Kaj piše nadškof Rožman o potovanju po Ameriki

Cleveland, 4. dec. Dolgo mi ni bilo toliko časa na razpolago, da bi zapisal vsaj nekaj bežnih vtisov, ki se z do slednjo naglico sipajo v dušo. Zdaj, ko vodim misijon v največji slovenski župniji clevelandski, pri sv. Vidu, upam najti par prostih minut, da otmetim počasni doživetja zadnjih dveh tednov.

Na ameriški Vrhni

Ko sem 16. novembra dopolnil obiskal še grobove slovenskih župljanov štebigenjskih na njihovem lepem pokopališču v "Zeleni dolini," so prišli že odpolanci, da me odvedejo v Waukegan. Ob meji države Illinois je čakala dolga vrsta avtomobilov s policisti na čelu, ki me je spremjal v slavnostnem sprevodu v ameriško Vrhni, kakor Waukegan ponosno imejajo. Pa moramo pomniti, da je v Ameriki vse neprimerno večje in razsežnejše kakor v "starem kraju," zato obsega ameriška Vrhni tudi Borovnico, Horjul in Polhov Gradec. Vem, da bi v "starem kraju" Polhograjevi odločno protestirati, če bi jih hoteli steti med Vrhničane, v Ameriki pa vsi lepo složno žive skupaj pod širokim in častim imenom "Vrhničani," ker glavni predsednik K. S. K. Jednote, Vrhničan Mr. Frank Opeka, v Waukeganu stoluje. Pred cerkvijo je bil krasen "starokrajski" spremem z deklamacijami in šopki, v cerkvi pa takoj pridiga in pete litiane.

Prijetno presenečen sem obstal pred cerkvijo. Pred glavnim vhodom stoji mogočno drevo, čisto v Plečnikovem slogu. Ko je sedanj jiolski župnik Plevnik zidal to cerkev, ni puštil dreves posekati, ampak je pomaknil cerkev toliko od ulice nazaj, da ima lepo drevo dosti prostora. Tako bi napravil pri nas mojster Plečnik. Vprašal sem, če imajo v Ameriki tudi kakega Plečnika, pa sem zvedel, da je to drevo predmet hudi bojev že trideset let. Eni ga hečeo posekati, drugi pa ohraniti. Letos so pozidali nov stolp, pa so se nasprotniki spet oglašili, da mora drevo pasti, ker zakriva pogled na novi "prelepi" zvonik. Oglasajo se tudi z zahtevo po stoljni urki, potem bo moralno drevo proč, kajti čemu ura na stolpu, če se nanjo ne vidi. Meni se je zdaleko lepo, še lepše pa, da stoji prav pred vhodom kot moreno stebber, in bi cerkev na lepoti izgubila, če bi odstranili ta kras. Samo en razlog bi bil zadosten, da bi g. župnik Butala, jolički rojak, dal drevo posekati, če bi namreč fantje med mašo postajali pod njim zunaj, cerkev. Ker pa ameriški fantje te grde starokrajske razvade nimajo, ampak hodijo med mašo in pridigo lepo dobrojno in udobno sedet v klopi, ni nobenega razloga, da bi se drevo posekalo. Zato sem ga ob odhodu blagoslovil, da ostane

ne kot spomin na moj obisk. Eden izmed nasprotnikov dreves je nato baje resigniranovo izdihnil "Trideset let sem to dreno preklinjal, zdaj ga bom moral pa kušniti."

V nedeljo, 17. novembra, sem imel pontifikalno mašo in dve pridigi. Pri maši je pel močan in dobro izvezban cerkevni zbor Leonardovo tretjo mašo v "B-Flat" pristno ameriško deло. Pri Credo se ponavlja Amen samo 36 krat. Za spomin sem vzel partituro seboj, da bo Msgr. Stanko-Premrl videl, kje je ameriška cerkvena glasba. Ne rečem, da ne bi ustvarila ta maša v človeku neko slavnostno razpoloženje, a precej na poskočno meji in grotovo ugaja tistim, ki so navajeni na prelah-

KONGRESNI ZAPISNIK (CONGRESSIONAL RECORD)

Tekom zadnjih 160 let, odkar je pričel kongres Združenih držav zborovati, izdaja vladni poseben tiskan zapisnik, ki tvori najbolj važen del političnega delovanja in zgodovine Združenih držav, in ki je menda edini te vrste na svetu.

Kongresni zapisnik se tiska vsak dan tekom kongresnega zasedanja na navadnem časniškem papirju v velikosti 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 9 palcev in nevezan. Vsebina strani ali listov je različna, po delovanju in debatah obeh zbornic, kongresne in senatne; včasih zavzemata nad 100 strani. Tiska se ga dnevno v okrog 35,000 izvodov.

Izdajo ali sestavo tega zapisnika ima v oskrbi šest najbolj izvezbanih stenografov, ki so pri tem delu že nad 25 let. Vsakih 12 minut po vrsti sestavljajo poseben zapisnik, ki tvori najbolj važen del političnega delovanja in zgodovine Združenih držav, ampak bo ponosen svojim sodelovanjem zatrgoval, da je istega rodu kakor novi ameriški svetnik. Waukeganska šola me je še tem bolj zanimala, ker je njen temeljni kamen leta 1926, blagoslovil prev. nadškof dr. Anton Bon. Jeglič Šolarji so mi pripravili v pondeljek, 18. oktobra dopoldne, malo akademijo, zato so dobili prosti, kar so vzelci s hurenškim vptijem na znanje. Sicer je pa poseben užitek za mene, da otrdkam se pogovarjam, ker slišim včasih nad vse ljubke odgovore. Angleščina ne pozna tikajanja v vikanju, ima za vse in vsakogar le en nagovor "Vi." tudi za male otročice. Slovenci pa se po domače vse tikajo. To pa je "starokrajskemu" ušesu kajkaj tuje. Nekje sta mi ministrala dva bratrance katera mi je župnik predstavil češ, tu sta "dva centa" — Centa se pišeta. Govoril sem nekaj besed z njima in ju povabil, naj me kdaj v Ljubljani obiščeta pa mi je eden preprosto vprašal: "Kaj si ti iz Ljubljane?"

Zatem se rokopis zapisnika hitro odpošlje v državno tiskarno. Ves ta rokopis celotne seje, ki obsega včasih na desetisoč besed je v doglednem času nastavljen, precitan po korektorih, urejen v strani in tiskan na modernih strojih. Dasiravno se včasih zboruje še po noči, je došlo v celoti gotov že zjutraj, da se istega zborovalcem razdeli in naročnikom takoj odpošlje po pošti.

V uredništvu teh zapisnikarjev so na razpolago različni besednjaki, svetopisemske knjige, pravne, literarne, zgodovinske itd. ker je treba večkrat v iste pogledati, da je beseda ali stavki pravilno v zapisniku označen, katerega vodi asfaltirana cesta, ponoči razsvetljena, da morejo bogoslovci cesta-ta mreže bogoslovci tudi zvezcer še napraviti obhod okrog jezer. Sestoji iz dvanajstih deloma ogromnih skupin poslopij. Je zdaj v njem 335 filozofov in bogoslovcov. Vzdrževalni stroški znašajo dnevno 400 do 500 dolarjev. Najnovejše poslopje je zgledno urejena




