Delitev Rusije?

V zadnjem zvezku "Ruskega arhiva" emigrantske revije, ki izhaja v Beogradu v srbohrvaškem jeziku, je objavljen članek znanega ruskega publicista V. Lebedeva "Nova strategija — nova diplomacija Rusije." Skoraj ob istem času izšli izvirnik tega članka je vzbudil izredno pozornost zlasti v češkem tisku. Lebedev, ki se že dolgo bavi s politično - vojaškimi vprašanji, prihaja v svojih izjavah do nekaterih senzacionalnih sklepov.

Po njegovi sodbi se je že v zadnjih letih dokaj spremenila vojno-politična konjunktura v Evropi. Ne glede na razne spore in imperialistična poželenja bolj ali manj lokalnega značaja, je danes vsem poučenim krogom jasno, da se zbirajo ogromne sile za še ogromnejši načrt: za delitev Rusije. To utegne postati že v dohodnem času najusodnejši zapletljaj, ki čaka Evropo in ves ostali svet. Nemčija, Japonska in Poljska zastavljajo svoje skrite sile za izvedbo načrta, o katerem jasno razpravljata dva ideologa nemškega narodnega socializma: Hitler v knjigi "Mein Kampf" in Rosenberg v spisu "Der Mythos des XX. Jahrhunderts."

Lebedev predvsem poudarja dvoje: Nova, po svetovni vojni razvita vojna tehnika in strategija nujno zahtevata nagel napad na nasprotnika. Sredstva, s katerimi se bo vodila bodoča vojna, dosežajo najvišjo učinkovitost samo v primeru naglega napada, medtem ko je pri daljšem vojskovanju njih učinkovitost znatno manjša. Gre za to, da napadalec ne pričakovanu udari in onemogoči napadencu vsak jačji nasprotni udar. Mobilizacija starega tipa, kakor jo poznamo iz l. 1914., spada po sodbi vojaških avtoritet (n. pr. maršala Petaina) že v zgodovino.

Zaradi tega je bodočemu napadalcu potrebna daljša mobilizacijska doba, da v okrilju miru mobilizira svoje napadalne sile za odločilni trenutek, od katerega pričakuje svojo popolno, čeprav pošastno strahotno zmago. Dolga leta priprav. leta do skrajnosti premišljene in smotrno zasnovane mobilizacije vojaških in zlasti še tehničnih, gospodarskih in finančnih sil — za pričakovano kratko obdobje silovitih napadov — to je hladno, strateško popolnoma utemeljeno načelo sodobne vojne tehnike!

Če se hoče imperialističen narod temeljito pripraviti za zverški napad, kakor ga je označil Petain, mora njegovo državno življenje zavzeti tako obliko, da bo kar najmanj mogoča javna kontrola. Demokratičen sistem nikakor ni ugoden za obdobje moderne mobilizacije, ki — kakor smo že omenili — traja daljšo dobo. Najprimernejša oblika je fašizem, ki si podreja vse bitje in živje državljanov in izključuje javno kontrolno skrite dolgotrajne mobilizacije.

Nagel napad in fašistična diktatura kot najprimernejša vladavina v mobilizacijski periodi sta potemtakem v najtesnejši zvezi. Narodi, čijih odločilni krogi pripravljajo nagel napad, ne morejo imeti demokracije, ker le-ta predstavlja in uveljavlja voljo miroljubne večine.

Japonska, Nemčija in tudi Poljska so že zavrgle demokracijo, da tako lažje mobilizirajo vse razpoložljive sile za usodni trenutek, ko se bo skušala izvršiti imperialistični načrt.

Lebedev se podrobno bavi z značajem počasne mirovne mobilizacije in s tehniko naglega napada, poudarjajoč, da so vsi novi vojni pripomočki, od katerih si vojaški strokovnjaki obetajo zmago, zasnovani na načelu hitrosti; nagel napad je potemtakem samo posledica razvoja vojne tehnike in strategije. Umljivo je, da so spričo takega stanja dokaj iluzorni vsi pakti in vse mednarodne diplomatske obveze, kajti vojna je vedno poznala eno samo načelo in izključevala vse, kar nasprotuje možnosti popolnega poraza sovražnika. V bodoči bo ta brezobzirnost še hušja in peklensko dosledna. Kajti krog bodoče vojne bo širši od vojne-ge ozemlja: v njem bodo vsi važnejši kraji, ki jih bo mogla tuja vojna avijacija najhitreje in najlažje napasti. Zato bo civilno prebivalstvo prav tako neizprosnno vrženo v vrtnice kakor vojaštvo.

Po Lebedevu je že izdelan podrobnejši načrt za delitev Rusije. Japonska si bo skušala zagotoviti znaten del vzhodne Sibirije in rusko obal Tihega oceana. Nemčija sanjari o osvojitvi baltičskih pokrajin. Poljska bi skušala ustvariti vazalno ukrajinsko državo, ki je takisto v interesu Nemčije. (Naj-novejši poskusi sporazuma med Poljaki in poljskimi Ukrajinci bi kazali v to smer). Zaradi tega spada med poglavitne naloge mobilizacijskega obdobja ustvarjanje in podpiranje raznih separatističnih stremeljenj na ruskem ozemlju. Obstoji možnost, da bi se v primeru poraza Rusije ustanovila cela vrsta nadaljnjih vazalnih držav (Kavkaz, Turkestan i. t. d.). Separatistični pokreti in njih voditelji bi imeli v primeru naloge napada posebne, že vnaprej določene vloge in naloge.

Pristaši naglega napada ne prikrivajo svojih načrtov. Po podatkih "La Revue de Paris" je bilo v Nemčiji 31. decembra 1934. okrog devet milijonov delavcev, to je 60% vsega zaposlenega delavstva, v službi oboroževalne industrije. Ker zavisi uspeh naglega napada predvsem od avijacije, se je v Nemčiji najbolj razvila industrija letal, ki baje že sedaj izdelala dnevno 15 letal; po neki, baje Goringovi odredbi bo produkcija letal tako razširjena, da bo Nemčija razpolagala v dohodnem času s 16,000 aparati.

Lebedev je emigrant, vendar moško priznava, da glede obrambe ruske zemlje ne more biti razlik v nazorih, zato ob koncu svojega članka razglablja tudi položaj ruske emigracije v primeru, da bi se pričel zgodovinski boj za delitev Rusije. Emigranti bi se v tem primeru borili za svojo domovino v vojskih, ki se postavijo v fronto sovjetske Rusije. Umljivo je, da ni mogoče napovedati, kdaj bo izbruhnila pričakovana vojna; to zavisi od vojno-politične konjunktura, ki se večkrat spreminja in ruši na videz že trdne načrte. Lebedev misli, da bi se usoden dan mo-

čno približal, če bi si Nemčija zagotovila nevtralnost Vel. Britanije. Krvavi ples pa se bo po vsej verjetnosti pričel na japonski strani; v tem pogledu je Japonska izvršila že kar preočitne, vsem znane priprave. Načrt bi bil močno omarjan, če bi Poljska zapustila zunanje-politično fronto Nemčije.

Za Rusijo je položaj težaven, vendar ne brezupen. Njena strategija se mora razvijati baš v nasprotno smer: pripravljena mora biti, da odbije nagel napad in ga spremeni v dolgotrajno vojno. Njene ogromne dimenzije so kakor nalašč za to, da se na njih razbije in razkropi napadalna sila sovražnika. Sedanja gospodarska politika Rusije je za obrambo ugodna, ker omogoča državi, da uravnava vse gospodarsko življenje po vojno-političnih potrebah. Ogromni napredek ruske aviacije je znak, da Sovjeti poznajo položaj in da se v vojno obrambni politiki ravno po modernih načelih. Umljivo je, da sedanja Rusija predvsem podpira miroljubna prizadevanja, pri tem pa prav tako skrbno suši smodnik.

V tem smislu piše publicist V. Lebedev, ki mu ni mogoče odreči odgovorne resnosti in globljega poznanja političnih problemov. Vzlic temu je treba sprejeti njegova izvajanja z rezervno in čih beležimo, ni v tem obtožba prizadetih držav, marveč samo eno izmed pričevanj, ki vzbujajo zanimanje in o katerih bi samo želeli, da bi jih zanimal bodoči razvoj političnih dogodkov v svetu.

Demisija treh ministrov.

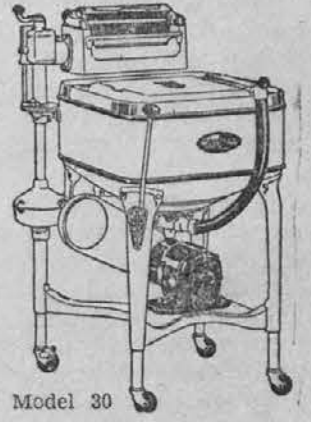
