















## HERE IS THE GUIDE

### RULES GOVERNING THE ORGANIZATION AND OPERATION OF K. S. K. J. ATHLETICS

#### ARTICLE ONE

##### Name

The name of this body shall be the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board.

#### ARTICLE TWO

##### Membership

The K. S. K. J. Athletic Board shall consist of a Supreme Commissioner elected at the regular convention of the KSKJ by the general assembly of delegates to the respective convention. The state chairmen shall consist of representatives of states or zones, each of whom shall be duly elected by the athletic directors of the various athletic booster clubs within their respective states or zones.

The athletic directors shall be duly elected by the members of their respective KSKJ athletic booster clubs.

#### ARTICLE THREE

Section 1. The object is to encourage organization of KSKJ athletic activities wherein the members shall be given opportunity to fraternize, to regulate and govern all athletic activities of the KSKJ societies and booster clubs, and encourage and aid same and generally to foster the athletic program and social spirit among the members of the KSKJ.

#### ARTICLE FOUR

##### Duties of the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board

Section 1. To organize the athletic activities among the members of the KSKJ and sponsor the formation of sectional athletic leagues, associations and clubs for the promotion of amateur athletics in various sports.

Section 2. To regulate and supervise championship events and tournaments and designate the time and place of championship contests, play-offs and tournaments, among the KSKJ athletic organizations.

Section 3. To act as a final tribunal in the decision of all controversies regarding rules, etc., that may arise in connection with athletic contests, said decisions to be along lines suggested by the rules and regulations of the American Amateur Athletic Association.

Section 4. To promote athletic activities in the KSKJ.

Section 5. To supervise and approve rules, regulations and by-laws for the various athletic groups representing the subordinate societies of the KSKJ, including all sectional league tournaments and championship events.

Section 6. To restrict the use in all athletic contest, on the various teams, to members who have been in good standing in the KSKJ for a period of at least six months prior to the particular contest.

Section 7. To allow a society in any locality which is unable to organize a group to promote athletics (except bowling) to accept members from another local lodge in the same community, providing that that lodge is not already sponsoring an athletic movement of a similar kind. This will be subject to the approval of the Athletic Board.

Section 8. To insure that wherever a league exists in a certain locality, a KSKJ team in that locality applying for compensation must belong to this league, if such team is of the same athletic caliber as the league.

Section 9. To sponsor baseball, basketball and bowling as major sports and to urge the promotion of such other sports as are best adapted to particular communities, providing that they are not of a nature that will cause a risk of health, life or limb.

#### ARTICLE FIVE

##### Relatoin of Dependent Groups to the Athletic Board

Section 1. Any KSKJ group desiring to organize athletic events must notify the Athletic Commissioner, or some member of the Athletic Board and receive a permit from said Board, in order that the event shall be recognized by the Board.

Section 2. Every group must register the roster of their various teams with the Board at the beginning of each playing season; such roster must be certified by the secretaries of the respective lodges with which they are affiliated and all changes in said roster must be filed with the Athletic Board, as they occur from time to time.

#### ARTICLE SIX

##### Meetings

Meetings of the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board shall be held upon the written call of the chairman, and held at the time and place fixed by him; to avoid unnecessary expense, the Board shall conduct its business, so far as practicable, by correspondence.

#### ARTICLE SEVEN

##### Authority and Voting

A majority of votes cast by the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board shall be final and the chairman shall have one vote, in case of a tie.

#### ARTICLE EIGHT

##### Athletic Fund

Section 1. The expenses incurred by the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board shall be paid out of the general expense fund of the KSKJ; this fund is derived by the diversion of 7½ per cent of the Juvenile Department Funds plus an equal amount from the general expense fund.

Section 2. Both the Supreme Committee and the Athletic Board shall keep a permanent record separately of all expenditures incurred by the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board, or which shall be authorized by said Board.

Section 3. All disbursements shall be made by the Supreme Secretary of the KSKJ, but only upon presentation of a voucher signed by the chairman of the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board and approved by a majority of the members of said Board.

Section 4. Every group recognized by the K. S. K. J. Athletic Board may solicit financial aid from the expense fund of the KSKJ by application to the Athletic Board, but no aid in excess of one hundred dollars (\$100) shall be given to any group for its athletic program for one year.

Section 5. The K. S. K. J. Athletic Board may approve the expenditure of money needed to promote championship contests and tournaments for expenses incurred at its meetings and for expenses incurred by members of the Athletic Board in performance of their duties.

Section 6. The K. S. K. J. Athletic Board shall have the privilege of soliciting either from the Supreme Committee or

the Quadrennial Convention of the Union such other financial support as it may find will be needed to carry on an appropriated athletic program.

#### ARTICLE NINE

##### Distribution of Athletic Funds

Section 1. The K. S. K. J. Athletic Board shall have full authority to designate the amounts to be awarded as prizes in championship tournaments or play-offs, in any major sport that is now or may be hereafter included in the KSKJ athletic curriculum and shall also have full authority to designate the amount or amounts to be paid in rendering financial assistance toward organizing or promoting teams and KSKJ activities, all such activities to be confined, however, to the general objectives above outlined.

Section 2. Any group which shall be found guilty of using any appropriation illegally shall be automatically cut off from further assistance and shall be declared ineligible for competition in any KSKJ athletic tournaments or play-offs; the Athletic Board shall be the sole and only arbiter of whether an illegal or improper act has been committed and there shall be no appeal from its action in disqualifying any group or groups; said Athletic Board shall further have the power to reinstate any group or groups, at its discretion.

#### ARTICLE TEN

##### The Revision of By-Laws

The K. S. K. J. Athletic Board may change, amend or repeal the foregoing by-laws and regulations, at its discretion, by means of a two-thirds majority vote, subject, however, to the written approval of the Supreme Board.

Article 5, Section 3. No change in roster after date set by the Commission as final date—half of playing season.

Section 4. All KSKJ booster and sport clubs, leagues or associations, must file a copy of their rules with the Commission for permanent record, must notify him of changes as they are made from time to time to avoid any disputes.

Section 5. All KSKJ sport or booster clubs shall have a spiritual director, same as lodges.

## LECTURE ON SLOVENIAN WOMEN WRITERS

Cleveland, O.—It probably will be the first time that Slovenian authoresses will be the subject treated in a lecture when Anthony J. Klančar, translator and lecturer, will deliver a talk, "Slovenian Women Writers," before the Beta chapter of Sigma Tau Delta, Cleveland College professional writers' fraternity, March 9, at the Chamber of Commerce, Terminal Tower.

There is a surprisingly large number of women writers in Slovenia. But the greatness of such universal geniuses as Prešeren, Cankar, Župančič and Vl. Levstik, Meško, Finžgar and Sardenk obscures the real merit of many Slovenian authoresses.

Mr. Klančar will discuss the lives and works of these Slovenian women writers. Among those to be discussed are Josipina Turograjska, Lujiza Pesjakova, Pavilna Pajkova, Zofka Kveder-Demetrovič, Marica Bartolova, Vida Jerajeva, Ljubmila Poljanec, Marija Kmetova, Ljudmila Prunkova, Ljubmila Pivkova and Minka Govekarjeva. The lecturer will read selections from the works of these poets, novelists, short-story writers and journalists in original translations.

In the January number of the Skyline, Cleveland College paper, appeared one of Mr. Klančar's translations from Ivan Cankar, "Her Grave." In the coming number of the Slavic Review, published in London, there will appear six other sketches translated from the same author. Last year the lecturer translated and produced Cankar's farce-comedy, "Scandal in the Valley of St. Florian," for the first to be put on the English stage. More recently he has delivered a series of four lectures on modern Slovenian authors at the St. Clair-E. 55th Branch Library.
