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## Federacija jugoslovanskih podpornih organizacij

Prva konferenca petih organizacij je bila zadnji teden v Clevelandu. Prihodnja konferenca bo prihodnje jesen v Milwaukeeju. Veliko obetajoč začetek. Ideja federacije je bila sprožena na zadnji konvenciji SNPJ

Dne 8. aprila so se zbrali v Slovenskem narodnem domu v Clevelandu, O., zastopniki petih jugoslovanskih podpornih organizacij v Ameriki—med katerimi sta HBZ in SNPJ največji in predstavljata večino članstva vseh—v svrhu ustanovitve federacije teh organizacij.

Zastopane so bile sledeče organizacije in imena zastopnikov: Slovenska narodna podpora z sedežem v Chicagu; Vincent Cankar, Frank Aleš in Mihael Pleše—Hrvatska bratska zajednica s sedežem v Pittsburghu; Anton Gazdić, Vinko Šolić in Geo. Sanković—Jugoslovanska podpora zveza Sloga s sedežem v Milwaukeeju; Viktor Petek in Frank Ermenc—Slovenska svobodnodelna podpora zveza s sedežem v Chicagu; Vatro J. Grill, William Rus in John Kalan—Srbski narodni savez s sedežem v Pittsburghu; Simon Sakota.

Konferenci je predsedoval br. Vincent Cankar, podpredsednik je bil Gazdić in zapisnik je vodil Grill. Konferenca je trajala samo en dan in končno je zaključila, da se povabijo vse ostale organizacije na prihodnjo konferenco, ki se vrši 6. oktobra t. l. v Milwaukeeju, Wis.

Zastopniki so razpravljali o raznih vprašanjih, ki so vsem organizacijam skupna in važna, na primer: sprejemanje novih članov, simulacija, kulturne naloge, legalni interesi, gospodarska akcija, propaganda med Američani, zavetišča, ohranitev mladine itd.

O vseh teh vprašanjih bodo pripravljene obširni referati za prihodnjo konferenco. Izvoljenih je bilo osem referentov, ki bodo poročali: Šolić o skupni kontroli sprejemanja novih članov, Rus o skupni kontroli nad simulacijo, Grill o skupnih kulturnih nalogah, Cankar o skupnih pravnih nalogah, Aleš o skupnih gospodarskih nalogah, Petek o skupni propagandi med Američani, Ermenc o problemu, kako ohraniti našo mladino organizacijam in Gazdić o skupni sirotinici in zavetišču.

To je bila le pripravljajalna konferenca, ki oskrbi vse priprave za prihodnjo konferenco, na kateri bo federacija šele formalno ustanovljena. Na prihodnji konferenci, na kateri bodo—kot je trdno upanje—zastopane tudi druge organizacije, bo šele izvoljen stalni odbor. Zdej je bil izvoljen le začasni odbor do prihodnje konference, v katerem so: Vincent Cankar, predsednik; Anton Gazdić, podpredsednik; Vatro J. Grill, tajnik.

Zapisnik prve konference bo poslan vsem jugoslovanskim listom, predvsem glasilom podpornih organizacij.

Zelo razveseljivo dejstvo je, da je na konferenci vladalo popolno sporazumljenje in bratsko razpoloženje ter zaupanje, čeprav so bili zastopniki prvič skupaj, kar je pomagalo, da je bila konferenca končana v enem dnevu. Vsi zastopniki so čutili, da je federacija potrebna in da bodo imele podporne organizacije kakor tudi ves jugoslovanski narod v Ameriki veliko korist od tega koraka.

Pittsburgh, Kans. — Premogovniške družbe v distriktu Kansas-Missouri so storile prvi korak, s katerim so pokazale, da ne bodo priznale reorganizirane rudarske unije United Mine Workers, kateri predseduje Alexander Howat, njihov star sovražnik. Družbe so ustavile "check-off" ali pobiranje unijskega asesmenta od plače članov vseh krajevnih unij, razen devetih.

Bivši šerif obtožen umora pravdnika

Mauston, Wis. — Lyall T. Wright, bivši šerif, je bil aretiran kot osumljenec, da je ustrelil distriktnega pravdnika Clintona G. Prilleja, navdušenega suhača, ki je grozil, da pomete z vsemi butlegarji v svojem območju. Zadnje nedeljo zvečer je oblezal mrtev v svoji hiši zadet od krogle, ki je prišla skozi zadnja vrata z vrta.

Unija strojnikov napreduje

New Haven, Conn. — Na prošnji seji krajevnih unij strojnikov je pristopilo 26 novih članov. Unija strojnikov stalno napreduje in v prvih mesecih tega leta je pridobila nad sto članov.

Stavbni delavci izvajali pet-dnevnik

Lynn, Mass. — Organizirani tesarji bodo od 1. maja, ko stopi v veljavo nova pogodba med njimi in podjetniki, delali le pet dni v tednu. Mezda ostane stara.

## Vojna proti jetiki

Število otrok v Chicagu, ki bolehalo na tuberkulozi, je naraslo

Chicago. — Zdravniške avtoritete so v tekočem mesecu organizirale kampanjo po vseh krajih Združenih držav, da se omeji število smrti, ki jih povzročata ta morilka. Dr. Benjamin Goldberg, direktor mestnega sanatorija za tuberkulozne, poroča, da se je število smrtnih slučajev vsled te bolezni med odraslimi zmanjšalo v prejšnjem letu za 7%, dočim je med otroci do petnajstega leta znatno naraslo.

Dr. Goldberg pravi, da je glavni vzrok povečanju števila smrtnih slučajev med otroci nepazljivost. Mnogi starši ne pazijo dovolj na svoje otroke, da ne bi prišli v dotiko z osebami, ki bolehalo na jetiki. Vodstvo mestnega sanatorija skrbi, da se ne krši postava, ki je bila sprejeta v tem oziru; v prejšnjem letu je ločila 2,058 otrok od oseb, ki so bolehalo na tuberkulozi.

Mestni sanatorij ima sedaj 31,593 otrok pod zdravniškim nadzorom, da tako prepreči razširjanje te bolezni. Dr. Goldberg je mnenja, da bi se moralo prebivalstvo v Chicagu zanimati za zdravje otrok in prijaviti vsak slučaj te bolezni zdravstvenim avtoritetam.

Kdor najde "dušo Amerike," dobi \$3000

New York. — Narodni klub umetnosti je razpisal \$3000 o nemu pisatelji, ki spiše najboljšo knjigo z naslovom "Duša Amerike" (The Soul of America).

## Akcija proti izdajanju sodniških prepovedi

Delavske unije v državi New York znagovite

New York. — (F. P.) — Sodnikom v državi New York, ki so bili vselej uslužni napram delodajalcem, kadar so ti zahtevali injunkcije proti delavcem v industrijskih sporih, injunkcije, ki so prepovedovale piketiranje tovarnen in razne druge aktivnosti v stavkah, je bila odvzeta ta oblast s sprejetjem Hofstadter-Lefkowitzove predloge v državni legislaturi. Predloga je bila sprejeta v obeh zbornicah in sedaj čaka na podpis gubernerja Roosevelta.

Predloga vključuje določbe, ki prepovedujejo sodniku izdajanje injunkcije na zahtevo delodajalcev, dokler se o tem ne obvesti unijo in se o zadevi vrši zaslišanje. V izrednih slučajih se lahko pokliče zastopnike unije na zaslihanje na dan, ki ga določijo pravni zastopniki delodajalca.

Sprejeta predloga ne določa porotne obravnave, predno sodnik izda injunkcijo. Originalna predloga je vsebovala tudi to določbo, ali reakcionarni republikanski poslanci v legislaturi so mrcvarili predlogo toliko časa, da je bila ta določba izbrisana, nakar je bila predloga sprejeta brez vsake opozicije. Kljub pomankljivostim, je sprejetje predloge, ki omejuje oblast sodnikom, velikega pomena za delavske unije in se lahko reče, da so s tem mnogo pridobile.

Država New York se je s sprejetjem protinjunkcijske predloge pridružila državi Illinois in New Jersey, v katerih je moč sodnikov pri izdajanju sodniških prepovedi precej omejena. Med velikimi industrijskimi državami je sedaj Pennsylvania na prvem mestu v kolikor se tiče oblasti sodnikov pri izdajanju injunkcij proti delavcem v industrijskih sporih. V tej državi je moč tovarnarjev, katerim načelujeta zakladniški tajnik Mellon in senator Grundy, skoraj neomejena.

## Unije rešujejo vprašanje brezposelnosti

Sprejele so resolucijo, v kateri zahtevajo, da se Volsteadov zakon amandira

New York. — (F. P.) — Newyorški centralni strokovni in delavski svet se je lotil vprašanja brezposelnosti. Rešitev vidi v amandiranju prohibicijskega zakona tako, da bi dovoljeval izdelovanje piva in lahkih vin. Na svoji seji so zastopniki sveta soglasno sprejeli resolucijo, v kateri pravijo, da bi z amandiranjem zakona dobilo milijon in pol brezposelnih delavcev delo v pivovarnah.

Najbrž so se zastopniki delavskega sveta motili v mnenju, da bi taka akcija odpravila brezposelnost, kajti vsakdo lahko dobi vsakovrstna vina in piva v newyorških "speakeasies," katerih je samo v New Yorku okrog 32,000, ako je verjeti izjavi policijskega komisarja Whalena, ki mora pač vedeti, kaj govori. Te tajne točilnice uposljujejo več kot sto tisoč delavcev, ki bi bili ob delo, ako bi se namera delavskega sveta uresničila in vprašanje brezposelnosti bi ostalo še vedno nerešeno.

Radio iz Indije užgal luči v Zagrebu

Dunaj, 15. apr. — Radio kratke valovne dolžine iz Malabarja v Britski Zapadni Indiji je večer užgal električne luči na sejmju v Zagrebu.

Boljševiški pesnik se je ustrelil

Moskva, 15. apr. — Vladimir Majakovski, eden najboljših pesnikov in vodilni dramatik v sovjetski Rusiji, je večer izvršil samomor s kroglo.

## INDIJSKI VODITELJI ODHAJAJO V ZAPOR

Redsednik nacionalističnega kongresa obojen na šest mesecev. Solna revolucija se nadaljuje

Bombaj, Indija, 15. apr. — Višek krize v nacionalistični kampanji civilne nepokorščine v Indiji je prišel ta teden, ko so začele britske oblasti metati v zapor voditelje takozvane solne revolucije. Včeraj sta bila aretirana in takoj obojena na šest mesecev zapora Pandit Javaharlal Nehru, predsednik nacionalistične organizacije in J. M. Sengupta, župan v Kalkuti; prvi je delal sol in drugi je čital dijakom prepovedano čtivo.

Odbor nacionalističnega kongresa je takoj odredil "dan žalovanja" in razposlal 500 novih prostovoljcev za izdelovanje in prodajanje kontrabratne soli. Aretacije solnih rebelov so zdaj v teku po vsej deželi. Vaak čas se pričakuje tudi aretiranje "svetnika" Gandhija, glavnega voditelja pasivne revolucije za neodvisnost Indije.

Gandhi je zdaj odredil mobilizacijo žensk za kampanjo proti alkoholnim pijačam. Danes je 300 prostovoljk korakalo po ulicah Bombaja. Prepevale so svetne pesmi proti alkoholu in se ustavile pred vsako vinski pivnico roteč ljudi, naj rajši pijejo "kri nacionalistov" kakor vino.

## Uporno gibanje v Indiji se širi

Anglija se bo morala poslužiti drastičnih sredstev, da odbrzi ekonomsko kontrolo nad Indijci

New York. — (F. P.) — Vojskovo Velike Britanije, ki se nahaja v Indiji ne bo moglo preprečiti nacionalistične revolucije, ki jo vodi Gandhi, čigar namen je izzvati oblasti s kršenjem zakona solnega monopola Morsko obrežje Indije je dolgo pet tisoč milj in Velika Britanija ne bo mogla iz dohodkov, katere ji donša monopol soli, skrbeti za vse aretirane osebe, ki bodo vržene v zapore radi kršitve tega zakona. To je mnenje Sailerdranatha Ghoseja, predsednika ameriške branže Indijskega narodnega kongresa.

Ghose je nadalje izrazil upanje, da bo revolucija proti solnemu monopolu uspešna. Kadar se to zgodi, ne bo imela Velika Britanija drugih dohodkov kot od izvoza produktov v Indijo. Toda tudi od izvoza produktov ne more Anglija pričakovati velikih dohodkov, ker bodo Indijci bojkotirali britsko blago. Milijarde dolarjev, katere je Velika Britanija investirala v Indiji, ne bodo nosili ogromnih profitov kot do sedaj, kadar postane Indija neodvisna.

V provinci Mysore je rudarska stavka, v kateri je udeleženo petnajst tisoč rudarjev. Med njimi se širi tudi civilna nepokorščina v tem, da neboje plačevati davkov, pojavlja se bojkot angleškega blaga in kršenje zakona solnega monopola.

Organizirane cerkvene sekte so na strani Velike Britanije, toda proti njim se je postavila mlajša generacija na sličen način kot v Rusiji, ki se ne briga za stare tradicije. Velika Britanija je vedno nudila podporo verskim organizacijam in vsak indijski princ, ki je zavzel stalni položaj, je bil protektiran, dočim je vlada preganjala osebe, ki so agitirale za neodvisnost Indije.

Indijsko ljudstvo, ki se skuša otresti angleške nadvlade, ne pričakuje pomoči niti od laboritske stranke, ki je sedaj na krmilu vlade, ker je mnenja, da so tudi delavci v Angliji nasprotni, da bi Indija dobila neodvisnost.

## Proti naseljevanju Mehikancev

Voditelji Ameriške delavske federacije so mnenja, da ceneni mehiki delavec ogrožajo življenjski standard ameriških delavcev

Washington, D. C. — (F. P.) — Eksekutivni odbor Ameriške delavske federacije je poslal na vse centralne delavske unije v ameriških industrijskih mestih obvestilo, naj pritiskajo na zvezne senatorje in kongresnike, da sprejmejo predlogo za omejitev naseljevanja iz Mehike v Združene države. Voditelji federacije stoji na stališču, da mehiki delavci ogrožajo življenjski standard ameriških delavcev, ker so pripravljani delati za nizke mezde.

Ameriška delavska federacija podpira predlogo, ki je sedaj pred kongresom in vsebuje določbe, da se uvedejo proti Mehikancem enake restrikcije pri naseljevanju kot so v veljavi proti evropskim delavcem. Ako bo predloga sprejeta, bo le okrog tri tisoč Mehikancem letno dovoljen vstop v Združene države.

Mehiki delavci poplavlajo delavski trg ne samo v južnozahodnih državah, temveč tudi na vzhodu in severu. Voditelji federacije dože, da je za brezposelnost v južnozahodnih državah odgovorno neomejeno naseljevanje mehikiških delavcev, ki delajo na železniških progah in na poljih sladkorne pese.

Predložena predloga bo udarila tudi kanadske delavce, posebno one, ki žive onstran reke Detroit in prihajajo na delo v Združene države.

## Ljudsko šotlje ni končano

Mnogo Čikažanov nagaja števem in nekaj je bilo aretiranih in kaznovanih

Chicago. — Popisovanje prebivalstva v Chicagu in okolici, ki je imelo biti končano v dveh tednih, to je danes, še traja. Kakor poroča Jos. E. Vesely, direktor lokalnega censusnega biroja, se je štetje zavleklo radi mnogih ljudi, ki nagajajo števecem in se jih nalašč izogibljajo.

V pondeljek je bil aretiran John Sankovich, 519, Center st., ki je uposlen pri Midland Terra Cotta Co. Ko je prišel števec v njegovo stanovanje, ga je Sankovich zapodil iz hiše rekoč, da se naj briga za svoj business, ne pa zanj. Števec je poklical policajca, ki je Sankoviča aretiral.

Mrs. Schlorff, 2229 W. 22nd st., je bila tudi aretirana, ko je pogrnala popisovalko iz hiše in jo udarila po prstih z vrati.

Miss Dorothy Duncan, 4130 Sheridan road, je plačala \$50 kazni, ker je popisovalki raztrgala listine — delo dveh tednov in jo vrgla iz stanovanja.

Levičarska unija pri delu

New York. — Trade Union Unity liga je pričela kampanjo za organiziranje delavcev, ki so uposleni v kovinski, avtomobilski, jeklarski in živezni industriji. Tajnik lige Jack Johnstone poroča, da organizatorično gibanje med temi delavci dobro napreduje. Liga je dosedaj ustanovila svoje unije med rudarskimi, tekstilnimi in oblačilnimi delavci.

65-letnica Lincolnove smrti

Chicago. — Včeraj — 15. aprila — je preteklo 65 let, kar je bil umorjen predsednik Abraham Lincoln v Ford gledališču v Washingtonu. John Wilkes Booth se je utihotopil v ložo, v kateri je Lincoln sedel in mu pognal kroglo iz pištole od zadaj v glavo. Lincoln je ležal v nezavesti dva dni in potem umrl. Booth je po storjenem činu skočil iz lože na oder in zbežal skozi odraška vrata iz gledališča. Nikdar ga niso dobili.

## PLUTOKRATJE SO HVALEŽNI WHALENU

Priredili mu bodo banket radi njegovih zaslug, ki si jih je stekel pri preganjanju radikalnih delavcev

New York. — (F. P.) — Petsto vodilnih wallstreetških finančnikov je aranziralo banket v počast newyorškemu policijskemu komisarju Whalenu. Banket se bo vršil 6. maja v hotelu Astor, dva meseca potem, ko je Whalen vgal svoje policaje, da so napadli brezposelne delavce, ki so se udeležili demonstracij na Union Squaru.

Med drugimi denarnimi veličnammi se bodo udeležili banketa John D. Rockefeller Jr., ki je dal povod masakru žensk in otrok v Ludlowu, Colo., l. 1913; W. W. Atterbury, predsednik Pennsylvanske železnice, čigar privatna policija je pretopala železniške delavce, ki so bili na stavki l. 1922; J. P. Morgan in George F. Baker, vodilna finančnika Wall Streeta, in Vincent Astor, ki je napravil milijonske profite pri spekulacijah z zemljiščem.

Povabljen je župan Walker, da bo pel alavo svojem policijskemu komisarju, ki je pred par meseci bahato izjavil, da se zakon najuspešneje izvaja s pomočjo policijskega količka. Nadalje bo govoril Charles M. Schwab, predsednik jeklarskega trista in odprt sovražnik organiziranega delavstva.

Ako je bil doslej še kdo tako naiven, da je verjel, da ni imel Wall Street ničesar opraviti pri brutálnih navalih na brezposelne delavce in da ni odobrala nasilja, ga mora ta akcija plutokratov prepričati, da se je motil. Wall Street dobro ve, da ima v policijskemu komisarju Whalenu dobrega podpornika, zato ga bo počastil s posebnim banketom.

Delavski list pobija "mokra" propagando

Philadelphia, Pa. — "Philadelphia Union Record", glasilo delavskih unij v tem mestu, kritizira nekatero voditelje unij, ki skušajo napraviti zahtevo za odpravo prohibicije najvažnejše vprašanje v tekoči volilni kampanji. Glasilo pravi, da je vprašanje injunkcij, ki se izdajajo proti delavcem v industrijskih sporih, bolj važno vprašanje kot pa prohibicija. Proti temu zlu bi se morale boriti vse delavske unije, ker so injunkcije najmočnejše orožje, ki ga vihte delodajalci proti delavcem.

Stavka nogavičarskih delavcev

Easton, Pa. — Sto nogavičarskih delavcev, ki so bili uposleni pri Hulmeville Hosiery Co., je te dni zastavkalo, ker je družba odklonila njihove zahteve za zvišanje mezde. Kompanija je na sodišču izposlovala injunkcije proti stavkarjem, ki prepovedujejo piketiranje.

Brezposelnost v Massachusettsu narasla

Boston, Mass. — Število brezposelnih delavcev v državi Massachusetts je v mesecu marcu naraslo za pet tisoč. Tako se glasi poročilo državnega delavskega departamenta, ki je bilo izdano te dni. Največja brezposelnost je nastala v čevljarški industriji.

Injunkcija proti navigarjem

Philadelphia, Pa. — Rogers Hosiery Co. je izposlovala injunkcijo proti navigarjem, ki so zastavkali v njeni tovarni. Injunkcija prepoveduje piketiranje tovarne in smešenje stavkokožov.

20 oseh mrtvih v gorečem centru v Italiji

Rim, 15. apr. — Dvajset oseb se je zadušilo v kinoteatru v Licat, Sicilija, ki ga je večerj ugnil požar.

Sanje so bile misterij; prav tako senca, odmev in odsev. Največji misterij za človeštvo je pa bila — in za preproste ljudi je še danes — smrt.

Ljudje so si vse to razložili po svoji miselni stopnji. Pripisali so vse zunanjim, nevidnim silam, ki so okoli njih in nad njimi. Nato so se začeli tem silam dobrikati, da jih pridobijo zase in se s tem očuvajo slabega ter si naklonijo dobro. Tako se je začelo verovanje v dobre in slabe nadnaravne sile in posel dobrikanja dobrim in odganjanja slabih sil je bil poverjen prebrisanecem, ki so se imenovali magičerji, čarovniki in duhovni, sploh "čudodelci", ki so "prodrli v skrivnost" in posredovali med ljudmi in nadnaravnimi bitji.

## Pazi na noge

Malokateri del telesa se v higijenskem oziru tako zanemarljivo kot noge. Zavedamo se važnosti nog šele, ko nas začno boleti ali kadar iz enega ali drugega vzroka ne morejo vršiti svoje dolžnosti. Stiskamo jih v tesne čevlje, mučimo jih na vse mogoče načine, potem se pa čudimo, ako nam za krajši ali daljši čas odpovedo službo. Krivi smo sami.

Vsaka noga je sestavljena iz nič manj kot 26 malih kosti, ki so med seboj povezane z vezmi. Za gibanje se na nogi nahaja veliko krajših in daljših mišic. Da bi noga bila elastična, tvorijo kosti na podplatu lok tako, da se nornažalna noga pri stoji dotika tal s peto in na prstih, kakor tudi na zunanji strani noge, na notranji se pa ne dotika. Plosnato stopalo (Plattfuss) pa se dotika tal s celo svojo površino in je mnogo manj elastično.

Noge dojenčkov so mnogo bolj pregibljive v stopalu kot noga odraslih. V tem oziru se dojenček približuje opici, pri katerih se noge ravno tako spretno kot roke. Jako zanimivo je opazovati dojenčka, kako giblje prste na nožici. Njegovi prsti so pregibni navzdol, navzgor, se razprejo, pri hoji pa skoraj zarijejo v zemljo. Nekaj podobnega opazamo pri narodih, ki hodijo vedno ali skoraj vedno bos. Nasprotno so noge odraslih kultiviranih ljudi mnogo manj prožne, prsti so skrčeni, skoraj se ne dajo razmakniti, pri hoji se jako malo gibljejo. To je posledica preozkega obuvala. Tu kot tudi drugje na telesu dovede neuporaba mišic do njihove oslabelosti in izgube.

Cimbolj svet uporablja razna vozila, čim manj hoja peš, tem slabše postajajo človeške noge. Hoja po trdem tlaku tudi veliko bolj utruja noge kot hoja po mehkih stezah. Tudi stoji na mestu je utrudiljevsja ko hoja, čeprav se pri hoji mišice bolj napejajo. Pogosto pomilujemo kitajske žene, pri katerih se začena mučenje nog že v najranjši mladosti, samo da bi imele manjše noge. Pa ozka ženska in tudi moška obutev v naših krajih v marsikaterem oziru tudi ni veliko boljša. Ozeč čevlje ne povzročata samo bolečin, ampak tudi ovira pravljen krvotok v nogi. Kri zastaja, noga pa otekajo, mišice ne morejo pravilno delovati. Kri prenaša toploto v vse telesne dele. Kjer cirkulira kri, je tudi toplo, kjer se kri ne pretaka, tja tudi ne prihaja toplota. Dotični del telesa postane hladen, kot da pripada mrliču. Tesen čevlji pritiska tudi na nogavice in iztisne iz njih ono, kar jih dela toplim, zrak. Na ta način se hladna čevljeva koža tesno prileže na telesno kožo in prenaša mrz. Cesta nošnja tesnega obuvala povzroča deformiranost nog, ki je danes tako pogosta. Kako redko vidimo idealno lepe noge, kakor so jih imeli stari Grki, ki so nosili sandale in s tem dali nogam priliko se prirodno lepo razvijati.

Kurja očesa so posledica nepravilnega obuvala in so povzročena radi pogostega trenja, kakor tudi radi pritiska. Koža na tem mestu odebeli in postane trda kot roženica, kar radi pritiska zopet povzroča bolečine zdravega tkiva spodaj. Gotovo je, da je najboljšje zdravilo za kurja očesa nošnja pravih čevljev, kar je mnogo koristnejše, kot pa vsa mogoča še tako reklamirana zdravila, tekočine, obliži, itd. Rajši se ljudje, posebno ženske, mučijo s pretesnimi, premajhnimi čevlji, prenašajo dražestno se smehljaje peklenske bolečine kurjih oči, kot da bi nosili lorda samo malo širše ali za eno številko daljše čevlje. ### HAECKEL'S EMBRYO-DRAWINGS

Isolated medical men and professors were drawn in. One, of good standing, Professor Keibel, declared that Haeckel had, in perfect good faith, really shortened the tail of an embryo-monkey, taken various other liberties, and inserted imaginary embryos without saying so. The Keplerbund took courage, and issued a circular to the leading scientific men of Germany, calling upon them to declare themselves. They did; but not quite as Professor Dennert wanted, and the clerical press represents. Nearly all the leading embryologists and anatomists in Germany signed this statement. I need only say that the forty-seven names include Weismann, Wiedersheim, Bonnet, Boveri, Kollmann, Haeckel, Flechsig, Waldeyer, Korschelt, Hertwig, Lang, Plate, Pfeffer, Rabi, Ruckert, Rumbler, Ruge, Schwalbe, Goette, Chun, etc. And what they said was—a few lines sufficed—that, "though they did not like the kind of schematizing which Haeckel practiced in some cases, they, in the interest of science and the freedom of teaching, condemned in the sharpest manner the attack of Brass and the Keplerbund on Haeckel."

In face of that document, religious journals—the journals which are always wondering how men can possibly be truthful and good without their assistance—are assuring their readers all over the world that Haeckel is "morally and scientifically dead," and has been condemned by German science. But was there not a counterblast to this defense of Haeckel? There was—the blast of a penny trumpet. A document in condemnation of Haeckel was issued by the Keplerbund, and signed by thirty-six men, some of them of great distinction in the world of science. But what our truthful friends always omit to say in regard to this document is that the men of real distinction who signed it were astronomers, geologists, botanists, lawyers, etc., but never embryologists. Their judgment on the point is absolutely worthless, and, indeed, they do not pretend to be able to judge it. They take the word of Dr. Brass, the worth of which we shall see in a moment.

The second round had gone very badly for Herr Brass. The third was fatal. Some amiable and religious director of a bank child Professor Hertwig for letting the defender of the faith down so badly. The distinguished embryologist replied that he had welcomed that means of giving expression to his "indignation," which was "so much the greater as he saw the name of Brass again for the first time since the scientific activity of the man had come to a deserted and unfortunate end in the field of zoology—twenty-five years before." A bad hit for Dr. Brass. Then Professor Rabi, another of the leading embryologists, son-in-law of Haeckel's great opponent, Virchow, entered the list, and finished the defender of the faith. In the "Frankfurter Zeitung" for March 5, 1909, he, like Hertwig, emphasized the great services of Haeckel to science, and showed that Brass had, in his illustrated works, committed precisely the faults he brought against Haeckel. Brass was, he said, a "mere layman" in embryology, and university students had to be warned not to trust his illustrations. Professor Forel also joined in the defense of Haeckel.

So the "honor" of Professor Haeckel was amply vindicated by the anatomists and embryologists of Germany. It will be more difficult to rehabilitate the honor of the religious press, which has, in defiance of the plain facts of the case, trailed its unscrupulous slander over the world. But there is a further point. What of this "practice of schematizing" on Haeckel's part which his colleagues "do not like?"

In the first place, the assertion that it was done to prove a thesis is part of the slander. Says Professor Rabi: "Illustrations which are absolutely true to nature prove Haeckel's phylogenetic deductions far better and more convincingly than his schematic figures do." That cuts down a fine crop of inaccuracies. Secondly, the general public probably sees only one point of great importance in Haeckel's embryonic figures—the gill-slits, which so strikingly show the fish-ancestry. About these there is no dispute. I have seen human embryos, and any reader of the "Evolution of Man" knows that the illustrations taken from other authors wholly agree with those of Haeckel in this. Thirdly, a writer for the general public, which is not permitted to see undeveloped human beings, has no the same task as a professor of embryology. For instance, Haeckel commonly cuts away the ventral pedicle and yolk sac and clears the abdomen. Professor Keibel says that it is wrong. It is a mere matter of opinion. That is an example of schematizing.

But we may in conclusion, turn to Haeckel's own book for his defense on this point. He has an easy task with many of the "falsifications" which the acute eye of Dr. Brass discovered. Some readers will remember a fine plate showing the skeletons of man and the four anthropoid apes—which, in unconscious humor, I have entitled "Five Anthropoid Apes"—in the "Last Words on Evolution." Dr. Brass finds grave and purposive inaccuracies in them. But they are photographs of the actual skeletons. Next, Dr. Brass has personally seen certain genetic tables for the instruction of the public in Haeckel's Museum, and is "full of shame for Haeckel and his friends." But the tables do not yet exist.

The best idea of this schematizing, however, can be conveyed at once to any reader who has "The Evolution of Man." Fig. 137 (complete edition) shows a human embryo drawn by Count Spee. Fig. M. I. on Plate V (two pages later), shows the same figure "schematized" by Haeckel for the purpose of comparison. The change of "falsifying" is ludicrous, and the aim of Haeckel quite plain. Yet this is one of the classical examples. Another is the alleged cutting-short of the tail of the poor embryonic monkey. The truth is that even the human embryo is so excellently tailed at an early stage that there could be no point in such a procedure. Again, where Brass quarrels with the number of vertebrae in a human embryo, no definite number was intended, as the number is variable.

These examples will suffice to explain Haeckel's procedure. He has tried to aid the general reader by schematizing six or eight per cent of his pictures. Many of his colleagues think that he ought not to have done so, but they sternly denounce the indictment of his "honor," and declare that more exact figures prove the evolution of man even more conclusively.

## Upton Sinclair: How to Beat the Market

Now Upton Sinclair tells us how to beat the stock market. His advice is better than a course in the Harvard School of Business Administration, where the professors dare not be frank about financial practice. Sinclair tells us how in his novel of business success Mountain City (Bonl, \$2.50), the story of Jed Rusher who rose from a ranch boy to \$50,000,000 in 30 years.

The way to beat the market is not to study corporation reports from the outside. Jed Rusher's smart lawyer described such molasses as of the "Christmas, birthday, and dance-card variety." The way to beat the market is to manipulate securities from the inside. Thus Jed Rusher's oil company would run fictitious signals of distress. Its huge surpluses would be hidden by imaginary liabilities. Its directors would pass a dividend and the price of Tarbucket oil shares would hit the toboggan. Meanwhile Jed and his gang would lend the surplus to themselves and sell Tarbucket short, making millions on the drop. Then they would catch the market on the low and get 60,000 more shares than they had before. Six months later the company would advertise a surplus and issue stock dividends, securities would soar and Jed would unload, making millions again.

Jed Rusher was a puritan capitalist, a devout Methodist. He rigged the market. He bribed and blackmailed. He even plotted to commit fornication with his employer's 14-year old granddaughter with the hope of crashing into a rich family by way of a shotgun marriage. But that was a matter of business, not lust of the flesh. And aside from that affair he was as moral as Rockefeller, not drinking, smoking, playing poker at night nor committing other transgressions that interfered with his business efficiency.

What Denver will say of Mountain City will be jolly. Newspapermen will chuckle at the portraits from life and none should be merrier than those who have worked for the well known Colorado publisher who got his start as a bartender and once boasted at a Chamber of Commerce banquet that "When I took in a silver dollar I would toss it to the ceiling, and if it stuck, it belonged to the boss, and if it came down, to me." This cynical pirate made his biggest money out of the news not fit to print, suppressing the scandals of Mountain City society for a price.

As the success story of a multi-millionaire, Sinclair's latest novel has brief, witty scenes than Oil and Boston and The Jungle but those brief scenes are poignant bits of human suffering. The cattle ranch hands, burned and frozen by the weather and their children underfed; the farmers sinking deeper and deeper into debt while their little ones crawled among the sugarbeets missing school—their misery hurts because it is so real. Sinclair is more than our best muckraker, he is America's outstanding labor novelist.
