fluid extract of witch-hazel put on at once on a compress is excellent treatment. If discoloration has occurred, its disappearance may be hastened by rubbing the bruise with some mild ointment, like lanolin. If one should experience great pain due to a bruise, this may be relieved by taking one to two tablets of aspirin or pyramidon. In severe cases, a physician should be consulted.

SPRAINS. A sprain is caused by twisting or straining of a joint. It produces great pain on motion, rapid swelling, and often a discoloration of the skin, like that of a bruise, in a few days. In some severe cases, the recovery is slow. Every sprain, except the very mildest, should have a physician's attention as early as possible. In case of a sprain, the joint should be soaked for from one-half to one hour in very hot water, or moist heat can be applied, and then it should be massaged for a considerable time, and be put at absolute rest. After the acute pain and all signs of inflammation have disappeared, which is often a matter of days, and often weeks, the joint may be rubbed daily with soap liniment or chloroform liniment and very carefully and slightly moved. Finally, a support made of bandages, or strips of adhesive plaster, or elastic supports is used.

BURNS AND SCALDS. A burn is the result of contact with a flame or dry heat of some sort, while a scald is produced by a hot fluid. The treatment of burns and scalds consists in first attending to the shock by application of heat to the body. If possible, administration of stimulants, such as whiskey or black coffee may be given. The clothing should then be removed gently, being cut if necessary. If the burn is slight and no blisters have formed, the part is to be dressed with a solution of ordinary baking soda, or dusted with baking soda, zinc stearate powder, starch, or talcum powder, and thus the air is excluded. Air is an irritant to a burn. If the burn contains blisters, caron oil (equal parts of linseed oil and lime water) may be applied on soft linen or muslin gauze to the burned surface. Perhaps the best all-around application for burns is Amerton salve (Lilly Product). Every burn should be managed by a physician as soon as possible.

FAINTING. When a person faints the head should be lowered and the feet raised, the blood in this way being sent back to the brain. Plenty of air should be given. The clothing should be loosened about the neck and chest and a little cold water dashed over the face is usually sufficient to restore consciousness. Another method which is often practiced, is to place the patient on a chair and to push the head down between the knees, the hands hanging down at the side. The patient is kept in that position until the face becomes red, being then able to rise and walk about. Spirits of ammonia should be applied to the nose at intervals. A physician should be called as soon as possible, because the patient may develop heart failure.

CONVULSIONS IN CHILDREN. When a child has convulsions a physician should be summoned immediately. First-

aid should be started as soon as possible while waiting for a physician, by putting the child into a hot bath or hot mustard bath without waiting to undress it, which can be done in the tub. The head should be raised, and cold application applied to it. The hot water will dilate the blood vessels of the body, thus diverting blood from the brain of the body. If the attack is the beginning of any of the diseases, the heat will also drive out the rash, besides relieving any pain from the abdomen elsewhere. The child is kept in the bath about ten minutes, and is then taken and wrapped up in a warm blanket, and an enema of suds should be given to clear the bowels. Next, treat the child with the advice of the physician, whether it be indigestion, worms, stomach disorders, constipation, rickets, whooping cough, onset of acute infectious diseases, meningitis, or influenza.

NOSE BLEED. In a nose bleed the head and arms should be elevated and pressure on the fingers should be made of the nostril from which the bleeding is coming, or a small piece of lemon, or a small piece of cotton wrung out in vinegar, then inserted in the bleeding nostril. This will contract blood vessels unless it is a hemorrhage. The patient should not blow the nose, because it will disturb the formation of blood clots. Ice or cold compressions may be applied to the back of the neck and to the head. If the bleeding is stopped within a few minutes a physician should be summoned.

POISONING. Accidental poisoning often arises from administration of medicine from the wrong bottle. It is of great importance that all bottles in the house containing poisons, washes, disinfectants, etc., that are likely to be poisonous when taken internally should be kept in dark bottles and prominently labeled and in addition, marked "for external use only, poison." If a physician is taken accidentally a physician should be called immediately. In the mean time first-aid treatment should be started in all cases of poisoning, except those caused by strong acids and alkalis. The stomach contents should be emptied. This may be done by giving a large tablespoonful of mustard in a glass of warm water, or a solution of table salt in warm water, and also tickling the throat with a finger or a feather. If vomiting, the patient should drink large amount of milk water and the bowels should be emptied as soon as possible. Any vomited matter should be preserved for the physician to examine so that proper treatment can be prescribed.
