

AVTNA UNIJA ODLOŽILA OKLIC SPOŠNE STAVKE

Delavsko razsodišče prejelo pritožbe proti Fordovi družbi

KANADSKI STAVKARJI ODKLONILI KONCESIJE

Washington, D. C., 20. apr. — Člani eksekutive unije združenih avtnih delavcev, ki se je večer prišla v uradu Johna L. Lewisa, načelnika CIO, je bila razpisana glede oklica splošne stavke ameriških tovarnih korporacij General Motors, ker noče priznati avtne unije v Oshawi, da akcija je bila odložena v pričakovanju, da bo stavka v kanadski tovarni korporaciji malo poravnana. Korporacija je pristala na nekatere koncesije, katere pa so stavkarji v Oshawi odklonili.

Člani eksekutive avtne unije dalje razpravljali o organizatorni kampanji med avtnimi delavci v Fordovih tovarnah. Prejeli niso nobenega definitivnega zaključka, ker se nočejo enoglasiti. Splošna organizatorna kampanja v Fordovih tovarnah se bo pričela v prihodnjem novembru.

Homer Martin, predsednik avtne unije, je večer uradno izjavil, da je bila zadeva zapostavljena unifikaciji delavcev v Fordovih tovarnah predložena delavnemu delavskemu razsodišču. Pozneje je naznanilo uradno in izjavilo, da bo unija bila pritožbe proti Fordovi družbi, toda datuma ni omejeval.

Delavsko razsodišče v smislu regulacij ne sme povedati, če prejelo pritožbe. Voditelji avtne unije so na tej seji zaključili, da bodo še nadalje finančno spremljali avtne stavkarje v Oshawi.

Istočasno, ko so uradniki avtne unije in reprezentantje Lewisa odbora razpravljali o kontaktu med korporacijo General Motors in avtnimi delavci v Oshawi, se je vršila seja eksekutive sveta Ameriške delavske federacije. Sejo je sklical William Green, predsednik federacije.

Na dnevnem redu je bilo razprava, ali naj ADF skliče izredno konvencijo, ki naj bi odločila glede izključitve Lewisovih, ki so bile suspendirane v zadnjem septembru na obtožbeni listini revolte v vrstah organiziranega delavstva. Green je po končani seji izjavil, da ni v podzavest nobena akcija glede vprašanja.

Toronto, Ont., Kanada, 20. apr. — Avtni delavci, ki so zastavili v tovarni korporaciji General Motors v Oshawi, so na dnevnem shodu odklonili koncesije v obliki zvišanja mezde in izboljšanja delovnih ur, katere je korporacija ponudila, če se vrnejo na delo. Izjavili so, da bodo vztrajali v boju, dokler ne bodo ugodile glavnim zahtevam, ki je zmanjšanje unije.

Alex Hall, župan v Oshawi, ki nastopi na shodu, je prečital pismo J. H. Highfielda, glavnega upravitelja tovarne General Motors v Oshawi, v kateri so bile koncesije omenjene. Highfield je objubil, da bo upošteval pritožbe stavkarjev pri nadaljnjih pogajanjih, če pretrgajo zveze z organizatorji Lewisovega odbora, kar pa so stavkarji odklonili.

George Thompson, organizator, je pohvalil stališče stavkarjev. "Vesel me, ker vztrajate pri svojih zahtevah," je rekel Thompson. "Dobili boste vse, kar ste zahtevali, ker ste pokazali vzornost in disciplino v tej stavki."

Frey hvali harmonijo v federaciji

Washington, D. C. — John P. Frey, predsednik kovinarskega departamenta ADF, je dejal, da prevladuje harmonija med člani eksekutive Ameriške delavske federacije, odkar so bile suspendirane Lewisove unije. "Ze dolgo časa ni bilo v federaciji take enotnosti kakor je sedaj," je rekel Frey. Istočasno je tajnik blagajnik ADF poročal, da je imela federacija v zadnjem fiskalnem letu \$53,548 več stroškov kot dohodkov. V blagajni je bilo \$569,405 in v tem je vključena vsota \$510,623, ki predstavlja obrambni sklad krajnjih in federalnih unij. Na prihodnji seji eksekutivnega sveta bo med drugim razprava glede razpisa izrednega sesenstva za financiranje organizatorne kampanje med poljedelskimi in oljnimi delavci.

Nemčija pristane na konferenco?

Angleški delavski vodja dobil zagotovilo od Hitlerja

Berlin, 20. apr. — Tajne priprave glede sklicanja mednarodne ekonomske konference, ki naj bi razpravljala tudi o splošni omejitvi oboroževanja, so večer dosegle višek. George Lansbury, voditelj angleške delavske stranke, je nameraval zagotovilo, da se Hitler načelno strinja z onimi, ki se navdušujejo za tako konferenco in da se je bo Nemčija udeležila.

"Nemčija je pripravljena sodelovati v skupnih naporih in svrhu utrditve ekonomske kooperacije in sklenitve vzajemnega sporazuma med državami, če bo predsednik Roosevelt ali načelnik katere druge močnega države prevzel vodstvo glede sklicanja konference," se glasi uradna izjava.

Hitler je objavil ta sklep na predvečer svojega 48. rojstnega dne, ki ga bodo praznovali po vsej Nemčiji.

Lansbury, ki se je razgovarjal dve uri s Hitlerjem, se pogaja tudi s predstavniki drugih držav glede sklicanja mednarodne ekonomske konference. Med temi so predsednik Roosevelt, francoski ministar predsednik Leon Blum, Paul Van Zeeland, belgijski premier in zunanji ministri skandinavskih držav. On upa, da bo Roosevelt sklical konferenco, katere se bo udeležila tudi Sovjetska unija. Hitler je dejal, da ne bo ugovarjal, če sovjetska vlada pošlje svoje reprezentante na konferenco.

Med drugim se bo konferenca bavila z vprašanjem omejitve oboroževanja in z odstranitvijo vzrokov, ki vodijo v vojno. Razpravljala bo, kakaj se države oborožujejo in kaj imajo od tega.

Velika zmaga tekstilne unije

New York. — Podpis pogodbe z Viscose Rayon Co. je prva velika zmaga v organizatorni kampanji, ki jo vodi unija tekstilnih delavcev. Ta družba, ki jo kontrolira angleški kapital, uposljuje okrog 20,000 delavcev v svojih tovarnah. Poleg priznanja je unija izvojevala zvišanje mezde 15 odstotkov, petdnevnik in 40 ur dela, plačane vsakoletne počitnice in izključno pravico kolektivnega pogajanja. Veljavnost pogodbe poteče čez dve leti.

Sovjetsko letalo se bliža severnemu tečaju

Moskva, 20. apr. — Sovjetski letalec P. G. Golovin, ki je 23. marca zapustil Moskvo na poleto proti severnemu tečaju, je te dni sporočil, da je dosegel Rudolfov otok, ki se nahaja 2500 milj od Moskve in 560 milj od severnega tečaja. Rudolfov otok je del Francozofove zemlje. Golovin ima s seboj dva mehanska in radiooperatorja. Namen tega ruskega poleta je, ustanoviti letalsko linijo iz Rusije v Ameriko čez severni tečaj, na katerem bo letalska postaja.

Španski uporniki imajo špijone v Mehiki

Mexico City. — Voditelji mehiških delavskih unij pravijo, da imajo španski uporniki svoje špijone v vseh mehiških mestih. Zdjaj so pozvali kongres, naj odredi preiskavo aktivnosti agentov, ki so informirali generala Franca, vrhovnega poveljnika španske fašistične armade, o kretanju tovarnega parnika Mar Cantabrica. Ta je bil potopljen v bližini Biskajskega zaliva.

NOVE UNIJE PRIHAJAJO V LEWISOVO KOLO CIO

Velik uspeh organizatorne kampanje med jeklarji

ZAPRTA DELAVNICA JE CILJ CIO

Washington, D. C. — (FP) — Odbor za industrijsko organizacijo bo v kratkem izdal čarterje več ko 300 novim krajevnim unijam, ki so bile ustanovljene v zadnjem času. To izjavo je podal John L. Lewis, načelnik CIO, v razgovoru s reporterji. Splošna organizatorna kampanja je zdaj v teku med telegrafisti in radiooperatorji. Unija American Radio Telegraphists, ki ima 25 podružnic in več ko 10,000 članov, se je zdaj pridružila CIO in sodeluje v kampanji med delavci pri Western Union Co., Postal Telegraph Co. in American Telephone & Telegraph Co. Slednja je največje privatno podjetje na svetu.

Pogodbe, ki jih je podpisala Zveza železarskih in jeklarskih delavcev z jeklarskimi podjetji, odkar traja organizatorna kampanja, krijejo \$90,000 delavcev, več ko polovico vseh delavcev, ki so upošeni v jeklarski industriji. Jones & Laughlin Steel Co., Youngstown Sheet & Tube ter druge "neodvisne" jeklarske kompanije so naznanile, da se bodo pričele pogajati z reprezentanti jeklarske unije, ko je federalno vrhovno sodišče potrdilo Wagnerjev zakon, ki daje delavcem pravico organiziranja in kolektivnega pogajanja.

Lewis je dejal, da tudi kampanja med delavci v Fordovih tovarnah dobro napreduje. Kmalu bo prišlo do preizkušnje med unijo in Fordovo kompanijo, ki je edina izmed velikih avtnih kompanij, ki odklanja kolektivna pogajanja z organiziranimi delavci.

Obdolžitve, da je njegova organizacija CIO komunistična, je Lewis zanikal, priznal je, da je cilj CIO zaprta delavnica v vseh industrijah. "S strašilom, da komunisti operirajo v avtni uniji, je najprej prišla na dan korporacija General Motors," je dejal Lewis. "Komunistično strašilo ne bo preprečilo organiziranja delavcev v industrijah masne produkcije. Delavci danes vedo, da imajo koristi od organizacije. Rudar na primer, ki plača \$12 na leto uniji, dobi svoj delež. Pred štirimi leti je moral rudar delati deset in več ur na dan za \$3.25, danes pa dela sedem ur na dan in plača je \$6."

Darrow, osemdesetletnik, je zadovoljen

Chicago, 20. apr. — Clarence Darrow, slavni pravni branitelj in filozof, je te dni obhajal svoj osemdeseti rojstni dan. Ko so ga obiskali poročevalci in vprašali, kako se počuti, je starček odgovoril, da je zdrav in čvrst ter popolnoma zadovoljen s svojim življenjem, katerega bi ne zamenjal za nobeno drugo življenje. "Življenje na tem svetu je vse, kar imamo, in če kaj dozežemo, dosežemo samo tu," je rekel Darrow.

Maribor (Slovenija), Jugoslavija, 20. apr. — Jože Stoklas, 77-letni grobar v Heiligenblutu v okolici, je pred kratkim praznoval redki jubilej. Izkopal je tisoč grob po dolgih letih tega svojega dela. Ko je bil grob izkopen in ko je Stoklas vrgel navzgor zadnjo lopato prsti, ga je zadel mrtvoud in obležal je v grobu mrtev. Ta grob je bil zanj...

Stavka električnih delavcev končana

Družba pristala na kolektivna pogajanja

St. Louis, Mo. — (FP) — Emerson Electric Co. je pristala na kolektivna pogajanja z reprezentanti unije United Electrical & Radio Workers in a tem je bila stavka, ki je bila oklicana 2. marca, končana. Dogovor med unijo in kompanijo je naznanil Leonard C. Bajork, pokrajinski direktor federalnega delavskega razsodišča.

V tej stavki je bilo prizadetih okrog 2000 delavcev in se je razširila tudi na Century Electric Co. Dogovor, ki je končal stavko pri Emerson Co., je v imenu kompanije podpisal njen pravni svetovalec William Sentner, v imenu unije pa Robert Hawes. Kompanijska unija je bila razpisana kakor hitro je federalno vrhovno sodišče potrdilo Wagnerjev zakon za ustavnega.

Hawes je naznanil rastignitev organizatorne kampanje na vse tovarne v tem distriktu, ki izdelujejo električno opremo. James B. Carey, predsednik unije Electrical & Radio Workers, je izjavil, da je njegova organizacija vložila pritožbo pri delavskem razsodišču proti družbam, ki odklanjajo kolektivna pogajanja.

Telegrafisti in mornarji zmagali

Parobrodna družba priznala unijo

New York. — (FP) — International Merchant Marine Co. se je po 36 ur trajajoči stavki uklonila in priznala uniji telegrafistov in mornarjev. Dogovor, ki določa zaprto delavnico za člane American Radio Telegraphists Assn., predvideva tudi priznanje delegatov vseh treh divizij mednarodne mornarske unije. Te so Eastern & Gulf Sailors Assn., Marine Firemen, Oilers & Watertenders in Marine Cooks & Stewards.

Voditelj ARTA in pred kratkim ustanovljene unije ISU so po tej zmagi naznanili, da bodo zahtevali obnovitev pogajanj z drugimi parobrodskimi družbami. Če se bodo upirale, bodo oklicali stavko.

Stavka pri International Merchant Marine Co., ki je preprečila odhod parnika President Roosevelt iz newyorškega pristanišča, je bila oklicana, ko je unija ugotovila, da je kompanija upostila nekaj delavcev, ki so stavkotali v teku zadnje stavke v pristaniščih ob vzhodni obali. Ako se ne bi bila kompanija takoj podala, bi se stavka razširila na vse njene parnike.

Mervyn Rathbone, predsednik ARTA, je po podpisu dogovora izjavil, da je ta zmaga odprla pot za formiranje splošne mornarske organizacije na vzhodu, ki bo potegnila v svojo arado okrog 121,000 delavcev. Lewisov odbor CIO je objubil podporo v organizatorni kampanji.

Stavka zajela oblačilne tovarne v Kanadi

Montreal, Que., Kanada. — Unija International Ladies Garment Workers, ki pravi, da reprezentira 75 odstotkov delavcev, ki so upošeni v kanadski oblačilni industriji, je oklicala stavko v tukajšnjih tovarnah. V stavki je zavejanih več tisoč delavcev, ki zahtevajo pravico kolektivnega pogajanja, zvišanje mezde 20 odstotkov, plačo in pol za čezurno delo, izboljšanje delovnih pogojev in skrajšanje delovnega tedna. Stavka se bo morda razširila na oblačilne tovarne v Torontu, Winnipegu in Hamiltonu.

ŠPANSKA VLADA PROTESTIRA PROTI BLOKADI

Šestdeset bojnih ladij je oklenilo Španijo, da ustavijo orožje, strelivo in prostovoljce

NOVI USPEHI MILICE

London, 20. apr. — Španska vlada v Valenciji je danes poslala mednarodnemu nevladnemu odboru v London formalen protest proti blokadi španskih pristanišč, ki se je začela danes po polnoči. Okrog 60 bojnih ladij je zaplo vsa pristanišča; angleške in francoske bojne ladje pasijo na fašistične luke, italijanske in nemške ladje pa na luke pod kontrolo vlade. Španska vlada posebno protestira proti prisotnosti Mussolinijevih in Hitlerjevih bojnih ladij pred svojimi pristanišči, kar smatra za sovražno potozo, kajti fašistični Italiji in nacijski Nemčiji špansko ljudstvo ne more in ne sme zaupati.

Španska vlada izjavlja, da je blokada krivična in proti določbam mednarodnega zakona, zato je španska vlada ne priznava in njene pomorske ter letalske sile imajo nalogo, da ščitijo ladje španske republike in ladje onih držav, ki ne sodelujejo pri blokadi in katere imajo po mednarodnem pravu vso pravico plovbe v španska pristanišča.

Blokadna straža na špansko-francoski meji obstoji iz 180 danških, škandnavskih, avstrijskih in angleških vojaških častnikov pod vodstvom Danca, do čim je na špansko-portugalski meji sto angleških stražnikov; na špansko-gibraltarski meji je 90 Angležev in Holancev pod vodstvom turškega častnika.

Madrid, 20. apr. — Fašistične granate, ki padajo v Madrid iz zapadne strani še osem dni zaporedoma, so v tem času ubile okrog sto oseb in dvakrat toliko je ranjenih. Bombardiranje se vrši s hribov nad parkom Casa de Campo, odkoder se bo ponavljalo toliko časa, dokler ljudska milica ne okupira teh hribov.

Glavna ofenziva ljudske armade se zdaj vrši na fronti okrog Teruela 150 milj severovzhodno od Madrida. Milica potiska fašiste nazaj in se počasi približava Teruelu; prodiranje je počasno zaradi silnega odpora fašistov, ki se zavedajo, da bodo uničeni, če bodo odrezani od Zaragoza na severu.

Naciji svarijo filmsko družbo

Hollywood, Cal. — Igralci, ki nastopajo v filmu "Pot nazaj", v povojni povesti Nemčije, katero je spisal Erich Remarque, avtor prej izdane knjige "Vse mirno na zapadni fronti," so bili razkašeni, ko je nacijski konzul posvaril filmsko družbo Universal, da se film ne bo kazal v Nemčiji, ker ni v skladu z nacijskimi gledališčem in filozofijo. Uradniki te družbe in igralci, ki nastopajo v tem filmu, so prejeli svafilo. Konzul pravi, da je možnost, da se ne bodo tudi drugi filmi, v katerih nastopajo ti igralci, kazali v Nemčiji, ker jih bo vlada prepovedala.

Akcija za združitve rudarjev v Illinoisu

Chicago, 20. apr. — Eksekutiva rudarske unije UMWA v 12. distriktu (Illinois), ki te dni zboreje v Chicagu, je povabila vodstvo razkolne rudarske unije PMU na konferenco za enotno fronto. Ray Edmundson, distriktni predsednik UMWA, je izjavil, da so Illinoiski operatorji povzročili prvotni razkol in samo v njihovem interesu je, da se ta razkol nadaljuje. Koristi vseh rudarjev v Illinoisu so, da se čim prej združijo v eni sami uniji.

Comments on This and That

CANADA IS LEARNING. — WORKERS SHOULD NOT PAY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT. — THE PROSVETA EDITORIAL STAFF IS TAXED ENOUGH

The industrial unions gathered around CIO have lately won a whole basketful of victories in the U. S.; then they went across the "undefended" border into Canada for additional victories. There they encountered a rugged individualist, one Mitchell Hepburn, the premier of the "democratic" province of Ontario, who swears that no "paid foreign agitator" shall organize the free Canadian workers and lead them to a sit-down strike. Up to this writing Hepburn has succeeded in blocking an understanding between the striking auto workers of the General Motors auto plant in Oshawa, Ont., although the company is willing to recognize the union.

What is interesting in this Canadian strife is the fact that the company involved is an American corporation which has recognized the same American auto workers union in this country. But when this same union followed this same corporation into Canada, where the latter was received with open arms, it is told by an autocratic premier of the "democratic" province of Ontario that it cannot enter because it is "foreign". American capital that goes into Canada is not "foreign", but an American idea of a union is "foreign".

The Canadian politicians of the individualistic school will now learn that they cannot have American-controlled factories in Canada without having American-controlled labor unions in Canada, because international capital implies international labor.

Illinois is one of the five remaining states of the U. S. which have not so far enacted the unemployment insurance law. There is now a bill before the Illinois legislature which intends to fill this gap. The bill is good in all particulars except one. It provides that contributions shall be paid not only by employers but also by employees; the workers of Illinois are to contribute one per cent of their wages.

This provision is unjust. The purpose of the unemployment compensation law is clear in placing responsibility upon owners of industry for the control and compensation of unemployment. Workers have no control over industry; therefore, they cannot control their jobs. Why then should they be made to contribute for their own benefits to be paid to them when they lose their employment through no fault of their own?

Illinois labor is getting poor treatment because it is weak politically and industrially.

Bro. Michael Fleischhacker of the Integrity Lodge, Chicago, complains in this issue of the Prosveta that the Editorial staff of this paper made a poor showing at the last sport festival of that lodge. His contention is that the staff made no account of the affair on its own hook, and did not even visit the tournament.

There have been explanations in the past and there will be in the future, but, I am sure, all will never be satisfied. The Prosveta has no reporters, and the staff works only in the office. Outside of the office, the members of the staff are free from duty and if they want to attend any lodge affair that is their own choice, and no one can compel them to do so. When the Prosveta reaches the stage of having a regular sports reporter it will then be a different matter.
